TOWN WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Bartlett in the County of Carroll in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Bartlett on Tuesday, the twelfth day of March, next at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

3. To see if the voters will authorize the Selectmen and Town Treasurer to borrow a sum or sums not exceeding in the aggregate \$50,000 in anticipation of the collection of taxes for the current municipal year, and to issue in the name of the Town and on the credit of the same, negotiable notes therefore, said notes to be repaid during the current year from taxes collected within current municipal year.

4. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the Town through Tax Collector's deeds or by any other means by giving thirty (30) days notice by posting.

5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) to perambulate the town line between Hart's Location and Bartlett.

6. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the provisions of RSA 41.16-A, 41.2-A and 41.26-A to extend the term of office to three years for the Town Clerk, Town Tax Collector and Town Treasurer, agreeable to a petition signed by Arthur Harney and others.

7. To see if the Town will vote to pay the sum of Four Thousand Dollars (\$4000.00) to retire the final bridge note and place the sum of Five Hundred and Ninety-one Dollars and forty-six cents (\$591.46) in the Capital Reserves Tax Map account, according to the provisions of RSA 33.3-A.

8. To see if the Town will vote to have all property subject to taxation in the Town of Bartlett re-assessed by the State Tax Commission, in accordance with a petition signed by William Levy and others.

9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Twenty-Five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000.00) for said re-assessment by the State Tax Commission, the above amount to be paid over a period of three years, in accordance with a petition signed by William Levy and others.

10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Twenty Thousand Dollars (\$20,000.00 to complete a tax map of the Town.

11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the amount of Four Hundred Dollars \$(400.00) to help the Carroll County Community Services, Inc. In accordance with a petition signed by William Paine and others.

12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Five Thousand Dollars (\$5000.00) to be placed in a Capital Reserve Fund to be used for the replacement of the equipment of the Bartlett Village Fire Department and the Glen Volunteer Fire Department. In accordance with a petition signed by Raymond J. Kelley and others.

13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of One Thousand Dollars (\$1000.00) to be divided between the Bartlett Village Fire Department and the Glen Volunteer Fire Department for regular operating expenses of said departments. In accordance with a petition signed by Raymond J. Kelley and others.

14. To see if the Town will vote to accept the deed to a certain piece or parcel of land, being the road as shown on a map of "Holiday Ridge, Inc.," subject to the acceptance of the road thereon by the Selectmen as a town road. In accordance with a petition signed by E. J. Lindquist and others.

15. To see if the Town will vote to accept the deed to a certain piece or parcel of land, being the road as shown on a map of "Pendexter Woods," subject to the acceptance of the road thereon by the Selectmen as a town road. In accordance with a petition signed by Sheila Wyatt and others.

16. To see what sum the Town will vote to appropriate for the support of the Eastern Slope Regional Airport for the current year.

17. To see if the Town will vote to accept from Mittenwald, Inc., two parcels of land as described in a certain petition, signed by Ervin Grant and others. The Selectmen shall not maintain the road on such land unless and until the road shall have met the requirements for acceptance as a town road.

18. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

The book circulation for the Bartlett Public Library for 1967 was the bartet tuble to the bartet tuble tuble to the two was 6,529, an increase of 962 books over 1966 circulation. Three hundred and twenty-three new books were purchased and several were given to the library. Mr. David Taylor subscribed to the "American Opinion" magazine for the library. The bookmobile visited the library four times and left a total of 817 books.

The librarian took a course in "Public Library Techniques" in the fall of 1967 and plans to take the course "Programs and Children's Work" that will be offered this spring. These courses are given through the University of New Hampshire Extension Service and are held weekly for ten weeks at Plymouth State College. The librarian attended five co-operative bookbuying meetings and a workshop on library policy making. Because the library is part of the North Country Co-operative Library

Because the library is part of the North Country Co-operative Library System, the library is able to purchase its books at 38% discount as com-pared to 25-30% that we would receive if buying books alone. We also received a state aid grant of \$100.00 for reference books. This year we purchased a 1968 edition of the Compton's Pictured Encyclopedia. The "Friends of Library" group under the chairmanship of Mrs. Ben-son Howard, met and planned activities for National Children's Book Week in November, and are now making plans for National Library Week in April. Monthly film programs on Authors are being held for teen-agers. This year's budget is basically the same as last year except we would

This year's budget is basically the same as last year, except we would like to purchase some much needed free standing stacks. At present our shelving is inadequate and with more book purchases, there will not be shelf room for the books.

Report of Forest Fire Warden and District Chief

After several successive years of drought, the rains of 1967 came as a welcome change. Our records of the past fire season is good. Our thanks to all who contributed to achieve this good record. Continued improvement in the matter of accurate, prompt detection and rapid effective suppression action can help to maintain this good, worthwhile record even though we do not have an abundance of rain as in the fire season of 1967.¹

It will help if we follow these simple suggestions:

- 1. No burning of debris and waste between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. and then only with a written permit from the Forest Fire Warden.
- 2. Take debris and waste to the town dump.
- 3. Maintain a clean, safe dump.
- 4. Keep matches away from young children.
- 5. Be sure matches and smoking material are dead out when we discard them.
- 6. Set a good example for others in fire prevention.

Regional Airport Report - 1967

Fryeburg, Maine

February 8, 1968

To the Selectmen of the Area Towns:

In the year 1967, the Directors of the Eastern Slope Regional Airport Authority have experienced another year of further progress, mixed, as usual, with a number of problems. Use of the airport has certainly continued at least at as great a level as in former years, in spite of Operator matters beyond the control of the Directors.

The Operators engaged at the beginning of 1967 found themselves unable to continue the operation beyond the Spring, due to transfer of one of their number to foreign service. Accordingly, it was necessary for the Authority to employ an attendant at the airport during the summer of 1967 while searching for a new Operator. However, during the summer a substantial improvement was made to protect the airport by the sealing of pavement cracks, which should leave the pavement in good condition for many years.

With the Fall of 1967, the Directors have made arrangements with a new Operator, Mr. Hanson, whose subsequent operation of the airport has, in the opinion of the Directors, been superior to any previously experienced. In fact, usage of the airport has grown to such an extent that in December of 1967, the Directors voted to undertake the erection of a six-place "T" hangar, because of the great demand by pilots in this area for winter protection for their craft. It is hoped that over the years rental income from this facility will go a long ways towards recovering its cost, as well as providing a valuable needed service. This hangar is now under construction, and will, hopefully, be in use during the last half of the 1967-68 winter season. It will exhaust all of the capital funds of the Airport Authority, and compel borrowing to at least a limited degree, thus making support by the municipalities even more necessary than in the past.

An interesting activity at the Airport during 1967 was the operation therefrom of a glider doing experimental research on clear air turbulence in the Mt. Washington area. Every potential new business which has made inquiries concerning the area has indicated that the airport has had a significant effect in attracting it here. The Directors urge that all citizens of area towns make an effort to pay a personal visit to the airport, so that they and their friends may be acquainted with its facilities and available services.

During the year of 1967, this department handled over 80 calls with a total of 177 hours work and 952 miles by car.

There was one arrest for disturbing the peace, with court action resulting in conviction.

Rabies Vaccination Required

RSA 442-A:2 Rabies Vaccination Required. Every dog three months of age and older shall be vaccinated against rabies. Young dogs shall be vaccinated within thirty days after they have reached three months of age. Unvaccinated dogs acquired or moved into the state must be vaccinated within thirty days after purchase or arrival, unless under three months of age, as specified above. Every dog shall be revaccinated at not more than twelve-month intervals with killed vaccine or thirty-six months chick embyro, LEP Flury Vaccine. In rabies infected areas, dogs recently vaccinated should be kept under control for at least thirty days before being allowed to run free.

RSA 188:2 Vaccination Prerequisite to Licensing. Before a license is issued under the provisions of the subdivision, except under the provisions of section 6, the owner or keeper of a dog shall furnish to the clerk a certification that said dog has been vaccinated against rabies in accordance with the provisions of RSA 442:A.

Dogs must be licensed on or before April 30th if dog is 3 months old or older and wear a license tag to comply with N. H. Laws, chapter 446, RSA or owner shall FORFEIT \$15.00 to town dog is kept in.

All of the children received eye and ear examinations and physical inspections.

42 students in grades 1, 4, and 7 had physical examinations at Memorial Hospital.

10 children received Measles vaccine.

A Dental Education Program was given by the State Dental Hygienist. Dental fluoride and cleaning treatment was offered to grades 1, 3, 6, and 7.

WHY SPEECH THERAPY?

A child sits silently in his first grade classroom day after day unable to communicate with the other children or the teacher because his speech has not developed as rapidly as the other children's speech. A girl in Kennett High School dreads being called on in class because her hesitant, stuttering speech makes talking so difficult for her. Across the hall another student is straining to catch all that the teacher is saying. This student is handicapped by a hearing loss.

These are just some of the cases in our school union which have been helped through speech therapy. A total of 125 students have been enrolled in this new remedial speech program. The following breakdown shows the number of students enrolled in speech therapy from each school:

Conway – 22	Tamworth -20
Pine Tree – 10	Madison – 7
John Fuller — 24	Jackson – 3
Kennett – 12	Chatham – 2
Bartlett — 15	Freedom – 10

Defective speech can be defined as speech which calls attention to itself. When a child uses speech that is not normal or that calls attention to itself, a program of speech therapy is necessary. Our goal is to help the child with defective speech attain normal, acceptable speech.

To facilitate this end we are fortunate enough to have some very up-to-date equipment, including one item of special importance -a video tape recorder. This machine is like a miniature TV camera in that a child's image can be recorded on tape along with his voice. We then play the tape back so the child can see and hear himself on the TV screen. This has proven invaluable in correcting some children's speech.

Speech difficulties are not something that occur only in other communities to other people's children. We have realized that fact here in School Union No. 9 and have set up an adequate program of speech therapy to help those children who need help in speech.

ELEMENTARY GUIDANCE COUNSELING

As an Elementary Guidance Counselor for Supervisory School Union No. 9 under the Title I Project, I am also a member of the teaching staff; and am concerned with the normal learning development of all the elementary school children in the Union.

Vocational Guidance is a part of my service. I feel that students should be exposed to the world of work, and should be helped to understand their own abilities and interests so that they can make realistic choices. Educational Guidance is closely related to Vocational Guidance and all other types of guidance, individual or group.

In addition to my personal contacts with students and consultations with teachers and parents, I give such tests as the Stanford Achievement Test, the Lorge-Thorndike I.Q. Test, and the State-Wide test for the eighth grades. These I evaluate and correlate in statistical form.

I am also trying to launch research on the effectiveness of the guidance program as regards its value to school children in their learning and developmental attitudes toward school.
