# Warrant

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## THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Stewartstown, in the County of Coos in said State qualified to vote in Town Affairs :

You are hereby notified to meet at the town house in said town of Stewartstown on Tuesday, the 12th day of March next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects :

1. To see if the town will vote to accept State Aid.
2. To see if the town will vote to accept the budget, as approved by the Budget Committee and raise money for the same. If not, to see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to defray town charges for the ensuing year as follows :
  - (a) Town Officers' Salaries.
  - (b) Town Officers' Expenses.
  - (c) Election and Registration.
  - (d) Municipal Court Expenses.
  - (e) Town hall, office and other buildings.
  - (f) Damage and Legal Expenses.
  - (g) Health Department.
  - (h) Town Dump Expenses.
  - (i) Vital Statistics.
  - (j) General Expense of Highway Department.
  - (k) Civil Defense
  - (l) Interest on Temporary Loans.
  - (m) County Tax.
3. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for support of poor.
4. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for support of Libraries.
5. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for care of cemeteries.

6. To see if the town will vote to raise two thousand two hundred dollars (\$2,200.00) for street lighting.
7. To see what action the Town will take in regard to the Police Department.
8. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the following departments :
  - (a) Police Department
  - (b) Fire Department.
  - (c) Sewer Department
9. To see what sum of money, if any, the town will vote to raise in addition to that required by law for the road maintenance.
10. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for winter roads.
11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Fifty dollars (\$50.00) to the White Mountain Region Association, for the purpose of issuing and distributing printed matter and publicizing the advantages of the town in cooperation with the other 45 towns in the region.
12. To see if the Town will request the assistance of the Tax Commission in appraising all lands and buildings and raise the sum of fifteen hundred dollars (\$1,500.00) in the current year, the balance to be raised in 1964.
13. To see if the town will vote to instruct its Selectmen to appoint all other officers as required by law not elected by Non-Partisan Ballot.
14. To nominate and elect two members to serve three years on the Municipal Budget Committee.
15. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to incur debts, for temporary loans in anticipation of taxes on the Municipal year and pay out of the tax money when it is received.
16. To choose by Non-Partisan Ballot the following Town Officers :
  - (a) Town Clerk.
  - (b) Selectman for the three years ensuing.
  - (c) Town Treasurer.



- (d) Two Road Agents.
  - (e) One or more Auditors.
  - (f) Overseer of Public Welfare.
  - (g) Collector of Diamond Pond Rent.
  - (h) One or more Sextons.
  - (i) Trustee of Trust Funds.
  - (j) One library trustee for the three years ensuing.
17. To transact any other business that may be legally brought before this meeting.

Since joining the staff of the New Hampshire Department of Health as Public Health Nurse for the Northern half of Coos County, I have made 75 visits in Stewartstown.

At the Orthopedic Clinic in May at West Stewartstown, 26 children were seen by Dr. Lacey and 24 by the pediatrician Dr. Hume. 74 pre-school children from Stewartstown attended the Oral Polio Clinics in Colebrook last summer. A new series of Oral Polio Clinics, for all ages, were started in December, sponsored by the Frontier Grange.

On behalf of the State Department of Health and Welfare, I wish to thank the people of Stewartstown for their help and cooperation. It is my hope that our continued cooperation will result in a sound program of Health that will benefit the entire area.

## Superintendent's Report

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To the School Board and Citizens of the School District of Stewartstown.

### FOREWORD

Most of what has been said and written during the past few years about the strong or weak points of our American education system has had to do with conditions in the country as a whole. This has been particularly true in the discussion of size of unit, of reading methods, science subject matter, and the teaching of the concept of number. The arguments presented have by no means been confined to either what should be taught or how it should be taught, as no small part of this running educational gamut has had to do with the individual on the receiving end—the pupil, and what is considered to be the best time to try to persuade him to take it. And all this has taken place even though becoming increasingly more aware every day of the uncertainty of how to determine ability potentials, especially from the standpoint of what can or will be accomplished when once stimulated to action.

With both the prescribed minimum standards for high schools, which goes into effect this fall, and the Interim Commission's recommendations, which applies to both the elementary and high school, geared for large educational units in the state, there is a definite pointing to the conviction that provision for offering more subjects in the above mentioned and other areas to a larger number will result in a better education. Whether or not this belief will be borne out, time only can tell. Past experience has shown that the spending of more dollars, which almost invariably has been the case in the end, to provide a large school to accommodate the pupils from several smaller ones has not necessarily produced superior accomplishments. Even after all the various factors have been considered and the problems of organization have been solved, time has been found to be vitally important in the working out of the many details of implementation.

### TEACHERS

With the number of available teachers becoming, if anything, less rather than greater each successive year, it means a great deal to have experienced teachers in all positions. Mrs. Esther H. Bean, a veteran teacher with many years of experience in this area, and who has been taking summer school courses during the past several years at both teachers college as well as at the state university, teaches Grades 5-8 at the Hollow Elementary School. Mrs. Mary A. Pease teaches Grades 1-4 at the same school. The teachers at the West Stewartstown School, with respective grades taught, are: Mrs. Gladys M. Oakes, Principal, Grades 6-7-8; Mrs. Henrietta W. Jackson, Grades 3-4-5; and Mrs. Cleora M. Richardson, Grades 1-2.

### SCHOOL NURSE—HEALTH

With conclusive findings of scientific studies showing that, with other factors being equal, the efficiency with which school work is done by the pupil is directly proportional to his or her overall state of health, the importance of the outstanding work done by our school nurse, Mrs. Ethel S. Sturgis, becomes ever more apparent.

The comprehensive program conducted throughout the school year includes periodic clinics for the purpose of administering immunizations, giving physical examinations, and taking x-rays, in addition to constant check-ups on height, weight, hearing, and eyesight, and continuous supervision of the general health.

### MAINTENANCE—REPAIRS—EQUIPMENT

For the third consecutive year, extensive maintenance and repair work has been done at the West Stewartstown Building during the summer vacation period. Outside, after removing the old shingles and replacing such roof boards as were necessary, the entire roof was covered with a layer of asphalt paper over which new interlocking asphalt shingles were laid; the old eaves trough was removed and replaced with aluminum edging at the base of the roof; broken glass was replaced and glazing was done where needed in the windows; and all exterior walls, as well as porch floors, after being scraped and spot primed where necessary, were painted. Inside work included patching of plaster here and there, installing a door-check on basement door at the top of stairs leading to boys' basement, and painting the floors in both basements and lunch room.



Other than painting the chairs and tables in the lower grade room, and covering the inside of the door leading from the corridor to the boiler room with asbestos, repair and maintenance work done at the Hollow Elementary School Building has been very minor in nature.

The only piece of equipment of note added during the past year was a new lavatory installed in the boys' basement at the W. Stewartstown Building.

### **SCHOOL LUNCH**

To conduct an outstanding school lunch program down through the successive years in a small school, for the most part on a self-supporting basis, is a major achievement. Much credit for this vitally important health-giving activity, which contributes very materially in the building of morale and to the overall happy life of the school, goes to the operator, Mrs. M. Eva Day, at the West Stewartstown School.

A tabulation of the receipts and expenditures of this program for the year just completed, will be found on subsequent pages in this report.

### **NOTES ON THE BUDGET**

The School Board's budget for 1963-64, which is the same as that of the Budget Committee, is \$82,276 in comparison to \$71,924 voted for the current year. This amount is reduced by an estimated income of \$27,500, which leaves a requested appropriation of \$54,776 to be raised by taxes by the town in comparison to \$52,924 for this year. Although a substantial decrease in the provision for repairs more than offsets small increases for salaries, transportation, and heat, an appreciably larger amount required for anticipated tuition costs explains most of the increase in the budget for next year.

### **ENROLLMENT AND ATTENDANCE**

The present enrollment of 132 is the largest in ten years, as it was 119, 120, 124, 113, 112, 113, 117, 113, and 110 respectively for the preceding 9 years. This appreciable increase in the number of pupils enrolled in schools inside the district is due to the larger number than usual at the Hollow Elementary School where there are 59, in comparison to 47 a year ago at this time, while the number of 73 at the West Stewartstown School is only one more than last year's total of 72. The average percentage of attendance at these school, for the past year, taken in the same order, was 94.72 and 95.51, while the average number of tardinesses per pupil was .05 and .16.

**TUITION PUPILS**

By coincidence, as is true that the number of pupils enrolled in schools inside the district is the largest in ten years, so is the same thing for the number enrolled in schools outside, as there are 55 in comparison to 47, 47, 39, 45, 37, 35, 38, 31, and 37 respectively for the preceding nine years. A breakdown of this year's number of tuition pupils shows that there are 22 at Colebrook Academy, 30 at Canaan High School, Canaan, Vermont, and 3 at Colebrook Elementary School.

**CONCLUSION**

May I again express my sincere appreciation to the members of the School Board, parents, teachers, and citizens for all the assistance and cooperation received as we have worked together during the past several years in a joint effort to provide and maintain high standards in our schools.
