#### TOWN WARRANT

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Fremont in the County of Rockingham, in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

#### [L. S.]

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Fremont on Tuesday, the twelfth day of March, next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To hear the report of the budget committee and act thereon.
- 3. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be deemed necessary, for the following purposes: town charges, care of cemeteries, street lighting, support of poor, old age assistance, maintenance of highways and bridges, general expenses of highway department, public library, and for Memorial Day.
- 4. To see if the town will vote to accept Class II or Class V aid from the State on highways and raïse either \$823.50 for Class II or \$245.10 for Class V highway construction, to be expended on Sandown road.
- 5. On petition of Clifton H. Beede and 57 others, to see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$1,500.00 for the further construction and improvement of the Sandown road (so-called), said sum of money to be expended during the year 1940 under the direction of the Selectmen.

- 6. To see if the town will vote to purchase a V type truck plow for snow removal and raise and appropriate money for same
- 7. To see if the town will vote to cooperate with the State Forestry Department in the control of the White Pine Blister Rust and raise and appropriate money for same.
- 8. To see if the town will vote to put a fire escape on the Town Hall and raise and appropriate money for same.
- 9. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
- 10. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.
