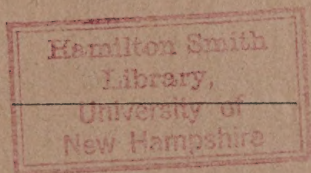

## TO THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES :

There are 3,816 books in the library. One hundred and seventy-one have been added by purchase and 17 by gift. Ninety-three new cards have been issued. Amount received from fines, rentals, new cards, etc., \$28.91.
