**RECORD OF ANNUAL TOWN MEETING OF
THE TOWN OF BETHLEHEM, N.H.
Held March 12, 1963**

The meeting was called to order by Moderator Charles H. Whittier at 7:00 A.M. It was voted to proceed immediately to act on Article One and Article Thirteen by non-partisan ballot, Article One being to choose all necessary Town Officers; Article Thirteen being to see if the Town will vote to give permission to operate a dog track in the Town of Bethlehem if legalized by the State of New Hampshire. The balloting proceeded until 6:00 P.M. at which time the Moderator closed the polls for non-partisan ballot voting. The ballot box was turned and the officials proceeded to count the ballots with the following results:

Article 2. It was voted to raise \$74,233.13 to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same, including Ski Tow, Recreation, Concerts and Memorial Day.

This budget was first discussed item by item. There was considerable discussion regarding the Police Department item of \$6,800.00. Objection to the amount was offered by James Shea. Selectman Hazen answered numerous questions explaining the cost. Malcolm Stevenson spoke in favor of the appropriation.

The Country Club appropriation of \$11,000.00 was seriously questioned by Philip Martignetti who finally moved that we change it to \$9,000.00, his motion was duly seconded but it was voted down. Franklin Smith then moved that we raise the \$11,000.00 as stated in the original budget. His motion was seconded and carried.

After all the items in this Article had been read and discussed, Mr. Hazen for the selectmen, moved that the entire amount of \$74,233.13 be raised to take care of the above items under Article 2. His motion was seconded and passed by a voice vote.

Article 3. Motion made by Lester Stone, seconded by George Blaney and carried by a voice vote that the town do not buy a new truck this year.

Article 4. It was voted to raise \$32,900.00 under this article. Selectman Hazen moved that we raise \$35,900.00 for Highway Purposes. This motion was seconded by Frederick Stevenson. Lester Stone moved to amend this to \$32,900.00. His motion was seconded by Philip Martignetti. This motion was voted by a

division vote and carried 92 to 15. Then the amended motion was voted by voice vote.

Article 5. It was voted to raise and appropriate \$1,750.00 for Health Department, Nurse and Littleton Hospital.

Article 6. It was voted to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money during the current year on the credit of the Town to pay Current Indebtedness in Anticipation of Taxes.

Article 7. It was voted to raise and appropriate \$858.41 for Town Road Aid.

Article 8. It was voted to appropriate a sum not to exceed \$30,000.00 for the purpose of making improvements to the following Class V roads within the Town: Brook Road, such sum to be raised through the issuance of bonds or notes under and in compliance with the provisions of Chapter 241, New Hampshire Revised Statutes Annotated, 1955, as amended by Laws of 1957, Chapter 273:3 and to authorize the Selectmen to determine the date and place of payment of such bonds or notes and to determine the rate of interest thereon, and to take such other steps as may be necessary to negotiate such bonds or notes as shall be to the best interest of the Town of Bethlehem.

This was put to a division vote and was passed 107-0.

Article 9. It was voted to raise and appropriate \$400.00 for the Control of Ragweed.

Article 10. It was voted to raise and appropriate \$700.00 for the White Mountains Region Association and Town Signs.

Article 11. It was voted to raise and appropriate \$2,200.00 for Advertising and/or Related Purposes.

Article 12. It was voted to raise and appropriate \$1,200.00 to maintain an Information Booth during the Summer Season of 1963.

Article 13. See results of ballot voting above.

Article 14. Selectman Whittier informed the meeting of an offer made by the Littleton Park Commissioners to rent the Town Swimming Pool for forenoon hours during the summer season for an amount of \$800.00 to \$1,000.00. It was moved by John Keller, seconded by George Blaney and unanimously voted to give authority to the selectmen to rent the Town Swimming Pool to the Littleton Park Commissioners for forenoons during the summer of 1963 with the understanding that the Bethlehem children be included in the program conducted by the Littleton Park Commissioners without charge.

A motion was made by Lewis Roberts, Sr., seconded by Lewis Roberts, Jr., and unanimously carried that the zoning regulations relating to signs applying in Bethlehem Village District be made to apply throughout the whole town area.

A motion was made by Russell Maguire and seconded by George Blaney and unanimously carried that the selectmen make reports of any items of significance that occur in their weekly meetings in the Littleton Courier.

Malcolm Stevenson brought up the matter of the White Mountains Region Association taking action against the development of a monorail train in Beth-

lehem. There was some discussion of this and finally upon motion made by Malcolm Stevenson and seconded by George T. Noyes it was voted to ask the selectmen to write a letter of protest to the White Mountains Region Association.

A motion was made by Leo Stacy, seconded by Winifred Gearwar and unanimously carried that the selectmen get together with the Bethlehem Village District Commissioners in an effort to straighten out the matter of which board shall handle the money appropriated by the town of Bethlehem for use on town highways located within Bethlehem Village District.

Motion was made by Leonard Greco, seconded by Louise Ross and carried that the selectmen be requested to put up Christmas lights on Main Street if they can find funds for this in their budget.

During the discussion of the above articles Elwyn Miller and Malcolm Stevenson took turns as acting moderator so that the duly elected moderator could take part in the discussions.

The meeting was adjourned at 10:50 P.M.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the School Board and Citizens of Bethlehem :

It is with pleasure that I submit my annual report relative to your schools.

A very radical change has taken place in the Bethlehem school system since my last report and a change that has brought about a marked improvement in the educational program. As a result of your vote a year ago, Bethlehem High School was closed officially on June 30 and all high school pupils were tuitioned to neighboring high schools at the beginning of the school year in September.

Fifty-three Bethlehem pupils registered at Littleton High School, eleven registered at Whitefield High School and five at St. Johnsbury Trade School. It is interesting to note that those who have transferred out have done so because of a change in address. Reports from the various schools indicate that most of these pupils are doing reasonably well in their work. A large percentage made the honor roll in their respective schools.

Another significant improvement in the educational program was your decision to add to staff in the elementary school and eliminate the practice of two grades in a room under a single teacher. The providing of kindergarten for the five year olds was another step in the right direction.

As a result of the above reorganization, it was necessary to employ additional elementary teachers and to replace one that left. Mrs. Charlotte Kezar of Littleton, a graduate of Plymouth Normal, with a number of years' experience in New Hampshire was elected to teach the third grade. Mr. James Enderson, a

graduate of Keene Teachers College and with previous experience in Marlboro, was elected to teach grade six, replacing Mr. Charles Day who resigned to accept a position in Massachusetts. Mrs. Natalie Wheeler of Franconia, a graduate of Plymouth with a number of years' experience in Vermont and New Hampshire. was elected to teach grade 5. Mrs. Pauline Keach, a graduate of Lyndon Teachers College, with previous experience in Gorham and Bethlehem, was elected to teach kindergarten. A complete list of teacher assignments for this year will be found on another page of this report.

Some departmental work has been started this year in grades six, seven and eight with each teacher teaching those subjects in which he is best qualified. The Greater Cleveland Mathematics program has been introduced into the first four grades and the upper four grades are being given transitional material in the new modern mathematics.

Major repairs this past year include painting the entire auditorium walls and ceiling and the replacement of window drapes. It is hoped that a new stage curtain and cyclorama can be installed this coming year.
