TOWN WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the Town of Croydon, in the County of Sullivan, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Town on Tuesday, the 10th day of March next, at 10 o'clock in the forenoon, (polls not to close earlier than 6 o'clock in the afternoon) to act upon the following subjects:

- ART. 1. To choose one Selectman for three years, Highway Agent, two Auditors, Library Trustee for three years, one Trustee of Trust Funds for three years, and all such officers and agents as may be necessary for the transaction of the Town's business for the ensuing year.
- ART. 2. To bring in votes on the Zoning Ordinance as proposed by the Planning Board.
- ART. 3. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Planning and Zoning.
- ART. 4. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to defray Town Charges for the ensuing year.
- ART. 5. To see if the Town will vote to accept State Aid for Class V Highways and Bridges and raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be deemed necessary for the purpose.
- ART. 6. To see if the Town will vote to accept State Aid for Class V roads and vote to raise and appropriate \$685.42 for same; the State to contribute \$4,569.46.
- ART. 7. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for summer and winter road maintenance.

- ART. 8. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for General Expense of the Highway Department.
- ART. 9. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for maintenance of Town Dump.
- ART. 10. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for cutting brush.
- ART. 11. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for upkeep of cemeteries.
- ART. 12. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Capital Reserve Fund to be used for new equipment.
- ART. 13. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Street Lights and Lighting Town Buildings.
- ART. 14. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Social Security on Town Employees for the ensuing year.
- ART. 15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$80.00 for White Pine Blister Rust.
- ART. 16. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire all necessary sums of money for use during the year in anticipation of Taxes.
- ART. 17. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Insurance.
- ART. 18. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Old Age Assistance.
- ART. 19. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to help support and maintain the Lebanon Regional Airport.

- ART. 20. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 to defray the cost of Library, including Librarian's Salary, heat, etc.
- ART. 21. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Newport Area Home Health Agency.
- ART. 22. To see what action the Town will take on the Cemetery Report and raise and appropriate any sums necessary.
- ART. 23. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 to have the Town Records photocopied.
- ART. 24. To see if the Town wishes to exclude from the plan service in any class or classes of positions of election officials or election workers for a calendar quarter in which the remuneration paid for such service is less than \$50.00.
- ART. 25. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the purpose of publicizing and promoting the natural advantages and resources of the town together with other towns in the Dartmouth-Lake Sunapee Region Association.
- ART. 26. To see if the Town will vote to rename so-called Cash Street to be known as Spectacle Pond Road.
- ART. 27. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to credit receipts from the old town truck sale to the Capital Reserve Fund.
- ART. 28. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for resurfacing or rebuilding existing paved roads.
- ART. 29. To see what action the Town will take on petition filed by Alex J. Wesoja and Robert McGray stating, We, Alex J. Wesoja and Robert McGray, of Melody Lane in Ryder Corner would like to have the Town of Croydon maintain 550 feet of said Melody Lane to the Croydon and Sunapee line.

ART. 30. To transact any other business which may legally come before said meeting.

REPORT OF THE FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND DISTRICT CHIEF

The 1969 fire season was a quiet one in this area. Frequent rains kept the danger to a minimum and there were few violations. Your Forest Fire Warden's job would be easier if everyone understood the State laws that govern the kindling of outdoor fires. A synopsis of these laws follow:

Fire Permit

A fire permit is needed for all outdoor fires in or near woodland anytime the ground is not covered with snow. This includes household waste burning, even if in an incinerator, grass burning, garden trash as well as brush burning. Such burning is restricted by regulation to be prior to 9:00 a.m. and after 5:00 p.m.

Exceptions

Commercial or Industrial burning is allowed anytime under normal conditions with permission of the District

Chief and a permit from the Fire Warden.

Camp or cooking fires are allowed on your own property with permission of the Fire Warden. On another's property with written permission of the landowner and permission of the Fire Warden. The Warden can forbid such fires if in a hazardous area. Permits for cooking fires in the White Mountain National Forest can be obtained from the Laconia Office or at the Ranger Stations. Permits are not required in public camp or picnic grounds where fireplaces have been built for this purpose.

Penalties

- 1. For kindling a fire without a permit. Maximum of \$200.00 fine; or imprisonment for not more than 60 days.
- 2. For kindling a fire by any means wilfully or recklessly that shall endanger woodlands the maximum fine is \$500.00 or one year's imprisonment.

- 3. For failure to totally extinguish a camp or cooking fire before leaving it the same penalties as in (1) above.
- 4. For dropping inflammable material in or near woodland maximum fine of \$25.00.

REPORT OF CEMETERY COMMITTEE

There are six public cemeteries in the Town of Croydon: the East Village, Croydon Flat, Four Corners, Pinnacle, Putnam and Under-the-Mountain. The remaining lots in these cemeteries are to be sold on an individual lot basis, except for the Under-the-Mountain Cemetery.

For the purposes of clarification, a "resident" is defined as a person who has resided in the town of Croydon for not less than three years consecutively. However, it is understood that at times there will be extenuating circumstances when a resident will not have resided here for three years, and this fact will be taken into consideration by the proper authorities.

PROPOSED REGULATIONS

Croydon residents may purchase the remaining lots in these cemeteries, except for the Under-the-Mountain Cemetery, on an individual or family plot basis, which is not to exceed four graves, and a lot being a single grave-site.

With the limited space available in these cemeteries it would be impossible to determine an exact size of a lot because of the pre-existing lay-out.

The fee for the remaining lots in all the public cemeteries shall be \$50.00 (Fifty Dollars) per individual lot. If the family decides not to use the lots already purchased, they must revert back to the town at which time the purchase price will be refunded, and if the lot is not used within 100 years of the purchase date, it shall revert back to town ownership without any refund of monies. The monies received from the sale of cemetery lots will be placed in a general cemetery trust fund, the interest from which will be used for the perpetual care of the cemeteries.

The lots in the new part of the Croydon Flat Cemetery have already been laid out in 4 ft. by 11 ft. lots and the foregoing regulations shall also apply to it. All grave stones in this new section of the cemetery shall be flush with the ground except those already established.

Each lot shall have a permanent marker bearing sufficient vital statistics to identify the grave. (Applies to all cemeteries.)

Complete permanent records shall be kept by a superintendent of cemeteries or other responsible agencies.
