6. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$1,000.00 for fire protection for the ensuing year and make appropriation for same.
7. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$700.00 for insurance for the ensuing year and make appropriation for same.
8. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$200.00 for fire trails for the ensuing year and make appropriation for same.
9. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$100.00 for legal expenses for the ensuing year and make appropriation for same.
10. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$50.00 for Civil Defense and make appropriation for same.

12. To see if the Town will raise \$750.00 for the maintenance of the Town dump and make appropriation for same.

Shelburne Library Report

During the past year the Shelburne Library has been operated by the trustees: Miss Merrell staffed the library every Tuesday from 3 to 5 p.m., and Mrs. Judge did the administrative work. We loaned 891 books to 13 adults and 26 children. The library borrowed 1054 books from the Bookmobile, of which 210 were fiction, 234 non-fiction, and 606 juvenile. 25 books were loaned by the State Library.

The Library received a grant of \$100.00 from the State for the purchase of basic reference books. With this and Town Funds deposited with the State we purchased 61 new books, which selection also includes fiction, non-fiction, and children's books. Serving on the Book Committee were Mrs. George Thompson, Mrs. Charles Whelden, and Mrs. Stanley Judge.

The administration of the library this past year has been a holding operation, and as we trustees have become familiar with its contents we are impressed by the quality and variety of reading material it contains. We sincerely hope the townspeople will take fuller advantage of the books available. Students wishing to use the reference books may do so at home by contacting any member of the Library Committee. We also plan to initiate several programs and film shows to stimulate the interest of the younger children. Library hours continue to be Tuesday, 3 - 5 p.m.

The Committee wishes to thank Mrs. Lowell Reed for her gift of subscriptions to *Jack and Jill* and *Humpty Dumpty* magazines for children. Also on hand are current issues of the National Geographic Magazine.

The School Board's proposed budget totals \$49,746.47 which represents an increase of \$2,925.96 over the present budget of \$46,870.61. We have allocated the sum of \$42,000.00 for tuition in the proposed budget. Of the \$42,000.00 an amount of \$2,359.00 is an allowance for any additional pupils.

Most of the increase is due to transportation and Supervisory Union No. 20 expenses.

The proposed budget provides \$39,641.00 for 62 pupils, plus an allowance of \$2,359.00 for any additional pupils who may move into the District.

School Bus

The School Board recommends that the District consider the purchase of a new school bus in two or three years. At present we have \$3,000.00 in the Bus Capital Reserve Fund. A special article in your warrant requests that an additional \$2,000.00 be raised and placed in this fund. It is anticipated that a new bus will cost about \$10,000.00.
