

WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Stewartstown, in the County of Coos in said State qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the town house in said town of Stewartstown on Tuesday, the 10th day of March next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

1. To see if the town will vote to accept State Aid.
2. To see if the Town will vote to accept the Budget, as approved by the Municipal Budget Committee and raise money for the same. If not, to see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to defray town charges for the ensuing year as follows:
 - (a) Town Officers' Salaries.
 - (b) Town Officers' Expenses.
 - (c) Election and Registration.
 - (d) Municipal Court Expenses.
 - (e) Town hall, office and other buildings
 - (f) Damage and Legal Expenses.
 - (g) Health Department.
 - (h) Town Dump Expenses
 - (i) Vital Statistics
 - (j) General Expense of Highway Department
 - (k) Civil Defense.
 - (l) Interest on Temporary Loans.
 - (m) County Tax.
3. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for support of poor.
4. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for support of Libraries.
5. To raise such sum of money as may be necessary for care of cemeteries.

17. To see if the town will vote to pave and raise money for the following purposes:
 1. Riverside Street from St. Albert Church to the Oscar Cote property.
 2. The so-called Bohan Street from the State highway to Riverside Street.
 3. Do the necessary repairs to Riverside Street, damaged last summer by the laying of a new water main.

18. To see if the town will vote to establish zoning ordinance in the Town of Stewartstown.

19. To choose by Non-Partisan Ballot the following Town Officers:
 - (a) Town Clerk.
 - (b) Selectman for the three years ensuing.
 - (c) Town Treasurer.
 - (d) Two Road Agents.
 - (e) One or more Auditors.
 - (f) Overseer of Public Welfare.
 - (g) Collector of Diamond Pond Rent.
 - (h) One or more Sextons.
 - (i) Trustee of Trust Funds.
 - (j) One library trustee for the three years ensuing.

20. To transact any other business that may be legally brought before this meeting.

Superintendent's Report

To the School Board and the Citizens of the School District
of Stewartstown

FOREWORD

History tells us that a great majority of our early forefathers on this continent received a goodly share of their early education outside of school. Theirs was the rigorous school of life which was required to meet the challenges of the times, and not too much thought was given to subject matter content and the best way to get it across to the learner. Survival itself sufficed outside and the birch rod spoke rather convincingly inside the classroom.

In the atomic and space age of today, when we have come to lean more and more upon mechanization and scientific advancement to get things done, of necessity greater and greater reliance has had to be placed upon the more formal aspect of the educational effort. Although certain values, certain knowledge, and certain skills of long and universal standing apply just as much today as they did when our ancestors hit this country, the constant demand for new learnings and competencies emphasizes the urgency of an educational program of ever growing scope and quality.

As has been true down through the years, the two factors within the schools which will largely determine the extent that education meets this challenge are the learner and what he learns. With greater recognition of the unique differences and the greatly broadened experience horizons of the former, and the designing of procedures and selection of subject matter content in keeping with the latter, the standards of achievement may well be extended beyond the present academic level.

TEACHERS

The district is very fortunate in that, with the exception of one, all teachers returned this year. Miss Sylvia M. Hodge, a graduate from Plymouth Teachers College, replaces Mrs. Esther H. Bean in the upper grade room at the Hollow School. Mrs. Mary A. Pease teaches in the lower grades. The three veteran teachers

at the West Stewartstown School are: Mrs. Gladys M. Oakes, Principal, grades 6-8; Mrs. Henrietta W. Jackson, grades 4-5; Mrs. Cleora M. Richardson, grades 1-3.

SCHOOL NURSE—HEALTH

Mrs. Dorothy L. Ducret, our new school nurse who received her training at the Maine General Hospital, Portland, Maine, is continuing the same comprehensive type of program as has been done during the past several years, which has been so effective in maintaining consistent overall good health in the schools. As has been cited before, in addition to the many daily and routine services, the work includes complete physical examinations every four years, various periodic immunizations, and annual pre-school and X-ray clinics.

GROUNDS—BUILDINGS—EQUIPMENT

At long last, heavy-wire fences have been constructed on the grounds at both schools. Supported by cedar posts and a top rail, both painted white, the one along the front of the yard next to the road at the Hollow creates an attractive effect and at the same time provides greater safety to pupils while on the playground. At West Stewartstown, where the wire is fastened to iron posts and top rails, the new fence replaces the former wood portion which included the south and north sides and the back. This fence, also, provides greater safety to the pupils while playing outside, and improves appreciably the overall appearance of the grounds. Incidentally, it should be cited at this point that through the generosity of the St. Regis Paper Company a good-sized section of its land, which borders the school grounds on the south sides, has been leased to the district for a nominal sum and is now enclosed within the new fenced-in area.

Other than repairing the playground apparatus and the water system, installing additional shelves in one of the service rooms at the Hollow, the overhauling of the heating system, and painting the floors in the basement and lunch room at West Stewartstown, such other maintenance work as was done was minor in nature.

Outside of a few miscellaneous small items, the purchase of equipment during the last twelve-month period has been confined to that of an electric mixer for the lunch program at West Stewartstown and a liquid duplicator for the Hollow School.

SCHOOL LUNCH

As has been stated before, to conduct a school lunch program year after year in a small school, which, except for the cost of minor repairs and bottled gas used, is operated upon a self-supporting basis, is an outstanding achievement. This vitally-important, health-giving activity, which is carried on by Mrs. M. Eva Day, contributes much to the overall happy life and educational effort of the school.

A tabulation of the receipts and expenditures of this program for the year just completed will be found on subsequent pages in this report.

MILK PROGRAM

To date, patronage of the milk program, begun at the Hollow School the first of November, has been exceptionally good for a school where most of the pupils come from homes operating dairy farms. This program, like the lunch program conducted in the west side of the district, will mean a great deal in building morale and in maintaining good health as it is continued over the years.

NOTES ON THE BUDGET

The School Board's budget for 1964-1965, which is in concurrence with that of the Budget Committee, is \$77,977 as compared to \$82,276 for the current year. This amount is reduced by an estimated income of \$31,300 which leaves a requested appropriation of \$46,677 to be raised through taxation by the town in comparison to \$54,776 for this year. Although the budget provides for an increase in salaries, lower costs of repairs and tuition result in an overall appreciable reduction from the amount voted for this year.

ENROLLMENT AND ATTENDANCE

The enrollment, at the time of this writing, of 110 is the smallest that it has been in ten years, as it was 132, 120, 124, 113, 112, 113, 117, and 113 respectively for the preceding nine years. A breakdown of the present enrollment shows 56 on the west and 54 on the east side of the district. The average percentage of attendance at these schools last year taken in the same order was 95.90 and 95.63, while the total number of tardinesses was 74 and 11.

TUITION PUPILS

In contrast to the smallest number being enrolled in schools within the district, the number enrolled outside, at the present time, of 62 is the largest that it has been in ten years since it was 55, 47, 47, 39, 45, 37, 35, 38, and 31 respectively for the previous nine years. Of the number of pupils for which the district is paying tuition for the current year, 23 are at Colebrook Academy, 37 at Canaan High School, Canaan, Vermont, and 2 at Colebrook Elementary School.

CONCLUSION

I wish to express my deep appreciation to the members of the School Board, parents, teachers, and citizens for all the assistance and cooperation received as we have worked together during the past several years to provide and to maintain high standards in our schools.
