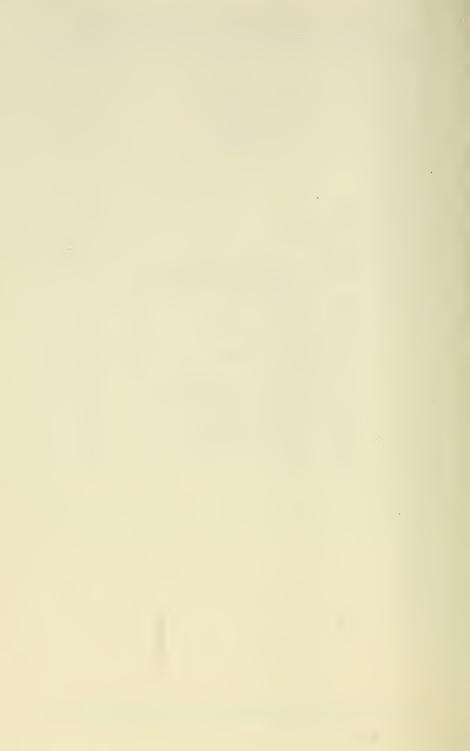

#### TOWN WARRANT

#### STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Sandown in the County of Rockingham in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall in said Sandown on Tuesday, the Fourteenth day of March, next at One of the clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as amy be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
- 4. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of, at a public or private sale, property taken through Tax Collectors Deeds.
- 5. To see if the town will vote to accept Town Road Aid. State to contribute \$2653.64, Town to raise and appropriate the sum of \$398.05.
- 6. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3400.00 for black topping One mile of the Little Mill Road, starting at Route 121A.
- 7. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 for the purchase of a 12 Foot Angle Blade.
- 8. To see if the town will vote to discontinue the Hazelton Mill Road (so called), from the Wells Village Road to the Chester Line, in accordance with Chapter 238 R.S.A.

- 9. To see if the town will vote to adopt the Stagger System for electing Town Auditors. At Town Meeting in 1962, One Auditor shall be elected for One year and One Auditor shall be elected for Two years. Thereafter One Auditor shall be elected each year for a two year term, in accordance with Chapter 41 Section 32A R.S.A.
- 10. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 to be used in co-operation with State and Federal funds for the control of White Pine Blister Rust within the confines of the town.
- 11. To see if the town will vote to adopt the changes in the Zoning and Building Code as approved at the Public Hearing held February 1, 1961.
- 12. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1500.00 for the installation of modern toilet facilities in the Town Hall.
- 13. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$12 00.00 for the purchase of an Emergency Alarm System.
- 14. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$715.00 for the purchase of a 10 Foot Snow Plow Wing.
- 15. To act on any other town business that may legally come come before said meeting.

The polls will be open from One o'clock in the afternoon until Seven o'clock in the evening.

#### REPORT OF THE PLANNING BOARD FOR 1960

The Sandown Planning Board has recently completed its recommended revision and modification of the "Building, Zoning, Land Subdivision, and Mobile Home Ordinance". Many of these revisions consist of amendments adopted by the townspeople over the years at special or regular town meetings.

Also, revision of our basic subdivision ordinance was recently completed. The new "Land Subdivision Control Regulations" were designed to meet the needs of the town in view of the population explosion here in the southern counties of New Hampshire. The statistics recently released from the 1960 census show the surrounding area experienced a population gain of 25 to 30 percent. The predicted future growth for the next decade is conservatively estimated at a magnitude equal to or surpassing the growth of the last decade. Sandown experienced a population growth of only 13 percent during this time. However, it is felt this is mainly due to its geographical location in relation to the nearby industrial centers of Manchester, Haverhill and Lawrence. We feel that the present trend in suburban living will soon overtake our town. Your Planning Board, in anticipation of this growth, is recommending these regulations with which it hopes to provide for orderly growth within the town.

In addition to our regular meetings, the Planning Board has held seven special meetings to accomplish the goals planned for the year. Four new subdivisions were examined and given either approval or partial approval during the year.

The Planning Board wishes to acknowledge the suggestions and recommendations we received from Everett Holmes in connection with road construction for our new Subdivision regulations.

The Planning Board would appreciate more active participation on the part of the townspeople at our regular meetings. These meetings are held on the third Wednesday of every month, and the public is invited to attend.

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said district on the tenth day of March, 1961, at eight o'clock in the evening to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose a Moderator for the coming year.
- 2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.
- 3. To choose a Member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.
  - 4. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.
- 5. To determine and appoint the salaries of the School Board and Truant Officer, and fix the compensation of any other officers or agent of the district.
- 6. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees, or Officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 7. To choose Agents, Auditors and Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.
- 8. To see what sum of money the district will raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from the state foundation aid fund together with other income; the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.
- 9. To see if the School District of Sandown will vote by ballot.

- 10. To see if the School District of Sandown will vote to adopt the Non-Partisan Ballot System for the election of school officers as provided in R.S.A. Chapter 59, Section 73, 77, 79-86.
- 11. To see if the School District of Sandown will vote with the other Districts of Supervisory Union No. 14 to provide for thd services of a Helping Teacher as provided in R.S.A. 186:11, XXII, XXIII, XXIV, as amended 1947, R.S.A. 252:2
- 12. If the above vote is in the affirmative to see if the District will raise the sum of \$347.79 for salary, transportation, retirement and social security.

#### SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS REPORT

It is with confidence that I relate to you the fact that this year through the effort of the superior teachers that you have that the type of education your children are receiving is comparable to other schools in nearby communities.

Although you have not been asked for an additional teacher so that each pupil will receive greater individual attention I urge you to be considering this so that in the near future this might become a reality. It is extremely difficult for one person to teach four grades and within each grade groupings in each subject area. It is up to you however to determine the type of education that you would like your children to receive. I therefore leave the questions of an additional teacher for your consideration.

Reference is made again this year to the questions brought to your attention last year in my report to you; mainly the type of education you expect and the type you are willing to support. We still need to reduce class size to 25 or 30. We still need a program of studies. We still need a basic series in our subject areas. In addition one of the greatest needs in this Union is still help at the Union level. This is in relation to the position of Superintendent. It is unreasonable to expect anyone to fulfill all the obligations this person should fulfill as Superintendent of Schools and properly care for all the communities that are expected to be cared for in this Union. I feel it necessary to again this year request and emphasize the need for a Helping Teacher.

In looking over our needs listed last year it is noted that some of them have been fulfilled. For example, we are rapidly progressing toward a program of minimum essentials and a program of studies. We have improved our basic series in the subject areas. We have evaluated and made changes and and are now using a new report card. We have developed and have only recently put into use a permanent record system that is universal throughout the Union. There is being offered an inservice training program for teachers, insignificant as it is at the present time, we are providing courses to improve teaching ability.

In conclusion I would like to offer to you as parents and and citizens a challenge. Let us all search ourselves and others to determine what type of school is most desirable, ask ourselves if our school presently fits these requirements, and if not attempt to create change so that it will.

As a newcomer in the position of Nurse-Teacher I was surprised and pleased at the changes that have occurred over the years. No longer is the nurse responsible only for checking heads, fingernails, etc. The entire wellbeing, physical and mental, of every child with whom she comes in contact, is of vital importance to her.

Sandown is indeed fortunate to have teachers interested in the health and health education of their pupils. Because they observe them daily, any difficulties are seen and are reported to the nurse. She can then proceed to work with these children and their parents to overcome the problems.

This past year all children received routine checkups on height, weight, hearing and vision.

The financing of a Dental Health Program is under consideration by the members of the P. T. G., to be put in effect during the 1961 - 1962 school year.

I would like to thank all the people and groups who have helped with their services and financial aid.
