The word library has two connotations, one, a place to store books, two, the books themselves. We have the place. The task for 1967 will be to fill the storage place with books for the town to use.

To this end the trustees will spend the balance of the Lancaster Fund contribution, plus the money appropriated for this purpose. This should give us a small well-rounded library collection. This not only involves the purchase of books but the considerable amount of labor necessary to get them ready to be put in circulation.

DEPARTMENT EXPANSION AND INCREASED PERSONNEL

I have requested the promotion of four (4) special officers to permanent status. This can be accomplished within the present appropriation, excepting the usual fringe benefits of the permanent employee.

Our present complement provided for three (3) patrol routes and a desk officer for each group; Eight (8) crossing guards, a parttime safety officer. Police woman and Police matron. Our new department clerk will take over the traffic reports and such additional clerical work as may be assigned.

We are now in a position to improve the efficiency of the department by assigning two (2) of our more experienced officers to specialized work.

Investigations, identification, photography, firearms instruction, etc. on a part-time basis.

The continuing expansion of the commercial area on Rt. 28, and our constantly increasing population will require additional patrols on Rt. 28 and the compact area. We are asking for four (4) additional officers, effective July 1st, 1967 to be assigned whenever needed, in the above areas.

EDUCATION AND TRAINING

We can anticipate from the present session of the Legislature, a New Hampshire Law Enforcement Officers training program. It will feature a basic training course for all future permanent officers and a program of the various specialties for the older and more experienced officers.

We will continue our in-force training program, featuring crowd control, and small arms instruction at the revolver range in the rear of the new Police Station on Veterans Parkway.

TRAFFIC CONTROL AND HIGHWAY SAFETY

We are maintaining a traffic incidence map, for the purpose of showing the location of every accident that has been reported to the department.

It should be of extreme value to the transport survey, which we are hopeful will be conducted during the coming year.

The project of widening North Broadway should be completed during the Summer and with a new traffic control system in the Depot area, the number of accidents occurring in this complex should be greatly reduced.

During the month of April, 1966 the New Hampshire Department of Public Works and Highways conducted a traffic analysis of the Main, School and Bridge Street intersection at Salem Center. The report is now available and will be considered as part of the 1967 transport Survey.

The department is now functioning at our new location on Veterans Parkway. We expect to have a formal dedication during the month of May.

In the meantime, we would welcome a visit from any interested resident of this community.

Dear Mr. Staples:

During the year 1966, the Salem Fire Department responded to 466 alarms, 194 still and 272 box alarms, a decrease of 189 alarms from the year previous. The ambulance answered 532 calls, an increase of 44 calls over 1965. The fire loss for the year was \$127,000.00 compared to a loss of \$263,905.81 for the year 1965. The fire at Bob's Radio & TV Service was responsible for approximately \$60,000.00 of our fire loss.

During the past year, the department moved into its new Central Fire Station. At the two "open houses", one for the townspeople and one for fire officials from neighboring communities, many favorable comments were received relative to the construction of the station. With the additional space, Engine IV, previously assigned to the North Salem Station during the winter because of lack of space at central, is now permanently assigned to the Central station. This piece of equipment, used at all grass and brush fires, will be held in reserve for special calls for aid at other major fires.

The department can report again this year that the three 750gallon pumpers are in excellent operating condition. New equipment added the past year included a new hose washer. Now hose can be properly washed and then hung to dry in either the hose tower or on the hose rack.

The major deficiencies reported in the 1965 Town Report still exist. They include the need for additional permanent firemen, a substation south of the Spicket River and the purchase of either an aerial ladder or a snorkel. The department extends a warm welcome to the citizens of Salem to visit our stations at any time, and again thanks you for your continued interest, support and cooperation.

Salem District Nursing Association

Since the beginning of the nursing services on June 1, 1965, over. 1,000 visits have been made by the visiting nurse. The Salem District Nursing Association was certified June 27, 1966 by the Social Security Administration to be a Home Health Agency under Medicare. A requirement of this certification by the Medicare Program was a cost analysis of the fee schedule. As a result of this analysis the fees were increased to a flat rate for all nursing visits. It is not allowable to have one fee for Medicare patients and another for non-Medicare patients. The nurse can still adjust the fee for any patient unable to pay the full rate. This is a confidential matter and is not made public.

According to the census of the town, it was estimated that the need for the nursing services of the visiting nurse would be greatly increased, especially after July 1st; but this has not proved to be a fact.

Many people are still not utilizing the service available to them. Patients may contact the nurse directly or have the family physician contact the nurse for necessary care or treatments. The nurse works Monday - Friday from 8 A. M. to 5 P. M. She can be contacted by telephone from 8 - 9 A. M. and 1 - 2 P. M. at 898-4737. During the time the nurse is working in the district, telephone messages are taken by the switchboard operator at the Municipal Building where the nurse has her office with the Town Clerk.

SALEM CONSERVATION

This is the second Annual Report of the Commission and we feel that we are making progress along several avenues of endeavor. The Commission was brought to full strength in April when the Selectmen reappointed Laurence Belair and appointed Donald Petzold, Gerard Bauters, Harriet Headley, and Everett Johnson. Mr. Belair subsequently resigned and was replaced by William Brown. We are charged with the responsibility of safeguarding, maintaining, and improving the community's natural resources and we intend to accomplish our objectives with the aid of all interested individuals and groups.

During the year trees were planted along Geremonty Drive, at the Water Treatment Station, Sewerage Treatment Plant, Municipal Office Building, and Fire Station. Additional plantings will be made along the Main Street sidewalk and at the Police Station in the spring.

Mrs. Headley attended the Natural Beauty and Enviromental Quality Workshop held at Plymouth State College on June 13, 14, and 15 and a meeting in Concord on October 6th sponsored by the New Hampshire Savings Bank at which James W. Rouse of Baltimore, Maryland was the main speaker. Mr. Rouse is the planner and developer of the entirely new city of Columbia City, Md.

Everett Johnson, James Falls, and Laurence Belair attended the August 18th meeting of the Salem Contractors Association to explain the need for a strong Soil Removal Ordinance. The proposed Ordinance was discussed in detail and the Association appointed a committee to review it further and recommend any changes to the Commission.

On September 18th the Commission sponsored a Conservation Seminar at the Soule School. The film "No Time for Ugliness" was shown followed by a panel discussion moderated by Roger Sloan of the UNH Extension Service. Other participants were Executive Director David L. Mann of the New Hampshire Municipal Association; Robert Norman of the Hanover Conservation Commission; and B. W. Bergstrom of the New England Electric System.

On November 22nd the Commission co-sponsored a meeting on conservation, civic beautification, and historical sites with the Rockingham County Rural Area Development Committee. Participating in the panel discussion were Roger Sloan; RAD State Coordinator Stanley Colby; Leslie Clark of the Society for the Protection of N. H. Forests; Malcolm Chase, Staff Project Engineer for the Dept. of Public Works and Highways; and Colby Moody, Vice Chairman of Rockingham County RAD Committee.

The Commission found that there is much field work to be done and in 1967 will solicit assistance from the Boy Scouts and others to clear 60 acres of town owned land south of the High School, pick up all debris along the Salem shore of Canobie Lake, and endeavor to improve the environment of Salem wherever we can.

During the year there were 232 water samples taken to the Water Pollution Committee Laboratories for analysis.

There were dispersed, 78 lbs. of rat poisoning throughout the Town; primarily the Town Waste Disposal Site, however, property owners were also furnished a small amount.

The new sewage disposal regulation adopted in September will be of great value in the prevention of further pollution of waterways by requiring a permit for all installation.

REPORT OF THE RECREATION COMMITTEE

The Recreational Committee has completed its second year of measured progress. A moderate expansion of recreational activity was initiated in 1966 along with strengthening those programs begun in 1965.

Budget requests for previous years were purposely held to a minimum to insure adequate but well formulated programs; each receiving the personal attention of the committee and each representing a step by step formula for building a fully coordinated and comprehensive recreational program.

The committee now feels that the recreational facilities and programs have reached the stage where a full time recreational director is required to coordinate, fully implement and expand recreational activities in Salem. This position is discussed later in the report, however, those areas that involved the committee in 1966 are categorized as follows:

SUMMER PROGRAM

The second summer program was started in July and was conducted for ten weeks. The average daily attendance was over one hundred and various programs, including tennis, intramural softball and arts programs were administered successfully by instructors. Fourteen instructors were employed; all residents of Salem, and the following school playground areas utilized: Woodbury, Foss, Soule, Fisk, Haigh and Palmer.

SKI PROGRAM

Skiing instructions were offered again at Spicket Hill under the supervision of Mr. Raymond Landry and Mrs. Nancy Stickney, a member of the recreational committee. Over 250 of Salem's young people signed up for instruction, but due to the lack of snow during the early winter the programs were greatly curtailed.

BASKETBALL PROGRAM

A Sunday evening basketball program was initiated under the leadership of Mr. Frank Kivell. Six teams were organized and play was scheduled for a six week season. Dues were provided by the players to compensate referees, score keepers and janitors. There are 85 Salem men involved and additional membership is invited. Women's basketball is also available on Wednesday evening and although there is a small number of participants, the game is enjoyed by all who play. Salem women are invited to participate in this program also.

SOFTBALL PROGRAM

A seven team softball league for Salem men was organized during the summer. Eighty players were involved in fast moving games that were enjoyed by all participants. Softballs and bats were provided by the recreational committee and the teams played in a field behind the Palmer School and the Woodbury High School diamond. The League will be continued next year with hopefully greater participation.

RECREATIONAL BUILDING

The old fire house located on the corner of Millville and Main Street, was given to the Recreational Committee as office space to hold meetings and to utilize as a recreational center within the limits of its accommodations. The building was renovated with the removal of an annex that caused a traffic hazard along with internal repairs, such as electrical work, painting and repairing.

DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMS

Linwood Avenue The Board of Adjustment granted an exception to the recreational committee to allow this area to be used to establish a ball park. Action in preparing the land for use was delayed until the final decision was rendered by the Board of Adjustment. During the fall, however, the area was partially cleared of brush and protective fencing was added along the banks of the Spicket River, for safety purposes.

<u>Millville - Lancaster</u> This area was started in 1965 with skating facilities that were used by capacity crowds. Last year the skating area was prepared for use again, but further development plans were curtailed until the Lancaster Memorial school was completed. The Recreational Committee decided that recreational plans for this area would be better determined after the School was established and the surrounding area identified.

PROJECTED PLANS

The Committee's plans for 1967 include further site develop-

ment work at Linwood Avenue and the Millville - Lancaster area..

Efforts to clean up the Spicket River, adjacent to the Linwood Avenue recreational area will be completed along with establishing a baseball diamond, seeding and the placing of picnic tables and benches.

The Millville - Lancaster area is slated for the construction of a fireplace facility for skaters, the addition of picnic tables and general beautification.

The Summer Program will be continued with the addition of a more comprehensive Arts and Crafts program. Further, plans are being detailed for full use of the Salem Recreational Building.

SPECIAL REPORT

The Recreational Committee was requested by the Board of Selectmen to investigate a site for town bathing and recreation facilities, and tossubmit a report with recommendations to the Board.

A proposal was submitted to the Selectmen in November with development costs and manpower requirements on a site which is presently being considered.

RECREATIONAL DIRECTOR

The need for a Recreational Director to guide recreational programs in Salem is considered an absolute necessity at this time by the Recreational Committee.

The Salem program now consists of 15 part time summer employees, site development specifications, dissemination and receipt of bids, establishing employment policy, and more important, determining the direction and goals of recreation in Salem.


With a \$10,000 budget and the responsibilities as described, the Recreational Committee is convinced that the need for a director has arrived.

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the School District in the Town of Salem, qualified to vote in District affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Salem High School in said District on the eighteenth day of March, 1967 at 1:00 o'clock in the afternoon to act upon the following subjects:

1. To hear the reports of Committees or Officers chosen and pass any vote relating thereto.

2. To see what sum of money the District will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the payment of salaries for school district officials and agents, and for the payment of the statutory obligations of the District.

3. To see if the District will authorize the School Board to make application for, to receive, and to spend in the name of the District, such advances, grants-in-aid or other funds for educational purposes as may now or hereafter be forthcoming from Federal, State, local or private agencies.

4. To see if the District will vote to apply unanticipated State Building Aid to cover a portion of the deficiency in the current budget, caused by the over-expenditure in the transportation account, said expenditure governed by contract obligations.

5. To see if the District will vote to complete the construction of the three elementary schools, and to authorize the School Board to issue bonds or notes in the amount not to exceed Two Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$200,000.00) for this project and to authorize the School Board to apply toward the cost of the project all funds available from local, State or Federal grants, aids or donations, as well as all interest accrued or earned.

6. To see if the District will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Four Thousand Dollars (\$4,000.00) to meet the first interest payment on the bond issue under Article 5.

7. To see if the District will vote to purchase and install bleachers for the new athletic field at the Salem High School, and to authorize the School Board to issue bonds or notes in the amount not to exceed Thirty Thousand Dollars (\$30,000.00) for this project and to authorize the School Board to apply toward the cost of the project all funds available from local, State or Federal grants, aids or donations, as well as all interest accrued or earned.

8. To see if the District will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Six Hundred Dollars (\$600.00) to meet the first interest payment on the bond issue under Article 7.

9. To see if the District will vote to construct and equip a building on school or town property in order to transfer School Union Offices to Salem and to authorize the School Board to issue bonds or notes in the amount not to exceed Seventy Thousand Dollars (\$70,000. 00) for this project and to authorize the School Board to apply toward the cost of the project all funds available from local, State or Federal grants, aids or donations, as well as all interest accrued or earned.

10. To see if the District will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of One Thousand Four Hundred Dollars (\$1,400.00) to meet the first interest payment on the bond issue under Article 9.

11. To see if the District will vote to accept the following minimum salary schedule for teachers and raise and appropriate the sum of One Hundred Fifty-One Thousand Four Hundred Twenty Dollars (\$151, 420.00) to place all teachers on schedule as of September, 1967:

Non-degree teachers presently on the staff are to remain Four Hundred Dollars (\$400.00) below schedule.

The credits earned beyond a Masters Degree must be taken at an accredited institution and in an approved course of study. A copy of the teacher's anticipated course of study must be approved by the Superintendent of Schools and filed prior to earning the credits. The teacher has the responsibility to file all necessary data with the Superintendent of Schools.

12. To see if the District will remove from the salary schedule all nurses who are not certified as nurse-teachers as adopted by the New Hampshire State Board of Education March 12, 1962.

13. To see if the District will vote to raise and appropriate Two Thousand Dollars (\$2,000.00) to purchase and install fences on school property bordering the property of Isabel Bushway on Main Street, Leon Playdon on Main Street and Frank Spurr on Clough's Crossing Road.

14. To see if the School District will vote to authorize the School Board to dispose of the No. 8 School building in whatever fashion is deemed best by the School Board and to see if the District will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed One Thousand Seven Hundred Dollars (\$1,700.00) for this purpose.

15. To see if the School District will vote to authorize the School Board to convey the Palmer School property in North Salem to the Town of Salem by quitclaim deed.

16. By Petition: To see if the School District will vote to name the school being built on Zion Hill Road the North Salem Elementary School.

17. By Petition: To see if the School District will vote to reduce the number of School Board members from six (6) to three (3).

18. To transact any further business that may legally come before the meeting.

REPORT OF THE SCHOOL BOARD CHAIRMAN

To the People of Salem:

This past year the Salem School Board has had many interesting and complex problems associated with the educational needs of the children. The three major areas which this report concerns itself with include: 1. New Construction, 2. Supervisory Union #55, 3. Current school policies.

1. New Construction: The completion of the new High School which began in 1964 has been a continuing project with the primary responsibility being the outside grading, landscaping and laying out of the athletic fields.

With the approval of the School District Meeting in 1966, the School Board proceeded with the planning and construction of three elementary schools for Salem. With economy in mind and with the requirements and recommendations of the State Department of Education as a guide, it was decided to have the three schools of similar construction. All three schools are two story buildings, with a central hall to be used as a cafeteria-assembly room and a future physical educational facility. The buildings are basically square in shape. One, located on Millville Street is to be of 18 classrooms and to be called the William Lancaster School. The other two buildings have 12 classrooms, one located on Zion's Hill Road and the William Barron School to be located on Butler Street. Both of these schools have the basic facilities so that they can be expanded to 18 classrooms without too much additional cost. With this type of constructional planning, the School Board saved money both in architectural fees as well as in the General Contractor's bid. It is anticipated, at this time by the General Contractor, that all buildings will be ready for occupancy by September, 1967. The 1967-68 School Board will have the task of completing these buildings as well as providing some type of building for the Superintendent's Office to be located in Salem.

2. Supervisory Union No. 55: A second matter of concern to the board was that of Supervisory Union No. 55. With the major effort to bring about a separation from Union No. 55, Salem has concentrated its efforts on having a bill filed in the legislature this year. If passed, it would bring about the separation in July of 1967. Because of the amount of money that Salem contributes to the Union, it is felt that Salem can operate a Superintendent's Office with the same amount of money.

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This past year we have hired a new Assistant Superintendent and next year will see the retirement of Mr. Wendell V. Davis and the appointment of a successor. This could be the most important Union decision to have been made in some time.

3. Current School Policies: Now, as in the past, there are no easy answers to the school problems. Probably the most pressing problem facing the Board this year has been the procurement of teachers. Because of the nationwide shortage of people in the educational field, Salem, along with many other communities has had to spend more time and effort recruiting the best available staff that our money allows. This has been a continuing process since late last spring to the present time. In order to update our salary structure, a committee was appointed to make recommendations for a new salary schedule for Salem. The study was to be a comparison of Salem and its neighboring communities in order to make the salaries and fringe benefits of the staff more competitive.

For the third year in a row, it has been necessary to rent classrooms in order to carry on normal school operations. For their participation this year on behalf of the School Board, I would like to thank St. Joseph's Parish and the Pleasant Street Church for the use of the buildings and cooperation with the school authorities.

Obviously, space does not permit details of all problems handled by the Board this past year such as transportation, maintenance and development of policies, but we would like to thank the people of Salem for their cooperation and support.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the School Board and Citizens of Salem:

I am presenting, herewith, my Eleventh Annual Report as Superintendent of Schools in Salem. Statistical information will be listed separately.

PERSONNEL

There were fifty-four teaching positions filled this year in Salem - some more than once. Twenty-two of these positions were in the High School - fourteen being replacements and eight being additions. There were five changes in the Junior High - four were replacements and one addition. There were twenty-two changes in the elementary schools: thirteen replacements and nine additions. There were five Special Service changes; four replacements in music, Special Education and Guidance and a Guidance Position was established in the Junior High.

This past year twenty-three of the teachers hired were beginners. We do hire a large number of beginners because we do not have enough experienced teachers applying. The large number of positions to be filled naturally has a bearing on this fact. This condition makes it imperative that we establish a competitive beginning salary.

A Salary Schedule will be presented to the people and it should be adopted. One needs only to read the papers to realize that our neighboring communities are doing better, so we can't afford not to adopt the schedule. We should be able to hold more teachers and attract more experienced teachers with this Schedule. Our neighbors, of course, can do the same thing. I believe that the beginning Salary should have been higher.

We will need to concentrate on a strong recruitment program. We have available an attractive brochure which is being distributed to all prospective teachers.

It is most essential that we consider also attractive fringe benefits. We have a large turnover of teachers and everything we can reasonably include in an overall package will help attract and hold our teachers.

It is my opinion that the School District should permit the School Board to change the Salary Schedule if they feel it necessary and

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not have to present it as a warrant article each time a change is requested. I know of no other School District that follows this practice. The Budget Committee still governs the amount of money placed in the budget and the School District controls the appropriation of money.

Recruitment of teachers starts in earnest early in January. You need to know at that time what salary you can offer prospective teachers. If you have to wait until after the March meeting for a firm figure, you are handicapped. This year, for example, we are unable to offer beginners better than \$5,000 until a new Schedule is adopted. You can lose excellent prospects under this present system.

HOUSING

Our enrollments continue to increase about 300 pupils per year. We will have ready, by September 1967, three new elementary schools. For the first time in several years there will be no need for rentals and all pupils will be housed in a total of eight modern public school buildings. We have appreciated the cooperation of the churches and others who have made facilities available to us.

For the first time ever in Salem each pupil will have the opportunity to participate in a School Lunch Program.

Enrollment projections indicate that additional housing will be needed by September, 1969. This means that new housing should be considered in March, 1968 in order to be ready for September 1969. The high school, at that time, will be unable to handle fully grade 9, and this class may have to be placed in the Woodbury School with grades 7 and 8. This will necessitate additional elementary schools in additions or both.

An article will be placed in the warrant to permit the housing of the Supervisory Union Office in Salem. Many people believe that the office of the Superintendent should be housed in the largest town and by so doing, Salem will receive better service. This housing will be needed whether Salem becomes a separate School District or continues to be part of Union No. 55. The present contract for housing the Union Office in Plaistow, New Hampshire expires this year, June 30, 1967.

BUDGET

The School Board has reduced the budget substantially. The equipment item was reduced drastically. One item in this area that

merits consideration and was cut, was graphic arts. It was hoped that this subject could be offered in the Industrial Arts area and give a fuller program to the non-college student. Offset Printing and other features of the course would be most attractive even to all levels of ability. The budget item was carried at \$22,000.

Thirty thousand dollars was cut out of the budget for bleachers for the new football field. This item has been placed in a special article for voter consideration.

The voters will need to vote additional money to complete the three elementary schools. The decision to proceed with the construction was approved when it was realized that there was enough money for the general contract and that the School Board and Budget Committee would request additional funds for the completion this March when the actual additional cost will be known.

The warrant article will ask for a bond issue to be paid over a period of years. The only effect on next year's tax rate will be one interest payment.

The School Board and Budget Committee have attempted to review the budget objectively with the thought in mind of keeping the tax increase within reason and at the same time not hurt the educational program.

FEDERAL AID

Salem has benefited from Title I and Title II of the Elementary and Secondary Act of 1965. Title I provided Remedial Reading teachers for the middle grades. Title II has provided for additional library books and audio-visual materials such as records, filmstrips and periodicals on microfilm. Title II B provided additional Basic Education for Adults. Salem received a Title III Planning Grant to study socialogical aspects of the Salem population to help build a more suitable curriculum for an ever-changing school population.

Census taking was given to the Title III personnel as a solution to a perplexing problem - one part of which was to find out the actual population of Salem. This experiment did not work out. We need 100% results not 90%, and because of the nature of the survey there were probably no better than 50% returns. We had no idea that we would get such results so we can only face facts and say it was a failure and as far as the School Census is concerned, I suggest we go back to the old system and select a team to contact every house. Salem continues to benefit from Title III of the National Defense Education Act. The Federal Government matches what we spend for various items in several areas of the curriculum as the need arises.

We had two classes for the pre-schoolers in the Headstart Program which was most popular. We plan to continue this program next summer.

I believe we should continue to accept Federal Aid and I believe that a continued effort should be made to reduce Federal controls to a minimum and that local and State authorities be given freedom to develop their own educational programs in light of their own specific needs.

IMPROVING EDUCATION IN NEW HAMPSHIRE

Education is becoming more costly and the local property tax payer is absorbing most of the cost. The 1966 Governor's Conference on Education recommends as its top priority that the New Hampshire legislature raise and appropriate sufficient State funds to implement, in full, all existing legislature for State Aid to Education. Foundation Aid is but one program within the budget submitted by the State Board of Education. If Foundation Aid was appropriated as requested it would mean \$337, 234, 33 for Salem for the year 1967-1968. This year we received no Foundation Aid.

The Conference further recommended that the State Board of Education develop standards leading to quality education for elementary schools and that the Board raise and strengthen existing standards for secondary schools. Compliance with these standards should be required for participation in our State Aid Program.

Another recommendation by the Conference is as follows: It is recommended that the New Hampshire legislature require Kindergarten programs for all public school pupils of the State, that all public and private programs of pre-school education be brought under the supervision and regulatory control of the State Board of Education and that the State Department of Education be staffed to meet these responsibilities.

It is interesting to note that the Governor's Conference was made up of 17 cooperating organizations and they formally committed their full support of all reasonable methods of raising revenue at the State level to finance the projected costs of increased financial aid for

quality education.

Here at home, in the elementary area, we are making a study of the non-graded system and individualized reading. We have two pilot programs at present in both of these areas.

Serious consideration should be given to a readiness program for the younger first graders because we believe that not all children are ready to move at the same pace.

I believe that we should offer public kindergarten as soon as funds and housing are available.

I believe that we should have guidance personnel in the elementary area as well as an elementary librarian. Elementary libraries and curriculum resource centers are becoming more popular.

A Science course via the University of New Hampshire is being offered in Salem to elementary teachers during the second semester.

The Woodbury School Library has had a very successful year. It is gratifying to see the children using the library for research and selecting books related to their school work as well as for their reading pleasure.

Salem High School has increased the educational opportunity for many students with instruction in German, Electricity and Electronics, Metal Machine Shop and Boys' Physical Education. The Phillips Exeter Academy English Program is entering the third successful year. The High School is deeply involved in the construction of a reading program for slow readers, as well as an advanced Science Seminar. It is hoped that Graphic Arts, Girls' Physical Education and more Driver Education can be added to the curriculum this coming year.

Education is changing rapidly and each School District must be aware of what is happening and be willing and ready to accept new ideas that will surely be a part of the age of automation and electronics.

APPRECIATION

This will be my final report as your Superintendent. I look forward to retirement with mixed emotions but I have no regrets. Most important I will treasure the friends I have made and I am most deeply appreciative of the support and cooperation given me during my association with the people of Salem for twenty-one years. I am particularly appreciative of the courtesies extended to me by all School Board Members, Principals, Teachers, Pupils and Staff Members.

Comparative statements of appropriations and expenditures, estimated and actual revenues for the fiscal year ended June 30, 1966, are presented in Exhibits D and E. As indicated by the Budget Summary (Exhibit E), a net overdraft of appropriations of \$6, 289.50, less a revenue surplus of \$3,746.80, resulted in a net budget deficit of \$2,542.70.

Statement of Receipts and Expenditures: (Exhibit F)

A summary statement of receipts and expenditures for the fiscal year ended June 30, 1966, made up in accordance with the uniform classification of accounts, is included in Exhibit F. Proof of the Treasurer's balance as of June 30, 1966, is indicated in Exhibit G.

High School Building Fund: (Exhibit H)

A statement of the activity in the High School Building Fund account during the fiscal year is included in Exhibit H.

School Lunch Account: (Exhibit I)

A statement of the School Lunch Program account for the fiscal year is included in Exhibit I.

Woodbury High School Activities Funds: (Exhibit J)

A statement of the Woodbury High School Activities Funds account is presented in Exhibit J.

Statement of School Tax Account: (Exhibit K)

A statement of the School District Tax account with the Town of Salem is presented in Exhibit K. As indicated therein, as of June 30, 1966, the School District had received from the Town the total amount of the 1965-66 School Tax plus a prepayment on account of the 1966-67 School Tax of \$8,000.00. This prepayment represented a deficiency appropriation for 1965-66 of like amount which was made at the annual meeting in March 1966.

Statement of Bond and Coupon Account: (Exhibit L)

A statement of the Bond and Coupon account for the fiscal year is included in Exhibit L.

Statement of Bonded Indebtedness: (Exhibit M)

A statement of the outstanding bonded indebtedness of the School District as of June 30, 1966, showing annual debt service requirements, is contained in Exhibit M.

GENERAL COMMENTS

(Current Deficit) or Surplus:

It is noted that the current financial condition of the School District changed from a current deficit (excess of current liabilities over total assets) of \$5, 199.13, to a current surplus (excess of total assets over current liabilities) of \$258.17, during the fiscal year ended June 30, 1966, as shown herewith:

TOWN MEETING WARRANT

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the Town of Salem, in the County of Rockingham in said State, qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Ackerman Hall, in said Town, on Tuesday the 14th day of March next, at ten (10:00) in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

Article 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.

Article 2. To see if the Town will vote to amend the Zoning Ordinance and the Zoning Map by designating the area as shown on the 1966 Salem Tax Maps as Lot No. 10 on Map No. 105 and Lot No. 37 as shown on Map No. 106 to residential rather than rural. The area affected by such amendment is that area of the designated Lot No. 10 on Map No. 105 and Lot No. 37 on Map No. 106 lying Easterly of Oakridge Avenue and Southerly of Pond Street extending to the Salem, New Hampshire and Methuen, Massachusetts line.

Article 3. To see if the Town will vote to change from rural to residential the area shown as Lot No. 47, Map 3 on the 1966 Salem Tax Maps, consisting of approximately 4.5 acres of land presently owned by John Annaian and Rose B. Annaian and being bounded on the South by Pond Street.

Article 4. To see if the Town will vote to amend the Salem Zoning Ordinance with the following Earth Removal Article.

Earth Removal

- 1. No earth shall be disturbed from any parcel of land in any district in the Town without a written permit from the Building Inspector or from the Board of Selectmen except as hereinafter provided.
- 2. Permits for the removal from the site of earth for the following purposes shall not be required:

- a. Where necessary as a part of farm, garden or nursery activities.
- b. When incidental to landscaping or similar activities for which a building permit is not required.
- c. When such earth is not necessary in connection with the construction of a building being built in accord with a permit issued by the Building Inspector, the amount to be removed to be limited to the volume of the foundation and basement of the building.
- d. When such earth is not needed in connection with the construction of a private road or drive.
- 3. Earth removal other than above shall not be permitted unless authorized by the Board of Selectmen, or their Agent, after a public hearing. Formal application shall be filed with the Board of Selectmen, which application shall include the following specific information and supporting documentation:
 - a. The location of the proposed excavation.
 - b. The legal name and address of the owner of the property involved.
 - c. The legal name and address of the petitioner, which address shall be used by the Board for all correspondence hereunder.
 - d. Name and address of all abutting property owners, including those across any streets.
 - e. A plan of the land involved showing topography by five foot contours of the area to be excavated and up to at least one hundred (100) feet beyond the perimeter of the area involved and along all property lines. At least three permanent bench marks with elevations marked thereon must be set so that if one is disturbed, those not disturbed can be recognized.
 - f. A plan of the land showing five (5) foot contours of the site as of the proposed completion of the

excavation project.

- g. Plan must show no excavations, fills or side casts to be made any closer than five (5) feet from abutters' property lines.
- Plan must show side slopes in pit no steeper than a three (3) (horizontal) to one (1) (vertical) ratio.
- i. Plan must show final elevation of floor of the pit does not exceed a three (3) per cent grade from the nearest public way or ways.
- j. A proposed form of bond to be used.
- 4. Any permit issued hereunder shall automatically expire upon the completion of the earth removal project for which it was issued or at such other time as may be specified in said permit. A permit may be granted by the Board of Selectmen with the provision that it may be renewed for one year, without a hearing if the Building Inspector finds that all conditions then applicable have been complied with and that the work had been carried on continuously and in good faith.

LIMITATIONS

- 1. No permit for the removal of earth shall be approved by the Board of Selectmen or Building Inspector except upon condition that a cover of topsoil of not less than four inches in depth shall be replaced or allowed to remain, except where, due to construction of roads, buildings, or other permanent physical features, such provision is impractical.
- 2. No permit shall be issued for the removal of earth in any location if such removal will:
 - a. Endanger the public health or safety or constitute a nuisance.
 - b. Produce noise, dust or other effects observable at the lot lines in amounts seriously objectionable or detrimental to the normal use of adjacent property.

- Result in the transportation of materials in such a manner as to cause traffic congestion or hazards, particularly on residential streets.
- d. Result in the transportation over ways which will be unduly injured thereby.
- e. Result in a change in topography and cover which will be disadvantageous to the most appropriate use of the land.
- 3. No permit for the removal of earth shall be approved by the Board of Selectmen if the work extends within three hundred (300) feet of a way open to public use, whether public or private, or within two hundred and fifty (250) feet of a building or structure unless the Building Inspector is satisfied that such removal will not undermine the way or structure.
- 4. In approving the issuance of a permit, the Board of Selectmen shall impose reasonable conditions which shall be written upon and shall constitute part of the permit, including but not limited to:
 - a. The finished leveling and grading.
 - b. The placing of topsoil and planting necessary to restore area to usable condition.
 - c. The duration of the removal operation.
 - d. The construction of necessary fencing and other protections against nuisance.
 - e. Method of removal.
 - f. Temporary structures.
 - g. Hours of operation.
 - h. Routes of transportation of material.
 - i. Control of temporary and permanent drainage.
 - j. Disposition of boulders and tree stumps.

- k. Requirements that roadways used for transportation of material must be swept clean and cleared of material spilled from trucks at least once each forty-eight (48) hours and oftener, if occasion requires.
- 1. Requirement that damage to pavement, drainage structures and curbing caused by said trucks or spillage be repaired by the prime contractor.
- 5. The Board of Selectmen shall require a bond or other security to be filed with the Town Counsel to enforce performance of conditions imposed by this section.

Continuation of Pre-existing Operation

Earth removal activities in lawful operation on any parcel of land at the time this section is adopted may continue unless and until abandoned for more than twelve (12) consecutive months. However, unless specifically authorized by a new permit issued hereunder:

- 1. The depth of excavation shall not be increased below the grade of the lowest point excavated on the effective date of this section.
- 2. The total area of excavation within the parcel shall not be increased by more than fifty (50) per cent over its area on said effective date.

Administration and Penalty

- 1. The Building Inspector shall review the progress of the work from time to time to ensure proper conduct.
- 2. The Building Inspector, if he concludes that there has been a violation of this section, shall send to the offender, by registered or certified mail, to the address stated on the initial application, and if applicable, a notice ordering a cessation of the improper activities. If the offender holds a permit issued under this section, such permit may be revoked according to law.

3. If a permit holder or other offender persists in such violation, the Building Inspector shall seek the imposition of the penalties authorized by Article IX of the Salem Zoning Ordinance.

Article 5. It is proposed to amend the Zoning Ordinance and the Zoning Map to have the land described below which is now Zoned Commercial-Industrial District "B" to be made Rural "B" land:

Commencing at the Southeasterly intersection of Interstate 93 and Cross Street; thence in a Southeasterly direction by Interstate Route 93 nineteen hundred (1900) feet, more or less, to a brook and ditch representing the Southeasterly corner of land presently owned by Burko; Thence following the course of said brook or ditch in a Westerly and Northwesterly and Northerly direction to land of Doucette; thence in a Westerly direction by land of Doucette five hundred fifty (550) feet, more or less, to Cross Street; thence following the Easterly boundary of Cross Street in a Northerly direction to the point of beginning.

Article 6. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary to defray the expenses of operation of the Town; Town Officers salaries and expenses, expenses of Election and Registration, Planning Board, District Court and Town Buildings, Ambulance, expenses of the operation of the Police, Fire and Civil Defense Departments, expenses of the Town Dump, and damage by dogs, expenses of the Health Department, Summer and Winter Maintenance and general expense of Town Highways, Street Lighting, Town Poor and Legal Expenses, Social Security and Retirement (Town's share), Interest and other necessary expenses pertaining to the operation of the Town of Salem, including Water Department, all such amounts being shown in the posted Town Budget.

Article 7. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen and Treasurer under the provisions of RSA 33:71, 1955, to borrow, in anticipation of taxes, such sums as are necessary for the operations of the Town, and to set the rate, effect the issuance of notes and to otherwise negotiate for the sale of notes to be paid within the present fiscal year.

Article 8. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen and Town Manager to apply, negotiate and do all other things necessary to obtain such Federal Interest Free Loans, and to expend the same, as may be required for the preparation of plans and designs of Town Roads, Municipal Buildings, extension of the Water System and other Town functions.

Article 9. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen and Town Manager to apply for, negotiate, and do all other things necessary to obtain such Federal funds as may be made available and to expend the same.

Article 10. To see if the Town will vote to amend Section III of the Salem Sunday Ordinance to read as follows:

It shall be lawful for all retail businesses in the Town of Salem to remain open on the Lord's Day after 1:00 P. M. Additionally, newspapers, magazines, dairy products, tobacco products, flowers, candy, soft drinks and toiletries may be sold during all usual business hours. Gasoline service stations for the sale of gasoline, oil and related automotive products, restaurants, car washes and self-service laundries may do business during their usual business hours.

Article 11. To see if the Town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to provide two or more additional polling places in the Town of Salem.

Article 12. To see if the Town will vote to:

- (a) Construct and equip a town garage.
- (b) Authorize the Town Manager and Selectmen to take such actions as they deem proper therein.
- (c) Authorize the Selectmen to issue bonds and/or notes in an amount not to exceed one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000.00) for the purpose of financing the project and
- (d) authorize the Selectmen to apply to the project all available funds including interest and federal grants.

Article 13. To see if the Town will vote to:

- (a) acquire land for Town purposes, including but not being limited to a sand pit, roads and refuse disposal areas,
- (b) authorize the Selectmen to take all such actions as they deem proper to acquire title to such land,
- (c) authorize the Selectmen to issue bonds and/or notes in an amount not to exceed One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000.00) for the purpose of financing the project and
- (d) authorize the Selectmen to apply to the project all available funds including interest and federal grants.

Article 14. To see if the Town will vote to:

- (a) authorize the Town Manager and Selectmen to extend the municipal sewer system,
- (b) authorize the Town Manager and Selectmen to take such actions as they deem proper therein,
- (c) authorize the Selectmen to issue bonds and/or notes in an amount not to exceed Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00) for the purpose of financing the project and
- (d) authorize the Selectmen to apply to the project all available funds including interest and federal grants.

Article 15. To see if the Town will vote to

- (a) authorize the Town Manager and Selectmen to extend water distribution lines and replace undersized water lines in the area known as Noyes Terrace and to replace other undersized lines throughout the town water system,
- (b) authorize the Town Manager and Selectmen to take such actions as they deem proper therein,

- (c) authorize the Selectmen to issue bonds and/or notes in an amount not to exceed Two Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$200,000.00) for the purpose of financing the project, and
- (d) authorize the Selectmen to apply to the project all available funds including interest and federal grants.

Article 16. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to enter an agreement with a competent firm of municipal appraisers for the purpose of reappraising property values in Salem and to raise and appropriate the sum of sixty thousand dollars (\$60,000.00) to accomplish this purpose.

Article 17. To see if the Town will vote to purchase and equip an emergency vehicle for the Fire Department and raise and appropriate the sum of Seven Thousand Dollars (\$7,000.00) for this purpose.

Article 18. By request of the Salem Fire Department: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Fifty Six Thousand Dollars (\$56,000.00) for the purchase of a "Snorkel" rescue and fire-fighting apparatus.

Article 19. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Three Thousand Seven Hundred and Forty Seven Dollars (\$3,747.00) to be paid over to the Salem District Nursing Association for the Association's program.

Article 20. To see if the Town will vote to

- (a) employ a community planner at a salary range of Eighty Five Hundred Dollars (\$8, 500.00) to Ten Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$10, 500.00) and
- (b) raise Six Thousand Dollars (\$6,000.00) as salary for such planner for the year 1967.

Article 21. By request of Gertrude H. Baker and others, to see if the Town will vote to change the water pipe in Muse Terrace from two inch galvanized to six inch cement lined cast iron for a distance of six hundred (600) feet (approximate) and to raise and appropriate the sum of Forty Five Hundred Dollars (\$4, 500.00) for the same.

Article 22. By request of Howard MacDougall and others: To

see if the Town will vote to replace the two inch galvanized water line in Brown Street with six inch cement lined cast iron pipe and raise the sum of Thirty Five Hundred Dollars (\$3,500.00) for the same.

Article 23. By request of residents of North Policy Street and others: To see if the Town will vote to extend the municipal water system from the present system on North Policy Street to 184 North Policy Street, a distance of approximately 2, 400 feet, and to raise and appropriate the sum of Seventeen Thousand Dollars (\$17,000.00) for the purpose of financing the same, such sum to be raised by the issuance of bonds and/or notes under and in compliance with the provisions of the Municipal Finance Act, and to authorize the Selectmen to issue and negotiate such bonds and/or notes and pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 24. By request of Armand Pellerin and others, to see if the Town will vote to install a surface drain in front of 15 Benning Avenue and raise the sum of One Thousand Eight Hundred Dollars (\$1,800. 00) for this purpose.

Article 25. By request of Robert DeFeo and others, to see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Twelve Hundred Dollars (\$1,200.00) for the installation of approximately two hundred (200) feet of twelve inch drain pipe and one catch basin to be installed in the Westerly corner of 12 Scollay Circle and to be picked up at existing drain at the north corner of 16 Scollay Circle.

Article 26. By request of Ted Bogannan and others, to see if the Town will vote to place an eight inch lateral sewer line a distance of one hundred twenty five (125) feet in Belmont Street from Westchester, and raise the sum of Two Thousand Dollars (\$2,000.00) to accomplish the same.

Article 27. By request of Wallace E. Stickney and others, to see if the Town will vote to continue the installation of dry hydrants in areas not serviced by the water system and raise Three Thousand Dollars (\$3,000.00) for the same.

Article 28. By request of Wallace E. Stickney and others, to see if the Town will vote to complete the street numbering system and raise Two Thousand Dollars (\$2,000.00) for the same.

Article 29. By request of the Salem Conservation Commission and others, to see if the Town will vote to appropriate Twenty Five Hundred Dollars (\$2, 500.00) from the Capital Reserve Fund to be used by the Conservation Commission in obtaining options for the purchase of land. Upon purchase of any such land the money deposited for the option will be returned to the Capital Reserve Fund.

Article 30. To see if the Town will designate the following area as an historic district:

Commencing at the Westerly side of Bridge Street and the Southerly bank of the Spicket River, thence following the Southerly and/or Easterly bank of the River to its intersection with Route 97; thence in a Westerly and Southerly direction by Route 97 to the Southerly boundary of land of Sylvia Dunkley; thence crossing Main Street to the Northeasterly boundary of the Methodist Parsonage; thence following the Parsonage boundary in a Northwesterly direction three hundred fifty (350) feet, more or less, to the Westerly line of said Parsonage property; thence following the Westerly boundary of the Parsonage land and land of Earl Woodbury six hundred five (605) feet, more or less, to land of James Brown; thence in a Southwesterly direction one hundred forty (140) feet, more or less, to the Northeasterly corner of land of John Cotter; thence in a Southwesterly direction by the Northerly boundary of land of said Cotter one hundred twenty (120) feet, more or less, to land of Stanley Morgan; thence in a Northwesterly direction by said Morgan property fifty five (55) feet, more or less; thence in a Southeasterly direction by the boundary of said Morgan property one hundred twenty (120) feet, more or less; thence in a Southwesterly direction by said Morgan property eighty five (85) feet, more or less, to School Street; thence crossing School Street at the Northeast corner to land of William Brown; thence in a Westerly direction by land of said Brown and land formerly of Vivian Runnells one hundred seventy (170) feet, more or less; thence in a Northwesterly direction across land of Domonic Pono sixty (60) feet, more or less, to the Northeasterly boundary of land of Florence Kelly; thence in a Westerly direction by said Kelly land and land of Walter Hunt two hundred thirty five (235) feet, more or less, to land of LMD, INC; thence Southerly two hundred eighty (280) feet, more or less, to the Northerly boundary of Main

Street; thence crossing Main Street to the Northwesterly corner of land of the Hannah Tenney Methodist Church; thence in a Southerly direction by the Westerly boundary of said Church land one hundred thirty five (135) feet, more or less; thence in an Easterly direction by said Church land seventy five (75) feet more or less, to land of Mary Fisk; thence in a Southeasterly direction by said Fisk land and other land of the Hannah Tenney Methodist Church one hundred sixty (160) feet, more or less; thence in an Easterly direction by the Southerly boundary of said Church land one hundred thirteen (113) feet, more or less, to land of Bernice Martin; thence in a Southeasterly direction by said Martin land two hundred twenty (220) feet, to the Spicket River; thence crossing the Spicket River by a prolongation of the last course to the Southerly bank of said River; thence following the Southerly bank of said River in a Northeasterly direction to the point of beginning.

Article 31. By request of Beverly J. Ellis and others, to see if the Town will vote to retain the William E. Palmer School House (No. 4 School) after its use as a school shall be terminated, that it may be used for the benefit of the community and the decision of its use shall be decided upon at a meeting, or a series of meetings, which shall be attended by citizens of the community and also by the Board of Selectmen and the Town Manager.

Article 32. By request of Dudley F. Chaya and others, to see if the Town will vote to make a study of the bridge on Providence Hill Road over Providence Hill Brook in time to request funds under the State Bridge Aid Program for the 1968 Town Warrant.

Article 33. By request of Philip DeZutter and others, to see if the Town will vote to accept Blake Road and surface the same for a distance of approximately two hundred (200) feet north of the end of Glen Road and raise money for the same.

Article 34. By request of Harold F. Stackpole and others, to see if the Town will vote to accept three streets located in Arlington Park, namely, Chase Street from Shore Drive to Hunt Street; Hunt Street from Chase Street to Griffen Road; and Griffen Road to Shore Drive.

Article 35. By request of William J. Falwell and others, to see if the Town will vote to accept, grade and oil surface certain roads on

the Westerly shore of Millville Lake known as "Little Saugus Area", and to raise and appropriate money for same. Article 38. By request of Arthur B. Harper and others, to see if the Town will vote to install six (6) street lights on Royal Circle and Centerville Drive on pole numbers 3, 10, 12, 14, 5626 and 2425 and raise money for the same.

Article 39. By request of the Shadow Lake Association, to see if the Town will vote to install seven (7) street lights; one (1) at the intersection of Route 111 on Shadow Lake Road and Hitty Road, pole number 1257; one (1) at the intersection of Hitty Road and Dennison Road, pole number 3101; one (1) at the intersection of London Road and Dennison Road, pole number 2851; one (1) at the end of Hitty Road, pole number 4032; one (1) on Dennison Road, pole number 3194, Two (2) on London Road poles numbered 2880 and 2882 and raise money for same.

By request of Elis Svenson and others, to see if the Town will vote to install street lights at the following locations and raise money for the same: three lights on Car Mar Lane on pole numbers 5497, 3899, and 4050; one (1) light on Walter Palmer Lane on pole number 5740; and two (2) lights on Westwood Road on pole numbers 3451 and 3449.

Article 41. By request of Grace DeCesare and others, to see if the Town will vote to install three (3) street lights on Sandy Beach Road on poles numbered 3675, 3673, 3685 and raise money for the same. Article 42. By request of Carl Gallines and others, to see if the Town will vote to install one street light on Shore Drive on pole number 3166 and raise money for the same.

Article 43. By request of Patricia L. Zahn and others, to see if the Town will vote to install a street light on pole number 5639 on Brady Avenue and raise money for same.

Article 44. By request of Philip DeZutter and others, to see if the Town will vote to install two (2) street lights on New England Telephone poles number 10 and 11 and raise money for the same.

Article 45. By request of John Begg and others, to see if the Town will vote to install four (4) street lights on Royal Circle on poles number 5513, 5598, 5600 and 5293 also two (2) lights on poles number 5401 and 5403 on Centerville Drive, and raise money for the same.

Article 46. By request of Harold Stackpole and others, to see if the Town will vote to install street lights on pole number 4059 located on Chase Street, pole number 4302 located on Hunt Street, and unnumbered pole on the corner of Shore Drive and Chase Street, all located in Arlington Park, and raise money for same.

Article 47. By request of Arthur E. Parker and others, to see if the Town will vote to install one (1) street light on pole number 5721 on Parker Circle, North Salem and raise money for same.

Article 48. By request of Thomas Donigian and others, to see if the Town will vote to install one (1) street light on pole number 2674, Brady Avenue, and raise money for the same.

Article 49. By request of William D. Cornwell and others, to see if the Town will vote to install one (1) street light in front of the residences of William Cornwell and Donald Holliday and raise money for the same.

Article 50. By request of Elmer E. Bussey and others, to see if the Town will vote to install five (5) street lights on Route 38 (Lowell Road) to junction of Brady Avenue, and raise money for the same.


