- 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$50.00 for Memorial Day.
- 11. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for support of the Library.
- 12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$150.00 for the Elliot Community Hospital of Keene, New Hampshire.
- 13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$25.00 for care of Town Clock.

- 14. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to appoint Constables instead of electing by ballot. (By Petition)
- 15. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate \$1,000.00 for the Police Department for protection of persons and property.
- 16. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate \$1,000.00 for maintenance and upkeep of the new Fire Station and Municipal Building.
- 17. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate \$500.00 to rent and maintain land for a public dump.
- 18. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate \$200.00 for the Monadnock Region Association of Southwestern New Hampshire for the issuance and distribution of printed matter, newspaper and magazine advertising, and by other means calling attention to the resources and natural advantages of the Town, in cooperation with the other thirty-seven towns in the Monadnock Region.
- 19. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$100.00 for care of parks and playgrounds.
- 20. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 for support of band concerts.
- 21. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$25.00 for Vital Statistics.
- 22. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,500.00 for fire protection and support of the Fire Department.
- 23. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$150.00 for Forest Fire Fighting Equipment.
- 24. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for Civil Defense.
- 25. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$2,500.00 for Bonds for Town Officers and Insurance.
- 26. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$775.00 for interest on temporary and long term notes.
- 27. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$850.00 for expenses of Social Security.

- 28. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$2,200.00 for Street Lights.
- 29. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$955.28 for TRA construction, the State to contribute \$6,368.55.

- 41. To see if the Town will vote and appropriate the sum of \$50.00 for Town Planning and \$50.00 for Town Conservation Commission.

- 42. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to apply for State Bridge Aid for the construction of one new bridge on Route 123 at foot of Hatch Hill. The Town's share to be \$5,500.00 for this project.
- 43. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$1,000.00 toward the above project and authorize the Selectmen to finance long term note of \$4,500.00.
- 44. To see if the Town will elect Town Clerk, Town Treasurer and Town Tax Collector for a three year term, as per Chapter 243 of N.H. RSA of 1967. (By Petition)
- 45. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$300.00 for Damages and Legal Expenses.
- 46. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to use the sum of \$2,500.00 from Arch Pond Fund toward the purchase of new water gates for Vilas Pool.

SELECTMEN'S REPORT

The taxpayer's of Alstead have used the new Building for a year now and we are pleased to report we have had many fine comments regarding it.

We had hoped to have had an official dedication for it but for unforseen reasons it did not materialize.

Our planning board finally got enough members and is now functioning and they were in hopes of having some building codes ready for this town meeting, due to sickness and other reasons it was impossible to do so. However, they are in hopes of having something in the near future.

Vilas Pool was opened a little late again this year and we feel that as our good weather is later or not at all that this is a good idea, it cuts down on the operating expenses and this helps a great deal. The Dam should have repairs and the Selectmen are in hopes you will act favorably on the Article asking for some Arch Pond funds for same as the Vilas account is pretty low.

The bridge on Cooper Hill road has let us down and we must do something about it. We are thinking about a culvert instead of another bridge similar to what was done at Darby Brook a few years ago and it has worked out very well.

In the New Hampshire Annual Report Contest, Alstead was awarded THIRD PLACE in CLASS II for the year 1967 in recognition of the excellence of its 1966 Annual Report by the University of New Hampshire.

Most residents of Alstead are probably aware that the town dump is shared by residents of Langdon. For the past several years they have contributed \$300.00 per year. Due to increase cost of this operation Langdon has been requested to pay \$400.00 for 1968.

During the year the Vilas Free Bed Fund at Mary Hitchcock Hospital has provided 76 days of service to 7 residents of Alstead for the year of 1967.

We are pleased to report an increase in the earnings as they have increased for this Free Bed Fund.

The support and assistance of the many who have helped us this year is greatly appreciated.

SUMMARY OF FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

Gentlemen:

Submitted herewith is the report of the annual examination and audit of the accounts of the Town of Alstead for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1967, which was made by this Division in accordance with the vote of the Town. Exhibits as hereafter listed are included as part of the report.

SCOPE OF AUDIT

Included in the examination and audit were the accounts and records of the Board of Selectmen, Treasurer, Tax Collector, Town Clerk, Road Agent, Trustees of Trust Funds and Vilas Pool.

FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Comparative Balance Sheets - December 31, 1966-December 31, 1967: (Exhibit A-1)

Comparative Balance Sheets as of December 31, 1966 and December 31, 1967, are presented in Exhibit A-1. As indicated therein, the financial condition of the Town Changed from a Surplus of \$289.33 to a Net Debt of \$5,332.78 during 1967.

Analysis of Change in Financial Condition: (Exhibit A-2)

An analysis of the change in financial condition of the Town during the year is made in Exhibit A-2, with the factors which caused the change indicated therein.

Comparative Statements of Appropriations and Expenditures - Estimated and Actual Revenues: (Exhibits A-3 & A-4)

Comparative statements of appropriations and expenditures, estimated and actual revenues for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1967, are presented in Exhibits A-3 and A-4. As indicated by the budget summary (Exhibit A-4), a revenue deficit of \$3,085.99, less a net unexpended balance of appropriations of \$2,517.88, resulted in a net budget deficit of \$568.11.

Summary Statement of Receipts and Expenditures: (Exhibit B-1)

A summary statement of receipts and expenditures for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1967, made up in accordance with the uniform classification of accounts, is included in Exhibit B-1. Proof of the Treasurer's balance as of December 31, 1967, is indicated in Exhibit B-2.

AUDIT PROCEDURE

The accounts and records of all town officials charged with the custody, receipt and disbursement of public funds were examined and audited. Vouchers and cancelled checks were compared with supporting invoices and payrolls as well as entries in the books of record. Receipts were checked by source insofar as possible and totals of receipts and expenditures verified. Book balances were verified by comparison with reconciled bank balances made from statements obtained from depository banks. Verification of uncollected taxes was made by mailing notices to delinquent taxpayers as indicated by the Collector's records. The amounts of uncollected and unredeemed taxes as indicated in this report are therefore subject to any changes which may be necessitated by the return of verification notices.

GENERAL COMMENTS

Current Surplus:

The current surplus (excess of total assets over current liabilities) decreased from \$25,289.33 to \$17,167.22, as shown herewith:

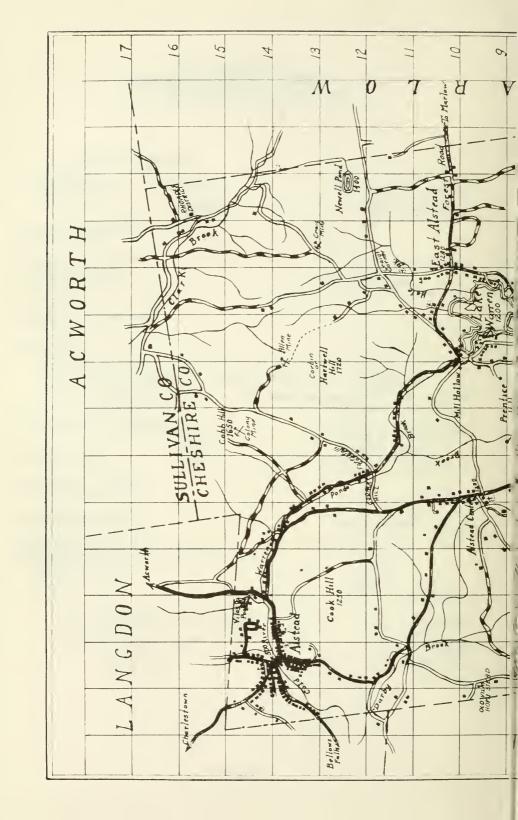

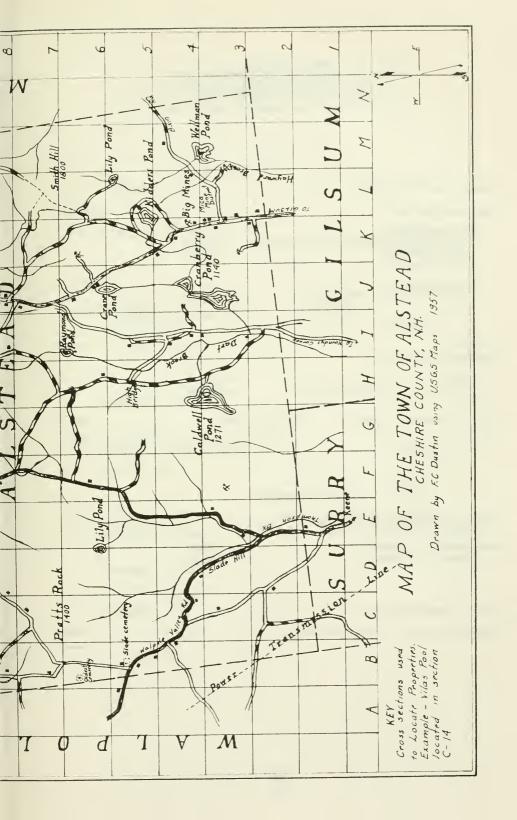

REPORT OF DOG CONSTABLE

The year 1967 has been a busy one. A total of 40 dogs were handled, of which 29 were returned to their owners, 9 were taken to the Cheshire County Humane Society, and 2 were laid away, due to illness and injury. 63 other complaints were investigated which includes 5 reports of deer chasing and 3 of cruelty.

Because of the new state law requring rabies vaccination, a clinic was held and an invitation was extended to surrounding towns. Dr. Tucker Burr conducted the clinic and felt it was a great success, as 278 dogs were vaccinated.

Unless readily identified, all stray dogs have been advertised on WKNE with very good results. I would like to impress upon the owners of dogs that it is really very beneficial both for dog and owner if the dog is provided with a sturdy collar to which are attached the license and rabies tags. This is a law and should be heeded.

Two dogs which had been missing from their out-of-state owners for over 3 months were located and returned. This requires considerable time spent making inquiries and checking through records kept of lost dogs, etc. but it is worth it to see an 11 year old boy get his Beagle pet back after a three month separation.

REPORT OF THE LIBRARIAN SHEDD-PORTER MEMORIAL LIBRARY FOR 1967

As your librarian, I hereby submit my report for 1967.

Your librarian is pleased to report that the book and magazine circulation for 1967 was the highest it has ever been. Due, I'm sure, to the encouragement given to the school children to read more. Their circulation was 5,994, almost half of the total book circulation of 12,728.

Our new Basic Reference Books, received last spring, have been used extensively this fall in reference work by pupils from Fall Mountain High as well as Vilas schools. We are to receive more Reference Books soon.

Book Week Posters were posted in Vilas Jr. High and Elementary Schools. The bus pupils, chaperoned by 2 mothers, visit the Library each Friday, weather permitting.

The Bookmobile has stopped here four times this year and 501 books were borrowed. The teachers of the first five grades visited and selected books from the Bookmobile for their classes.

Sixty-nine books were borrowed from the State Library in Concord by request.

Mrs. Laura MacLane, Mrs. Mildred Moultrop and your Librarian attended 4 book meetings in Walpole and Keene where many books were on display. The State Library Consultant and Bookmobile Supervisor gave book reviews.

Number of books added by purchase - 297; number of books added by gift - 7; number of magazines - 17; daily paper - 1; weekly paper - 1.

CONSERVATION COMMISSION

The Conservation Commission was established by the voters of Alstead at the 1966 annual town meeting. To date, the Commission has not fulfilled its legal responsibilities which include keeping an index of all open marshlands, swamps and other wetlands, as well as all open lands and land owned by the state or town. An initial obstacle was the lack of suitable maps of the area. The Commission is exploring the possibility of acquiring proper maps and has received guidance from the Soil Conservation Service representative in Keene. Maps with sufficient detail would require an expenditure of perhaps several hundred dollars.

Another drawback - and a more serious one - is the failure to find people willing to serve on the Commission. On Oct. 3rd the Selectmen co-sponsored a public informational meeting featuring Mr. Floyd Barker, Extension Coordinator on Natural Resources at the University of New Hampshire, who outlined the many exciting possibilites for town conservation. He also illustrated with colored slides the disastrous results of some New England towns where development was haphazard and unplanned. This meeting, however, did not result in attracting any new Commission members.

There are signs of hope-the re-activation of the Town Planning Board and recent response at public hearings-indicate there does indeed exist concern for the future of the town. Conservation Commissions are successfully carrying out many worthwhile projects elsewhere - why not here?
