ARTICLE 2: - read by the Moderator: -"authorize Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes".

Motion by Emery N. Eaton, second by Bruce G. Brown that the Selectmen be authorized and empowered to borrow money in anticipation of taxes and to renew and refund Town. Notes.

MOTION CARRIED

ARTICLE 3: - read by the Moderator: -"action on balaces of Special Appropriations".

Motion by Francis Valli, Sr., second by Bruce G. Brown, that the balaces stated under Article 3 be carried forward and used as originally intended.

MOTION CARRIED

ARTICLE 4: - read by the Moderator: - "vote to revise the salaries and wages of the Town Officials and Employees".

Motion by Emery N. Eaton, second by Bruce G. Brown, to revise the wages and salaries as follows:

It will be noted that at the time of the last pay revision the Fire Dept. was operating on a 56 hour week. The above proposal will bring them in line with other Town Employees.

SELECTMENS CLERK - Increase from \$80.00 to \$90.00

SUPERVISORS OF CHECKLIST - \$200.00 on odd years and \$300.00
on even years.

All town employees on hourly pay to be paid at \$2.50 per hour.

Annual Leave and Sick Leave as previously voted to remain in effect.

Employees and Officials not covered by this proposal to be paid at rates previously established.

The Board of Selectmen is hereby empowered to establish the starting salaries of new full time employees.

ARTICLE V-A: To see if the Town will vote to authorize and empower the Selectmen to purchase or accept deeds to various parcels of land located in the areas of the Riley Well Field and the Crovetti Well Field and in other areas of the Town for the purposes of protecting and improving the Town Water System and to expend the moneys from the New Lands and Buildings account for this purpose; and to execute such documents as are necessary to accomplish the same.

ARTICLE VI. To see if the Town will authorize and empower the Selectmen to sell and convey those premises owned by the Town, whether acquired by Tax Collector's Deeds or otherwise, which are within the perimeter of the following bounds:

North of the Mill Creek,
South of Brown's River,
East of a line which is perpendicular
to the end of Rocks Road,
West of Route 1A.

at private sale, upon such terms and conditions as the Selectmen, in their discretion, deem to be in the best interest of the Town, and to execute such agreements, deeds, or other documents necessary to accomplish the same.

ARTICLE VII. Do you approve of having two sessions for the annual Town Meeting in this Town, the first session for choice of Town Officers elected by an Official Ballot and the other action required to be inserted on said Official Ballot and the second session, on a date set by the Selectmen, for the transaction of other business?

(On the Official Ballot)

ARTICLE VIII. To see if the Town will vote to authorize and empower the Selectmen to convey, on such terms and conditions as they deem to be in the best interest of the Town, to Wellesley F. Berry, the Town's interest in the premises located on the Westerly side of Lafayette Road in the Town, which was acquired by Tax Collector's Deed dated October 4, 1962 and recorded in Rockingham Records, Book 1733, Page 154 and by Tax Collector's Deed dated December 27, 1962 and recorded in Rockingham Records, Book 1733, Page 166.

ARTICLE IX. To see if the Town will vote to authorize and empower the Selectmen to convey, for a sum not less than Thirty Thousand (\$30,000) Dollars, to Richard E. Blinn and Hervey L.

Solar, the Town's interest in the premises located on the Westerly side of Lafayette Road in the Town, which was acquired by deed of the Seabrook School District dated September 26, 1957, and recorded in Rockingham Records, Book 1611, Page 219, said conveyance to provide that the premises shall be used only as a professional building and shall revert to the Town if they are not used for this purpose.

ARTICLE X. To see if the Town will vote to authorize and empower the Selectmen to take appropriate legal action in the event that the method of assessing costs to the Town of Seabrook by the Winnacunnet Cooperative School District is not changed, at the annual meeting of said District for 1972, to the average daily membership method.

ARTICLE XI. To authorize and empower the Selectmen to accept gifts or donations of real estate if they deem such acceptance to be in the best interest of the Town.

ARTICLE XII. To authorize and empower the Selectmen to convey the premises acquired by Tax Collector's Deed dated February 6, 1970 and recorded in Rockingham Records, Book 2009, Page 263 and dated October 14, 1970 and recorded in Rockingham Records, Book 2054, Page 316, upon such terms and conditions as they deem to be in the best interest of the Town, to the Seabrook Firemen's Association and to accept and execute on behalf of the Town such agreements, deeds and other documents as are necessary to accomplish the same.

ARTICLE XIII. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the expenditure of the Fire Equipment Fund in its entirety including any addition made thereto at this meeting (the current balance of said fund including principal and interest is \$23,779.00 and an addition of \$7,000.00 to the fund is provided for in the proposed 1972 budget) for the purchasing of a new fire truck and to authorize the Selectmen to purchase said truck and to enter into such contracts and other agreements as are necessary to purchase said truck.

(Approved by the Budget Committee)

ARTICLE XIV. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$10,000.00 and raise and appropriate an additional \$30,000.00 to be raised by the issuance of bonds or notes of the Town for the purpose of purchasing one rubbish truck, one dump truck and one four-wheel drive pickup truck, and vote to authorize and empower the Selectmen to purchase said vehicles and enter into such contracts and other agreements as are necessary to purchase said vehicles.

(Approved by the Budget Committee)

ARTICLE XV. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 for the purpose of paying the Town's share

for the employment of a Probation Officer, who will serve the Hampton District Court, the Seabrook Municipal Court and the Plaistow District Court.

(Submitted Without Recommendation of the Budget Committee)

ARTICLE XVI. To take the sense of the qualified voters whether the amendments of the Constitution proposed by the 1971 session of the General Court shall be approved.

ARTICLE XVII. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to expend the Highway subsidy provided by the State of New Hampshire pursuant to the provisions of RSA 241:14 (Supp.) for the purposes defined in said statute.

(Approved by the Budget Committee)

ARTICLE XVIII. Upon the Petition of Melvurn A. Morgan and fifteen (15) others: To see if the Town will vote to accept as a public highway the road named True Lane as shown on plan entitled "Seabrook Acres, Seabrook, N.H., Jan. 1971, Parker Survey Associates, Inc."

ARTICLE XIX. To hear the report of the Planning Board and to act thereon.

ARTICLE XX. Are you in favor of the adoption of the following Ordinance as proposed by the Planning Board.

An Ordinance Relative to Front and Sidelines, Minimum Lot Size and the Number of Dwelling Units On a Lot.

1. No building shall be constructed or erected less than twenty (20) feet from the sideline of any road or less than eight (8) feet from any adjoining lot.
2. The minimum lot size on which a building may be constructed is 12,500 square feet where municipal sewerage and water is not available unless said lot was existing prior to the enactment of this ordinance.
3. No more than one dwelling building, with accessory buildings, may be constructed on any lot where municipal sewerage and water is not available and no dwelling building shall contain more than two (2) living units per 12,500 square feet of land area of the lot on which said building is located.

ARTICLE XXIII. Upon the Petition of Charles S.B. Knowles and eighteen (18) others: To see if the Town will vote to have the Selectmen appoint two permanent Police Officers and to raise and appropriate the sum of Ten Thousand Four Hundred (\$10,400.00) Dollars for the same.
(Submitted without Recommendation of the Budget Committee)

ARTICLE XXIV. Upon the Petition of Charles S.B. Knowles and ten (10) others: To see if the Town will vote to purchase the following equipment for the Police Department-Identification camera, Fingerprint camera, and a Breathalyzer. And to raise and appropriate the sum of Seventeen Hundred Dollars (\$1,700.00) for the same.
(Approved by the Budget Committee)

ARTICLE XXV . Upon the Petition of Scott H. Buck and eleven others (11): To see if the Town will vote to set the salary of the Fire Chief at \$1,000.00 per year.

Small and eleven (11) others: To see if the Town will vote to accept as a public highway the roads named Pine Cone Drive and Timber Court as shown on the plan entitled "Pinebrook Estates, N.H." by Great Eastern Land Corp., scale 1"=60', August, 1971, Parker Survey Associates, Surveyor, Lafayette Road, Seabrook, N.H., with the provision Great Eastern Land Corp. will put up a bond or certified check for \$2,500.00, which is the total cost for 1" finish coat of asphalt to be applied when the weather permits.

ARTICLE XXX11. Upon the petition of Stasia H. Holcroft and seventeen (17) others: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$11,000.00 to hot top True Road.

(Submitted without Recommendation of the Budget Committee)

(Disapproved by the Budget Committee)

ARTICLE XXXVII. Upon the petition of Antonio Santasucci and twenty-six (26) others: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,000.00 to gravel and hot top Dow's Lane.

(Submitted without Recommendation of the Budget Committee)

ARTICLE XXXVIII. To see what sums of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the expense of the General government, for the protection of persons and property, for health and sanitation, for highways and bridges, for the support of the Town Poor and for all necessary expenditures for the ensuing year.

ARTICLE XXXIX. To transact all other legal business that may come before said meeting.

Gentlemen:

Submitted herewith is the report of the annual examination and audit of the accounts of the Town of Seabrook for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1970, which was made by this Division in accordance with the vote of the Town. Exhibits as hereafter listed are included as part of the report.

One of the enclosed audit reports must be given the Town Clerk to be retained as part of the permanent Town records.

SCOPE OF AUDIT

Included in the examination and audit were the accounts and records of the Board of Selectmen, Treasurer, Tax Collector, Town Clerk, Municipal Court, Water Department, Trustees of Trust Funds, Special Water Project Fund and Bi-Centennial Account.

FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

General Fund:

Comparative Balance Sheets-December 31, 1969 and
December 31, 1970: Exhibit A-1

Comparative Balance Sheets- General Fund- As of
December 31, 1969 and December 31, 1970 are presented in
Exhibit A-1. As indicated therein, the Net Debt of the
Town decreased by \$16,185.86 in 1970, from \$474,001.20 at
December 31, 1969 to \$457,815.34 at December 31, 1970.

Analysis of Change in Financial Condition: Exhibit A-2

An analysis of the change in financial condition of the Town during the year is made in Exhibit A-2, with the factors which caused the change indicated therein. These were as follows:

Comparative statements of appropriations and expenditures, estimated and actual revenues- general fund- for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1970, are presented in Exhibits A-3 and A-4. As indicated by the Budget Summary (Exhibit A-4), a revenue surplus of \$12,251.11 less a net overdraft of appropriations of \$2,172.93 resulted in a net budget surplus of \$10,078.18.

TREASURER

General Fund:

Summary Statement of Receipts and Expenditures:
(Exhibit B-1)

A summary statement of general fund receipts and expenditures for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1970 made up in accordance with the uniform classification of accounts, is included in Exhibit B-1. Proof of the Treasurer's balance as of December 31, 1970, is indicated in Exhibit B-2.

Municipal Court: (Exhibits E-1 and E-2)

The activity in the accounts of the Municipal Court during 1970 is disclosed in Exhibits E-1 and E-2.

Water Department:

Comparative Balance Sheets- December 31, 1969
and December 31, 1970:(Exhibit F-1)

Comparative Balance Sheets of the Water Department as of December 31, 1969 and December 31, 1970, are presented in Exhibit F-1. As stated therein, the Net Debt of the department decreased by \$28, 465.91 in 1970, from \$509,926.23 to \$481,460.32.

Classified Statement of Receipts and Expenditures:
(Exhibit F-2)

A classified statement of Water Department receipts and expenditures is contained in Exhibit F-2. Proof of the Treasurer's balance at December 31, 1970 is shown in Exhibit F-3.

Special Water Project Fund: (Exhibit F-4)

A summary of the activity in the Special Water Fund is included in Exhibit F-4.

Statement of Long Term Indebtedness: (Exhibit H)

A statement of the outstanding long term indebtedness of the Town as of December 31, 1970, showing annual debt service requirements, is contained in Exhibit H.

AUDIT PROCEDURE

The accounts and records of all town officials charged with the custody, receipt and disbursement of public funds were examined and audited in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards, and accordingly included such tests of the accounting records and such other auditing procedures as were considered necessary in the circumstances.

Verification of uncollected and unredeemed taxes was made by mailing notices to delinquent taxpayers as indicated by the Tax Collector's records. Consequently, the amounts of uncollected and unredeemed taxes as indicated in this report are subject to any changes which may be necessitated by the return of verification notices.

GENERAL COMMENTS

Current Surplus- General Fund:

The general fund current surplus (excess of total assets over current liabilities) decreased by \$12,512.68 during 1970, from 1970, from \$18,285.18 to \$5,772.50 as shown herewith:

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Overdraft of Appropriation and Application of the Municipal Budget Law:

There was an overdraft of appropriations amounting to \$2,172.93 in the fiscal year ended December 31, 1970, as disclosed by the Budget Summary (Exhibit A-4). Included in this amount, however, was an overdraft in the "Overlay" account in the amount of \$1,184.02. Inasmuch as the amount of "Overlay" is fixed by the Board of Selectmen rather than appropriated by the Town, the actual net overdraft of budgetary appropriations in 1970 was \$988.91, (\$2,172.93-\$1,184.02).

In accordance with the provisions of the Municipal Budget Law, R.S.A., Chapter 32, application should have been made to the Tax Commission by the Board of Selectmen, with the written approval of the Budget Committee, for a certificate of emergency authorizing expenditures in excess of budgetary appropriations.

Unredeemed Taxes:

As of December 31, 1970, unredeemed taxes on account of the levies of 1967 and prior years amounted to \$22,426.11, as shown in the following tabulation:

This amount represents approximately thirty eight percent (38%) of the total unredeemed taxes outstanding at December 31, 1970, as shown by the Tax Collector's records.

The statutory redemption period has expired in all of these cases. The Tax Collector, therefore, should have delivered tax deeds to the Town for all the tax-delinquent real estate involved. This, however, was not done prior to the close of the fiscal year ended December 31, 1970.

Consequently, these unredeemed taxes are carried on the records as part of the total assets of the general fund and, in our opinion, overstate the amount of the Town's current surplus.

To correct this situation, we have set up the sum of \$22,426.11 as a provision for estimated uncollectible tax liens on the Balance Sheet of December 31, 1970 (Exhibit A-1) This reduces the estimated recoverable tax liens held by the Town at that date to \$36,654.89. We believe that this latter amount reflects more realistically the net assets and current surplus of the Town at the close of the fiscal year 1970.

We have instructed the Tax Collector to execute tax deeds to the Town at once on all properties on which tax liens are in default, in accordance with the requirements of R.S.A 80:38.

Surety Bond of Town Treasurer:

The surety bond of the Town treasurer should be increased in amount from \$25,000.00 to \$29,000.00 in order

that it may be proportional to the amount of funds received by this official. This bond should be issued on an annual basis in that amount.

Tax Collector:

The tax collector should adopt the use of the prescribed columnar cash journal in which all tax payments (cash or check) should be recorded and classified.

Tax payments should be recorded in the calendar year in which these are received. The collector's cash book should be closed on December 31, of each fiscal year.

It was found that the lists supporting the poll and head tax warrants had been altered by the Tax Collector. The names of persons appearing on the original lists, in some cases, were removed and the names of persons added to the tax rolls after the original warrants had been committed to the Collector were substituted. This practice should be abandoned. All taxes which are assessed after the original commitment of taxes to the collector should be listed on a separate page in the warrant books. Supplemental warrants should be issued for the collection of such taxes.

Water Department:

Inasmuch as the Town of Seabrook operates under the provisions of the Municipal Budget Law, annual appropriations of the Water Department must be submitted to the budget committee for consideration as are other Town appropriations and likewise must be included in the budget forms (Form M-7) which are posted with the annual town warrant. The same limitations apply to Water Department expenditures as apply to other Town expenditures, i.e., expenditures may not exceed budgetary appropriations.

Our audit reveals that gross appropriations for this department have not been included in the annual budget forms as required. We were advised that the amount actually raised under the caption "Municipally Owned Water Utilities" covered hydrant rentals only.

The records of the Town indicate that the Water Department over a period of years was advanced funds which had not been raised by the Town. These funds were used to sustain the operating expenses of the department, which obviously were in excess of revenues. As of December 31, 1970, the balance of advances due the town general fund by the Water Department amounted to \$36,577.52.

It is recommended that a complete double entry, accrual system of accounting be adopted for the Water Department. This system would include the use of general ledgers with such nominal and proprietary accounts (and related subsidiary accounts and ledgers) as are necessary to show accurately the financial condition of this enterprise and the results of its' operations. Under the present system of accounting such information is virtually impossible to obtain.

Municipal Court:

Some difficulty was experienced in reconciling the accounts of the Municipal Court for the fiscal year 1970.

To comply with accepted accounting procedures applicable to Municipal and District Courts, the following procedures should be adopted:

1. All expenditures should be entered in the payment section of the docket book. These should be recorded in ink.
2. Bail receipts should be attached to complaints
3. The amount of bail set by the Court should appear in the proper space on complaints.
4. The date fines are paid should be duly recorded on each complaint.
5. All money columns of the docket book should totaled cumulatively for the fiscal year.
6. The checking accounts should be reconciled monthly. Any differences which occur between these records should be located and adjusted promptly.
7. All court expenditures should be paid by check.
8. An accurate register should be maintained to account for bail in the custody of the Clerk of Court.

In this connection, attention is called to Chapter 31, Sections 25 and 27, of R.S.A., relative to how Trust Funds may be invested. All funds are required to be invested in approved banks located and doing business in the State of New Hampshire.

It is noted, therefore, that only the funds deposited in the Rockingham National Bank and the Portsmouth Trust Company are invested in accordance with the governing statutes.

Conclusion:

The provisions of Chapter 184 of the Laws of 1955 require that the auditors' summary of findings and recommendations (letter of transmittal) shall be published in the next annual report of the Town. Publication of the Exhibits contained in the audit report is optional, at the discretion of the Board of Selectmen.

We extend our thanks to the officials of the Town of Seabrook for their assistance during the course of the audit.

This is to certify that we have examined and audited the accounts and records of the Town of Seabrook for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1970.

Our examination was made in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards and accordingly, included such tests of the accounting records and such other auditing procedures as were considered necessary in the circumstances.

Inasmuch as the accounts of the Water Department are kept substantially on a cash basis, expenditures for plant property and equipment are expensed in the year purchased. Plant and equipment ledgers are not maintained. The value of the Water Department's fixed assets, therefore, could not be determined as of December 31, 1970, and is not reflected in this report. Consequently, we are unable to express an opinion as to the fairness of the current financial condition of the Water Department as expressed in Exhibit F-1.

With this exception, in our opinion, the Exhibits included herewith present fairly the financial condition of the Town of Seabrook as of December 31, 1970, together with the results of operations for the fiscal year ended on that date.
