

## Town Warrant

#### THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Exeter, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet in the Town Hall, in said town, on the second Tuesday of March next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1st. To choose by ballot and major vote a town clerk.

2nd. To choose by ballot and major vote one selectman for three years.

3rd. To choose by ballot and major vote one trustee of the Robinson Female Seminary for the term of seven years.

4th. To choose by ballot and major vote one trustee of the trust funds held by the Town of Exeter, to hold office for three years.

5th. To choose all other necessary town officers, auditors, or committees for the ensuing year.

6th. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the maintenance of the poor, for repairing highways, for repairing and building bridges, for repairing and building sidewalks, for building drains and sewers, for oiling the streets, for payment of the town debt, for lighting streets, for defraying the expenses of decorating the graves of Union soldiers, for preventing the spread of insect pests within the town, and for other charges arising within the town, and for the payment of the firemen for the ensuing year.

7th. To hear the reports of the committees heretofore chosen and pass any vote relating thereto.

8th. To see what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate for the use of the Robinson Female Seminary during the coming year.

9th. On petition of Arthur O. Fuller and twelve others, to see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to take such steps as may be necessary to provide for the disposal of sewage from houses on Court Street between Marston Street and Little River, and to appropriate money therefor.

10th. On petition of Stanley Wasiewski and twenty-three others, to see if the town will vote to install a sewer on Wentworth Street; in said Exeter, and appropriate money for the same.

11th. On petition of Joseph Morrissette and twelve others, to see if the town will vote to place street lights on Court extension to the Kensington line and appropriate money for the same.

12th. On petition of Harold M. McLane and eighteen others, to see if the town will vote to have two additional electric lights installed on Portsmouth Avenue, between High Street and Prospect Street.

13th. On petition of Lizzie M. Towle and twenty-four others, to see if the town will vote to install an electric light on Clifford Street, opposite the Star Laundry, and appropriate a sufficient sum of money to maintain the same.

14th. On petition of John West and sixteen others, to see if the town will vote to extend the electric lights from Perkins Hill on Kingston Road down the mail route to the East Kingston town line.

15th. On petition of Richard A. Godet and fifteen others, to see if the town will vote to install an electric light at the lower end of Ash Street, and appropriate a sufficient sum of money to maintain the same.

16th. On petition of Michael F. Riley and fifteen others, to see if the town will vote to appropriate money to extend and

maintain the street lights on the Hampton Falls road from Haines' corner to the Hampton Falls town line.

17th. On petition of Winthrop E. Fiske and thirty others, to see if the town will appropriate the sum of \$500 with which to buy two sets of scenery and put the stage in suitable condition for presenting any dramatic performance.

18th. On petition of Fred A. Moore and eighteen others, to see if the town will vote to appropriate the sum of five hundred (\$500) dollars for a series of ten concerts by the Exeter Brass Band to be played on the Swasey Band Stand in the Square during the summer season, 1928.

19th. On petition of Carrie W. Byington and ten others, to see if the town will choose a committee of three to consider reconditioning the present Public Library Building to provide an adequate "Children's Room," recommend designs, obtain estimates of cost, and report to the next meeting of the town.

20th. On petition of Frank M. Cilley and nine others, to see if the town will appoint a committee of three to inquire as to the water now being furnished to the inhabitants of the town, both as to its drinking qualities and quantity for fire protection, to investigate the question of rates now effective or which may be proposed, with authority to appear, in behalf of the town in all matters pertaining to the water supply, before the Public Service Commission of the State, and with the duty to report at the next annual Town Meeting. To see if the town will appropriate the sum of \$300.00 to be used to pay for such services and expenses of the above mentioned committee as may be approved by the selectmen.

21st. On petition of George A. Carlisle and thirteen others, to see if the town will vote to buy a pumper for the Exeter Fire Department and appropriate the sum of twelve thousand five hundred dollars (\$12,500).

22nd. On petition of Frank M. Cilley and nine others, to see if the town will vote by ballot under the provisions of Chapter 136 of the Laws of the State of New Hampshire, passed at

•

the January Session, 1927, to authorize the selectmen of Exeter, to contract with Exeter Industries Corporation or with some person duly authorized to act in their behalf, they now proposing to erect or put in operation a certain manufacturing establishment in such town, for the abatement for the term of five years of all local taxes which may be assessed upon such manufacturing establishment, including buildings, machinery and stock in trade, upon such terms and conditions as may be mutually agreed upon.

23rd. On petition of Ralph E. Meras and fourteen others, to see if the town will vote to earry its own insurance on town property after the expiration of policies in force at the time of the adoption of this article.

those pupils who for a stated period have best-exemplified school spirit. The class of 1929 plans to leave to the school a cup to be awarded each year to the girl who combines to the greatest degree superior character, marked ability in leadership, and high scholarship. These suggestions have all come from the pupils themselves, and are being worked out by them.

During the adolescent period high ideals are indispensable. Statements of ideals made by the pupils themselves offer the best assurance we have of the probability of fixing the habit of lasting allegiance to high standards of thought and action. By such means public opinion in school life is established on a high level. Public opinion undoubtedly is one of the most powerful factors in life, particularly in secondary school life.

Pupils are asked to estimate their own success in the attainment of character qualifications in the hope that focusing their attention upon the things of greatest worth may implant a genuine desire to improve steadily and continuously in the supremely important task of establishing on a sure foundation strong, clean character.

The importance of character training through the fixing of right attitudes deserves far greater attention than it has received in most schools. Too great stress has been placed upon scholastic marks, with the result that attempts frequently have been made to gain high marks even by dishonest means.

Since it is the conviction of practically every teacher that all instruction has for its ultimate aim character formation, it is clear that the excessive emphasis upon scholarship rather than upon character which has obtained in most schools has been a serious mistake.

In not a few high schools the question of moral education is now regarded as a major consideration. It is even suggested that major emphasis should be placed upon character building and that promotion should be decided upon the basis of character ratings instead of scholastic ratings.

In the Seminary, promotion might well be determined by marks based both on scholarship and on character.

To a constantly increasing extent colleges are basing upon character their judgment of the fitness of candidates for entrance. The president of a State University says, "We plan to make the character, aims, and personality of the candidate at least equivalent in value, if not superior, to his academic achievements."

Bonding companies are more carefully than formerly investigating the habits and character of those for whom they furnish bonds.

Several great business corporations are insisting upon superior character qualifications in their employees.

The crime wave which has swept our country has emphasized the need of co-operation of every possible agency in the upbuilding of ethical character.

The school is only one of these agencies, but it should be a conspicuous leader in every movement which gives promise of producing better citizens.

Within recent years many changes of great importance have been effected through the genuine interest which the Board of Trustees has shown in the school's welfare.

Recent additions to the equipment of the science laboratory are of great value. The new projection apparatus is being used with excellent results in several departments.

Improvements have been made in lighting facilities, in seating arrangements, in the expansion of the course in Domestic Arts, in the addition of courses in Commerce and in Physical Education. These changes have made possible a type of teaching formerly so difficult as to be almost unattainable.

In several reports I have pointed out the most significant features of the methods now employed. Results of these methods have given the school a rating as one of the best in the state. A straw which shows the direction of the wind is the fact that a pupil who failed in college work through lack of preparation was advised by the college authorities to complete her preparation in Robinson Seminary where many of the college's best students were taught, and she is now in school.

Medical inspection of the present year reveals a condition of defective teeth so widespread that I repeat a suggestion made in 1918 that a dental clinic at the school seems not only desirable, but almost necessary if pupils are to be so cared for as to enable them to work without a serious handicap.

In other respects general health conditions are good.

I know you have in mind the inadequacy of the old heating system, its excessive consumption of coal, and the consequent desirability of a modern heating plant.

Under the charge of the new janitor, Mr. Roy Nesbitt, notwithstanding all the difficulties of the situation, the Seminary building is comfortable both in temperature and in cleanliness to a degree that previously was impossible of realization.

The need of seats of the correct posture type to replace the uncomfortable, badly worn settees in the Assembly Hall, I have mentioned in a previous report. I hope it will be possible immediately to replace at least a part of the settees.

The dressing room on the second floor is ill suited to the demands made upon it both because of its arrangement and because of its diminutive size.

An additional class room is desirable, since a class is forced to recite for several periods each week when all the class rooms are in use in the corridor on the third floor which has no radiator.

The room which has been used for a part of the books of the school library is neither large enough nor well enough arranged to serve the needs of a good library.

A suitable place for gymnastic exercises with shower bath facilities is a need for which provision should be made. The success of the department of physical education justifies the expenditure that may be necessary to provide such facilities.

An addition to the building might be made which would provide the necessary space for class rooms; for the library; a room for a dental clinic, for the work of a school nurse, and the school physician; ample dressing room space; suitable accommodations for physical exercises; and an up to date heating plant.

Emphasis upon the need of an addition to the building is justifiable because it is not reasonable to expect wholly satisfactory results according to modern standards unless ample room is provided for modern school activities.

I believe it is possible to add wings across the north end of the building which would enhance rather than detract from the architectural plan of the building.

I am confident that you will strive to improve unsatisfactory conditions, and will continue to grant to the teachers of the school the very generous support and encouragement which you have given them through the years in which it has been my privilege to work with you.

In their behalf and from a deep sense of personal appreciation, I wish to record my sincere thanks.


