EDUCATION AND TRAINING

We are continuing our in-force training program with a demonstration of the use of gas in crowd control, riots, etc. by a representative of the Federal Laboratories and the initial program in the use of firearms.

With the completion of the revolver range, we can arrange for instruction in all types of fire power on a regular basis, which should result in an improved efficiency in this area.

Several members of the department are now completing a police school conducted by the Rockingham County Sheriff's Department over the past six months.

TRAFFIC CONTROL AND HIGHWAY SAFETY

We have had an analysis of the present system of traffic control in the Depot area by the State Highway Department and it has been recommended that the town provide a new installation in this area, to comply with the National Traffic Code.

A traffic count conducted by the State Highway Department at Salem Center, in April, 1966 is available and this report would indicate a need for traffic control in that area.

In the interest of Public Safety, both areas should be provided with Automatic Traffic Control.

A concerted effort should be made to provide sidewalks in the vicinity of our new elementary schools and in addition; to extend this program to as many of our heavily traveled streets as possible.

There is an additional need for improved street lighting with a strong emphasis on providing adequate lighting for street intersections and the elimination of the so-called "bug light" which can be replaced at a minimal cost.

During the year 1967, the Salem Fire Department answered 407 alarms; 215 still and 192 box alarms, a decrease of 59 alarms from the previous year. The ambulance responded to 562 calls, an increase of 30 calls over 1966. The fire loss for the year was \$110,405.00 compared to a loss of \$127,000.00 for the year 1966. The fires at the A. Winger home and at Ackerman Hall accounted for losses of \$32,232.00 and \$31,629.00 respectfully.

The two firefighters authorized in last year's budget were added to the day shift. This year's budget includes a manpower request for the second and third shifts.

Civil Defense Director, Melvin Marsh, has informed the department that the CD Rescue Truck should be delivered in late April or May. Director Marsh and I have reviewed the equipment requirements of the New Hampshire Civil Defense authorities and the required items are included in the department's budget.

It is my recommendation again that serious consideration be given to the construction of a sub-station south of the Spicket River near Route 28. Each year the assessed property valuation increases between \$4.5 million and \$5.0 million and a major portion of this increase lies in the area where the new sub-station is proposed. Recent information indicates that the assessed property valuation has reached an all time high of \$85. million.

The other major deficiency reported in the 1966 Town Report still exists; that is, the need for an aerial ladder, an aerial tower or a Snorkel. We should realize that as our town grows so does the need for additional manpower and apparatus. The availability of personnel and specialized equipment are also prime factors in attracting new industry to a community.

The department extends its thanks to the citizens of Salem for their interest, cooperation and support.

Conducted a Christmas vacation program and plan a February vacation program for Jr. High and High School students.

Plans are made for one Jr. High School dance per month.

Ski instruction classes under the direction of Mr. Ray Landry are held weekly, ski conditions permitting.

A skating area has been prepared at the rear of Lancaster School.

A Council on the Arts has been formed to bring cultural programs to the residents of Salem.

I attended an informative workshop on recreational programming for retarded children.

I will continue to work to bring a program of recreation to Salem that serves all age groups. Any suggestions that will better our program are welcome.

SALEM CONSERVATION COMMISSION 1967

On May 18, 1967, the Conservation Commission and the Salem Planning Board met together to hear speaker Floyd Barker, Extension Coordinator, Natural Resources Development, from the University of New Hampshire. Mr. Barker formerly worked with the New Hampshire Soil Conservation Service and, from his wealth of experience, maps and data, emphasized to us in Salem the duty and desirability of mapping and indexing open space, marsh and wetlands, and any unique areas to be preserved untouched or developed for their appropriate use.

Throughout the year much time was spent in consideration of land for possible green areas or "open space" for Salem, especially in the "Little Saugus" and Millville Street areas adjacent to the park-like Millville Lake area which was recently purchased by the Town for recreational purposes.

The Conservation Commission will work with Recreation Director, Mr. George Brusco, in guiding the development of the Millville Lake Recreation Area.

In cooperation with the Contractors' Association, the Soil Removal Ordinance was again presented to and not accepted by the Planning Board. Three drafts of this Soil Ordinance have been prepared with varying restrictions, and several meetings with the Contractors' Association and the Planning Board have been held in an effort to procure a wise, protective Soil Removal Ordinance for Salem which will involve the best soil conservation practices for all. This effort will be continued as the Conservation Commission thinks it highly needful to establish basic regulations and understanding of wise land conservation.

A "Homebuilder's Award" was drawn up to be given by the Salem Conservation Commission to any builder fulfilling satisfactorily the following standards. The award will be granted yearly provided these building standards are met:

1. Suitability of the building to the site.
2. Preservation of natural features such as trees, rocks, stone walls and wildlife habitats.
3. Preservation of “Open Space” areas through careful layout.
4. Conservation and placement of adequate topsoil to support lawns and plantings.
5. Adequate off-street play areas for children.
6. Compliance with all zoning regulations and building codes.
7. Preservation of springs, brooks, and marshes.
8. Varied types of buildings to prevent monotonous repetition.

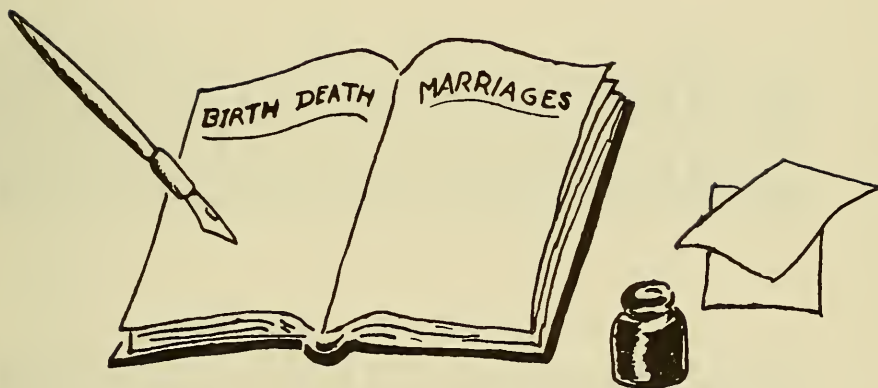

To the inhabitants of the Town of Salem, in the County of Rockingham in said State, qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Ackerman Hall, in said Town, on Tuesday the 12th day of March next, at ten o'clock (10:00) in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

Article 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.

Article 2. By petition: To see if the Town will vote to amend the Zoning Ordinance and the Zoning Map by designating the area shown on the 1967 Salem Tax Maps as Lot No. 10 on Map No. 105 and Lot No. 37 as shown on Map No. 106 to residential rather than rural. The area affected by such amendment is that area of the designated Lot No. 10 on Map No. 105 and Lot No. 37 on Map No. 106 lying Easterly of Oakridge Avenue and Southerly of Pond Street extending to the Salem, New Hampshire and Methuen, Massachusetts line.

Article 3. By petition: To see if the Town will vote favorably on the following question:

“Are you in favor of increasing the Board of Selectmen to five members?”

Article 4. By petition: To see if the Town is in favor of having a three-year term of office for the Tax Collector.

Article 5. By petition: To see if the Town is in favor of having a three-year term of office for the Town Clerk.

Article 6. By petition: To see if the Town is in favor of having a three-year term of office for the Town Treasurer.

Article 7. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the following Housing Code for Salem.†

TOWN OF SALEM

In the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and sixty-eight.

AN ORDINANCE Establishing and Enforcing Minimum Standards for Use and Occupancy of Dwellings and Requiring the Repair, Closing, or Demolition of Dwellings Unfit for Human Habitation.

Whereas, in the Town of Salem, there are dwellings which are unfit for human habitation due to dilapidation, dangerous defects that are likely to result in fire, accidents, or other calamities, unhealthful lack of ventilation or sanitary facilities, or due to other unhealthy or dilapidated conditions; and

Whereas, such conditions adversely affect public health and safety, and lead to the continuation, extension, and aggravation of urban blight; and

Whereas, adequate protection of public health, safety, and welfare therefore requires the establishment and enforcement of minimum housing standards; now therefore

The Town of Salem ordains as follows:

Section 1 (a) Short Title. This ordinance shall be known and may be cited as the "Housing Code".

(b) That a public agency is hereby created under the provisions of R.S.A. 48-A, that the agency consist of the head of the Town Health Department, the head of the Town Fire Department, and the Town Engineer.

Section 2. Definitions. The following definitions shall apply in the interpretation and enforcement of this ordinance.

- (1) "Agency" shall mean the public agency referred to in Section 1 (b).
- (2) "Basement" is a portion of any dwelling located partly underground, but having less than half its clear floor-to-ceiling height below the average grade of the adjoining ground.
- (3) "Building Code" is the Building Code of this Town.
- (4) "Cellar" is a portion of any dwelling having half or more than half of its clear floor-to-ceiling height below the average grade of the adjoining ground.
- (5) "Town" is the Town of Salem.
- (6) "Dwelling" shall mean any building, structure, camp, trailer, dwelling unit, rooming house, or rooming unit, or any part thereof used for human habitation or intended to be so used, including any appurtenances belonging thereto or usually enjoyed therewith.
- (7) "Dwelling unit" is a room or group of rooms located within a dwelling and forming a single habitable unit with facilities which are used or intended to be used for living, sleeping, cooking, and eating.
- (8) "Habitable room" is a room or enclosed floor space used or intended to be used for living, sleeping, or eating purposes, excluding bathrooms, water closet compartments, laundries, foyers, pantries, communicating corridors, stairways, closets, basement recreation rooms, and storage spaces.
- (9) "Multi-family dwelling" is any dwelling or part thereof containing three or more dwelling units.
- (10) "Occupant" is any person including an owner or operator living and sleeping in a dwelling unit or rooming unit.

(11) "Openable area" is the part of a window or door which is available for unobstructed ventilation and which opens directly to the outdoors.

(12) "Operator" is any person having charge, care, management or control of any dwelling or part of it, in which dwelling units or rooming units are let.

(13) "Owner" is any person who, alone, jointly or severally with others, holds legal or equitable title to any dwelling, rooming house, dwelling unit, or rooming unit.

(14) "Person" is any person, firm, partnership, association, corporation, company, or organization of any kind.

(15) "Plumbing" is water-heating facilities, water pipes, garbage disposal units, waste pipes, water closets, sinks, installed dishwashers, lavatories, bathtubs, shower baths, installed clothes-washing machines, catch basins, drains, vents, and other similar supplied fixtures, together with all connections to water or sewer lines.

(16) "Plumbing Code" is the National Plumbing Code.

(17) "Premises" is a lot, plot, or parcel of land including the buildings and structures thereon.

(18) "Rooming house" is any dwelling, or that part thereof containing one or more rooming units, in which space is let to three or more persons.

(19) "Rooming unit" is any room or group of rooms forming a single habitable unit used or intended to be used for living and sleeping, but not for cooking or eating purposes.

(20) "Supplied" is installed, furnished, or provided by the owner or operator at his expense.

(21) "Two-family dwelling" is any dwelling containing two dwelling units.

(22) "Yard" is all ground, lawn, court, walk, driveway, or other open space constituting part of the same premises as the dwelling.

Section 3. Minimum Standards for Basic Equipment and Facilities.

No person shall occupy as owner-occupant or shall let to another for occupancy any dwelling, rooming house, dwelling unit, or rooming unit which does not comply with the following minimum standards for basic equipment and facilities:

(1) Dwelling Units. Every dwelling unit shall contain within its walls:

(a) Lavatory Facilities. A room, separate from the habitable rooms, which affords privacy and which is equipped with a flush water closet and a lavatory basin.

(b) Bathtub or Shower. A room, separate from the habitable rooms, which affords privacy to a person in the room and which is equipped with a bathtub or shower.

(c) Kitchen Sink. A kitchen sink.

(d) Sharing by Dwelling Units in Same Building. The occupants of not more than two dwelling units which are located in the same dwelling shall have its own sanitation facilities, including water closet, lavatory and tub or shower, providing:

1. Neither of the two dwelling units contains more than two rooms; however, for the purposes of this subsection, a kitchen with not more than 60 square feet of floor area is not counted as a room.

2. The habitable room area of each of such dwelling units aggregates not less than 400 square feet, exclusive of sanitation area.

(2) Water Line Connections. Every kitchen sink, lavatory basin, and bathtub or shower required by this ordinance shall be properly connected with both hot and cold water lines. The hot water lines shall be connected with supplied water-heating facilities which are capable of heating water to such a temperature as to permit an adequate amount of water to be drawn at every required kitchen sink, lavatory basin, and tub or shower at a temperature of not less than 120 degrees Fahrenheit even when the heating facilities required by this ordinance are not in operation.

(a) Plumbing Fixtures. All plumbing fixtures required by this section shall be properly connected to an approved water system and to an approved sewerage system.

(3) Rubbish Collection. Every multi-family dwelling shall have approved common garbage and rubbish storage or disposal facilities.

(4) Egress. Every dwelling unit and rooming unit shall have a safe and unobstructed means of egress leading to a safe and open space at ground level, as required by the laws of this State and this Town.

(5) Rooming House - Additional Sanitation Standards.

(a) Lavatories. Every rooming house shall be equipped with at least one flush water closet, one lavatory basin and one bathtub or shower for each six persons or fraction thereof living within the rooming house, including members of the family of the owner or operator if they share the use of facilities. In a rooming house in which rooms are let only to males, flush urinals may be substituted for not more than one-half the required number of water closets. All such facilities shall be properly connected to approved water and sewerage systems. No such facility located in a basement or cellar shall count in computing the number of facilities required by this subsection except when approved by the Inspector of Buildings. Every flush water closet, flush urinal, lavatory basin, and bathtub or shower required by this subsection shall be located within the rooming house in a room or rooms which:

1. Afford privacy and are separate from the habitable rooms.
2. Are accessible from a common hall and without going outside the rooming house.
3. Are not more than one story removed from the rooming unit of any occupant intended to share the facilities.

(b) Bedding and Towels. When bedding, bed linen or towels are supplied, the owner or operator shall maintain the bedding in a clean and sanitary manner, and he shall furnish clean bed linen and towels at least once each week and prior to the letting of any room to any occupant.

Section 4. Ventilation, Light, Heating and Screens. No person shall occupy as owner-occupant or shall let to another for occupancy any dwelling, rooming house, dwelling unit, or rooming unit which does not comply with the following minimum standards for ventilation, light and heating:

(1) Windows and Openable Space.

(a) Total Window Area. Every habitable room shall have at least one window which faces directly to the outdoors. The minimum total window area, measured between stops, for every habitable room shall be 10 per cent of the floor area of such room. Whenever walls or other portions of structures face a window of any such room and such light-obstruction structures are located less than three feet from the window and extend to a level above that of the ceiling of the room, such a window shall not be deemed to face directly to the outdoors and shall not be included as contributing to the required minimum total window area. Whenever the only window in a room is a skylight-type window in the top of such room, the total window area of such skylight shall equal at least 15 per cent of the total floor area of such room.

(b) Openable Window Area. Every habitable room shall have at least one window or skylight which can be easily opened, or such other device as will adequately ventilate the room. The total openable window area in every habitable room shall equal at least 45 per cent of the minimum area size or the minimum skylight-type window size, as required by this ordinance, except where there is supplied some other device affording adequate ventilation and approved by the Inspector of Buildings.

(c) Glass-Fronted Porch. For the purpose of this section, where a living room faces onto a glass-fronted porch, the porch shall be considered as a part of the living room if the total window and open space area between the porch and the living room is at least 15 per cent of the floor area of the living room.

(d) Bathroom. Every bathroom and water closet compartment shall comply with the window area and openable area requirements for habitable rooms, except where there is supplied some other device approved by the Inspector of Buildings as affording adequate ventilation.

(e) Laundry Rooms. Every laundry room shall have a minimum openable area of at least three square feet except where there is supplied some other device approved by the Inspector of Buildings as affording adequate ventilation.

(f) Public Halls and Stairways. Every public hall and stairway in every two-family dwelling, multi-family dwelling and rooming house shall be adequately ventilated, enclosed and hand railed.

(2). Lighting. Every dwelling within 300 feet of a power line shall be supplied with electricity as follows:

(a) Habitable Room. Every habitable room shall contain at least two separate floor or wall-type electric convenience outlets or one such convenience outlet and one supplied ceiling type electric light fixture, or a switch controlled outlet.

(b) Bathrooms, Utility Rooms. Every water closet compartment, bathroom, laundry room, and furnace room, shall contain at least one supplied ceiling or wall-type electric light fixture.

(c) Public Halls. Every public hall in a dwelling shall contain at least one supplied ceiling or wall-type electric light fixture. Every public hall and stairway in every two-family dwelling, multi-family dwelling and rooming house shall be adequately lighted at all times except that in a two-family dwelling an adequate lighting system which may be turned on when needed by conveniently located light switches shall be permitted instead of a full-time lighting system.

(d) Standards for Installation. Every outlet and fixture shall be properly installed and maintained in good and safe working condition. All electrical installations shall comply with the requirements of the National Electrical Code.

(3) Heating. Every dwelling shall have heating facilities which are capable of safely and adequately heating all habitable rooms, bathrooms, and water closet compartments within its walls to a temperature of at least 70 degrees Fahrenheit when the outside temperature is -20 degrees Fahrenheit.

(a) Portable Heaters. Portable heating equipment employing a flame and using gasoline or kerosene do not meet the standards of this ordinance and are prohibited.

(4) Screens. During the portion of each year extending from May 15th to September 15th and as protection against mosquitoes, flies and other insects, every door opening directly from a dwelling unit to outdoor space and used for ventilation shall be supplied with screens and a self-closing device; and every window or other device capable of being opened to outdoor space and used for ventilation shall likewise be supplied with screens. Every basement or cellar window used for ventilation, and every opening which might provide an entry for rodents, shall be supplied with screens or such other device as will effectively prevent their entrance.

Section 5. Space and Occupancy. No person shall occupy or shall let to another for occupancy any dwelling, rooming house, dwelling unit, or rooming unit which does not comply with the following minimum standards for space and occupancy.

(1) Habitable Floor Area. Every dwelling unit shall contain at least 300 square feet of habitable floor area for the first occupant, and at least 100 square feet for each additional occupant.

(a) Exception for Children under One (1) Year of Age. For the purposes of this section, a person under one year of age shall not be counted as an occupant.

(2) Sleeping Rooms. In every dwelling unit and in every rooming unit, every room occupied for sleeping purposes by one occupant shall contain at least 100 square feet of floor area, and every room occupied for sleeping purposes by more than one occupant shall contain at least 50 square feet of floor area for each occupant.

(3) Arrangement of Sleeping Room, Bathroom. No dwelling or dwelling unit containing two or more sleeping rooms shall have such room arrangements that access to a bathroom or water closet compartment intended for use by occupants of more than one sleeping room can be had only by going through another sleeping room, nor shall room arrangements be such that access to a sleeping room can be had only by going through another sleeping room or a bathroom or water closet compartment.

(4) Calculation of Floor Area. Floor area shall be calculated on the basis of habitable room area. However, closet area and hall area within the dwelling unit, where provided, may count for not more than 10 per cent of the required habitable floor area. At least 85 per cent of the floor area of a sleeping room, and at least one-half of the floor area of all other habitable rooms shall have a ceiling height of at least 7 feet 6 inches; and the floor area of any part of any room where the ceiling height is less than five feet shall not be considered as part of the floor area in computing the total floor area of the room to determine maximum permissible occupancy.

(5) Cellars. No cellar shall be used for living purposes.

(6) Basements. No basement shall be used for living purposes unless;

(a) The floors and walls are substantially watertight.

(b) The total window area, total openable area, and ceiling height are in accordance with this ordinance.

(c) The required minimum window area of every habitable room is entirely above the grade of the ground adjoining such window area, not including stairwells or access ways.

Section 6. Safe and Sanitary Maintenance of Structural Elements.

No person shall occupy as owner-occupant or shall let to another for occupancy any dwelling, rooming house, dwelling unit, or rooming unit which does not comply with the following minimum standards for safe and sanitary maintenance:

(1) Foundations, Exterior Walls and Roofs. Every foundation, exterior wall and exterior roof shall be substantially weathertight, watertight, and rodent-proof; shall be kept in sound condition and good repair; and shall be safe to use and capable of supporting the load which normal use may cause to be placed thereon.

(2) Floors, Interior Walls and Ceilings. Every floor, interior wall and ceiling shall be substantially rodent-proof; shall be kept in sound condition and good repair and shall be safe to use and capable of supporting the load as specified by the Building Code.

(3) Windows and Exterior Doors. Every window, exterior door and basement or cellar door and hatchway shall be substantially weathertight, watertight and rodent-proof; and shall be kept in sound working condition and good repair.

(4) Stairways and Porches. Every inside and outside stair, porch, and any appurtenance thereto shall be safe to use and capable of supporting the load of 80 pounds per square foot; and shall be kept in sound condition and good repair.

(5) Plumbing Fixtures. Every plumbing fixture shall be properly installed and maintained in sound mechanical condition, free from defects, leaks, and obstructions and in accordance with the Plumbing Code.

(6) Bathroom Floor Surfaces. Every water closet compartment floor surface and bathroom floor surface shall be constructed and maintained so as to be substantially impervious to water and so as to permit such floor to be easily kept in a clean and sanitary condition.

(7) Maintenance of Required Equipment and Utilities. Every supplied facility, piece of equipment or utility, which is required under this ordinance, and every chimney and smokepipe shall be so constructed and installed that it will function safely and effectively, and shall be maintained in sound working condition.

Section 7. Substandard Conditions of Structural Elements. Any dwelling which has any or all of the following defects of structural elements shall be deemed unfit for human habitation:

(1) Interior Walls and Vertical Structural Members. Any dwelling whose interior walls or other vertical members list, lean or buckle to such an extent that a plumb line passing through the center of gravity falls outside of the middle third of its base shall be deemed unfit for human habitation.

(2) Supporting Members and Non-Supporting Walls. Any dwelling which, exclusive of the foundation, shows 33 per cent or more of damage or deterioration of the supporting member or members, or 50 per cent of damage or deterioration of the non-supporting enclosing or outside walls or covering shall be deemed unfit for human habitation.

(3) Floor and Roof Loads. Any dwelling which has improperly distributed loads upon the floors or roofs or in which the same are overloaded, or which have insufficient strength to be reasonably safe for the purpose used shall be deemed unfit for human habitation.

(4) Damage by Fire, Wind or Other Causes. Any dwelling which has been damaged by fire, wind or other causes so as to have become dangerous to life, morals, safety or the general health and welfare of the occupants or the people of the Town of Salem shall be deemed unfit for human habitation.

Section 8. Substandard Conditions Generally. Any dwelling which has any or all of the following general substandard conditions shall be deemed unfit for human habitation:

(1) Dilapidated, Decayed, Unsafe or Insanitary. Any dwelling which has become or is so dilapidated, decayed, unsafe, insanitary or which utterly fails to provide the amenities essential to decent living, or which is likely to cause sickness or disease, so as to work injury to the health, morals, safety, or general welfare of those living therein shall be deemed unfit for human habitation.

(2) Inadequate Light, Air and Sanitation. Any dwelling having light, air and sanitation facilities which are inadequate to protect the health, morals, safety or general welfare of human beings who live or may live therein shall be deemed unfit for human habitation.

(3) Inadequate Egress. Any dwelling having inadequate facilities for egress in case of fire or panic, or those having insufficient stairways, elevators, fire escapes, or other means of communication shall be deemed unfit for human habitation.

(4) Insecure Parts. Any dwelling which has parts thereof which are so attached that they may fall and injure members of the public or property shall be deemed unfit for human habitation.

(5) Unsafe, Insanitary or Dangerous to Public. Any dwelling which because of its condition is unsafe, insanitary, or dangerous to the health, morals, safety or general welfare of the people of this Town shall be deemed unfit for human habitation.

(6) Violation of Ordinances. Any dwelling existing in violation of any provision of the Building Code of this Town, or other ordinances of this Town shall be deemed unfit for human habitation.

Section 9. Cooking Equipment. No owner, operator or occupant shall furnish or use any cooking equipment which does not comply with the following minimum standards:

(1) Construction, Installation and Maintenance. Every piece of cooking equipment shall be so constructed and installed that it will function safely and effectively and shall be maintained in sound working condition.

(2) Prohibited Equipment. Portable cooking equipment employing flame and using gasoline or kerosene as fuel is prohibited.

Section 10. Responsibilities of Owners, Operators, and Occupants.

(1) Sanitation.

(a) Cleanliness by Occupant. Every occupant of a dwelling, dwelling unit or rooming unit shall maintain in a clean and sanitary condition that part of the dwelling, dwelling unit and yard which he occupies and controls; and shall be responsible for his own misuse of areas and facilities available in common.

(b) Cleanliness by Owner or Operator. Every owner or operator of a two-family dwelling, multi-family dwelling or rooming house shall maintain in a clean and sanitary condition the shared or public areas of the dwelling and yard.

(c) Use and Operation of Supplied Facilities. Every occupant of a dwelling unit shall keep all supplied facilities, including plumbing fixtures and cooking equipment, in a clean and sanitary condition and shall be responsible for the exercise of reasonable care in their proper use and operation.

(2) Removal of Waste Matter.

(a) Storage and Disposal of Rubbish and Garbage. Every occupant of a dwelling unit shall dispose of all rubbish, ashes, garbage, and other organic waste in a clean and sanitary manner by placing it in approved storage or disposal facilities which are safe and sanitary. Every occupant shall provide such facilities for and within his dwelling unit and shall maintain them in a clean and sanitary manner. The owner or operator of a multi-family dwelling shall be responsible further for placing out for collection all common garbage and refuse containers, except where such facilities are for the sole use of an occupant, under which circumstances it shall be the responsibility of the occupant to place these containers out for collection.

(b) Rooming House Rubbish Storage and Disposal.

Every owner or operator of every rooming house shall dispose of all rubbish in a clean and sanitary manner by placing it in supplied and approved storage or disposal facilities which are safe and sanitary.

(3) Extermination.

(a) Extermination of Pests by Occupant. Every occupant of a dwelling unit shall be responsible for the extermination of any insects, rodents or other pests in it or in the yard.

1. Exception. When, however, infestation is caused by failure of the owner or operator to maintain a dwelling in a rodent-proof or substantially insect-proof condition, extermination shall be the responsibility of the owner or operator.

(b) Extermination of Pests by Owner or Operator.

Every owner or operator shall be responsible for extermination of any insects, rodents or other pests whenever infestation exists in two or more of the dwelling units of any dwelling or in the shared or public areas of any two-family dwelling or any multi-family dwelling.

(c) Extermination of Pests in Rooming Houses. Every owner or operator of a rooming house shall be responsible for the extermination of any insects, rodents or other pests in it or in the yard.

(4) Heat. During the time of the year when it is necessary, as determined by the Agency, every owner or operator of every two-family dwelling, multi-family dwelling and rooming house shall supply adequate heat to every habitable room therein except where there are separate heating facilities for each dwelling unit, whose facilities are under the sole control of the occupant of such dwelling unit.

(5) Utilities. No owner, operator or occupant shall cause any service equipment or utility which is required by this ordinance to be removed, shut off or discontinued for any occupied dwelling let or occupied by him, except for such temporary interruption as may be necessary while actual repairs or alterations are in process, or during temporary emergencies.

(6) Janitorial Service. Every dwelling of five or more dwelling units in which the owner or operator does not reside shall have a janitor as found necessary by the Agency.

(7) Transfer of Responsibility. A contract effective as between owner and operator, operator and occupant or owner and occupant, with regard to compliance hereunder shall not relieve any part of his direct responsibility under this ordinance.

(8) Notice of Maximum Occupancy. Every owner or operator shall advise the occupant in writing either by insertion in the lease between the parties or otherwise, of the maximum number of occupants permitted in the occupied premises under this ordinance.

Section 11. Standards for Repair, Vacation and Closing, or Demolition, or Removal. The following standards shall be followed in substance by the Agency in ordering repair, vacation, closure, demolition or removal:

(1) Repair. If a dwelling deemed unfit for human habitation can reasonably be repaired so that it will no longer exist in violation of the terms of this ordinance, it shall be ordered repaired.

(2) Vacation and Closure. If a dwelling deemed unfit for human habitation is in such condition as to make it dangerous to the health, morals, safety, or general welfare of its occupants, it shall be ordered to be vacated and closed.

(3) Demolition or Removal. In any case where a dwelling deemed unfit for human habitation is 50 per cent damaged or decayed or deteriorated from its original value or structure, it shall be demolished or removed, and in all cases where a dwelling cannot be repaired so that it will no longer exist in violation of the terms of this ordinance, it shall be demolished or removed. In all cases where a dwelling unfit for human habitation is a fire hazard existing or erected in violation of the terms of any ordinance of the Town or statute of the State of New Hampshire, it shall be demolished or removed. For the purposes of this ordinance, removal of a dwelling unfit for human habitation shall mean removal from the Town of Salem.

Section 12. Dwelling Unfit for Human Habitation - Nuisances. All dwellings deemed unfit for human habitation within the terms of Sections 7. and 8. of this ordinance are hereby declared to be public nuisances, and shall be repaired, vacated and closed, or demolished or removed as hereinbefore and hereinafter provided.

Section 13. Inspection of Dwellings.

(1) Inspection by Agency. The Agency shall inspect or cause to be inspected, dwellings located within the Town of Salem for the purpose of determining the condition of said dwellings and seeking information relating to violations of minimum housing standards prescribed by this Chapter.

(2) Access by the Agency. To carry out the purposes and provisions of this Chapter, the Agency, or any subordinate acting under its direction and supervision, is hereby authorized to enter, examine and survey at all reasonable times, and in an emergency at any time, all dwellings and the owner or occupant of the same, or the person in charge thereof, shall grant free access for the purpose of such examination and survey.

(3) Access by Owner or Operator. Every occupant of a dwelling, rooming house, dwelling unit, or rooming unit shall give the owner or operator thereof, or his agent or employee, access to any part of such dwelling, rooming house, dwelling unit, or rooming unit, or its premises, at all reasonable times for the purpose of making such repairs or alterations as are necessary to effect compliance with the provisions of this ordinance or with any lawful notice or order issued pursuant to the provisions of this ordinance.

Section 14. Enforcement.

(a) The Agency shall have the power to administer affirmation, examine witnesses, and receive evidence in the course of its hearings.

(b) The Agency shall appoint and fix the duties of such officers, agents, and employees as deemed necessary to carry out the provisions of this ordinance.

(c) The Agency may delegate any of its functions under this ordinance to such officers as it may designate.

Whenever it appears to the Agency that there are reasonable grounds to believe that there exists a violation of any provision of this Chapter, or whenever a petition is filed with the Agency

by at least 10 residents of the Town charging that any dwelling is unfit for human habitation, it shall issue and cause to be served upon the owner, every mortgagee of record and all parties in interest in such dwelling (including persons in possession) a written complaint stating the grounds thereof. If the person to be served resides outside the State, service may be made by registered mail; and if there are any unascertained persons having an interest in said dwelling, notice may be given them by publication in a newspaper having general circulation in the Town, such publication to be at least ten days before the date set for the hearing. Such complaint shall contain a notice that a hearing will be held before the Agency at a place therein fixed not less than ten days or more than thirty days after the serving of said complaint. The owner, mortgagee and parties in interest may file an answer to the complaint and appear in person, or otherwise, and give testimony at the place and time fixed in the complaint. Rules of evidence prevailing in courts of law or equity shall not be controlling in the said hearing.

(3) Whenever the Board after notice and hearing determines that, according to the minimum standards imposed by this Ordinance, a dwelling is unfit for human habitation, it shall state in writing its findings of fact in support of such determination and shall issue and cause to be served upon the owner thereof an order which, if the repair, alteration or improvement of the said dwelling can be made at a reasonable cost in relation to the value of the dwelling and the ability of the owner to assume such cost, requires the owner, within the time specified in the order, to repair, alter, or improve such dwelling to render it fit for human habitation, or to vacate and close the dwelling as a human habitation; or if the repair, alteration or improvement of the said dwelling cannot be made at a reasonable cost in relation to the value of the dwelling and the ability of the owner to assume such costs, require the owner, within the time specified in the order, to remove or demolish such dwelling.

(4) Whenever the owner of a dwelling is aggrieved by an order of the Agency, he may file an appeal with the Board of Selectmen who shall hold a hearing thereon, due notice of the same first being given to the Agency and to the said owner. The Board of Selectmen after hearing and in accordance with their findings, may affirm, revoke or modify the order of the Agency. Where the order is affirmed or modified, the Agency shall proceed to enforce the

same as affirmed or modified. When the order is revoked, proceedings shall be terminated.

(5) When the owner of any dwelling fails to comply with an order of the Agency, a petition shall be filed with the Superior Court by said Agency in accordance with the provisions of R.S.A. 48A as it may be amended from time to time.

(6) Whenever the Agency finds that a dwelling is unfit for human habitation and has issued an order to the person responsible therefor, the Agency shall post, in a conspicuous place thereon, a placard or placards which shall include the following words: "Condemned as Unfit for Human Habitation".

(7) Any dwelling which has been determined unfit for human habitation and which has been posted as such by the Agency shall be vacated within the time required by the Agency. No owner or operator shall let to any person, and no person shall occupy any dwelling, which has been found unfit for human habitation and which has been posted as such by the Agency.

(8) No dwelling which has been found unfit for human habitation and which has been posted as such, shall again be used for human habitation until written approval has been furnished by the Agency. Upon receipt of such order, the owner may remove the placard.

(9) Except in accordance with the provisions of Subsection (8), no person shall deface, cover, or remove any placard lawfully placed upon any dwelling by the Agency.

Section 15. Rooming Houses. No person shall operate a rooming house or shall occupy or let to another for occupancy any rooming unit in any rooming house, except in compliance with the provisions of every applicable section of this ordinance.

(1) Rooming House Permit. No person shall operate a rooming house unless he holds a valid rooming house permit issued by the Agency in the name of the operator and for the specific dwelling, dwelling unit, rooming house or rooming unit. The operator

shall apply to the Agency for such permit, which shall be issued by the Agency upon compliance by the operator with the applicable provisions of this ordinance. This permit shall be displayed in a conspicuous place within the rooming house, at all times. No such permit shall be transferable. Every person holding such permit shall give notice in writing to the Agency within 24 hours after having sold, transferred, given away, or otherwise disposed of ownership of, interest in, or control of any rooming house. Such notice shall include the name and address of the person succeeding to the ownership or control of such rooming house. Every rooming house permit shall expire at the end of one year following its date of issuance, unless sooner suspended or revoked as hereinafter provided.

(2) Any person whose application for a rooming house permit has been denied may request and shall be granted a hearing in accordance with the procedures required under Section 14 of this ordinance.

(3) Whenever upon inspection of any rooming house, the Agency finds that there may exist a violation of the minimum housing standards established by this ordinance, it shall, after giving notice to the owner and holding a public hearing as provided in Section 14, revoke the owner's permit where violations are found and may make such further orders as are authorized by the provisions of this ordinance.

(4) Every provision of this ordinance which applies to rooming houses shall also apply to hotels and motels, except to the extent that they may conflict with the laws of the State or with the lawful regulations of any State Board or Agency.

Section 16. Conflict of Ordinances. This ordinance shall not interfere with or annul any ordinance, rule, regulation or permit, provided that, unless specifically excepted, where this ordinance is more stringent, it shall control.

Section 17. Invalidity. The invalidity of any section or provision of this ordinance shall not invalidate any other section or provision thereof.

Section 18. Take Effect. This ordinance shall take effect upon its passage.

Article 8. To see if the Town will resolve, pursuant to the Housing Authorities Law of New Hampshire, that there is need for a Housing Authority to function in the Town of Salem, to be called "The Housing Authority of the Town of Salem".

Article 9. To see if the Town will vote to approve the application by the Housing Authority of the Town to the Federal Government for preliminary loans, and to authorize the Selectmen to enter into a Cooperation Agreement with the Housing Authority by adopting the following resolution:

Be it Resolved by the Inhabitants of the Town of Salem that there exists in the Town a need for low rent housing at rents within the means of persons and families of low income as defined in the United States Housing Act of 1937, as amended, which need is not being adequately met by private enterprise; that the application of the Housing Authority of the Town to the Department of Housing and Urban Development, Housing Assistance Administration, for a preliminary loan in an amount not to exceed four thousand five hundred (\$4,500.00) dollars for surveys and planning in connection with low rent housing projects of, not to exceed approximately one hundred (100) dwelling units, be, and hereby is approved; and the Selectmen are authorized to execute, on behalf of the Town, an agreement with the Housing Authority providing for the local cooperation required by the Housing Assistance Administration pursuant to the United States Housing Act of 1937, as amended, and to act in any manner relating thereto.

Article 10. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary to defray the expenses of operation of the Town; Town Officers salaries and expenses; expenses of Election and Registration; Planning Board; District Court and Town Buildings; Ambulance; expenses of the operation of the Police, Fire, and Civil Defense Departments; expenses of the Town Dump, and damage by dogs; expenses of the Health Department; Summer and Winter Maintenance and General expense of Town Highways; Street Lighting; Town Poor and Legal expenses; Social Security and Retirement (Town's share); Interest; and other necessary expenses pertaining to the operation of the Town of Salem, including Water Department, all such amounts being shown in the posted Town Budget.

Article 11. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen and Treasurer under the provisions of R.S.A. 33:71, 1955, to borrow, in anticipation of taxes, such sums as are necessary for the operation of the Town, and to set the rate, effect the issuance of notes, and to otherwise negotiate for the sale of notes to be paid within the present fiscal year.

Article 12. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen and Town Manager to apply, negotiate and do all other things necessary to obtain such Federal Interest Free Loans, and to expend the same, as may be required for the preparation of plans and designs of Town Roads, Municipal Buildings, extension of the Water System and other Town functions.

Article 13. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen and Town Manager to apply for, negotiate and do all other things necessary to obtain such Federal funds as may be made available, and to expend the same.

Article 14. To see if the Town will vote to become a member of a New Hampshire regional planning agency. This agency will have membership of at least two (2) of the municipalities in the general area. The objective of this agency will be to plan for and encourage regional planning analysis, provide consensus on major problems of regional concern, and to assist in the effectuation of projects which extend beyond the boundaries of a particular town. The agency will have no jurisdiction over any matter of local affairs. It will be primarily advisory. Two members of the regional planning agency shall be from Salem to be appointed by the Selectmen.

Article 15. To see if the Town will vote to direct the Selectmen to appoint a committee to investigate the advisability of Salem's adopting a city form of government.

Article 16. To see if the Town will vote to:

- (a) authorize the Town Manager and Selectmen to construct a Town Garage;
- (b) authorize the Town Manager and Selectmen to take such actions as they deem proper therein;

- (c) authorize the Selectmen to issue bonds and/or notes in an amount not to exceed one hundred thousand (\$100,000.00) dollars for the purpose of financing the project; and
- (d) authorize the Selectmen to apply to the project all available funds including interest and Federal grants.

Article 17. To see if the Town will vote to provide the necessary equipment and services for operating a sanitary land-fill operation and raise and appropriate the sum of forty thousand (\$40,000.00) dollars for same.

Article 18. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of twelve thousand five hundred (\$12,500.00) dollars to install more adequate traffic signals at the intersection of Main Street and Broadway; to provide and install traffic controls at the intersection of School, Bridge and Main Streets; and to install a caution signal at the intersection of School and Millville Streets.

Article 19. By request: To see if the Town will vote to:

- (a) authorize the Town Manager and Selectmen to purchase a snorkel fire truck;
- (b) authorize the Town Manager and Selectmen to take such actions as they deem proper therein;
- (c) authorize the Selectmen to issue bonds and/or notes in an amount not to exceed sixty-five thousand (\$65,000.00) dollars for the purpose of financing this purchase; and
- (d) authorize the Selectmen to apply to the purchase all available funds including interest.

Article 20. By request: To see if the Town will vote to:

- (a) authorize the Town Manager and Selectmen to purchase a one thousand (1,000) gallon pumper.
- (b) authorize the Town Manager and Selectmen to take such actions as they deem proper therein;

- (c) authorize the Selectmen to issue bonds and/or notes in an amount not to exceed thirty-five thousand (\$35,000.00) dollars for the purpose of financing this purchase; and
- (d) authorize the Selectmen to apply to the purchase all available funds including interest.

Article 21. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of twelve thousand seven hundred (\$12,700.00) dollars to be expended over the next three years to develop a comprehensive plan for Salem.

Article 22. To see if the Town will vote to reconstruct the present bridge on Providence Hill Road and raise and appropriate the sum of ninety-five hundred (\$9,500.00) dollars which will be matched in a like amount by the State of New Hampshire to accomplish this project.

Article 23. To see if the Town will vote to:

- (a) authorize the Town Manager and Selectmen to extend the municipal sewer system;
- (b) authorize the Town Manager and Selectmen to take such actions as they deem proper therein;
- (c) authorize the Selectmen to issue bonds and/or notes in an amount not to exceed six hundred and fifty thousand (\$650,000.00) dollars for the purpose of financing the project; and
- (d) authorize the Selectmen to apply to the project all available funds including interest and Federal grants.

Article 24. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of three thousand two hundred forty-seven (\$3,247.00) dollars to be paid over to the Salem District Nursing Association for the Association's program.

Article 25. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of forty-five hundred (\$4,500.00) dollars to be paid over to the Greater Salem Mental Health Association as the Town's share of and for the Association's program.

Article 26. By request of Laurence N. Belair, Francis Kivell, and others: To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to appoint a committee of seven (7) citizens for the purpose of planning and coordinating an appropriate Old Home Week Celebration to be held on Independence Day and to raise one thousand five hundred (\$1,500.00) dollars for same. Said event is to generally include such activities as fireworks, field events, a bonfire, a parade, and other activities as the committee shall deem desirable.

Article 27. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of twenty-six thousand (\$26,000.00) dollars to provide the facilities necessary to develop and operate a waterfront area on municipal property at Millville Lake.

Article 28. By request of Gilberte Carboneau and others: To see if the Town will vote to extend the municipal water system from the present system on Canobie Avenue, a distance of approximately 450 feet and to raise and appropriate the sum of three thousand six hundred (\$3,600.00) dollars for the purpose of financing same.

Article 29. By request of Wallace E. Anderson and others: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of seven thousand two hundred (\$7,200.00) dollars to install approximately 1,050 feet of six-inch water main from Millville Street to Morrison Avenue, on Summer Street, making a connection on said street water mains, and installing a fire hydrant on the installed pipe as deemed necessary by the Fire Department.

Article 30. By request of the Salem Historical Commission: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of one thousand (\$1,000.00) dollars or any part thereof, to establish a fund for the Salem Historical Commission to purchase and maintain property of historical value.

Article 31. By request of the Conservation Commission: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of seven thousand five hundred (\$7,500.00) to purchase land shown as Map 94 - Lot 12 on the 1967 Salem Tax Maps which comprises an area of ten (10) acres.

Article 32. By request of Norman Ellis and others: To see if the Town will vote to install a dry hydrant at or near the intersection of Mary Ann Avenue and Shore Drive in Arlington Park and raise money for same.

Article 33. By request of Stanley Ryan and others: To see if the Town will vote to install a dry hydrant in Franz Acres and raise money for same.

Article 34. To see if the Town will release to Carlton A. and Doris C. Holmes whatever rights, if any, it has to a portion of a right-of-way or land leading from Walter Palmer Lane to Car Mar Lane. The portion for which the Town is asked to release its rights extends in a Northeasterly direction from Walter Palmer Lane one hundred fifty-eight (158) feet and is sixteen (16) feet in width.

Article 35. By request of Austin and Henrietta Berton and others: To see if the Town will vote to accept Peak Road and surface same for approximately two hundred (200) feet from the end of Nolet Avenue to Blake Road and raise money for same.

Article 36. By request of Philip DeZutter and others: To see if the Town will vote to accept Blake Road and surface same for a distance of approximately two hundred (200) feet North of the end of Glen Road and raise money for the same.

Article 37. To see if the Town will accept the road extending from the Easterly line of North Main Street (opposite Bluff Street) to its junction with Town Farm Road; and, additionally, release to the abutting owners of the road which was replaced by the one referred to above, such rights as the Town had in such road.

Article 38. At the request of the Salem Planning Board: To see if the Town will vote to accept the following streets as listed below:

- Geremonty Drive, a distance of 3,401 feet from Main Street to Veterans Memorial Parkway;
- Veterans Memorial Parkway, a distance of 5,341 feet from South Broadway to Lawrence Road;
- Windward Terrace, a distance of 1,400 feet from Millville Street to Millville Street;
- Marsh Avenue, a distance of 1,830 feet from Bridge Street to Elmwood Avenue;
- Elmwood Avenue, a distance of 1,230 feet from Bridge Street to end, approximately 125 feet South of Marsh Avenue;
- Centerville Drive, a distance of 2,650 feet from Main Street to Royal Circle;
- Kelly Road, a distance of 2,600 feet from South Policy Street to Broadway;

- South Policy Street, a distance of 11,100 feet from MacGregor Avenue to Main Street;
- MacFarland Road, a distance of 670 feet from MacGregor Avenue to MacLarnon Road;
- MacLarnon Road, a distance of 2,150 feet from South Policy Street to MacFarland Road.

Article 39. By request of John G. Zilonis and others: To see if the Town will vote to install three (3) street lights on poles Nos. 3660, 3662, and 3320 on North Main Street and raise money for the same.

Article 40. By request of Robert L. Wilkesman and others: To see if the Town will vote to install a street light on pole No. 2890 on Bluff Street and raise money for the same.

Article 41. By request of Elsie Finnegan and others: To see if the Town will vote to install a street light on pole No. 3743 at the intersection of Wilson Avenue and Henry Taylor Street, Arlington Park, North Salem.

Article 42. By request of Dr. A. Martin Simensen and others: To see if the Town will vote to install a street light on pole No. 5261 on Lake Street and raise money for the same.

Article 43. By request of Ara Nazarian and others: To see if the Town will vote to install five (5) street lights on Linda Avenue and raise money for the same.

Article 44. By request of Marie M. Borchers and others: To see if the Town will vote to install a street light on Scotland Avenue on pole No. 5547 and raise money for the same.

Article 45. By request of George D. Linehan and others: To see if the Town will vote to install a street light on pole No. 3996 on Lowell Road and raise money for the same.

Article 46. By request of Edmund Cote, Jr. and others: To see if the Town will vote to install a street light on pole No. 5397 on Dwight Avenue and raise money for the same.

Article 47. By request of Harold A. Page and others: To see if the Town will vote to install a street light on pole No. 1217 located on Route 38 (Lowell Road) at the junction of West Street.

Article 48. By request of Marie Hobbs and others: To see if the Town will vote to install a street light on pole No. 5500 on Brian Avenue and raise money for the same.

Article 49. By request of Benjamin Q. Belonga and others: To see if the Town will vote to install a street light on pole No. 3051 on Grove Street (Little Saugus) and raise money for the same.

Article 56. By request of Anthony S. Rapisaida and others: To see if the Town will vote to install a street light on pole No. 2390 on Lawrence Road at the intersection of Senter Street.

Article 57. By request of Gordon Atwood and others: To see if the Town will vote to install three (3) street lights on Marianna Road on poles Nos. 5870, 5872, and 5874, these being of the smaller mercury type.

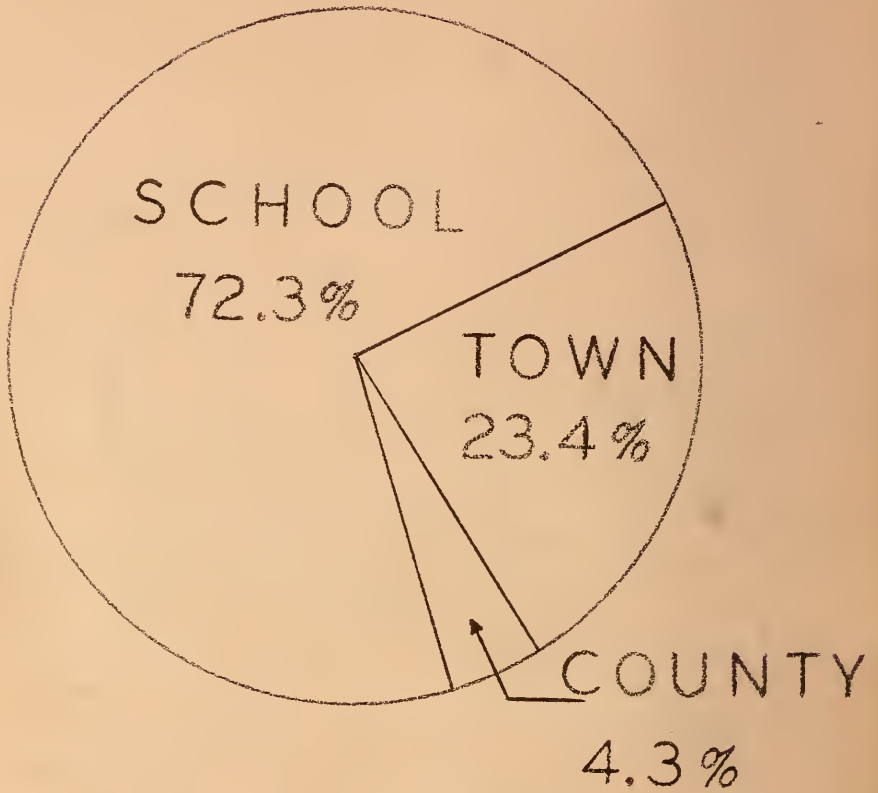
