Library Report.

To the Citizens of the Town of Gilford:

The trustees of the Gilford public library beg leave to submit their annual report together with that of the treasurer of the library funds, for the year ending Feb. 15, 1902.

The number of volumes added to the library during the year has been 140, making the number now on hand 1,121.

Out of the appropriation by the town 130 volumes have been added, and the balance of the increase have been donated by the state and by private citizens. The record kept by the librarian shows that 26 new borrowers have become patrons of the library during the year, and that 2,575 volumes have been loaned, classified as follows: Fiction, 2,499; history; 33, general literature, 6; travels, 17; art, 9; biography, 9; poetry, 1; farm and home, 1. The largest number loaned in any one day was 50. Your trustees did not deem it advisable to use more than eighty-five dollars of this appropriation in the purchase of new books at this time.

There are some books which need rebinding, and it would be advisable to issue a supplementary catalogue of such books as have been added during the year. There will probably be some expense incidental to furnishing the new library room, and your trustees have retained the balance of the appropriation for these purposes. The library is in need of more books of reference, and what is needed is a good encyclopoedia. It would be a great help to those attending school and to older ones as well.

A good work of this kind would probably require the expenditure of nearly two thirds of the annual appropriation, and your trustees do not feel like using so large a portion of the appropriation for this purpose. We are pleased to notice that there has been an increase of 692 in the number of volumes loaned during the year, thus showing an increased interest in the library.
