THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Wakefield in the County of Carroll in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall in said Wakefield on Tuesday, the Twelfth day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriation of the same.
- 3. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the repairs of highways and bridges.
- 4. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of a Public Health Nurse to be employed by the Red Cross Organization.
- 5. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of Libraries and where it shall be expended.
- 6. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the proper celebration of Old Home Week.
- 7. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for State Aid Construction.
- 8. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Street Lighting in the villages of Sanbornville, Union, Wakefield, East Wakefield and Woodmans.
- 9. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the proper observance of Memorial Day.
 - 10. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the

Selectmen to hire such sums of money as may be necessary to pay Town Bills in anticipation of taxes.

- 11. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the suppression of Brown Tail and Gypsy Moths and Pine Blister.
- 12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the purchase of a snow plow for Tractor, also new Tractor and plow.
- 13. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for oiling roads.
- 14. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate on Province Lake Road providing the State passes joint resolution on road construction.
- 15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$554.79 the State to contribute the amount of \$2219.17 for Town Maintenance.
- 16. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the provisions of the Municipal Budget Act.
- 17. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

Of these twenty-one graduates, sixteen entered some secondary school in September. At this time we have 16 pupils in Brewster Academy, 17 in Rochester High School, and 6 in Nute High School.

Our estimate for high school tuition in last year's budget was too low. We estimated a cost of \$1300. The actual cost will be over \$1800. This additional cost should be taken care of in this year's budget.

We have reason to be grateful that tuition is free at Brewster Academy. Otherwise our tuition bill would be greater by some \$1200.

Several changes have been made in our corps of teachers this year. Mr. Linton has been transferred from East Wakefield to Union Grammar School. He is succeeded at East Wakefield by Mrs. Hazel Merrill of Ossipee. Mr. Norman Hartfiel is in charge of Sanbornville Grammar School. Mr. Hartfiel is a resident of Farmington and a graduate from the four-years' course at Keene Normal School.

Medical Inspection in the schools is continued in charge of Miss Maude McBride, whose report will follow.

Owing to a reduction in the number of supervisory unions in the state, many changes have been made in the former unions. Supervisory Union No. 41, in which Wakefield had been placed for fifteen years, has been broken up and the towns of which it had been composed have been put into three separate unions. Wakefield now forms a part of Supervisory Union No. 64, composed of Wolfeboro, Wakefield, Brookfield, Middleton, Moultonboro and Tuftonboro.

Hot lunches are being planned for the Wakefield Corner and Union schools through the cooperation of the Woman's Club and the Ossipee Rotary Club. The East Wakefield school is 100% with hot lunches, each child bringing his own.
