WARRANT FOR TOWN MEETINGSTATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Rollinsford in the County of Strafford, in said State, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall in said Town, on Tuesday, the eleventh day of March next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- ART. 1. To bring in your ballots for Town Clerk, Town Treasurer, One Selectman and Overseer of the Poor for a term of three years, one Road Agent and Chief of the Fire Department.
- ART. 2. To choose all other necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.
- ART. 3. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations for the same.
- ART. 4. To see if the Town will vote to allow a discount of 2% on all taxes of the 1952 levy, except poll taxes, paid on or before September 1st. next.
- ART. 5. To see if the voters of the Town of Rollinsford will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of the collection of taxes.
- ART. 6. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate that has been or may be acquired through Tax Collector's Deeds.
- ART. 7. To see if the Town will vote to establish a Planning Board of five members with duties as

set forth in Chapter 53, Revised Laws of New Hampshire 1942 as amended to make a study of the Town's development and report to the Town appropriate recommendations for the promotion and Maintenance of the Town's best development. The Board Members shall consist of one Selectman and four other citizens appointed by the Selectmen as provided in Chapter 53 Revised Laws of the New Hampshire 1942 as amended.

ART. 8. To see if the Town will vote to accept the Road known as Pine Crest Lane off the Dover-Somersworth Road provided: the roadway is in satisfactory condition for oiling and that the boundaries are satisfactory to the Selectmen.

Appropriations will begin at eleven (11) o'clock sharp.

REPORT of SUPERINTENDENT of SCHOOLS

To the School Board and Citizens of Rollinsford:

This is my second report as your superintendent and it again is a pleasure to say that very few problems have taxed the administration of your schools.

The present staff of teachers under the leadership of Mr. Lewis Hatfield continues to give unselfishly of their time for the betterment of Rollinsford youth. They are to be thanked and commended for the fine job they are doing. Very few towns have kept a veteran teachers staff more than a couple of years.

Federal aid under P.L. 874 continues to be a help to the town in increasing income which offsets increased expenditures. The assessment for the next school year will remain approximately the same as 1951-52. This money comes as a grant (about \$100. per child) from the government due to parents working at the Portsmouth Naval Base and Newington Air Base. In January the school district received \$1,800. and we can expect a similar check before June of this year.

The school board has had the roof repaired completely, outside doors weatherstripped, the outside trim painted, and a new sump pump. There have also been some minor repairs in plumbing and electrical work. In the future several classroom ceilings and walls should be redecorated and the main corridor ceiling should receive some treatment.

Mrs. Bureau is still providing excellent hot lunches for the bus pupils. If facilities could be improved by the addition of a new sink all pupils should be able to have the advantage of this service. Rollinsford is one of the few towns in the state not providing meals to *all* students. This program is subsidized by the government by allowing 4 cts. for each meal served and also by allotments of such foods as prunes, orange juice, peanut butter, cherries,

apples, cheese, dried milk, dried eggs, apple sauce, shoulders, turkeys, etc.

Up until this year the teachers have been using several reading systems instead of a basic system with one philosophy. In September the first grade inaugurated the Scott-Foresman system which will be added grade by grade until complete. This system is used in 80% of schools in New Hampshire. Transfers find this an advantage.

In addition to this report there will be a summary of statistics, report of the principal, nurse and music teacher.

If the schools are to be "the people's schools" in the truest sense, it is essential that the people share in the basic decisions which affect them. Your constructive criticism is welcome at all times and I pledge myself to do the utmost in cooperation.

In closing I wish to thank the school board, teachers and citizens of Rollinsford who have helped to make the past year so pleasant.

REPORT OF SCHOOL PRINCIPAL

Rollinsford Grade School
January 22, 1952

*To: The Superintendent of Schools,
The Rollinsford School Board
The Citizens of the Town of Rollinsford, N. H.*

Again for the third consecutive year it is my pleasure to submit a report of the activities of the Rollinsford Grade School. The period covered by this report begins January 1, 1951 and extends through the date January 1, 1952.

Since education cannot proceed intelligently in any school system unless its purposes and objectives have been clearly defined, and since we are living in a constantly changing society, it becomes necessary for us, as teachers and administrators, to reconsider and reformulate our educational objectives and philosophies. Therefore we believe that the growth and development of our pupils means the attainment of knowledge, skills, appreciation, habits, and attitudes which help to make these pupils good citizens in a changing world. We recognize that certain basic knowledges and skills are important because they are the tools with which these students must work and that these skills must be emphasized. We also attempt to indoctrinate these pupils with the belief that citizenship, character, attitudes toward school, and one another are important as they affect all human behavior. Tolerance of one another, honesty and fair play are stressed. We believe that it is our task as teachers to provide meaningful experiences that will develop the above characteristics so necessary for the development of "The Whole Child."

We are continuing to strive for greater and greater scholastic achievement on the part of each pupil by stimulating him by employing any combination, and single area or all of the combinations of the following:

- (a.) Setting high standards of scholastic ideals
- (b.) Various contests employing group rivalry
- (c.) Noting failures, diagnosing them, and applying remedial treatment.
- (d.) Offering recognition for greatest progress.
- (e.) Stimulating the ideal of surpassing one's own best record.
- (f.) Exhibitions of the best efforts of individual pupils.

We still continue to maintain as our two main objectives of instruction the following:

- (1.) To get to know thoroughly each individual pupil as a total functioning person—his aptitudes, capabilities, interest, ambitions, school needs, psychological dynamics, and such other information and data about each that can be acquired and used for his advantage.
- (2.) To help each pupil understand himself thoroughly so that his plans and choices will include his new definitions of himself as a total person with specific aptitudes, interests, limitations, and goals.

SCHOOL PERSONNEL

A word or two concerning the faculty and staff may not be amiss here. I have received excellent cooperation from the teachers, the pupils, and the staff at all times. The teaching staff is well-prepared and has been particularly enthusiastic in giving an endless number of extra hours to the pupils so that they might be successful in their plans and ventures. Successful students and activities do not just happen accidentally. There is always the guiding leadership of the teachers in the background. Through my experience with several communities and school systems, I can truthfully state that our teaching staff is of the highest

calibre and possesses a great deal of professional spirit. This may be evidenced by their 100% membership in the National Education Association and also 100% participation in the State and local associations.

ENROLLMENT

The School year 1951-1952 commenced on Tuesday, September 4, 1951 with four days of the first week being given over to an Institute for teachers that was held at the Somersworth High School. On the following Monday, September 10, 1951 classes for all pupils began. School opened with an enrollment of 139. As of January 21, 1952 we increased to 140. A complete enrollment chart follows this report.

INSTRUCTION

From the tours of inspection that I have made and from the classroom visitations that I have performed, I would say that the instructional level as observed is high and that attention is being paid and adherence given to the mandates of the State Board of Education in regard to curriculum and content of the individual courses.

It should be noted here that because of the crowded conditions existing in Grades 5 and 6, and an impossibility of regrouping, it has been necessary to combine Grades 7 and 8 for this year and next. Instruction in this combined group is being handled this year at the 8th grade level and will be handled next year at the 7th grade level. The 6th grade has been added to the departmentalized teaching arrangements so that the result is a relief in teaching load from Miss Burns. Mr. Steeves and Mr. Hatfield and also Miss Burns are carrying on the instruction in Grades 6-7-8.

Mr. John Whalen came to us this year as the Music Instructor. We have the use of his services each Friday of the week both morning and afternoon. During the morning

sessions Mr. Whalen spends his time in teaching group singing in the separate grades. His afternoon consists of giving individual music lessons on the various band instruments and in teaching rhythm to the various grades. We are very pleased to have him as a very welcome addition to the faculty.

An attempt was made to start a school band amongst the pupils of the school, but it was felt by the parents that instrument prices were somewhat high and that perhaps another year would be a better time for instrumental instruction.

There are two other fields of instruction that are being given some attention. They are:

(a.) *Practical Arts*

Under this title is grouped the instruction in home economics by Mrs. Martha Evans. Three periods a week on Tuesday afternoons are devoted to this study. Also under the heading of Practical Arts, mention should be made of the excellent manual training program carried out under the able instruction of Mr. Ralph Steeves. As with Home Economics, instruction is three periods a week with classes being held continuously on Tuesday afternoon.

(b.) The Second Field of Instruction is That of *Physical Education*

This field is capably handled by all the teachers in their own grades but special emphasis is put on group competition through instruction in (1) boys basketball which is ably coached by Ralph Steeves and (2) girls basketball which is coached by Mildred Burns. Both these teachers have given much of their time, energy without recompence and have developed some good material.

HOT LUNCH PROGRAM

This department is under the capable supervision of Mrs. Edward Bureau who serves as both dietician and cook. She is ably assisted in this work by Mr. Edward Bureau, the custodian of the school.

Approximately 60 meals a day are served, all of them being the type A or Hot Lunch milk variety.

It has been necessary to advance the prices of the lunch this year because of the reduced number of donations from the Federal Lunch Program, and because of the general increase in food prices in the open markets.

It is to be hoped that the prices will eventually be lowered.

SCHOOL HEALTH

During the past year a vaccination clinic was held and 25 children were vaccinated. The following is a brief summary of the nurse's findings as a result of physical examination of the children:

Dr. Murphy, of South Berwick, the School physician, completed physical examinations of the members of grades 4-5-6. There were 55 pupils examined in this group. Notices were sent to the parents informing them of any defects that were noted, and requesting that the defect be remedied. Most of the defects have been corrected.

There was also held during the past year a dental clinic. This clinic was under the supervision of the State Department of health, and under the Direct supervision of Mrs. Joan Biron, D.H. The results of the clinic are summarized below:
