



## REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

'To the School Board and Citizens of Surry:

I submit herein my sixth annual report as superintendent of schools.

Our legislators at Concord are striving to find some avenue by which they may lighten the burden of taxation. We heartily co-operate with them in so far as it does not cripple our educational institutions. Therefore, as the printing of reports is costly, I shall emphasize the word brevity in my remarks. My statements will be general rather than specific and given to details.

President Hoover has stated concisely the philosophy of our educational system in the following words: "Racial progress marches upon the feet of healthy and instructed children. There should be no child in America that is not born and does not live under sound conditions of health; that does not have full opportunity of education from the beginning to the end of our institutions; that is not free from injurious labor; that does not have every stimulation to accomplish the fullest of its capacities."

These promotions were based on regularity of attendance, daily rank, examinations and standard tests.

One hundred percent of our eighth grade promotions entered the Keene High School in September, viz: Stanley Scripture, William Stillings, Henry Porter, Doris Britton, Howard Wilbur and Alton Wilder. We hope a large percentage of them will continue through the four year course.

#### TEACHERS

Teachers for school year ending June 30, 1928, were as follows: North End, Miss E. Marteile Phillips; Village, Mrs. Ruth G. Connor. Both teachers maintained excellent discipline, gave evidence of thoughtful motivation and preparation of school work. The schools made commendable progress during the year. Both teachers are continuing their services during the present year. With the exception of a recent epidemic of grippe and colds the schools are moving along with usual success.

In conclusion, I wish to express my appreciation of the co-operation of teachers and the helpful support of parents and school board.
