TOWN WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Chatham in the County Carroll in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House in said Chatham on Tuesday, the twelfth day of March, next at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of same.

3. To see if the Town will vote to establish a Planning Board of five (or seven) members with duties as set forth in Section 1-15, Chapter 36, N.H. Revised Statutes Annotated, 1955, to make a study of the Town's development and report to the Town appropriated recommendations for the promotion and maintenance of the Town's best development. The Board shall consist of one Selectman and four (or six) other citizens appointed by the Selectmen as provided in Chapter 26, N.H. Revised Statutes Annotated, 1955.

4. To see if the Town will vote to authorize and empower the Planning Board to approve or disapprove in its discretion new subdivisions and plats thereof showing streets, or the widening thereof, or parks, and upon adoption of this article, it shall be the duty of the Town Clerk to file with the Registry of Deeds of the County of Carroll a certificate or note showing that the said Planning Board has been so authorized, giving the date of authorization, as provided in Section 19, and Sections 19-29 inclusive, Chapter 36 of the N.H. Revised Statutes Annotated, 1955. If this article is adopted, it shall further be the duty of the Town Clerk to issue all certificates of failure when the Planning Board shall fail to take action as provided in Chapter 36: Sections 19, 20-29 inclusive.

5. To see if the Town will vote to allow a 2% discount on all property taxes paid within 30 days of Tax Bill.

6. To see if the Town will vote to donate \$200.00 to the Saco Valley Firemen's Association.

7. To see if the Town will raise \$61.64 asked for by the White Mountain Regional Association.

8. To see if the Town will raise \$25.00 for Civil Defense.

9. To see if the Town will raise \$75.00 for maintenance of Town Landing on Kimball Pond.

10. To see if the Town will raise \$1,250.00 toward the already \$2,000.00 to have the State build a new bridge on the Green Street Road in So. Chatham.

11. To see if the Town will raise \$300.00 for the use of the Fryeburg Dump.

12. To see if the Town will raise \$200.00 construction of the Town Hall Driveway.

13. To have the next Town Meeting at Six Thirty P.M.

14. To see what action the Town will take on the Budget submittal by the Budget Committee.

15. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

REPORT OF FOREST FIRE WARDEN & DISTRICT CHIEF

After several successive years of drought, the rains of 1967 came as a welcome change. Our record of the past fire season is good. Our thanks to all who contributed to achieve this good record. Continued improvement in the matter of accurate, prompt detection and rapid effective suppression action can help to maintain this good, worthwhile record even though we do not have an abundance of rain as in the fire season of 1967.

It will help if we follow these simple suggestions:

1. No burning of debris and waste between the hours of 9:00 A.M. and 5:00 P.M. and then only with a written permit from the Forest Fire Warden.

2. Take debris and waste to the town dump.

3. Maintain a clean, safe dump.

4. Keep matches away from young children.

5. Be sure matches and smoking material are dead out when we discard them.

6. Set a good example for others in fire prevention.
