

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE TOWN WARRANT

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Deerfield in the County of Rockingham in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Deerfield on Tuesday, the Twelfth day of March, next at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To vote by ballot upon the following question: Are you in favor of the adoption of the Zoning Ordinance, including the Mobilehome Ordinance, as proposed by the Planning Board?
- 3. To decide by ballot whether the Town is in favor of having the Tax Collector elected for a three year term, beginning in 1969.
- 4. To decide by ballot whether the Town is in favor of having the Town Clerk elected for a three year term, beginning in 1969.
- 5. To decide by ballot whether the Town is in favor of having the Town Treasurer elected for a three year term, beginning in 1969.

The following articles will be taken up at 8:00 P.M.

6. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

- 7. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire money in anticipation of taxes.
- 8. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell property acquired through Tax Collector's Deeds.
- 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,377.47 for Town Road Aid, the State to contribute \$9,183.10.
- 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$21,000 for the purpose of making improvements on Class V roads within the town, such roads to be selected by the Selectmen. Such sum to be raised through the issuance of bonds or notes, under and in compliance with the provisions of Chapter 241, N. H. Revised Statutes Annotated, 1955, and to authorize the Selectmen to determine the rate of interest thereon, and to take such other steps as may be necessary to negotiate such bonds or notes as shall be to the best interests of the town of Deerfield.
- 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$6,000.00 to be used to complete the tax map for the town of Deerfield.
- 12. To accept and adopt the provisions of RSA 154 relative to the fire department, with special reference to sections 5, and 17 and 24 thereof; and to direct the selectmen to appoint, for an indefinite term, as a board of three firewards those persons who are incumbents as Chief, President, and Secretary of the Deerfield Volunteer Fire Association, from time to time; the Chief thereof being designated as the Chief-Fireward.
- 13. To see if the Town will vote to accept a parcel of land on Blakes Hill Road, containing 65 acres more or less, to be deeded to the Town of Deerfield by Mr. Burton McNeil in memory of his wife upon the following condition:

"This area shall be known as the Agnes B. McNeil

Conservation Area and shall forever be open to the public."

- 14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200 for the control of White Pine Blister Rust in Deerfield.
- 15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$50 for the Merrimack Valley Regional Association.
- 16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$37.50 for the Rockingham County Action Program, Inc.
- 17. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue that section of the Old Mountain Road (so-called) leading from Route 43 to the Northwood-Deerfield town line and abutted by land of Ernest Stevens, Jr., William D. Stevens and Frederick Palmer.
- 18. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting. Polls to close at 6:00 P.M. due to reopening at 8:00 P.M. to take action on remaining articles in the Warrant.

REPORT OF THE BOARD OF SELECTMEN

The Board of Selectmen, in this its report to the town, wishes to thank all who served the Town on various commissions during the year 1967. As no remuneration is attached to these positions it is recognized that each person so serving has been interested in being a useful citizen.

As a result of action at the 1967 Town Meeting the bid of Mr. Chesley of Northwood was accepted to start a tax map. To date approximately one third of this map is completed and we have a firm commitment that this map can be completed for the \$8500.00 estimate given last Spring. This map now assumes prime importance under State Legislation, effective this year, that requires separation of land and buildings for tax purposes. Due to lack of information on some existing records some errors may exist and anyone noting these would be most helpful in calling them to our attention for corrective action.

Assessment books reflecting the 1967 tax assessments were compiled and have been mailed with the Town Reports.

The placing of the maintenance of the Town Dump, exclusive of the Caretaker, out to bid resulted in savings of nearly 40%. Additional savings will be reflected in 1968 by grouping certain insurance policies this year.

The adoption of an official map of the Town, as prepared by the Planning Board and the indexing of all roads and intersections by the ABC Committee has allowed the Board to place an order for ninety reflectorized metal road signs which will be erected this year.

We are requesting again this year an accelerated TRA Program as this allows maximum return on the tax dollar.

The completion of the tax map will allow the Board to study, the needs of a re-evaluation of the Town, in conjunction with the ABC and recommend a program to the Town to accomplish this.

The Town Hall parking lot, on the land donated by Mr. and Mrs. John Petersen, has been black-topped, and with this addition the need for a building to house equipment becomes more urgent. Under the same roof of such a building, Offices for Town Departments could be provided for moderate cost. The Board asks your consideration of this problem.

The Town of Deerfield has made progress over the years and we hope that all will work together to improve the Town and make it a better place in which to live.

STATEMENT OF THE

ADVISORY BUDGET COMMITTEE

The ABC Committee met on January 26 with the School Board for review of the proposed school budget. The reasons given for the increase of about \$16,000 were found acceptable to the Committee. It is worthy of note, however, to mention that each \$10,000 additional raised by property tax represents a 5% tax increase.

The added request of \$20,000 was not approved by the Committee. At a November (1967) meeting compiled a priority listing for road sign locations. The board of selectmen accepted the results which included 45 locations averaging 2 signs for each location.

Two meetings of the ABC Committee, held jointly with Surveyor True Chesley and the Board of Selectmen focused on the progress of the Tax Map authorized at the 1967 town meeting. With about one-third of the Map completed, the ABC Committee urges for the speedy completion of the Map. Given the proper go-ahead authorization the Tax Map could be available for use this year.

The Committee met with the selectmen on February 14th on review of the proposed town budget. Approval of the Committee was given to the proposed budget.

The ABC Committee has formally requested the Board of Selectmen to provide a public address system for the town hall. Mutually, it has been agreed that everyone has a right to hear and to be heard.

After several successive years of drought, the rains of 1967 came as a welcome change. Our record of the past fire season is good. Our thanks to all who contributed to achieve this good record. Continued improvement in the matter of accurate, prompt detection and rapid effective suppression action can help to maintain this good, worthwhile record even though we do not have an abundance of rain as in the fire season of 1967.

It will help if we follow these simple suggestions:

- 1. No burning of debris and waste between the hours of 9:00 A. M., and 5:00 P. M., and then only with a written permit from the Forest Fire Warden.
- 2. Take debris and waste to the town dump.
- 3. Maintain a clean, safe dump.
- 4. Keep matches away from young children.
- 5. Be sure matches and smoking material are dead out when we discard them.
- 6. Set a good example for others in fire prevention.

REPORT OF THE

PLANNING BOARD

A Planning Board of five members was established under RSA 36 by vote of the Town at a special meeting held on February 4, 1967.

At the same special meeting the Town voted to grant to the Planning Board such powers as to approve or disapprove plans showing streets or widening thereof, or parks, as provided in RSA 36:19 as amended.

The Town Clerk then filed with the Registrar of Deeds of Rockingham County a certified copy of the article and a record of the voting as required by law.

Shortly after the special meeting the Selectmen appointed the following members to the Board:

ROGER C. KING

GEORGE INNES

JOHN E. GRACE

JOHN S. BRINKLER

PAUL A. O'NEAL

On February 24, 1967 an organizational meeting was held at the Town Hall at 8:00 P.M. at which meeting John E. Grace served as temporary chairman. The members present were John S. Brinkler, John E. Grace and George Innes.

A brief outline of aims and purposes of the Planning Board was given by John E. Grace. He stated that help was assured from the Town's legal advisor and from the New Hampshire Department of Resources and Economic Development, and this help would be most particularly needed in the initial or formative stages.

A one year term for the office of Chairman was agreed upon, and elected to Chairman of the Board for the first

year was John S. Brinkler and nominated to the post of Secretary was George Innes.

After the March 15, 1967 meeting the Board met frequently to prepare a suggested Draft of a Zoning Ordinance for the Town. Later, a formal request was made to the Department of Resources and Economic Development for a Base Map of the Town with a scale of 1 inch equals 1500 feet, the accepted scale. By the end of April this same map was received for review and to make any necessary changes and corrections.

In the early part of May Roger C. King, as Chairman of the Board of Selectmen, resigned because of the great increase in Town Business. Bernard Weiss became the new member of the Board representing the Selectmen.

During May a Public Hearing was held at the Town Hall to discuss the suggested Zoning Ordinance and Mobilehome Ordinance. The meeting was well attended with one hundred and twenty-six (126) persons present. Mimeograph outlines were passed around to everyone present and the Chairman read the proposed Ordinance in its entirety.

Questions came afterwards and certain changes were suggested from the floor. As a result of this Hearing, and to further aid the Board, a request was made by the Board for soils information to the Rockingham County Soils Conservation District. This was approved and a meeting with the Soil Conservationist was agreed on for June 28, 1967. The Deerfield Conservation Commission was invited to attend the meeting. After this joint meeting the Planning Board voted to seek membership in the Rockingham County Soil Conservation District and a request was made regarding procedure to obtain a soils map with the necessary interpretation. However, the soils map project has been held over until after the middle of March, 1968, that is, after the Zoning Ordinance will have been considered by the Town.

During the last of August, a revised Base Map was sent to the Selectmen and on September 20, 1967, an Official Map of the Town was established and an approved, certified, copy was sent to the Registrar of Rockingham County.

Meanwhile, throughout the twice a month meetings, work progressed on a Subdivision Ordinance and a Zoning Ordinance, including a Mobilehome Ordinance, along with approval of plans required for presentation to the Registrar of Deeds.

A second Public Hearing was held on November 17, 1967 at 8:00 P. M. at the Town Hall. As a result of this meeting the Subdivision Ordinance, after a signed copy was sent to the Registrar of Deeds, became a legal regulation for Subdivisions.

The Zoning Ordinance, including the Mobilehome Ordinance as amended was read and discussed. A map showing the different zones of the Town was on display.

After the second hearing the Board contacted the Town's Legal Advisor relative to the question for the ballot, the wording on the Town Warrant and the extent of discussion from the floor at the Town Meeting.

The Board now feels that it has a Zoning Ordinance, including a Mobilehome Ordinance, ready for the voters of the Town to approve or disapprove.

FIRST REPORT OF THE DEERFIELD

CONSERVATION COMMISSION

Deerfield joined more than 60 other New Hampshire communities when voters in the 1967 Town Meeting approved a Town Conservation Commission.

The move established an arm of town government which can stand between expected population growth in Deerfield and possible harm to town natural resources. The Commission can improve existing deteriorated conditions.

To determine what taxpayers in Deerfield thought specifically should be done, the Commission decided to send a questionnaire to each property owner.

Five projects appeared most favorable to the townspeople who answered question one (multiple preference).

Survey water pollution, control mosquitoes, roadside cleanup, control poison ivy and open old woods and fire roads were predominant, in descending order.

The questionnaire was developed and mailed despite the lack of an appropriation for the Commission in the 1967 Town Budget. The Spaulding-Potter Trusts of Concord consented to finance the survey with funds offered Conservation Commissions for local publicity efforts.

The Commission thinks the questionnaire was the first such town-wide canvas of public opinion in Deerfield's 200-year history.

While detailed analysis of the questionnaire will tell much more about public preference, the Commission will consider any additional suggestions or comments. A complete analysis of the questionnaire is to be mailed to all taxpayers.

After a year of "getting its feet on the ground," the Commission became guided by the viewpoint Deerfield's natural assets are irreplaceable and should be preserved for the benefit of all. The Commission will coordinate and cooperate with the Planning Board and other agencies and officials to obtain maximum good for the town.

Despite the growth which will undoubtedly take place in Deerfield, the Commission aims to prevent the town's basic attractiveness being unnecessarily marred or permanently destroyed.



NOTICE TO DOG OWNERS

Every dog owner or keeper of a dog three months old or over shall annually, before April 30th, register it with the town clerk. The licensed dog must wear a collar and a tag around his neck with his registration number thereon. Annual fees are:

- (1) for a male or a spayed female \$2.00
- (2) for a female \$5.00

If fee is not paid by June 1st there is an added fee of \$1.00.

Certificate of Rabies shot must be presented when registering dogs.



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
