# TOWN WARRANT

#### THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Deering, in the County of Hillsborough in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Deering on Tuesday, the eighth day of March, next at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

Article 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year. Submitted by Selectmen.

Article 2. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,000.00 for the Town Officers' salaries and expenses. Submitted by Selectmen.

Article 3. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$150.00 for the elections and registrations. Submitted by Selectmen.

Article 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 for the upkeep of the Town Hall and other buildings. Submitted by Selectmen.

Article 5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 for the Police and Fire Departments. Submitted by Selectmen.

Article 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$750.00 for insurance. Submitted by Selectmen.

Article 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,500.00 for winter and \$5,000.00 for summer roads. Submitted by Selectmen.

Article 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$777.98 to secure Town Road Aid. Submitted by Selectmen.

Article 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$310.00 for street lights. Submitted by Selectmen.

Article 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,450.00 for Old Age Assistance and Town Poor. Submitted by Selectmen.

Article 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$70.00 for the Monadnock Region Association, or pass any vote relating thereto. Submitted by Selectmen.

Article 12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 for interest. Submitted by Selectmen.

Article 13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,268.00 for notes on the grader and bridges. Submitted by Selectmen.

Article 14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,600.00 for County Tax. Submitted by Selectmen.

Article 15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$10.00 for flags for Soldiers' graves on Memorial Day. Submitted by Selectmen.

Article 16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum equal to one year's average of monies (approximately \$5,964.54) which the town has raised and appropriated and to which the State has contributed for Town Road Aid or about 85% for the purpose of completing, after July 1 and during 1955, portion of roads for which there are no monies available from appropriation under Article 21 of 1954 Warrant, such sum to be raised through issuance of bond or note under and in accordance with the provision of statutes, and to authorize the Selectmen to issue and negotiate such bond or note and to determine the time and place of payment thereof, under such terms and conditions as they may deem to the best interests of the town. Such sum to be paid after payment of monies appropriated under Article 21 of 1954 Warrant or in three years (1958). A portion of the roads reconstructed in 1954 was so called stage construction, and unless completed, work done may be lost through wear and tear and erosion, and the State, therefore, will not contribute to rebuilding under Town Road Aid. The town's share will be approximately \$777.98 plus interest, the State's share about \$5,186.56. Submitted by Selectmen.

Article 17. To see if the Town will vote to pay the road agent an annual salary of \$2,500.00, instead of paying an hourly wage of \$1.20 an hour. The annual salary to be paid at the request of the agent in any denomination desired. Submitted by Selectmen.

Article 18. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$1,100.00 for a wing for the grader to plow snow. Submitted by Selectmen.

Article 19. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$50.00 for printing individual pocket size books of records of town assessment and valuations. To be sent out to each tax payer along with tax bill. Submitted by Selectmen.

Article 20. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$23,032.67 for Deering's share of the Cooperative School District. Submitted by Selectmen.

Article 21. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes. Submitted by Selectmen.

Article 22. To see if the Town will vote to permit the use of town equipment for private and state hire within the limits of the Town of Deering. Submitted by Selectmen.

Article 23. To see if the Town will vote to accept the already constructed road between the Arthur Ellsworth road and the last standing camp now owned by the Joe Brozowski heirs and raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 to improve and maintain said road. Submitted by Lewis J. Fisher.

Article 24. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to deliver inventory blanks to residents when assessing. Submitted by Selectmen.

Article 25. To see if the Town will vote to have the Town Clerk establish a reasonable schedule of hours for transacting the town clerk's duties. Submitted by Leon Bagdoyan.

Article 26. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to issue a Selectmen's deed to replace the deed issued in 1943 by the then Selectmen and Flossie Olson for the Charles T. Carter property in West Deering, such original deed having been lost or destroyed and not of record at the Registry of Deeds in Nashua. Submitted by James Hines, Atty.

Article 27. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to auction property taken by Tax Collector's Deed. Submitted by Selectmen.

Article 28. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same. Submitted by Selectmen.

Article 29. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting. Submitted by Selectmen.

# SCHOOL WARRANT

# THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the School District in the Towns of Hillsboro and Deering qualified to vote in district affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Hillsboro-Deering Cooperative High School Gymnasium in said district on the 4th day of March, 1955, at 7:30 o'clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose a Moderator for the coming year, a Member of the School Board for the ensuing five years, and two Auditors for the ensuing year.
- 2. To determine and appoint the salaries of the School Board and Truant Officer, and fix the compensation of any other officers or agent of the district.
- 3. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees, or Officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 4. To choose Agents, Auditors and Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.
- 5. To see what sum of money the district will raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from the state foundation aid fund together with other income; the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.
- 6. To see if the district will vote to appoint a committee, to work with the School Board, for the purpose of providing plans and presenting figures in connection with needed additional school facilities.
- 7. To see if the district will vote to rescind the amendment to the vote taken at the last district meeting pertaining to representation on the Cooperative School Board insofar as the same is related to the election otherwise at large under the statute.

- 8. To see if the District will authorize the School Board to make application for and to receive, in the name of the District, such advances, grants-in-aid or other funds for educational purposes as may now or hereafter be forthcoming from the U. S. Government and/or State Agencies.
- 9. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

## SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the School Board and Citizens of Hillsboro and Deering:

It is a pleasure to make my first report to you as Superintendent of Schools.

We are in the process of completing our first year as a cooperative school district and due to the planning and efforts of Mr. Moody and the school board the period of transition has been a smooth one indeed. Much credit is due these people for their untiring efforts to make this possible.

As anticipated, our enrollment continues to grow and our projection through 1960 shows no letup on total school enrollment although the potential entrants to the elementary school shows a slight decline with the population remaining constant, which at this writing does not seem probable.

On October 1, Mr. John Economopoulos took over the Principal's duties. His prior service consists of three years as principal of Henniker High School and two years at Newmarket High School. Mr. Williams Hoban was released early in September in order to devote full time to his camping business. Mr. Roger Rada of Queens, N. Y., has taken over his coaching and teaching duties. Mr. Rada comes to us after finishing his work for a Master's Degree at Springfield College.

Mrs. Eva Doble and Miss Lulu Cilley retired last June after many years of service to the youth of this area. Both were honored at graduation in June. Mrs. Iva Farrar replaces Mrs. Doble and Mrs. Elinor Vaillancourt returns to fill the vacancy in the elementary school created by Miss Cilley. Miss Frances Kelley starts her teaching career by filling a vacancy created by the need of an additional teacher.

Miss Marguerite Worth, teacher of Home Economics resigned to be married and moved to Michigan and we were fortunate in bringing back from Vermont, Miss Irene Mc-Alister, to replace her.

At Christmastime in 1953 Mr. Lund resigned to accept a more lucrative position in Connecticut. We finished out the year with three different substitutes and this year have as our shop teacher, Mr. Leo Bilodeau who comes to us from Lincoln. Mr. Gerald Avery, resigned to accept a position in his home community of Lebanon. Mr. James Stoughton of Amherst, Mass., replaces him in the English department.

This is quite a large turnover in a single year and I hope that the excellent staff which we now have will find it to their advantage to be with us for several years.

The program of studies was completely revised last spring and is in full operation this year. By this action we have been able to raise the standard in many of the college preparatory courses and feel that we are much better able to meet the needs of the pupils.

At a time when so much criticism of young people is prevalent, it is refreshing to be able to compliment our pupils for their efforts to cooperate with the administration and teachers.

The group accident insurance program which was inaugurated last year proved worthwhile and will probably continue to be a service offered to the pupils.

Our noon lunch program continues to grow more popular each year, under the capable management of Mrs. Florence McClintock assisted by Mrs. Henrietta Johnson. It is no longer in the experimental stage, but has come to stay as a school service and Hillsboro has every right to be proud of its kitchen and service.

This year with the aid of the Federal Government we have established a new milk program where the pupils are able to purchase a half-pint of milk at four (4) cents. In a 16 day period we served 7141 half-pints of milk. This is a wonderful program, in which every child should be participating, and we hope to see it continued a long time.

The problem of housing becomes more acute with each entering first grade. For complete information on this problem the committee authorized at the last District Meeting will give a full report.

Hillsboro is extremely fortunate in having as its school nurse Mrs. Anna Bailey, R. N. If ever a person was dedicated to her work, it is she. Her activities over and above the call of duty are innumerable. Again this year every child in both the high and elementary school was examined by a physician and all defects reported to the parents. Nurse Bailey's report will be found in another section.

In closing I wish to express my appreciation to the citizens of the community, the School Board, and the entire staff for making my work so enjoyable. Were it not for their cooperative efforts we would have been unable to accomplish so much toward our common goal—Education for our youth.

## NURSE'S REPORT

June 28, 1954

To the Board of Education of Hillsboro: 1953-1954

I am submitting an account of the School Nursing work for the year 1953-54.

For the first time in a number of years we were without a dental clinic in school, due to the illness of Dr. Harvey Grimes who has faithfully done so much for our school children every year for quite some time. We hope that he will come back to us in the coming year. Effort has been made to have other dentists come to school but so far we have had no success, thus, a very small amount of dental work has been done privately.

The hearing test clinic was held in school, as usual, with our HC Audiometer which takes care of the pupils from the 3rd through the 12th grades (358 were tested). 103 from the two 1st and the two 2nd grades also were tested this year with a True Tone Audiometer loaned to us by the State Board of Education in Concord. In all 461 were given that benefit. From that number only 6 were found defective, 4 slightly defective and 2 with hearing from one ear only—4 reported to an Otologist, the other 2 had already done so in the previous year.

We had 174 cases of Mumps in the 1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th, 5th, and 6th grades and 23 in the following grades: 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, and 12; with no complications from any of them; 1 case of chickenpox, 7 cases of Impetigo, and no pediculosis (head lice).

A T. B. Patch Clinic was held in school April 12. 201 were patched, that includes grades 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, and 3 teachers. Patches were removed after 48 hours and read again 2 days later. Only 11 were reactors. This was followed by a chest X-ray clinic on April 28. 41 pupils, 9 teachers, 2 adults in the Cafeteria, and the Office Secretary, 16 outside adults were X-rayed. All were found either negative or the finding insignificant, no T. B. in School. As in the past the Seniors requested the X-ray for future references only, and an individual report was issued to them for their benefit. Pupils paid 50¢, Adults \$1.00.

Free lunches were provided by the school to 12 pupils and on April 5th free lunches were provided by the P. T. A. to 10 more pupils. Free milk was given to 7 pupils, then to 5 pupils, these are the ones who bring their cold dry lunch. The free milk was paid with a small balance left in the bank just for that, plus \$10.00 given me by a member of the Nursing Association Board of Directors and \$1.00 by another lady, the rest \$1.50, was paid by me with the Salvation Army Fund. Thanksgiving and Christmas dinners were given to 10 and 14 children (24) also paid with the Salvation Army Fund (\$9.20), this was before free lunches were given to any one of them.
