To the Inhabitants of the Town of Seabrook in the County of Rockingham, in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet in the lower hall of the Seabrook Firemen's Association Building, Route 286, on Tuesday, March 9, 1971, at 10 o'clock in the forenoon and to cast ballots from that hour until at least 6 o'clock in the evening of the same day and to act on the following articles:

ARTICLE I. To elect by Non-partisan ballot; One Selectman, Assessor and Trustee of the Trust Funds for a term of Three (3) years; a Chief of Police; a Chief of the Fire Department; Three (3) Constables, Two (2) members of the Budget Committee for a term of Three (3) years, a member of the Park Commission for a term of Three (3) years, a member of the Park Commission for a term of Two (2) years, a Road Agent; and any other officers for the ensuing year.

(On the Official Ballot)

ARTICLE II. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes and to renew and refund Town notes.

ARTICLE III. To see what action the Town will take regarding the balances of the Special Appropriations; New Land \$1,984.97; Cross Beach Layout \$4,285.00; Street Survey \$305.00; Mosquito Control \$1,165.39; Selectmen's Assistant \$7,000.00; Black Snake Road \$465.00; Farm Lane Dock \$2,350.00; Dwight Avenue \$925.00; Lake Shore Drive \$1,857.00.

ARTICLE IV. To see if the Town will vote to revise the salaries and wages of Town officials and employees.

ARTICLE V. To see if the Town will vote to require a building permit for the construction of new buildings, for

renovations and/or additions to existing buildings and for the placement of mobile homes if the cost of said building, renovation, addition or mobile home exceeds \$500.00, said permit to be issued in such form as the Selectmen may determine; to authorize and empower the Selectmen to establish a fee of one dollar for each of said permits and a penalty of \$25.00 if said permit is not obtained where required; and to authorize and empower the Selectmen, on behalf of the Town, to collect said fee and take such steps, including the promulgation of regulations, as are necessary to enforce said penalty.

ARTICLE VI. To see if the Town will authorize and empower the Selectmen to sell and convey those premises owned by the Town, whether acquired by Tax Collector's Deeds or otherwise, which are within the perimeter of the following bounds:

North of the Mill Creek,
South of Brown's River,
East of a line which is perpendicular to the end of
Rocks Road,
West of Route No. 1A.

at private sale, upon such terms and conditions as the Selectmen, in their discretion, deem to be in the best interest of the Town, and to execute such agreements, deeds, or other documents necessary to accomplish the same.

ARTICLE VII. To see if the Town will authorize and empower the Selectmen to convey, on such terms and conditions and to such person, persons, firm or corporation as they deem to be in the best interest of the Town, the Town's interest in the premises described in deed of Karl J. E. Gove to the Town, dated November 29, 1965, and recorded in Rockingham Records Book 1800, Page 304, and to enter into, accept and execute on behalf of the Town, such agreements, deeds, and other documents as are necessary to accomplish the same.

ARTICLE VIII. To see if the Town will vote to continue the Surplus Commodity program and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,200.00 to defray the cost of same.

(Submitted by Budget Committee without recommendation)

ARTICLE IX. To see if the Town will authorize and empower the Selectmen to convey, on such terms and conditions as they deem to be in the best interest of the Town, to Robert E. Pevear and Marion P. Pevear the Town's interest in the premises formerly taxed to Donald Clark and described in Tax Collector's Deed to the Town dated December 31, 1956, and recorded in Rockingham Records Book 1424, Page 77.

ARTICLE X. To see if the Town will vote to accept the following lot of land:

A certain tract of pasture land containing nine (9) acres, more or less, known as the "Smith Pasture" situated in said Seabrook and bounded Northerly by land now or formerly of the heirs of Joseph S. Smith and a burying ground; Easterly by land now or formerly of George N. Chase; Southerly by land now or formerly of the heirs of Eben F. Smith and a Gravel Pit; Westerly by Main Road, a burying ground and land now or formerly of the heirs of Joseph S. Smith.

For title reference see deed of Guy W. Chase et al. dated August 28, 1940, and recorded in Rockingham Records, Book 1349, Page 054.

Meaning and intending to convey all unsold lots in the Hillside Cemetery, so-called, excluding any lots in the above described parcel which have previously been sold.

ARTICLE XI. To see if the Town will vote to accept as public highways that portion of the road known as Forest Drive which has not been previously accepted, that portion of the road known as Evergreen Drive which has not been previously accepted, the road known as Forest Court, and the road known as Ayer Circle, all as shown on plan entitled "Seabrook Development, Inc., Seabrook, New Hampshire, Survey B. T. W. Chesley Engineering Co., Northwood, New Hampshire, Date: January, 1962, Scale: 1 inch = 50 feet, Plan 1439."

ARTICLE XII. Upon a Petition by Raymond F. Lalime and twenty (20) others: To see if the Town will vote to accept as Public highways the roads named Virginia Lane and Raymond Drive as shown on plan entitled "Ebbtide at Seabrook, N.H. by Raymond & Virginia Lalime, Scale 1" = 50', May 1968, Richard K. Parker, Jr., Surveyor, Washington Street, Seabrook, N.H." with the exception of that portion of said roads, for the entire width thereof, which extends in a Southwesterly direction 50 feet from the Northeasterly end of said road as shown on said plan.

ARTICLE XIII. Upon a Petition by Asa H. Knowles, Jr. and fifteen (15) others: To see if the Town will vote to lay out a road, of sufficient width to accommodate modern day travel, to Cross Beach. Said road to begin at Route 1A and to run Westerly over the way now traveled or as near to it as practical, and to end at Cross Beach Creek, so-called. To take the same by gift, purchase, or by eminent domain. To raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000.00 to be added to the balance of an earlier appropriation entitled "Cross Beach Layout", the sum of the Two to be used for the above layout. And that any money remaining of this sum to be used to gravel said road from Route 1A to Ed Messiers Corner, to be a depth and width as the funds will allow.

(Submitted without recommendation by Budget Committee)

ARTICLE XIV. Upon a Petition by Simeon H. Brown and eighteen (18) others: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of One Thousand (\$1,000.00) Dollars to construct Dug-Outs and make other improvements at the Little League Field at Weare Park.

(Approved by the Budget Committee)

ARTICLE XV. Upon a Petition by Linwood O. Norton and twenty-one (21) others: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Six Thousand Five Hundred (\$6,500.00) Dollars to Hot-Top (resurface) Lakeshore, Evergreen and Forest Drives and Forest Court.

(Approved by the Budget Committee)

ARTICLE XVI. Upon a Petition by Frances Knowles and seventeen (17) others: To see if the Town will vote to authorize the collection of Rubbish and Garbage from the various restaurants and markets within the Town. Also to raise and appropriate the sum of Six Thousand Five Hundred (\$6,500.00) Dollars to defray the cost of the same for the remainder of the year; and that in succeeding years a proper amount be added to the regular Rubbish Collection account for this purpose.

(Submitted without recommendation by the Budget Committee)

ARTICLE XVII. Upon a Petition by Charles H. Felch and twenty-two (22) others: To see if the Voters of the Town will vote to hire One full time firefighter on a permanent basis, bring the total number of permanent firefighters to four, and to raise and appropriate the sum of Five Thousand Two Hundred (\$5,200.00) Dollars for same.

(Approved by Budget Committee)

ARTICLE XVIII. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Three Thousand Three Hundred (\$3,300.00) Dollars to purchase a Sedan to be used by the Police Department as a second cruiser.

(Submitted without recommendation by Budget Committee)

ARTICLE XIX. Upon a Petition by Charles S. B. Knowles and twenty-nine (29) others: To see if the voters of the Town will vote to have the Selectmen appoint Two additional permanent Police Officers, and to raise and appropriate the sum of Ten Thousand Four Hundred (\$10,400.00) Dollars for the same.

(Submitted without recommendation by Budget Committee)

ARTICLE XX. To hear the report of the Planning Board and to act thereon.

ARTICLE XXI. To see what sums of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the expense of the General Government, for the protection of persons and property, for

health and sanitation, for highways and bridges, for the support of the Town Poor and for all necessary expenditures for the ensuing year.

ARTICLE XXII. To transact all other legal business that may come before said meeting.

ADJOURNED TOWN MEETING

March 12, 1970
Passaconaway Hall
Seabrook, N. H.

Meeting called to order at 7:35 P.M. by Moderator Carroll B. Pineo.

Salute to the Flag led by the Moderator.

Invocation by Rev. Neil Iverson of the Trinity United Church of Christ.

The Moderator requested the check-lists be brought to the hall. The Moderator stated any amendments will be in writing with his or her signature. Unlimited debate. Warrant read by Moderator.

ARTICLE 2: - read by Moderator: - "authorize Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes".

Motion by Emery N. Eaton, second by Bruce G. Brown that the Selectmen be authorized and empowered to borrow money in anticipation of taxes and to renew and refund Town Notes.

MOTION CARRIED.

ARTICLE 3: - read by Moderator: - "action on balances of Special Appropriations".

Motion by Emery N. Eaton, second by James S. Eaton, that the balances stated under Article 3 be carried forward and used as originally intended.

MOTION CARRIED.

ARTICLE 4: - read by Moderator: - "vote to revise the salaries and wages of the Town Officials and Employees".

Motion by Emery N. Eaton, second by James S. Eaton, to revise the wages and salaries as follows:

Salary of full time Police Officers to be increased from \$105.00 weekly to \$110.00 weekly;

Salary of full time Fireman increased to \$122.00 weekly; Salary of full time Public Works Employees increased from \$105.00 to \$110.00 weekly; Salary of salaried Cemetery workers be increased from \$105.00 to \$110.00 weekly; Salary of full time Office Clerk be increased from \$70.00 to \$80.00 weekly; Salary of Assistant Chief of Police be increased to \$115.00 weekly.

All salaries and rates of pay not covered by this motion to remaine as previously established.

MOTION CARRIED.

ARTICLE 5: - read by Moderator: - "vote to establish a Capital Reserve Fund to be known as the Town Waste and Disposal Capital Reserve Fund, to deposit the funds derived from the sale of the Town Dump in said Capital Reserve Fund, and to authorize and empower the Selectmen to withdraw and apply said funds for the purchase of a new Town Dump.

Motion by Emery N. Eaton, second by Walter I. Randall, to authorize the Selectmen to establish a Capital Reserve Fund of \$28,312.50 to be put into Capital Reserve Fund. (Sale of Dump--\$28,312.50.)

ARTICLE 6: - read by Moderator: - "to raise and appropriate the sum of \$88,000.00 for the purpose of constructing a new Town Garage."

Motion by Thomas Riley, second by James S. Eaton, to postpone Article 6 indefinitely.

ARTICLE 7: - Acted on Official Town Ballot.

ARTICLE 8: - read by Moderator: - "to see if the Town will vote to require a building permit for the construction of new buildings, for renovations and/or additions to existing buildings and for

the placement of mobile homes if the cost of said building, renovation, addition or mobile home exceeds \$500.00, said permit to be issued in such form as the Selectmen may determine; and to authorize and empower the Selectmen to promulgate regulations requiring a fee for said permit and imposing a penalty if such regulations are not obeyed or said permit is not obtained where required.

ARTICLE DEFEATED. YES-- 64 NO-- 66

ARTICLE 9: - read by Moderator: - "vote to establish a salary for the Special Justice of the Seabrook Municipal Court."

Motion by Emery N. Eaton, second by James S. Eaton, that the salary for the Special Justice be set at \$500.00.

Amendment to motion by Walter I. Randall, second by Bruce G. Brown, that the Clerk of Courts receive same salary as the Special Justice.

AMENDMENT ADOPTED.

ARTICLE 10:- read by Moderator: - "vote to convey to Warren S. and Viola M. Frothingham all the Town's right, title, and interest in and unto the gravel pit situated at Collins Street in the Town of Salisbury, County of Essex and Commonwealth of Massachusetts, and to execute such deeds and other documents necessary to accomplish the same."

Motion by Robert Taylor, second by James S. Eaton, that Article 10 be adopted as read.

MOTION CARRIED.

ARTICLE 11:- read by Moderator: - "vote to ratify the Selectmen's action in accepting assistance from the Public Service Company of N. H. for testing an additional water supply for the Town's water system, and to authorize and empower the Selectmen to continue testing for said water supply and to install such wells, pumps,

mains and other equipment and acquire such real estate as is necessary for the addition of said water supply to the Town's water system; and to authorize and empower the Selectmen to enter into and execute such agreements, including agreements with Public Service Company of N. H. whereby the Town would agree to supply water to Public Service Company of N. H. and Public Service Company of N. H. would provide financial assistance for the construction of said well and the addition thereof to the Town's water system, and to execute such contracts and other documents necessary to accomplish the same."

Submitted herewith is the report of the annual examination and audit of the accounts of the Town of Seabrook for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1969, which was made by this Division in accordance with the vote of the Town. Exhibits as hereafter listed are included as part of the report.

One of the enclosed audits must be given the Town Clerk as part of the permanent records.

SCOPE OF AUDIT

Included in the examination and audit were the accounts and records of the Board of Selectmen, Treasurer, Tax Collector, Town Clerk, Trustees of Trust Funds, Special Water Account and Bi-Centennial Account.

FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Comparative Balance Sheets: December 31, 1968 and December 31, 1969: (Exhibit A-1)

Comparative Balance Sheets as of December 31, 1968 and December 31, 1969, are presented in Exhibit A-1. As indicated therein, the Net Debt decreased by \$28,461.97 in 1969.

Analysis of Change in Financial Condition: (Exhibit A-2)

An analysis of the change in financial condition of the Town during the year is made in Exhibit A-2, with the factors which caused the change indicated therein.

Comparative Statements of Appropriations and Expenditures Estimated and Actual Revenues: (Exhibits A-3 & A-4)

Comparative statements of appropriations and expenditures, estimated and actual revenues for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1969, are presented in Exhibits A-3 and A-4. As indicated by the budget summary (Exhibit A-4), a revenue surplus of \$11,181.20, less a net overdraft of appropriations of \$9,888.30, resulted in a net budget surplus of \$1,292.90.

Summary Statement of Receipts and Expenditures: (Exhibit B-1)

A summary statement of receipts and expenditures for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1969, made up in accordance with the uniform classification of accounts, is included in Exhibit B-1. Proof of the Treasurer's balance as of December 31, 1969, is indicated in Exhibit B-2.

Statement of Long Term Indebtedness: (Exhibit G)

A statement of outstanding long term indebtedness as of December 31, 1969, showing annual debt service requirements, is contained in Exhibit G.

Other Departmental and Special Accounts: (Exhibits F, H, I & J)

Statements of the activities in the Trust Funds, Bond & Coupon Account, Special Water Account and Bi-Centennial Accounts are presented in the above Exhibits.

AUDIT PROCEDURE

The accounts and records of all town officials charged with the custody, receipt and disbursement of public funds were examined and audited in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards, and accordingly included such tests of the accounting records and such other auditing procedures as were considered necessary in the circumstances.

Verification of uncollected and unredeemed taxes was made by mailing notices to delinquent taxpayers as indicated by the Collector's records. The amounts of uncollected and unredeemed taxes as indicated in this report are therefore subject to any changes which may be necessitated by the return of verification notices.

GENERAL COMMENTS

Current Surplus:

The Current surplus (excess of total assets over current liabilities) decreased by \$171.25, from \$17,356.43 to \$17,185.18 in 1969, as shown herewith:

Municipal Court:

Due to incomplete records we were unable to prepare a classified statement of receipts and expenditures. Exhibit E is a summary statement of receipts and expenditures. The receipts were taken from bank deposits and expenditures from checks issued.

Overdrafts of Appropriations:

As shown in the budget summary (Exhibit A-4) there was an overdraft of appropriations in the amount of (9,888.30.)

Chapter 32:10-d requires the approval of the budget committee and the tax commission authorizing expenditures in excess of the amount appropriated. Apparently the provisions of this chapter were not complied with.

Water Department:

As of December 31, 1969, the General Fund balance sheet reflected an asset due from the Water Department in the amount of \$77,577.52. This was an increase of \$42,100.00 during the year 1969. Inasmuch as the Water Department is a town department, it would appear that the assets of the Town are overstated by this amount which, if removed, the General Fund would show a current deficit of \$60,392.34.

It would appear that an increase in Water Rents or other measures should be considered to correct this situation.

Conclusion:

In accordance with the provisions of Chapter 184 of the Laws of 1955, this report or the summary of findings and recommendations (letter of transmittal) should be published in the next annual report of the Town.

We extend our thanks to the officials of the Town of Seabrook for their assistance during the course of the audit.
