# TOWN WARRANT

## THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Goshen in the County of Sullivan  
in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Goshen on Tuesday, the 12th day of March, next at one of the clock in the afternoon to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

The meeting will convene at 7:30 p.m. for consideration of the following articles:

2. To receive the reports of the Town Officers and take action thereon.

3. To raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,750.00 for town officers' salaries.

4. To raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 for town officers' expenses.

5. To raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 for elections and registrations.

6. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to install a suitable heating system in the town hall, unit selected by competitive bids and cost not to exceed \$1,100.00.

7. To raise and appropriate the sum of \$400 for the town hall and other buildings.

8. To raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 to defray the town share of Social Security.

9. To raise and appropriate the sum of \$700.00 for Police Dept.

10. To raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,050.00 for the Fire Dept.

11. To see if the town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$600.00 for insurance.

12. To raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 for care of town dump.

13. To raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,500.00 for summer maintenance of roads.

14. To raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,500.00 for winter maintenance of highways.

15. To raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000.00 for general expenses of the highway department.

16. To raise and appropriate the sum of \$335.07 for town road aid, state to contribute \$2,233.77.

17. To raise and appropriate the sum of \$750.00 for the Library.

18. To raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 for Town Poor.

19. To raise and appropriate the sum of \$825.00 for Old Age Assistance.

20. To raise and appropriate the sum of \$25.00 for Memorial Day.

21. To raise and appropriate the sum of \$350.00 for Cemeteries.

22. To raise and appropriate the sum of \$45.60 for Pine Blister Rust.

23. To raise and appropriate the sum of \$150 for damages and legal expenses.

24. To raise and appropriate the sum of \$50.00 for Advertising and Regional Associations.

25. To raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 to defray interest charges.

26. To raise and appropriate the sum of \$175.00 for hospitals.

27. To raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 to be placed in the Highway Capital Reserve Fund.

28. To raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 to open the road from the Center Road to Four Corners Cemetery.

29. To raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 to be placed in trust toward future reappraisal of town property.

30. To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

31. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Cemetery Commission to sell lots in town cemeteries at the rate of \$50.00 per double lot. Proceeds to be used for the maintenance of cemeteries.

32. To see if the town will vote to change from the present two party system to the nonpartisan method of election as provided in Revised Statutes Chapters 59-70 thru 59-87.

33. To see if the town will authorize the board of selectmen to appoint a committee to set up comprehensive rules and regulations governing our local Police Department.

34. To see if the Town will adopt the amendments to the Building Regulations (Code) as proposed by the Planning Board.

35. To see if the Town will adopt the following ordinance: Individual Mobile Homes shall be restricted to mobile home parks and such parks shall be established only by permit of the selectmen and providing they meet State health and safety regulations.

36. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money through note or bond in the sum of \$8,000.00 to be repaid at cost to the Fire Department for construction of a new Fire House.

37. To see if the town will vote to give the Highway Department a \$.25 per hour raise, 1 week's paid vacation and 5 paid holidays.

38. To take up any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

## REPORT OF THE PLANNING BOARD

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During the past year your Planning Board has held several meetings, initially to review the functions and objectives of planning boards in general, and secondarily, to investigate and survey the actions of other towns in this area and/or of this size. In addition, we have been in close touch with the Planning Division of the Department of Resources and Economic Development in Concord.

Long range surveys of the future by such organizations as Arthur Little Inc. and the New England Council (as well as state agencies) indicate that the population in New Hampshire will triple over the next 50 years. This naturally will have tremendous impact on governmental entities but it will have equal effect on us as individuals, for in addition to the surge of demand upon counties and municipalities for new services — and improved older services — there will arise the sudden problem of more people seeking less and less available land. No longer can we say that we are free to do what we want with our own land, for that has effect on our neighbors, but we even have to be careful what we do with our own time, our own selves and our own businesses. And if we do not keep our own houses in order, we face the possibility of the state and federal governments setting up restrictions devised for the best interests of the whole. To sum up, government has some right to issue restraints to protect “society” in a collective manner — and we as individuals necessarily will support certain restraints to protect our own land and building values, and to insure reasonable privacy and peace of mind to ourselves.

Because of time limitations and the necessity of “tailoring” any recommendations to Goshen’s specific needs, it was felt that the wisest procedure was to proceed slowly and thoroughly, to restrict any recommendations this year to the updating of the Building Regulations now in force. Because of requests from several individuals, we are also asking for an article to be inserted in the warrant to enable discussion on the possible regulation of future mobile homes within town limits. We would hope that citizens always remember that their Plan-

ning Board is an arm of their government and would like ideas and suggestions from individuals and/or groups, either for discussion by us as part of overall programs or for inclusion in future warrants for future town meetings to discuss.

# REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the Citizens of the Goshen-Lempster Cooperative School District:

## ENROLLMENT

The number of students totals 119, broken down as follows:

Grade 1	18
Grade 2	14
Grade 3	15
Grade 4	12
Grade 5	15
Grade 6	16
Grade 7	19
Grade 8	10

Fifty students are attending area high schools: 3 at Sunapee, 3 at Claremont, and 44 at Newport.

## PERSONNEL

We were fortunate to retain the entire teaching staff this year. I cannot over-emphasize the educational value that comes from the stability of a good staff. I believe we are able to see the results already through a better continuity of teaching which invariably comes from an experienced staff.

At a time when the salaries of teachers are rising rapidly, due to the critical short supply, may I urge you to go as far as you can financially to keep your present staff. The additional amount of money that it would cost as compared to hiring beginning teachers — if available — is small indeed for the better teaching service your children will receive.

## IMPROVEMENTS

The outside of the building was painted. An outside light has been installed. The septic field was extended.

New items of equipment include a new floor machine and a new food mixer for the Hot Lunch Program. Both are being put to good use.

## HIGH SCHOOL TRANSPORTATION

An Article is included in the Warrant to consider providing transportation for high school students. Please give this matter your ser-

ious consideration for some of the present transportation practices should not be continued. Today, a high school education is a necessity — not a luxury. Transportation to and from high school should not be a hardship on a student or his parents. I firmly believe transportation should be provided at District expense.

#### A R E A   S T U D Y

The School Board has indicated an interest in studying an A R E A school concept with Newport at the high school level. The statutes on A R E A schools have been changed considerably since an earlier study.

Tuition figures for the last three school years show that most of the students attended high school at Newport:

# GOSHEN-LEMPSTER SCHOOL PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

1967-68

In March the Players of Manchester, N. H., presented the play, "The Devil and Daniel Webster" to the entire school. This was the first live drama that many of the pupils had seen, and all were most enthusiastic — even the children at the primary level.

The 1967 eighth grade graduation exercises were held in the school multi-purpose room. Mr. Herbert O. Williams, Guidance Director at Newport High School, was the speaker. Diplomas were presented by Mrs. Nethersole, Chairman of the School Board, music was under the direction of Mrs. Bruno. Refreshments were served by the Parents Club and Mr. and Mrs. Wilber Campbell donated flowers for the occasion.

We were fortunate to have all our teachers back this fall with Mrs. Starkey again at Grades 1 and 2, Miss Jan Bradeen at Grades 2 and 3, and Mrs. Morrissey at Grades 4 and 5. Miss Nancy Hamilton and Mrs. Cain continued at the 6th, 7th and 8th grades in departmentalized mathematics, English, science, and social studies. Both teachers had art classes at these levels each Friday.

The part-time reading program with Mrs. Elizabeth Barrett as teacher was continued this year, made possible through the acceptance of a cooperative project with Newport and Sunapee under Title I of E. S. E. A., approved by the School Board and administered by Mr. A. J. Soucy, Teacher Consultant and Title I Coordinator for the School Union.

Mrs. Bevilacqua has donated her services for two hours a week as a "teacher aide" and has been working with Mrs. Starkey and her first grade.

Distant parts of the world were made real to our pupils through the personal accounts and interesting slides made by the people who had been there. We heard three delegates of the International Farm Youth Exchange, an organization administered by the National 4-H Foundation. In New Hampshire a state I. F. Y. E. Committee supervises this work. Last May, Miss Peggie Cope of Ossipee told of her experiences in Australia; in December, Pauline Allen of Hollis told us about Switzerland, and in January, Marlene Scammon of Stratham gave us an account of her stay in the United Kingdom. Later in December, Miss DeCourcy of Newport showed slides and told us about her work as a member of the Peace Corps in Malaysia.

In April, a Safety Program was presented by Cowboy Dave Winchell and Mr. T. O. Parker, representing the Child Safety Council, a service

provided through funds contributed by area professional and business people.

Mrs. Buck, our School Nurse, arranged a tuberculin test for pupils at the school. This fall from October to December, she arranged immunization clinics for pre-school children and for pupils who needed inoculations or booster shots. She has also been busy checking eyes.

The Parents Club sponsored a Dental Health Clinic again this year with Mrs. Wright as chairman and Mrs. Starkey as teacher-coordinator and Dr. Houlihan of Claremont as dentist.

Mr. Charles Newton, our new custodian this year, is doing a fine job in maintaining a warm, clean, and attractive school. Mrs. Francese Newton administers our School Lunch Program of delicious noon meals.

The 1967 Christmas Program consisted of a puppet show put on by the 6th, 7th and 8th grades and showed Christmas customs among Christian people around the world. The backgrounds and puppets were made in art classes conducted by Miss Hamilton and Mrs. Cain, inspired by the extension course in art taken this year.

In spite of the difficult driving this year, Mr. and Mrs. Wilber Campbell are doing an excellent job of getting our children to and from school safely.

The staff wishes to express appreciation to the members of the School Board, Mr. Gordon B. Flint, Mr. A. J. Soucy, Mrs. June Buck, the Parents Club, parents who transported pupils to the Dental Clinic, and all others for their interest and efforts on behalf of our school.
