To the inhabitants of the Town of Langdon in the County of Sullivan in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Langdon on Tuesday the fourteenth day of March, next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

ARTICLE I. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

ART. II. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

ART. III. To see what sum of money the Town will raise for the support of Highways and Bridges and make appropriation for same.

ART. IV. To see if the Town will raise \$343.50 for State Aid Construction on the Drewsville Road and make appropriation for same.

ART. V. To see what discount the Town will allow on taxes paid on or before a certain date.

ART. VI. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate \$30.00 for the celebration of Memorial Day.

ART. VII. To see if the Town will accept the following funds in trust for the upkeep of Cemetery Lots:

From	Melbern Knight Estate	\$200.00

ART. VIII. To see if the Town will raise the sum of \$200.00 to purchase the remaining volumes of the Town History from Frank Kingsbury and make appropriation for same.

ART. IX. To see what sum of money the Town will raise for fire protection and make appropriation for same.

ART. X. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

ART. XI. To transact any other business that may come before said meeting.

ART. XII. To allow accounts.

REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the Langdon School Board:---

I am able to make this, my ninth annual report as your superintendent of schools a cheerful one.

The new Langdon school building is an accomplishment. The grounds need more work, but the building is complete with two excellent class-rooms, running water, electric lights, a very modern and efficient heating system, a roomy cellar, superior sanitary conditions, and sufficient grounds to develop for beauty and usefulness.

Due to the generosity of Mrs. Sarah A. Porter and the cooperation of an efficient building committee, the cost to the Langdon School District is rather small considering the quality of the building. The only regret that I have heard, and I have heard that often, is that Mrs. Porter did not live to see the building finished.

I desire now to mention my appreciation that Mr. George L. Porter sold the district at a moderate price a valuable location, and that Mr. Sidney H. Batchelder presented the district with a new electric pump to enable the schools to have running water from the artesian well.

Last spring Miss Lewis and Miss Crosbie were elected to positions in other districts. The Langdon School Board hired Miss Ruth Lane as principal and teacher of the lower grades, and Miss Edith Noble to teach the upper grades. Both are graduates of Keene Normal School, and both have had successful experience in rural school work. The discipline has been excellent, the teaching of a superior quality, progress of the pupils very good, but attendance in the upper grades not as good as it should be.

With modern books, the best of supplies, good warm rooms, excellent teachers, I see no reason why the children of Langdon should not be very regular in attendance and be as contented as any children on earth.

I am very, very happy about the Langdon school situation, and I wish to thank the Building Committee, the Langdon School Board, the teachers, and every citizen who has helped in the bringing of this about.

It would be a great help to Langdon if the costs of high school education could be equalized by a plan similar to that by which the costs of elementary education are now equalized in this state.
