# Town Warrant

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## THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

*To the Inhabitants of the Town of Exeter, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:*

You are hereby notified to meet in the Town Hall, in said town, on the second Tuesday of March next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1st. To choose by ballot and major vote a town clerk.
- 2nd. To choose by ballot and major vote one selectman for three years.
- 3rd. To choose by ballot and major vote one trustee of the Robinson Female Seminary for the term of seven years.
- 4th. To choose by ballot and major vote one trustee of the trust funds held by the Town of Exeter, to hold office for three years.
- 5th. To choose all other necessary town officers, auditors, or committees for the ensuing year.
- 6th. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the maintenance of the poor, for repairing highways, for repairing and building bridges, for repairing and building side-walks, for building drains and sewers, for oiling the streets, for payment of the town debt, for lighting streets, for defraying the expenses of decorating the graves of Union soldiers, for preventing the spread of insect pests within the town, and for other charges arising within the town, and for the payment of the firemen for the ensuing year.
- 7th. To hear the reports of the committees heretofore chosen and pass any votes relating thereto.

8th. To see what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate for the use of the Robinson Female Seminary during the coming year.

9th. On petition of Arthur O. Fuller and nine others, to see if the town will vote to authorize the Trustees of Robinson Female Seminary to sell and convey to Alfred R. Wightman the premises on Front Street known as the Buzell place, upon the terms agreed upon by them and said Wightman and the representatives of the estate of the late Susan M. Buzell.

10th. On petition of Henry A. Shute and sixteen others, to see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of six hundred dollars for the purpose of a series of summer concerts, ten in number, to be played in the Swasey Memorial Bandstand during the summer of 1929 by the Exeter Brass Band.

11th. On petition of Frank G. Peavey and twenty-four others, to see if the town will vote to apply for State Aid upon Newmarket Road, and appropriate the sum of \$3,235.50 to be expended in the repair of said road.

12th. On petition of Samuel Kopka and fifteen others to see if the town will vote to install a sewer on Brown Court in said Exeter, and appropriate money for the same.

13th. On petition of James McLane and fourteen others, to see if the town will vote to place an electric light at the corner of Front and Cottage streets, and appropriate money for the same.

14th. On petition of Ralph E. Meras and sixteen others, to see if the town will vote to discontinue carrying insurance on its buildings, as present policies expire, and deposit the amount now paid for such insurance at interest, half with the Exeter Banking Company, and half with the Rockingham National Bank, to accumulate to a total of ten thousand dollars, at which time such deposits shall cease and the interest thereafter be deducted from the amount to be raised otherwise by taxation.

15th. On petition of Lester E. Williams and fourteen others, to see if the town will vote to adopt the provisions of Chapter 26 of the Public Laws (commonly called the Australian Ballot System) for the Town Meeting of 1930 and all subsequent Town Meetings for the election of: Town Clerk, Selectman, Town Treasurer, Collector of Taxes, Trustees of Trust Funds, Members of the Library Committee, and Trustee of the Robinson Female Seminary.

16th. On petition of James A. Tufts, Jr., and fifteen others, to see if the town will vote to appropriate two hundred and fifty dollars (\$250.00) for the use of the Exeter Old Home Day Association, to help defray the expenses of an Old Home Day observance in the current year.

17th. To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen to sell and convey the land and building on Water Street known as Hose House No. 2, and also the building on Kossuth Street, known as Hose House No. 3.

### *Administrative Changes*

#### 1. *The Scale of Marks.*

To clarify and simplify the method of marking, and to avoid misunderstandings, it was thought best to adopt the familiar

five point scale. This was done without changing the standards. A brief statement of the scale will be sufficient.

A—90 to 100

B—80 or 85

C—70 or 75

D—65 passing mark.

E—60 or below. This is the first failing grade that is entered in the permanent records.

## 2. *Permanent Records.*

A card system of recording marks has been selected. Each card provides for the complete academic and personal record of an individual pupil, giving at a glance all data included in the permanent records. Letters are used on the pupil report cards, but only the equivalent numerical marks are placed on the office record cards.

## 3. *Text-Books.*

(a) Mathematics. To replace worn texts and to modernize the course in mathematics in the seventh and eighth grades, *Stone's New Mathematics, Book I*, was selected for the seventh grade. If this text proves to be satisfactory, Book II will be used in the eighth grade next year.

(b) Typewriting. *The New Rational Typewriting* was adopted to replace worn texts and with a view to improving the course. The methods involved have been proved highly satisfactory and to obtain the desired results. Special practice sets purchased by the pupils, aid greatly in unifying the work and in checking the real progress of each pupil. Measurement of progress is always sought and it seems more possible with the new methods.

(c) Sociology. Nearly all text-books in Sociology seem to present the material for discussion in the reverse order from that which logic would dictate, that is offer problems for con-

sideration before the necessary background had been suggested. For this reason the new text, *Sociology and Modern Social Problems*, was chosen after the consideration of three late editions of well known books. The author guides the pupil in a logical way to an intelligent study of social problems.

### *Recommendations for 1929-1930*

#### *1. Requirements for Graduation:*

I heartily recommend that beginning with the year 1929-1930, the requirements for graduation be stated in terms of the unit system. In brief the plan is as follows:

16 units required for graduation.

A unit is equivalent to a year's work in a subject and constituting approximately one fourth of the year's work.

This plan is approved and followed by the majority of secondary schools and it is expressed in the terms used by all post-secondary institutions. When the requirements are stated in points, it is necessary to add an explanation of the value of the points when a transcript of marks is furnished for some other school.

In addition to simply avoiding confusion in records, this plan causes the pupils to think of their work in terms of subjects and not so much in terms of points. Under the present system, which requires 74 points for graduation, it is possible to earn 74 points and not fulfill the state requirements of 16 units. Pupils in the senior high division will be awarded credit in units on the basis of the subjects passed and all pupils entering the high school in the future will follow the unit plan easily. A well planned course is necessary for lasting benefit.

#### *2. Passing mark:*

I consider it advisable to raise the passing mark in all subjects to 70%. Such a standard will train the pupils to meet

the requirements of the higher institutions and at the same time make only a reasonable demand on those who will complete their formal education in the secondary school. A low passing mark never serves as a proper incentive to do one's best, and for that reason I regard 70% as a mark which would impress the pupils with the more serious nature of the work before them. There is yet the margin to allow for the individual differences found in any group.

### 3. *A New Course:*

With the rapidly increasing volume of history, it becomes advisable to alter the program of the secondary schools to meet the conditions. I recommend that a course in Modern European History be either substituted for, or alternated with the present course in English History. A change of this kind makes history as a whole more meaningful and offers a close companion course to American History, which follows in the senior year. Opinions of interested parties are desired.

### *Inspections:*

In November, the annual inspection under the State Department of Education was made by Russell H. Leavitt, state agent.

Under the supervision of Dr. Chesley and Miss Warren, the annual medical examinations were made and the parents informed of remedial action deemed advisable.

### *Parental Interest and Co-operation:*

I take this opportunity to suggest something that is often forgotten in any community. In spite of all the new textbooks and highly improved methods, no faculty can meet the demands frequently made by the community without the aid of one factor not in their power to control, that is parental interest and genuine co-operation. Several cases in which this has been entirely lacking prompts a mention of it. Thoughtful advice, wisely given by parents, can very nicely



supplement the efforts of the school authorities and bring pleasing results. On the other hand, no parent has a right to criticize the school adversely until he has done his part to encourage his child to do well that which is assigned, and to comply with the reasonable rules of the school. Criticism should be made on the basis of accurate information and any such criticism will be considered with respect and courtesy.

I sincerely trust that the records for the year will substantiate the present impression of satisfactory progress in all departments.
