## THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

---

To the Inhabitants of the Town of New Hampton, in the County of Belknap, in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House in said New Hampton, on Tuesday, the fourteenth (14) day of March next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriation of the same.

3. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the repair of highways and bridges and make appropriation of the same.

4. To see what action the town will vote to take in regard to a road at the south end of the town, beginning at the Kate Coolidge place, extending across said Coolidge land and land of Lucian Fogg to the said Fogg place, a distance of about one mile, and raise and appropriate money for the same.

5. To see if the town will vote to accept State aid for the maintenance of highways and raise and appropriate money for the same.

6. To see if the town will vote to accept State aid for the construction of highways and raise and appropriate money for the same.

7. To see how much money the town will vote to raise for the payment of long term notes and make appropriation of the same.



8. To see how much money the town will vote to raise for Memorial Day and the decoration of soldiers' graves and make appropriation of the same.

9. To see how much money the town will vote to raise for Old Home Day and make appropriation of the same.

10. To see if the town will vote to raise \$300.00 for the control of Blister rust and make appropriation of the same.

11. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and contribute to the support of the Laconia Hospital and make appropriation of the same.

12. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to hire money in anticipation of taxes.

13. To see if the town will vote to allow the playing of baseball on Sundays, after one o'clock P. M., by request.

14. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

## REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

**To the School Board:**

I have the honor to present my fourth annual school report. Last September our six schools opened with an enrollment of one hundred ten pupils. In addition to this figure we have twelve elementary school pupils attending school in Ashland and Meredith. We have thirty-one pupils attending high school in Ashland, Bristol, Meredith, and in the New Hampton school. Our total number of scholars is over one hundred forty. New Hampton could not support a high school at a cost of a little over three thousand dollars, as is the case at the present time. It is by far less expensive to send our children from the Winona district to Meredith than to support an additional school in that part of the town. Yet the fact remains that the cost of public education in New Hampton, without being enormous is substantial. When we consider that we are educating children for complex modern life, can we afford to do less? A guest who had been invited to supper helped himself to butter in generous amounts. The hostess turned to the guest and called his attention to the high cost of butter. The guest replied that he was aware of the fact, and smacking his lips added, "it is worth it."

Even though ours are one room schools, they are graded. We follow a modern program of studies. We use the program of studies suggested by the State Board of Education, the very one used by villages and cities where a teacher is provided for every grade. This means that we expect a great deal from our teachers who handle eight grades in one room. It also means that in order to put such a program across we must provide each school with a successful, well-trained and experienced teacher. It is commonly believed in New Hampton that we have such a body of teachers. Every district

in the town has received equal consideration. No poor teachers have been palmed off on any district. In fact in the district where the greatest concern in this respect was felt for a time this year, we have one of the two most experienced teachers in the town, a normal school graduate, and one of the two highest paid teachers in the town.

I am glad to voice the general satisfaction and happiness over the improvements which the school district has made possible for our schools. One half of the schools have electric lights. The others will have them as soon as power is available. Substantial repairs and alterations in the way of shingling, painting outside and in, new hard wood floors, new chimneys, and school yard improvements have been made. The Fiske school in addition to other improvements enjoy new movable adjustable school room furniture. The school rooms are the work shops of our children. There ambition is stirred, ideals are stimulated, and the keys which open the door to opportunity are forged. We are confident that gradually all the improvements which have been advocated will be made possible by the school district under the leadership of a school board which takes such interest and pride in the educational advancement of the town. Stagnation spells depression. Change and improvements bring on prosperity.

Just a word about health in our schools. Every year a certain number of children are bound to go through a period of sickness, affected with diseases which sooner or later every individual succumbs to. The only way out of such difficulties is for the families affected to be guided by the advice of the health authorities of the state, advice which is passed on to the public through the school board, the superintendent, and the teachers. In spite of our best efforts the work of one school has

been completely demoralized by the disregard of otherwise intelligent parents to follow our advice in regard to the school attendance of their children. This is to be regretted for it results into loss of time, money, and progress on the part of the children. We wish to appeal to the best judgment of our school patrons. Must the school authorities in the year of our Lord 1933 be obliged to enforce intelligent cooperation by resorting to the use of the arm of the law?

Some of the most interesting events since our last report have been the observance by the schools of the George Washington bicentennial celebration, and graduation last June. Both occasions were beautiful. The beauty of the occasions was surely enhanced by the music instruction enjoyed in our schools during the past two years. We must not forget to mention the school fair held under the auspices of the New Hampton Grange. That, too, is worthwhile training in citizenship. The activities which individuals engage in as children are unfailing earmarks of what they will do as adult citizens.

The bulk of my work as executive for the state and the local school board consists in providing the proper material for the schools to work with, in cooperating with my associates, and in furnishing a certain amount of leadership, and stimulation to a better understanding, and a greater conception of a very difficult occupation, namely, the education of all the children of all the people.
