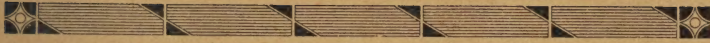

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of New Hampton, in the County of Belknap, in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House in said New Hampton on Tuesday, the eighth (8) day of March next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriation of the same.
3. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise, for the repair of highways and bridges and make appropriation of the same.
4. To see what action the town will take as to repairing or rebuilding of bridge, near John Thompson's residence and raise and appropriate money for the same.
5. To see if the town will vote to accept State aid for the maintenance of highways and raise and appropriate money for the same.
6. To see if the town will vote to accept State aid for the construction of highways and raise and appropriate money for the same.
7. To see how much money the town will vote to raise for the payment of long term notes and make appropriation of the same.

8. To see how much money the town will vote to raise for Memorial Day and the decoration of soldiers' graves and make appropriation of the same.

9. To see how much money the town will vote to raise for Old Home Day and make appropriation of the same.

10. To see if the town will vote to raise \$400.00 for the control of Blister rust and make appropriation of the same.

11. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and contribute to the support of the Laconia Hospital and make appropriation of the same.

12. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to hire money in anticipation of taxes.

13. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board:

I have the honor to present my third annual school report.

Items Previously Reported

Again I wish to call your attention to a few items which have been previously reported. The fact that we have kept them in mind so long shows both our interest, and their importance to the welfare of the schools.

1. Provision should be made for better playgrounds in all the schools.

2. The school yards should be improved in appearance. It should also be made possible for motor vehicles to enter and leave the grounds, especially during the winter months.

3. Three of the schools still have old type furniture, which cannot be adjusted to the size of the pupils.

4. The toilets in all the schools are not as sanitary as they should be. The installation of chemical toilets should be seriously considered.

5. No provision has been made for more accessible water supply for the various schools.

6. The schools are still without suitable shelves for the children's dinner pails.

The Sanborn School

The problem of congestion in the Sanborn school has been solved by the removal of a partition, which added hall space to the school room. The change now gives us sufficient seating capacity to take care of pupil growth for a number of years.

Children's Health

This year we have had considerable difficulty in our schools with skin diseases. On general principle the use of plenty of soap and water at home eliminates such difficulties. Another item which eliminates trouble is the intelligent cooperation of parents when their attention has been called to the fact that their children are infected with a disease whether contagious or not. Careless families make it hard for families which do care for their children.

I saw a boy with a dirty face in one of the schools. I asked the teacher why she did not make the boy wash himself. She replied that she did not have any water available for that purpose. She then informed me that that day she had already sent twice to a neighbor's house for water. Children are even compelled to eat their noon lunches with dirty hands. We cannot teach proper health habits without water.

It would be a great blessing for New Hampton as it is for other communities to have a school nurse the year round. The school board and the superintendent are considering plans to make it possible for New Hampton to join with a group of towns and share the expense of hiring a school nurse. This may mean greater expense. It would also mean better health, less absence from school, success in making the grade at the end of the year, and more happiness for the community in general.

One yearly medical inspection just to tell the child what ails him does not improve his health. A school nurse will not put doctors out of work. On the contrary she will create a greater demand for their services.

We Have Practiced Economy

Economy has been practiced during the past year. Without curtailing on the amount of fuel we have been able to secure wood at less cost than ordinary. The same may be said in regard to transportation. Strict economy has been practiced both in the purchase and use of school supplies. We have had trained and experienced teachers at reasonable salaries.

Music in Our Schools

The New Hampton Library Association deserves the gratitude of the school district for having financially assisted in employing a music supervisor. The work done has been of a substantial and worthwhile character. The music period is looked forward to with great pleasure both by teachers and scholars. Music is of practical and cultural value. It is an art worth cultivating in our children, especially during this machine age. This work should be continued by all means.

In Conclusion

I have kept in contact with the boys and girls, the school board, the teachers, and in a general way with the public. I have contributed my share to the functioning of education in the community. With the continued interest and desire to grow on the part of the community as a whole, our desire for a continuous improvement of the New Hampton schools will be realized.
