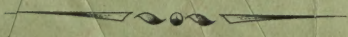



WARRANT.

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE.

*To the Inhabitants of the Town of Milan qualified to vote in town affairs:—*

You are hereby notified to meet at the Hall in the Odd Fellows' block, in said town, on the second Tuesday of March next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose a moderator to preside in said meeting.
2. To choose by ballot and major vote a town clerk.
3. To choose by ballot and major vote three selectmen, and one town treasurer.
4. To choose road agents and all other necessary town officers, including fish and game warden.
5. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the maintenance of the poor, to pay interest on town notes and apply on town debts and other necessary charges arising within the town.
6. To see what sums of money the town will raise for laying out, building and repairing highways and bridges.
7. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the support of schools.
8. To see if the town will vote to have a liquor agent.
9. To see if the town will vote not to distribute inventory blanks until such time as the selectmen shall examine and appraise property to be taxed.
10. To see if the town will vote to require the Upper Ammonoosuc Railroad Company to lower the highway

and make it level with the railroad crossing in West Milan village, and to raise the highway at the end of the bridge on the Higgins road, near West Milan village, and make it level with the crossing of said railroad, and to furnish a flagman at the two said crossings, and also to comply with the statutes in regard to the speed of trains in said village, and the giving of the required whistles with locomotive, also to stop dropping cars over the main road crossing without proper motive power attached to them, so as to stop them in case of danger, and to comply with the law in regard to leaving engines and cars on and too near the said crossings.

11. To hear the reports of agents, auditors, committees, or officers heretofore chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.
