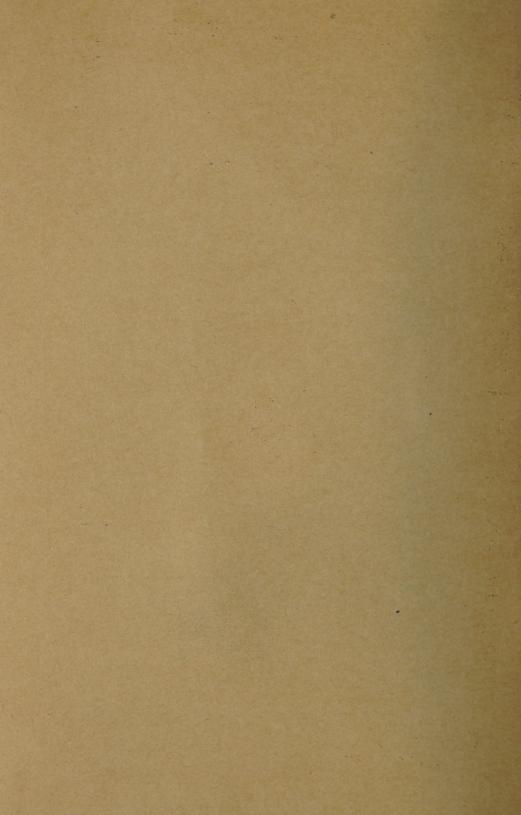

TOWN MEETING WARRANT

The State of New Hampshire

To the inhabitants of the Town of Lyman, in the County of Grafton, and the State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in the town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Lyman Town Hall in said town, on Tuesday, the 11th day of March, 1958, polls to open at ten o'clock in the forenoon and will not be closed before five o'clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- **Article 1.** To choose all necessary town officers for the ensuing year.
- **Article 2.** To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year.
- **Article 3.** To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of two thousand dollars (\$2,000.00) for the repair of town highways for the ensuing year.
- **Article 4.** To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of two thousand dollars (\$2,000.00) for the maintenance of its winter roads.
- Article 5. To see if the town will vote to accept Town Road Aid, and raise and appropriate the sum of five hundred ninety one dollars and sixty four cents (\$591.64) for the same.
- Article 6. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of two thousand dollars (\$2,000.00) for the general expense of the highway department.
- **Article 7.** To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of one hundred and twenty five dollars (\$125.00) for the compensation of the tax collector.
- Article 8. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate one hundred dollars (\$100.00) for the Blister Rust Control.

- Article 9. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) for the District Nursing Association.
- Article 10. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of ten dollars (\$10.00) for the observance of Memorial Day.
- Article 11. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to borrow such sums of money as they may deem necessary in anticipation of taxes.
- **Article 12.** To see what sums of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the town officers salaries and town officers' expenses.
- Article 13. To see if the town will vote to grant a discount of 2% on all taxes paid on or before such time as the selectmen may designate.
- Article 14. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate one hundred dollars (\$100.00) on account of property fires.
- Article 15. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of thirty-seven dollars and sixty one cents (\$37.61) for the White Mountain Region Association.
- Article 16. To see if the town wishes to continue obtaining the services of the state auditors for the yearly audit of the town books.
- Article 17. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the necessary money to defray the town's share of the cost of the Federal Social Security benefits extended to the town employees.
- Article 18. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate two hundred dollars (\$200.00) for the upkeep of the cemeteries in the town, as required by law.
- Article 19. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of five hundred (\$500.00) for the maintenance of its town bridges.

Article 20. To see if the town will vote to purchase any new equipment; and if so, to raise and appropriate the necessary money for the same; and if necessary, to authorize the selectmen to issue notes, or serial notes, on credit of the town, on such terms and at such rate of intsrest as may be necessary.

Article 21. To see if the town will authorize the selectmen to sell and dispose of any real estate acquired by the town by tax deeds.

Article 22. To hear the reports of agents, auditors, committees and officers heretofore chosen, and pass votes relative thereto.

Article 23. To transact any business that may legally come before the meeting.

Board of Selectmen Lyman, New Hampshire Gentlemen:

Submitted herewith is the report of the annual examination and audit of the accounts of the Town of Lyman for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1957, which was made by this Division as requested. Exhibits as hereafter listed are included as part of the report.

SCOPE OF AUDIT

Included in the examination and audit were the accounts and records of the Board of Selectmen, Treasurer, Tax Collector, Town Clerk and Trustees of Trust Funds.

FINANCIAL STATEMENTS Comparative Balance Sheets December 31, 1956 — December 31, 1957 (Exhibit A-1)

Comparative Balance Sheets as of December 31, 1956 and December 31, 1957, are presented in Exhibit A-1. As indicated therein, the Surplus increased by \$2,454.99 in 1957.

Analysis of Change in Financial Condition (Exhibit A-2)

An analysis of the change in financial condition of the Town during the year is made in Exhibit A-2, with the factors which caused the change indicated therein. These were as follows:

Comparative Statement of Appropriations and Expenditures-Estimated and Actual Revenues:

(Exhibits A-3 & A-4)

Comparative statements of appropriations and expenditures, estimated and actual revenues for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1957, are presented in Exhibits A-3 and A-4. As indicated by the budget summary (Exhibit A-4), a revenue surplus of \$1,904.10, plus a net unexpended balance of appropriations of \$817.32, resulted in a net budget surplus of \$2,721.42.

Summary of Receipts and Expenditures

(Exhibit B-1)

A summary of receipts and expenditures for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1957, made up in accordance with the uniform classification of accounts, is included in Exhibit B-1. Proof of the Treasurer's balance as of December 31, 1957, is indicated in Exhibit B-2.

AUDIT PROCEDURE

The accounts and records of all town officials charged with the custody, receipt and disbursement of public funds were examined and audited. Vouchers and cancelled checks were compared with supporting invoices and payrolls as well as entries in the books of record. Receipts were checked by source insofar as possible and totals of receipts and expenditures verified. Book balances were verified by comparison with reconciled bank balances made from statements obtained from depository banks. Verification of uncollected taxes was made by mailing notices to delinquent taxpayers as indicated by the Collector's records.

Conclusion:

The provisions of Chapter 184 of the Laws of 1955, require that this report or the summary of findings and recommendations (letter of transmittal) shall be published in the next annual report of the Town.

We extend our thanks to the officials of the Town of Lyman for their assistance during the course of the audit.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the School Board and Citizens of the Lyman School District:

I herewith submit my fifteenth annual report as Superintendent of Schools.

The total enrollment in your school last year was 27. The average membership was 26.2 and the percent of attendance was 96.16.

There were 5 pupils who attended junior high school and 11 pupils who attended high school in Lisbon.

The present enrollment is as follows: 28 pupils in Grades 1-6, 5 pupils in Grades 7 and 8 at Lisbon, and 8 pupils in the high school.

Graduating from Lisbon High School this year are Mabel Clough and Ernest Hart.

Mrs. Clara Birch completes her tenth year as teacher in Lyman. It is interesting to note that Mrs. Birch's daughter, Ruth, a former pupil of the Lyman schools, is a successful elementary principal in Athol, Mass. Ruth passes on many good teaching aids to be used by her mother for the Lyman children.

In January Miss Gloria Washburn replaced Mrs. Phyllis Rogers as school nurse. Miss Washburn has made an excellent start in her work. At present she is helping the children go to Dr. G. A. Clark's office for dental treatment. This program, in Grades 2 and 6, is sponsored by the Lisbon Dental Clinic.

Under a new law, effective last year for the first time, all towns receive tuition for foster children living in town and likewise assume responsibility for foster children who lived in town when the home was first broken. Under this law Lyman receives tuition for four children and pays for one child. Two children attend Lisbon High School with tuition assumed by Lisbon Special School District.

I wish to thank the School Board for their help and cooperation.

REPORT OF FOREST FIRE WARDEN

Forest Fire Prevention is Everybody's Business

To meet the challenge successfully, the state, your community and your local forest fire warden need YOUR thoughtful and cooperative effort. The rules are simple.

- 1. Don't burn at home, use your town dump and avoid all fire problems.
- 2. If you do burn, be sure to secure a written permit from your local forest fire warden when the ground is not covered with snow. Permits are required for open debris fires, home incinerators, outdoor fire places and camp fires. Your warden is instructed to permit burning if weather conditions, site and type of burning are safe.
- 3. Be sure that all lighted material; cigars, cigarettes and matches, are completely out before discarding them. Use ash trays in automobiles.
- 4. Make certain that your debris, camp and cook fires are completely out before leaving them.
- 5. Insist that others be careful and comply with burning requirements.
- 6. Call the warden promptly when fire is detected and aid him to extinguish it.
