NOTICE TO DOG OWNERS

Section 6—Every owner or keeper of a dog three months old or over shall annually on or before April 30 cause it to be registered, numbered, described and licensed for one year from the first day of the ensuing May, in the office of the clerk of the city or town wherein said dog is kept, and shall cause it to wear around its neck a collar distinctly marked with its owner's name, and bearing attached to said collar a metal tag distinctly marked with its registered number. Said tag shall be furnished by the clerk at the expense of the city or town from the amount received from dog license fees.

Section 18—The mayor of each city and the selectmen of each town shall annually within ten days from May first issue a warrant to one or more police officers or constables directing them to proceed forthwith either to kill or cause to be killed all dogs within such city or town not licensed and collared according to the provisions of this chapter, and to enter complaint against the owners of keepers thereof; and any person may, and every police officer and constable shall kill or cause to be killed all such dogs whenever and wherever found.

- TOWN WARRANT -

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

[L.S.] To the Inhabitants of the Town of Cornish in the County of Sullivan in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House in said Cornish on Tuesday, the fourteenth day of March, next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, and to close at four of the clock, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing. One Selectman, One Trustee of Trust Funds, One Library Trustee for three years.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the repair of highways and bridges.
- 4. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for Memorial Day.
- 5. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the repair of cemeteries.
- 6. To see if the town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to borrow money if necessary in anticipation of taxes.
- 7. To see what action the town will take in making up any deficiency in the Mercer Fund and raise money therefor.
- 8. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the control of White Pine Blister Rust.
- 9. To see if the town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to sell or otherwise administer on property acquired through tax sales.
- 10. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of One Thousand Four Hundred Forty Three Dollars (\$1443.00) for State Aid construction and instruct the Selectmen to apply for State

- Aid. Or would the town rather raise Seven Hundred Thirteen Dollars and Six Cents (\$713.06) for Class V roads. In case we apply for State Aid, the State will pay us (\$2886.00) Two Thousand Eight Hundred Eighty Six Dollars. If we apply for Class Five, the State will pay us (\$2852.24) Two Thousand Eight Hundred Fifty Two Dollars Twenty Four Cents.
- 11. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the support of the George H. Stowell Free Library.
- 12. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of Twenty Five Hundred Dollars (\$2500.00) to pay this year's note on money borrowed to build the Mercer Bridge.
- 13. To see what action the town will take in regard to raising One Hundred Dollars (\$100) to pay interest on note given for money to build the Mercer Bridge.
- 14. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for buying a light road machine to use with the truck.
- 15. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of Five Hundred Twenty Seven Dollars Sixty Three Cents (\$527.63) to pay for necessary repairs that had to be made on the Tractor.
- 16. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the support of Town Poor, Old Age Assistance and Soldiers' Aid.
- 17. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of (\$75.00) Seventy Five Dollars for street lights on Cornish Flat for the ensuing year.
- 18. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money not to exceed (\$75.00) Seventy Five Dollars for issuing and distribution of printed matter calling attention to the resources and natural advantages of the town in cooperation with other towns in the Dartmouth-Lake Sunapee Region: said appropriation to be distributed by the Selectmen.
- 19. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of Three Hundred Dollars (\$300) to be used for culverts only.
- 20. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) for Forest Fire Equipment, to be matched by an equal amount of State Funds.
- 21. To see if the town will vote to discontinue the road from the James Wark farm so called south and east to the intersection of the Witherill and Paget extension roads.

- 22. To see if the town will vote to discontinue the brook road from Carroll Kenyon's to the Powers hill road.
- 23. To hear the reports of Officers, Agents, Auditors and Committees heretofore chosen and pass any vote in relation thereto.
- 24. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

REPORT OF TRUSTEES OF G. H. STOWELL FREE LIBRARY

To The Citizens of Cornish:

In spite of broken windows, damaged roof and failure of electric light service, all of which were due to the hurricane, the library functioned on regular schedule throughout the year.

In addition to the regular established service to local schools, a special school project is underway, a reading contest among upper grade pupils. Note books reporting on books read will be submitted, judged, and book prizes will be awarded. The reading list compiled was checked with the State Board of Education's approved list, and all books included are obtainable at the library.

An interesting exhibit of school work from different school districts was displayed at the library at the close of the school year. It attracted much attention and favorable comment and the librarian plans to arrange a repeat display.

A group of 32 local pupils visited the library in May. Mrs. Dean as hostess conducted the group through the building, giving the story of its erection and explaining to the older children the use of the filing system. Pupils entering High school have since reported that the information on the use of files has been helpful.

Superintendent's Report

To the School Board of Cornish:

I hereby submit my sixth annual report as your superintendent of schools.

Because of the small number of pupils that would attend the Dingleton Hill School, it was closed for this year.

Four of last year's teachers did not return to Cornish for this year's work. Three accepted positions in other school systems and one was married.

Mrs. Marjorie Kidder was transferred to the Center School, Mrs. Ethel Johnson is continuing with the work at the City School, and Mrs. Winifred Barton at the South School.

Miss Dora Pinkham of Steuben, Maine, a graduate of Gorham Normal School is teaching the Chadbourne School. Miss Pinkham has had several years' experience, and she came very highly recommended for the work. Miss Reta Batchelder of Claremont, a Keene Normal School graduate with one year's experience was placed in charge of the Tracy School. Mrs. Merrill Tatro, who has taught several years in Cornish before accepting a grade position at Charlestown holds the position at the Flat School.

We are very fortunate in holding three able teachers from last year and in the choice of new teachers. The positions at the Chadbourne School and at the Flat School were hard for any teachers. The Board wanted someone for each place who could have order and at the same time create an interest that would make the lives of the pupils happy. I believe that it has been done.

The schools are of good size. At the opening of school the Flat School had five grades with 38 pupils, the South School three grades with 27 pupils, the Center School, eight grades with 22 pupils, the City School four grades with 27 pupils, the Tracy School seven grades with 20 pupils, and the Chadbourne School four grades with 19 pupils, making a total of 153 pupils.

There has been 55 pupils in high school this year, but already 5 have dropped out of Claremont High School and 2 out of Windsor High School. We have 6 seniors in high school, and 12 pupils in the eighth grade. From these conditions it is estimated that we shall have from 50 to 55 pupils in high school next year. I

hope that the costs of high school education may be placed on a plan of equalization the same as the costs of elementary schools are.

As your superintendent I feel that this has been a very successful year thus far. I wish to thank the Cornish School Board, the teachers and the citizens who have made this year's success.

Skin disease 8, Pediculosis 3, Chicken Pox 14, Pneumonia 1, Common Colds (?). The school dental clinic was held in May, 1938 when sixty children were given dental care by Dr. Irving Crandall. The clinic was financed by the parents, friends and the Red Cross. Limited funds and the present business conditions made it impossible to take care of all the school children. We were able to have all the children in the first five grades cared for. It is important that dental health become a regular function in the school program.

The school health program includes the regular health inspections at the opening of schools in the fall. These inspections are continued regularly through the year. Class room inspections, weighing and measuring, home visits, follow-up work, taking children to clinics or to hospitals, contacting social agencies for special work with the children, business and official calls, conferences, school talks, etc.

I wish to thank the Superintendent of Schools, the School Board, the teachers, parents and others who assisted in many ways to bring about another school health program.
