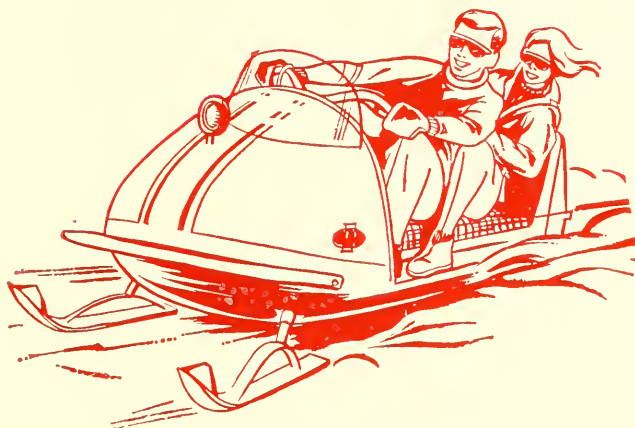

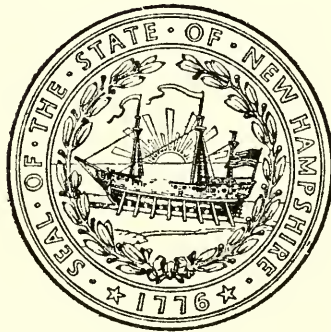

SELECTMEN'S REPORT

The members of the Board of Selectmen engaged in the usual round of activities: meeting weekly on Tuesday nights to work on payroll, pay bills, keep records and to interview those who came into the office for information, advice on one matter or another or to make complaints; and, to make whatever decisions the Selectmen are called upon to make in the performance of their responsibilities. Numerous extra meetings were used in preparation of records and reports. Assessing properties in the field and the revising of property assessment cards and recording transferred properties have been time consuming.

In carrying out the will of the last Town Meeting, bridge repair became a chief concern last summer. Major repairs were made on the Bohamon and the Roy Ford bridges. For a number of years the Bog Bridge has given us deep concern, especially in view of several accidents there, and we feel that we should no longer postpone its reconstruction. Hence, we recommend the adoption of the Article in the Warrant.

Sections of the North Road were resurfaced and sealing was done on the Frazier Sfith Road and the new section of Waukeena Road. The sealing of several black top roads is on the agenda for this summer.

The Board met with the New Hampshire State Highway engineer and the Town Highway Safety Committee and weighed the pros and cons relative to the improvement of the traffic flow in the village, at the intersection of Routes 4 and 104. The State's layout of the island area appears to have eliminated some of the confusion to motorists at the intersection. It is suggested that interested groups and citizens cooperate in a beautification project of planting in the island some low growing shrubbery strategically located so as not

to obstruct vision.

The Highway Department has been somewhat handicapped this winter by repeated breakdowns of major parts on the Town truck, a vehicle purchased in 1967, now 5 years old, and with more than an accumulated 70,000 mileage. To guarantee efficient operation, the Highway Department requires dependable equipment. It is advisable that, from here on, a sum of money be set aside each year, beginning in 1973, in the Capital Reserve Fund in anticipation of the purchase of new trucks as they are needed in future years. This will ease the tax burden of paying the full cost of a truck in one year and, also, will save interest in cases where a bank loan is necessary.

It was gratifying to all of us to learn that it was not necessary to increase the tax rate in 1971. Our good fortune was realized because of the \$6000 subsidy from the Gas Tax revenue, our Town's share of the New Hampshire State's new source of income.

You are urged to read reports of the various groups serving our Town and, especially, to note the achievements of the latest organizations reporting; namely, the Danbury Planning Board and the Kearsarge Visiting Nurse Association. We commend their efforts most heartily.

The members of the Board of Selectmen are most appreciative of Town Officers and public spirited citizens who have shown serious interest in our efforts by their expressions of goodwill and their cooperation. Please continue to send in your suggestions on matters of concern to the Town and the townspeople. Constructive and cooperative suggestions and justifiable criticisms will be given careful consideration.

TOWN WARRANT**The State of New Hampshire**

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Danbury in the County of Merrimack in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Town of Danbury on Tuesday, the seventh day of March, next at one of the clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing. Business meeting on all other articles to begin at 7:30 P.M.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

3. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the maintenance of Highways.

4. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sums of \$4200.00 plus \$693.00 for principal and interest on the long term Grader note, and the sum of \$1665.00 plus \$183.42 for principal and interest on the long term Bucket Loader note.

5. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$986.89 TRA money and receive the State's contribution of \$6579.24.

6. To see if the Town will continue to co-operate with the towns of Bradford, New London, Springfield, Sutton, Warner and Wilmot for the purpose of enabling the KEARSARGE VISITING NURSE ASSOCIATION to provide home nursing and other related services to the inhabitants of the participating towns, and to raise and appropriate an amount equal of \$1.25 per inhabitant of the town, the total amount being \$625.

7. To see what sum of money the Town will raise for the care and maintenance of Cemeteries.

8. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$450 for the George Gamble Library.

9. To see if the Town will vote to accept a two-stall one-story addition to be erected as an extension of the existing Fire Station, and to be planned and paid for in its entirety by the Volunteer Fire Department.

10. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$600 to meet the necessary expenditures of the Danbury Volunteer Fire Department.

11. To see if the Town will raise the sum of \$100 and appropriate the same for the Forest Fire Division, and if unexpended at the end of the fiscal year transfer the unexpended balance to the Capital Reserve Fund for the purchase of equipment.

12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$75 in support of the Twin Rivers Health Association.

13. To see if the Town will raise the sum of \$55 for Old Home Day and Veterans' Memorials.

14. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell real estate taken by the Town for non-payment of taxes or by Collector's deed.

15. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$50 for Civil Defense, and if unexpended at the end of the fiscal year, transfer such sum to a capital reserve fund for Civil Defense purposes.

NOTE: This Warrant contains only those articles submitted prior to going to press and is subject to additions, to be added to the posted warrant.

REPORT OF THE FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND DISTRICT CHIEF

Lest We Forget – It Can Happen Here

Disastrous forest and brush fires that destroy hundreds of homes are more prevalent on the west coast with their dry seasons and strong dry hot winds but 25 years ago this fall is the anniversary of a disaster that devastated large areas of northern New England leaving villages in ashes with rows of cellarholes and chimneys in a number of summer vacation home locations. Many lives were lost on that destructive day of October 23, 1947 – nothing could stop the wind driven flames.

It is true that such conditions are unusual for New Hampshire but they happened once, they can happen again. The fuel for fires is all around us. All it takes is a firebrand. Only by cultivating a habit of carefulness with fire at all times can we meet the challenge of protection when dry conditions prevail. Please let these reminders be your guide :

1. Never, either when walking, riding or driving, discard a firebrand – a lighted match or a glowing cigarette.
2. Always obtain a permit for any outside burning. The burning of household rubbish is not permitted if your town has rubbish collection. Burning of grass or garden litter can be dangerous. See your warden first.
3. If you camp or picnic, be sure open fires are allowed and if they are, put them *dead out* when leaving.
4. *Most important* – Instruct your children in the danger of the lighted match. A lighted match and dry grass or forest litter is a dangerous combination

which leads to destructive loss and can lead to tragedy.

The past year – 1971 was a favorable year for the control of fires. There were too many fire starts in some towns. We thank those who remembered and ask others to heed Smokey's message.

There should be money provided by the Town for the cost of flares, at \$35.00 a case, the cost of which I have been assuming.

DANBURY PLANNING BOARD

Immediately after the last Town Meeting your Planning Board held 8 meetings, 2 of which were open to the public, to draw up, correct and finalize the Subdivision Regulations for the Town of Danbury, also Minimum Road Standards for the Town of Danbury. These were then recorded with the Merrimack County Registry of Deeds, the N.H. State Planning Board and N.H. Water Supply and Pollution Control Commission. Members of the Planning Board put in many volunteer hours traveling and attending meetings to obtain information on Planning Board duties and Subdivision Regulations. The Planning Board has granted approvals (in some cases partial approval) for 6 subdivisions.

It was voted, in accordance with paragraph 36:8 of the Planning Enabling Legislation in New Hampshire, to hold regular meetings on the 2nd Wednesday of June, September and December and 1st Wednesday of March. Special meetings can be called by the chairman whenever necessary.

KEARSARGE VISITING NURSE ASSOCIATION

The Kearsarge Visiting Nurse Association, which serves Danbury and six other communities, has had a very busy and productive year, offering residents such services as skilled nursing care, physical therapy, speech therapy, nursing evaluations, case-finding and health supervision in such areas as mental health, diet instruction and use of surplus foods, instruction on safety hazards, care of newborns, crippled, handicapped and retarded children and adults, disease prevention and health promotion.

Also, referrals were made to physicians, welfare, child and family services, nursing homes, school nurses, mental health clinics, local organizations, other VNAs, hospitals. There were communications with hospital personnel, medex, social service department for purpose of follow-up through their referral system to K.V.N.A.

Mrs. Lois Spearman, R.N., visiting nurse, traveled 11,687 miles during 1971, making 1,252 visits. *139 of these visits were to homes in Danbury.*

Immunization clinics, for all participating towns, were held in each of the towns New London and Warner in April, May, June September, October and November, a total of 12 clinics reaching 294 children with 548 immunizations. The following vaccines were available: DPT, tetanus, polio, smallpox, measles and rubella.

Conferences and professional meetings attended by the visiting nurse included:

1. Board of Directors' Meetings of the K.V.N.A.
2. Consultations with physicians, VNAs, welfare, etc.
3. Inservice education regarding:
 - a. Crotched Mountain Rehabilitation Center
 - b. Blue Cross-Blue Shield requirements

- c. State TB control program
 - d. Other local VNAs, their problems - with discussion of cases and procedures
 - e. Interviewing and orientation of relief nurse for vacation, sick leave, etc.
 - f. Observing and finding abnormalities of the heart and lungs.
4. Discussions with State public health nurse in this area
 5. N.H. Council on Aging
 6. Alcohol and drug abuse symposium
 7. Cancer workshop
 8. Lecture on diabetes

Future plans of the Association include expansion of health supervision and promotion with the utilization of a part-time nurse; more frequent immunization clinics; child health conferences; responsibility for following of TB patients (re new State TB control program); and, keeping community and local organizations more aware of their own health needs and help them to meet those needs.

During 1971 Danbury contributed 8.1% of total money contributed by participating towns and received in excess of 11% of the service given.

The valuable health services rendered by the Association speak for themselves. As Danbury's members of the Board of Directors, we heartily recommend the continuous participation of the Town of Danbury in the Kearsarge Visiting Nurse Association.
