WARRANT FOR THE ANNUAL TOWN MEETING

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

(L. S.)

To the inhabitants of the Town of Webster, in the County of Merrimack, in said State, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Grange Hall in said Webster on Tuesday, the 12th day of March, next at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
3. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for the maintenance of highways and bridges.
 - (a) Summer Maintenance
 - (b) Winter Maintenance
 - (c) Tar Roads
 - (d) General Expense of Highway Department
 - (e) Street Lighting
4. To raise and appropriate the sum of \$442.82 for Class V road construction.
5. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for public welfare.
 - (a) Town Poor
 - (b) Old Age Assistance
6. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for the support of the town library.

7. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for patriotic purposes.

(a) Old Home Day

(b) Memorial Day

8. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for the support and maintenance of the Hy-Mar Fire Department, including forest fires.

9. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the care of cemeteries.

10. To see if the town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 for use in connection with the State program for the eradication of White Pine Blister Rust.

11. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed \$1,000.00 to be used to supplement a like amount donated by Mr. Clarence E. Hyde to build and improve a playground, Little League ball field and swimming facilities at the Webster Central School and picnic area.

12. To see if the town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$125.00 toward the operating deficit of the Concord Hospital, this amount being based on the number of patients admitted from Webster.

13. To authorize and empower the Board of Selectmen to borrow for the town by the issuance of notes a sum not exceeding \$20,000.00 in anticipation of taxes for the year 1957, said notes expressly payable from said taxes within one year from the date of issuance, and to authorize the Board of Selectmen to determine the rate of interest on such notes and to provide for the sale thereof.

14. To see what action the town wishes to take in regards to the purchase of Highway Equipment and appropriate such sum of money as may be needed to cover said equipment.

15. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

REPORT OF FOREST FIRE WARDEN

YOUR TOWN DUMP

Your town dump has been set up for your personal convenience. It provides a suitable place where you can dispose of the large amounts of dangerous, inflammable waste material and other useless items which accumulate around your household and local stores, brush, etc., cut on your property. The town dump has become a valuable and indispensable asset in modern community life.

The most successful town dumps are supervised—regular days provided for their use and inflammable material consistently burned. The town dump which receives no attention, where waste material is scattered about without supervision of any description, soon becomes a community menace and a liability rather than an asset.

Many people still burn debris around their homes. A large number of such fires get out of control causing unnecessary damage and expense to the burner. Why burn at home? Make use of your town dump and eliminate the hazard of burning. It will be easier for you—personally and financially.

If, however, you do burn on your premises

1. Secure a permit from your local forest fire warden—the law requires it.
2. Be sure to properly supervise your burning. Don't leave it.
3. Make certain your fire is DEAD OUT before leaving it.

After a very difficult year, 1955-1956, we have had an excellent start this year. Mrs. Wright who had finished out the year was forced to resign this summer. We were fortunate to secure Mrs. Rebecca Makin as the new teacher in the upper grades. Mrs. Makin is an experienced teacher and has taught in other towns in this Supervisory Union. The children appear to be very happy and good progress is being made.

It is difficult for people to understand the shortage of teachers when there is no sharp increase in the number of children in the community. The last three years the national record for the total number of births has been broken, and this year, it is to be broken again with over four million babies born during 1956. This means more class rooms, and more teachers to provide for the increasing number of children pouring into the nation's schools. Increased demand for teachers and short supply can only mean increased salaries for teachers. Beginning teachers are asking and getting salaries that are equal and above what our experienced teachers are getting in the smaller towns. In order to meet this competition, we have to increase salaries.

Due to the efforts of the School Board and the Young Women's Club, new equipment has been added to our playground so that it is now very well equipped. Some work should be done to improve the baseball field. I understand there has been a generous offer by one of our local citizens to make such improvements on the Central School grounds. This is an excellent idea and every effort should be made to carry out this worthwhile program. A small expenditure of money by the District to improve recreation for our children will bring back rich dividends for the money, time, and effort spent in such a project.

I enjoy visiting in the Webster school and appreciate the cooperation and many courtesies that I have received.
