To the Inhabitants of the Town of Lempster, in the County of Sullivan in said State, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Union Hall, in said Lempster on Tuesday, the tenth day of March, at ten of the clock, in the forenoon, to open the polls for voting for candidates and at one o'clock in the afternoon to open discussion of articles of Warrant.

Article 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing and to vote on the following question: "Shall the provisions of Chapter 171A of the Revised Laws relative to playing games of Beano be adopted in the Town?"

Article 2. To receive all reports and act thereon.

Article 3. To see what sums of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the following purposes for the ensuing year:

Article 4. To see if the Town will vote to allow the Selectmen to deliver blank inventories at the time they appraise property for taxation.

Article 5. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money for the Town in anticipation of taxes.

Article 6. To see if the Town will vote to receive sealed bids for mowing roadsides; a seperate bid to be sent for each district.

Article 7. To see if the Town will vote to purchase Grader for \$2,500.00; the sum of \$700.00 paid as rent to be applied to purchase price; the balance of \$1,800.00, and take any necessary action thereto.

Article 8. To see what sum per hour the Town will vote to pay the following: the Road Agent, Laborers and hired equipment.

Article 9. To see what action the Town will vote to continue the Town Forest Committee and take any necessary action thereto.

Article 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$706.74 for T. R. A.; the State will contribute \$4,711.60.

Article 11. To see if the Town will vote where the T. R. A. money should be spent.

Article 12. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$5,000.00 for State Aid Construction; the State will raise \$51,000.00, and take any other necessary action thereto.

Article 13. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$1,000.00 for State Aid Construction. The State will contribute \$10,000.00.

Article 14. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to keep the Information Booth open from June 22 to Sept. 7 and pass any yote in relation thereto.

Article 15. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to insure the dwellings acquired by Tax Collector's Deeds and make any necessary repairs thereto.

Article 16. To see if the Town will vote a sum of money to continue and increase the Town History Fund established in 1955.

Article 17. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the Fire Company. (\$800.00)

Article 18. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to purchase Liability Insurance for the Town and raise \$290.00 to cover expense thereof.

Article 19. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$350.00 for the Town's share of Social Security for its employees.

Article 20. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$32.00 for the Dartmouth-Lake Snnapee Regional Association.

Article 21. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$300.00 for White Pine Blister Rust.

Article 22. To see if the Town will vote to finish painting the Town Hall and make appropriation to cover the expense of same. Article 23. To see if the Town will vote to accept in trust the sum of \$50.00, to be known as the George Leslie Trust Fund.

YOU CAN HELP PREVENT FOREST FIRES

Twenty-five percent of all forest fires in New Hampshire are caused from careless debris burning—brush, paper, leaves, grass, etc. Most of them are started without the required permit from the local forest fire warden. The cost of extinguishing these fires annually runs into large sums of money.

According to law, responsibe parties must pay the cost of putting them out. In addition, violators may be subject to court prosecution with fines running as high as (\$200) two-hundred dollars.

In the interest of fire prevention why not eliminate burning at home? Use your town dump. It has been set up for your personal convenience. It provides a suitable place for the disposal of dangerous inflammable waste material and other useless items which accumulate around the home and local stores; brush, etc., cut on your property. Eliminate the hazard of burning yourself. It will be easier for you—personally and financially.

If, however, you do burn on your premises:

- 1. Secure a permit from your local forest fire warden—the law requires it.
- 2. Be sure to properly supervise your burning. Don't leave it.
- 3. Make certain your fire is DEAD OUT before leaving it.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the School Board and Citizens of the Goshen-Lempster Cooperative School District, I herewith submit my second annual report as Superintendent of Schools.

One new teacher was hired this year to complete the faculty of the cooperative school, Mr. Roy Balla was appointed Principal and teacher in the seventh and eighth grade room. In addition to his teaching assignment, Mr. Balla is in charge of school organization and administrative procedures. Our former Principal, Mr. Robert Jewell, resigned in June to accept a teaching position in New York State.

Mrs. Newman, Mrs. Starkey, and Mrs. Wirkkala have continued as regular classroom teachers in the new school. The towns of Goshen and Lempster should feel fortunate in having such fine, experienced teachers available in this area. I am sure our citizens are proud of the excellent school facilities provided by the Cooperative District. We are pleased with the fine work of Mr. Balla in carrying out his new assignment as head of the school during this first year.

Mrs. Rae Hodgman returned to take charge of the cafeteria. She has been assisted by Mrs. Irene Masury. The school cafeteria program has been well administered and very fine lunches have been served to all children who wished to take advantage of this service.

In July Mr. Harry Barnes was appointed janitor for the current year. The building was throughly cleaned during the summer, and at the opening of school everything was in readiness for the children and teachers. Three rooms were redecorated throughout.

The installation of black hot top on the driveways, walks, and parking area have improved the appearance of the school immeasurably. This has helped considerably to preserve the floor in the new building and make the work of the janitor much easier. Mr. Barnes has proven to be an exceptionally fine man at his job, and he has taken a genuine interest in the welfare of the school.

It is expected that we will have an entering class of seventeen pupils in the first grade next fall. Fifteen 8th graders will be graduated. This will mean a probable enrollment of 120 pupils at the opening of school in September 1959.

My experiences with the Cooperative School Board have been most pleasant. I have enjoyed working with the members. They have given unstintingly of their time and shown a genuine interest in the teachers, children, and management of the school.

We have lost several days due to weather conditions. However, since our calendar provides for 185 school days, it will not be necessary to make up this deviation in the school routine. Only 180 days minimum is required by law.

I wish to thank the teachers and citizens for their fine cooperation and support throughout the year. We shall continue to make every effort to provide a school program of which you may be proud.

PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

The school year 1958-59 has been a full and rapid one for us at the Goshen-Lempster Cooperative School. The present enrollment of 122 has given only minor problems as we adjust to a capacity program.

Mrs. Doris Newman is teaching grades one and two. Mrs. Myrtie Starkey is teaching grades two and three. Mrs. Frances Wirkkala is teaching grades four, five and six. Mr. Balla, Principal, is teaching grades six, seven and eight. The split in grades two and six is necessary due to the large classes and is responsible for the different reports sometimes returned home as far as class activities are concerned.

The new program of simplified art as applied in the upper grades has achieved its goal of making all connected with it look under the surface to see the real values of life. This program combined with the music program enables us to offer the students a better, more rounded education.

The hot lunch program has been very successful, serving over ninety each day. I would like to extend sincere appreciation from myself and the others here at school to Mrs. Rae Hodgman and Mrs. Irene Masury, the cooks, for the many fine meals they have served.

The bus crisis presented some problems early in the year, but through the efforts of parents and the bus drivers this has been overcome. The change over to the new schedule has been initiated with a minimum of hardship.

In conclusion, I would like to extend my sincere gratitude to the other teachers who join with me in further extending this feeling to the School Board, Mr. Stickney, the Parents Club, and all who have helped to make this a most successful school year.

SCHOOL NURSE'S REPORT

During the past year Immunization Clinics were made available to all school children as well as the pre-school children. Salk Vaccine, Triple Toxoid (a combination of Diphtheria, Tetanus and Whooping Cough) and Small Pox Vaccinations were given. Attendance at these clinics could be better. We still have a number of children who have not had Salk Vaccine despite the large number of Salk Vaccine Clinics we have had. I do hope that our spring clinics will take care of this.

The Tuberculin Patch Testing program was carried out with the children in the odd numbered grades and newcomers who had not previously had the test. This test is given to determine whether or not a child has ever had a contact with Tuberculosis. If the test reaction is positive, then the child has a chest X-ray through the New Hampshire Tuberculosis Association Chest Clinics.

Hearing and vision testing was done in all grades. The hearing defects were very few and all of those children with a hearing problem were seen by their family physician. The number of corrections of vision problems was excellent. Where a family was unable to assume the expense of eye care and glasses the local service clubs and the State Welfare Department assisted.

Examination with the Wood's Light for the detection of Scalp Ringworm was done in the elementary grades. There were no suspicious cases found. Scalp Ringworm still seems to be a public health menace in this state, as well as in the neighboring states.

The children were weighed and measured, and a general inspection was carried out by the school nurse. By far the outstanding problem was the need for dental care. Outside of the State Matching Fund there is very little assistance available for dental care.

All of the above mentioned programs are carried out yearly. These programs serve a dual purpose. First and very important, is the finding of defects and the correction of them. Second and equally as important, it is a teaching program from the standpoint of the child. We strive to help the child realize the importance of good health, as well as teach him to assume the responsibility of maintaining good health and well-being.

Success in carrying out the school health program is dependent

on many people. I would like to express my appreciation to you who have helped so much—the parents, the medical advisors, the School Board, the Superintendent, the Principals, the teachers and the custodians. Thank you.

You are hereby notified to meet at the Goshen-Lempster Cooperatice School, Lempster, on the twenty-first day of March, 1959, at two o'clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose a Moderator for the ensuing year.

2. To choose a Member of the School Board for the ensuing five years.

3. To choose Agents, Auditors and Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.

4. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees, or officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.

5. To determine and appoint the salaries of the School Board and fix the compensation of any other officers or agent of the district.

6. To see if the school district will vote to adopt a plan for extending to employees of the school district the benefits of title II of the Federal Social Security Act (Old Age and Survivors Insurance) as authorized by Chapter 101 of the Revised Statutes Annotated Amended by Chapter 301 and 332 of the Laws of 1955 and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$45.00 to defray the school district's share of the cost thereof.

7. To see if the school district wishes to exclude from the plan services in any class or classes of positions filled by popular election.

8. To see if the school district wishes to exlude from the plan services in any class or classes of positions the compensation for which is on a fee basis.

9. If a plan for Social Security coverage is adopted, to see if the school district will authorize the School Board to execute on behalf of the school district the necessary agreements with the State of New Hampshire to carry into effect the plan to see if the school district will designate the Chairman of the School Board as the officer to be responsible for the administration of the plan. 10. To see what sum of money the district will raise and appropriate for the suppert of schools, for the salaries of school district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from the state equalization and building funds, together with other income; the School Board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.

11. To see if the district will authorize the School Board to appropriate receipts from federal lunch reimbursements, tuition, gifts and other receipts from miscellaneous sources, in addition to the original appropriation for 1959-60, for the lunch program, general expenses, equipment and improvements.

12. To see if the district will authorize the School Board to make application for and to receive, in the name of the district, such advances, grants-in-aid or other funds for educational purposes as may now or hereafter be forthcoming from the U. S. Government and/or state agencies.

13. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.
