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

Town Warrant

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE Rockingham, ss.

To the Inhabitants of the Town of New Castle, in said County of Rockingham, in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall, in said New Castle, on Tuesday, the eighth day of March, next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To hear the reports of agents, officers and others heretofore chosen and to pass any vote in relation thereto.
- 2. To choose all necessary town officers for the year ensuing.
- 3. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and to make appropriation for the same.
- 4. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to incur temporary loans in anticipation of taxes upon the credit of the town.
- 5. To see if the town will vote to allow a discount upon taxes paid within a reasonable time and to fix the amount of such discount and the date or dates when the same shall be allowed.
- 6. To see if the town will vote to examine into the matter of the salaries of town officers, including the town clerk, selectmen, treasurer, collector of taxes, auditor, chief of police and chief of the fire department and any others, and pass any vote relating to same.
- 7. To see if the town will vote to participate in the publicity, planning and advertising activities of the New Hampshire Seacoast Regional Development Association and to appropriate the sum of \$90.00 therefor.

- 8. To see if the town will vote to place an additional street light on Portsmouth Avenue between the lights now located near the Boylston property and the Pridham property.
- 9. To see if the town will vote to sell or otherwise dispose of the narrow strip of land, now known as the Town Landing, at the river end of Wentworth Avenue, bounded on the South by Fort Constitution, to John C. Sweetser, and grant the proper authority therefor to the selectmen.
- 10. To see if the town will vote to regulate the taking of clams and clam worms within its limits, and make reasonable rules and regulations restricting the taking of same and relating to the sale and consumption thereof, and establish such reasonable fees for the taking and sale thereof, and adopt any other regulations deemed necessary for the protection, propagation and conservation of clams and clam worms within the limits of the town.
- 11. To see if the town will vote to lease for 25 years to John C. Sweetser the strip of beach and flats between high and low water marks and lying between the Wentworth Bridge and the eastern breakwater at the entrance of Little Harbor for the purpose of experimenting in clam culture and clam farming, and grant proper authority therefor to the selectmen.
- 12. To see if the town will vote to observe, during the month of August, 1949, the 50th Anniversary of Old Home Week, and raise and appropriate a sum of money therefor.
- 13. To see if the town will vote to restrict the use of the auditorium in the Town Hall for the playing of basketball and other similar sports which have a tendency to injure and deface the decoration thereof.
- 14. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to lease or rent the auditorium in the Town

Hall during the summer months for the purpose of conducting a summer theatre there.

- 15. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of \$1,000.00 for the payment of pensions to former school teachers for the year 1949, and to make appropriations therefor.
- 16. To see if the town will vote to hire one full time employee for the purpose of taking care of the town property, acting as janitor of town buildings and doing such things as may be assigned to him by the selectmen, and to raise and appropriate the necessary sums of money therefor.
- 17. To see if the town will vote to request the services of the State Tax Commission in assisting the selectmen in appraising the taxable property in the town in order to insure uniformity and equality of valuations, and to raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary to defray the cost thereof.
- 18. To see if the town will vote to petition the State Tax Commission to have an audit made of the books and accounts of the town officers, and to raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary to defray the costs thereof.
- 19. To transact any other business that may lawfully come before said meeting.

Report of Superintendent of Schools

To the School Board of New Castle:

I herewith present to you my nineteenth report as Superintendent of your schools. Included will be the statistical report for the school year 1947-48, and the pupil enrollment in our local schools as well as a list of the pupils attending the Portsmouth schools during the current year. The report of the school nurse will also appear.

The present year began Wednesday, September 8, 1948, with an enrollment of forty-three pupils, twenty-eight in the primary room and fifteen in the upper rooms. This compares with an enrollment of thirty-six last year. The earlier opening of the school year was made necessary by the ruling of the State Board of Education that the calendar must consist of 180 days spent in actual school service.

It is a pleasure to report that New Castle now employs a teacher of Art. Mrs. Doris Parker explained her plans and objectives to the Parent-Teacher group at a regular meeting of the association. She was cordially welcomed. Mrs. Parker works understandingly with children. The pupils like to have her come and are receiving results in increased ability to reproduce the pictures they themselves have in their minds. Art, as taught in the modern way, moves from within the pupil's mind to outside activity. This is exactly the opposite direction that was taken in former years. It is a development of the pupil and not something superimposed from without. The fact that Mrs. Parker teaches music also leads to an interesting unity of purpose in these subjects.

Reports coming to us from Portsmouth schools

show our graduates doing fine work. In fact, some of the teachers have volunteered commendation for the preparation the New Castle schools offer. This result is, of course, due to our teachers, Mrs. Woodeson and Mrs. Thompson. Their pupils do consistently good work. Their standards of scholarship are high.

Mrs. Lindsey, our school nurse, is ever watchful of the welfare of our pupils. In addition to regular inspections, she assists during the medical inspections and supervises clinics as needed. The patch test for tuberculosis tendencies was conducted this year. It is planned to repeat this every few years.

The legislature of two years ago appropriated two million dollars for educational aid to the local districts. New Castle received \$920.64 of this fund. This was wholly "General Aid"—that is, money based upon pupil membership. If, as is now proposed, all aid shall be given on an equalization basis, New Castle's share is uncertain. The budget should be considered in view of this condition.

The schools of Union 21 combined with those of the Exeter Union to hold a workshop for the teachers from November 15 to November 19, 1948. These five days were spent for "in-service training" for all the teachers. The state supervisors were in charge and brought to us the latest and most approved methods of presenting subject matter. The first two days were under the direction of Dr. Gertrude Lewis, director of Elementary School Services for the New Hampshire Board of Education. She discussed the Social Studies of the elementary school, outlining the entire program and helping to solve many of the problems found by teachers in their daily work. It was literally a work shop in which teacher committees worked on definite problems and arrived at their own conclusions based upon modern practices. The last three days of the

week were in charge of Dr. Lura Bruce, State Supervisor of Health, and Miss Grace E. Felker, director of Physical Education. The health program for the schools was discussed and ways of guarding the health of the children were considered. The proper use of the playground and of the school rooms for physical education was explained and illustrated. These workshops were held in a majority of districts and those who did not receive the services will be offered them next year.

The small towns are constantly allowing some of the talent developed locally to move to the larger cities despite the fact that the small town offers many opportunities for young people. It would seem that the pupils in our schools should know what the local community has to offer them. The schools, even in the lower grades, should develop a greater interest by school children in their own town. To this end it is suggested that definite time be allotted in the school program for the study of local history—the story of its founding, landmarks, folklore and special events of in-Also included in the work should be the story of how our people now make a living together with the advantages of working in the town. The question, as to what the town now does to benefit its citizens, would prove of value in stimulating future participation in government officers. The development of an interested and active citizenry will surely react to the benefit of any town or city.

Since such a program is not now available in suitable form for children, the information must be brought together and evaluated before presented as school work. Would it not be possible for a group of interested citizens to work with the teachers in formulating an outline as guide for this study? Any citizen who is willing to help should contact the teachers in order that a committee may be formed.

The New Castle Parent-Teacher Association is actively interested in the school. Its meetings are held regularly and the subjects discussed are pertinent. Membership in all PTA's is open to any person interested in the school or its pupils.

I wish to thank the School Board for their cooperation during the past year. Their understanding of the problems of modern education has been most helpful.
