WARRANT FOR THE ANNUAL TOWN MEETING

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

(L. S.)

To the inhabitants of the Town of Webster, in the County of Merrimack, in said State, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Grange Hall in said Webster on Tuesday, the eleventh day of March, next at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
3. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for the maintenance of highways and bridges.
 - (a) Summer Maintenance
 - (b) Winter Maintenance
 - (c) Tar Roads
 - (d) General Expense of Highway Dept.
 - (e) Street Lighting
4. To raise and appropriate the sum of \$539.46 for Class V road construction.
5. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 for State Aid Construction to complete the Tyler road.
6. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for public welfare.
 - (a) Town Poor
 - (b) Old Age Assistance

7. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for the support of the town library.

8. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for patriotic purposes.

(a) Old Home Day

(b) Memorial Day

9. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for the support and maintenance of the Hy-Mar Fire Department, including forest fires.

10. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the care of cemeteries.

11. To see if the town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 for use in the connection with the State program for the eradication of White Pine Blister Rust.

12. To see if the town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$250.00 toward the operating deficit of the Concord Hospital, this amount being based on the number of patients admitted from Webster.

13. To authorize and empower the Board of Selectmen to borrow for the town by the issuance of notes a sum not exceeding \$20,000.00 in anticipation of taxes for the year 1958, said notes expressly payable from said taxes within one year from the date of issuance, and to authorize the Board of Selectmen to determine the rate of interest on such notes and to provide for the sale thereof.

14. To see what action the town wishes to take in regards to the purchase of Highway Equipment and raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be needed to cover said equipment.

15. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for the maintenance of the playground.

16. To see if the town will vote to accept, as a gift, a fire truck from Clarence E. Hyde.

17. To see what action the Town wishes to take in regards to the Housing or Disposal of the fire trucks, and to raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary.

18. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

FOREST FIRE PREVENTION IS EVERYBODY'S BUSINESS

New Hampshire faces a continuing challenge in its forest fire problem — 97% of all our forest fires being man-caused and preventable — a serious indictment of interest in our own welfare and that of our neighbor. Both the State and the towns are striving diligently to effectively meet the challenge through education of the public to the threat fire presents to our woodlands; by maintaining a well trained corps of wardens and deputy wardens in every community and by providing ample opportunity for all who wish to dispose of unwanted waste materials. Careless and perverse-ness, however, continue to be big hurdles.

Thoughtlessly discarded lighted cigars, cigarettes and matches from moving vehicles by hikers, hunters and fishermen; careless burning of debris during hazardous periods in dangerous locations; illegal burning; improperly extinguished debris, camp and cook fires all result in serious loss of property, disruption of industry and farm work and unnecessary expenditure of town and State funds.

To meet the challenge successfully, the State, your community and your local forest fire warden need YOUR thoughtful and cooperative effort — the rules are simple.

1. Don't burn at home — use your town dump and avoid all fire problems.
2. If you do burn, be sure to secure a written permit from your local forest fire warden when the ground is not covered with snow. Permits are required for open debris fires, home incinerators, outdoor fire places and camp fires. Your warden is instructed to permit burning if weather conditions, site and type of burning are safe.

3. Be sure that all lighted material — cigars, cigarettes and matches are completely out before discarding them. Use ash trays in automobiles.
4. Make certain that your debris, camp and cook fires are completely out before leaving them.
5. Insist that others be careful and comply with burning requirements.
6. Call the warden promptly when fire is detected and aid him to extinguish it.

REMEMBER — the fire you prevent might be the one which could burn YOUR property.

SCHOOL WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE
*To the Inhabitants of the School District in the town of
Webster, qualified to vote in district affairs:*

You are hereby notified to meet at the Grange Hall in said district on the 11th day of March 1958 at 1:00 o'clock in the afternoon to act upon the following subjects:

1. To elect the following School District Officers:
 - a. Moderator for the coming year.
 - b. Clerk for the ensuing year.
 - c. Member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.
 - d. Treasurer for the ensuing year.
2. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, and Committees chosen and pass any vote relating thereto.
3. To choose Agents, Auditors, Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.
4. To see what sum of money the district will raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from the state foundation aid fund together with other income; the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.
5. To see if the town will vote to adopt a plan for extending to employees of the town the benefits of title 11 of the Federal Social Security Act (Old age and Survivor's Insurance) as authorized by Chapter 101 of the Revised Statutes Annotated Amended by Chapter 301 and 332 of the Laws of 1955.

6. To see if the town wishes to exclude from the plan services in any class or classes of positions filled by popular election.

7. To see if the town wishes to exclude from the plan services in any class or classes of positions the compensation for which is on a fee basis.

8. If a plan for Social Security coverage is adopted, to see if the town will authorize the selectmen to execute on behalf of the town the necessary agreement with the State of New Hampshire to carry into effect the plan and to see if the town will designate the School Treasurer as the officer to be responsible for the administration of the plan.

9. To see if the School District will adopt as its school check-list the Town check-list, as provided in RSA 197:12a, as inserted by Laws of 1957, Chapter 57; this provision to be effective for the 1959 and subsequent annual district meetings.

Due to personal reasons Mrs. Rebecca Makin was not able to return to the Webster schools this year. In her place in the upper grade room is Mrs. Ethel Colby who has had many years of experience in rural schools. Mrs. Colby attended summer school this summer and has been taking extension courses this fall. Mrs. Mabel Anderson has been with us a long time and we hope will be with us a long time to come.

Miss Blanche Bailey has been Music Supervisor in the Supervisory Union for the past twelve years, serving the towns of Bradford, Hopkinton, Newbury, Sutton, Warner and Webster. Although she had a busy schedule during her first years in the district, the last five years we have had to make increasing demands on her time. The music programs at Simonds High School and Hopkinton High School have been greatly expanded, and, with the new Minimum Standards for High Schools, further expansion is necessary. To further aggravate the situation Hopkinton will have four additional classrooms next year.

This means that some major change will soon be necessary for our music program. There are two possible solutions to this problem. The first possibility is to add an additional music teacher to the district to relieve Miss Bailey of some of the work. The second alternative is to cut down the number of visits to the small schools and have Miss Bailey serve as a Music Supervisor rather than teacher. She would help the teachers set up their programs and continue to guide and direct the teachers with the teachers doing more of the actual teaching. It would mean that Miss Bailey might only be able to make about three visits a month instead of once a week.

Whatever decision is eventually made you may be sure that it will be a joint decision of the school boards, and that the children will be the determining factor.

During the spring and summer, the playground has been leveled off so that there will be an excellent area for playground activity. It is a great improvement in the playground and makes possible a fine recreational opportunity for the young people of Webster.

I enjoy my association with the Webster children and teachers. There is a fine community spirit that I hope you never lose.
