Article 3. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriation of the same as set forth in the following budget:

Article 4. To see what action the town wishes to take in regard to proposed plans for the elementary school approach area and to raise the necessary funds.

Article 5. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,500.00 for the purchase of land for the purpose of erecting a Fire Station. Said section of land is located between the residence of Frederick Aldrich and the former Lobster Pound.

Article 6. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$150.00 for the Franconia Civic Improvement Cooperative.

Article 7. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 for the White Mountains 93 Association.

Article 8. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the necessary money to have the town of Franconia soil surveyed, a soil map developed and interpretations made of the same.

Article 9. To see if the town will vote to assume the responsibility of heating and lighting the Abbie Greenleaf Library at an estimated cost of \$500.00 and to raise and appropriate money for the same.

Article 10. To see if the town will vote to assume the responsibility of the custodial services of the Abbie Greenleaf Library and to raise the necessary funds.

Article 11. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$600.00 for the following purposes: (1) Install a power steering unit in fire apparatus Unit #1; (2) repaint fire apparatus Unit #2; and (3) repaint fire apparatus Unit #4.

Article 12. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,000.00 to acquire a new wheel-type front end loader.

Article 13. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,840.00 and pay such sum into the Aeronautical Fund and, further, to authorize the Selectmen, in accordance with the Revised Statutes Annotated, Chapter 423:8, to transfer said sum from the Aeronautical Fund to the N.H. Aeronautics Commission, said sum to be expended by said N.H. Aeronautics Commission on the Whitefield Regional Airport, so-called, in connection with the expansion of said airport facilities. Article 14. To see if the town will vote to allow the Selectmen to establish a Bridge Construction Reserve Fund with any unexpended funds of the Bridge Maintenance appropriation.

Article 15. To see if the town will vote to authorize a penalty of twenty cents on each poll tax unpaid on December 1 of each year, as authorized under Statute C66S44PL.

Article 16. To see if the town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to allow a discount for early payment of taxes.

Article 17. To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

Article 18. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

Presently we are revising our White Mountains Map which lists nearly 200 points of interest in our region, which was designed to keep the tourists with us a little longer. Information booth people tell us it is very popular with tourists. The new edition will be printed this winter.

Worked in cooperation and attended meetings with the White Mountains Recreation Association, Coos County Rural Areas Development Committee, Coos County Planning Committee, Carroll County Rural Areas Development Committee, N.H. Ski Areas Operators Association, White Mountains Region Industrial Council, the Coos, Carroll and Grafton Counties Community Action Program. The association with these many groups has been mutually helpful in developing new projects and programs in the north country.

REPORT TO HEALTH OFFICER TOWN OF FRANCONIA, N. H.

For Year Ending December 31, 1965

Three Well Child Conferences for Infants and Preschool children were held. 18 were given a physical examination by the attending physician, 28 received the polio vaccine, 37 received diphtheria, tetanus and whooping cough vaccine, and 9 were vaccinated for smallpox.

In the grades 1 & 4 at school booster shots of diphtheria and tetanus were given, and also the Heaf Sterneedle test for tuberculosis. These same two grades are done every year so that the children will be checked every 3 years.

Home visits were also made by the state public health nurse for follow up on cases.

This is the year when "Medicare" will come into effect. Starting July 1st, 1966 home nursing will be paid for by Medicare for those who are covered, over 65 years of age and in need of nursing care in the home after discharge from the hospital. With Medicare it is anticipated that there will be a shortage of hospital beds making the hospital stay shorter and requiring nursing care at home. For this reason we are urging the town fathers to start planning to provide this type of service, and to discuss means for hiring a local Public Health Nurse. Already your selectmen and your Civics club has shown interest in this project. Health Education, Prevention of Disease by teaching proper Immunizations, Exercises and Nutrition, Care of the Sick and Rehabilitation of the Aged are all nursing services needed in each and every town. Of course this would be under the direction of the family physician. The state nurse covers 15 towns so would not be able to do this work. The possibility of combining small towns together to be serviced by one nurse, (ex. Bethlehem, Franconia, Sugar Hill and Easton) is feasible and would be less costly. The office of Economic Opportunity, with headquarters in Woodsville, may be able to assist with funds to start this project. Later on we hope it would become self supporting.

Tax money is used for schools, road maintenance, police and fire protection. Healthy citizens should be as important if not more, because without health we cannot function.

My sincere thanks for the cooperation received.

REPORT OF SCHOOL NURSE-1965

The school health program was carried out with complete physicals on all pupils, whose parents requested them, by Dr. Parker the school physician.

Heights, weights, vision, and audiogram tests were done on all pupils and notices were sent home stating any defects found.

Registration day was held in May. Eighteen children were weighed and measured by the school nurse.

In October T.B. Heaf tests and diphtheria and tetanus injections were given—with parents' permission—to pupils in grades one and four.

I wish to thank all those connected with the school and the parents for their kind assistance and cooperation.

REPORT OF THE PRINCIPAL

I herewith submit my seventh annual report as Principal of the Franconia Elementary School.

ADMINISTRATION:

The present school year began on Wednesday, September 8, with a total registration of 85 pupils. As of this writing, there are 87 pupils enrolled in the school. A breakdown of this figure shows that 18 are in Kindergarten, 13 in Grade 1, 15 in Grade 2, 12 in Grade 3, 6 in Grade 4, 13 in Grade 5, and 10 in Grade 6.

The school day for Grades 1 - 6 starts at 8:00 A.M. with the doors being opened at 7:45. The school day ends at 2:30 P.M.

The teaching staff remained the same with but one exception. Mrs. Sally May of Littleton replaced Mrs. Maxine Aldrich in Kindergarten. Mrs. May is a graduate of Fitchburg State College and formerly taught in Bartlett, N.H. She is doing a splendid job under rather difficult circumstances. The Kindergarten, due to lack of space in the elementary school, is being held in the basement of the Town Building. It is in session there from 1:00 P.M. to 3:00 P.M. each school day.

This same room is also used by a private nursery school three mornings a week.

Robert Sheehan, custodian of the Town Building, is very cooperative in helping to carry out a rather complex schedule, involving much careful planning on the part of all concerned.

The other members of the faculty are Mrs. Evelyn Howe of Lancaster, who teaches Grade 2; Mrs. Leone Philbrook of Sugar Hill, who teaches Grades 3 and 4; and Mrs. Pauline Cole of Franconia, who teaches Grades 5 and 6. In addition to my duties as Principal, I teach Grade 1.

Mrs. Marion Callender of Lisbon continues to teach music in all grades.

Glenn Stillings of Littleton is again the Physical Education Instructor. He also assists in the Ski Program.

I find the faculty continues to be a conscientious and capable group of individuals, all of whom are very stimulating and highly cooperative at all times. They certainly have the welfare of your children at heart.

Richard Sullivan continues to do an outstanding job as school custodian. His constant helpfulness and courtesy are greatly appreciated.

CURRICULUM:

The program of studies is, of course, being carefully carried out with a great deal of emphasis being placed on the teaching of the basic fundamentals in each subject. As usual, the formation of good work habits is of primary concern. Individual guidance, direction and help are maintained.

After much research, as well as attendance at several reading workshops, the faculty recommended the new Scott and Foresman reading series. Those materials are now being used throughout the school. The phonetic phase of this new series is excellent. The reading material is proving of much interest to the pupils.

A new Science Mobile Laboratory has helped to update and modernize the teaching of Science in Grades 5 and 6.

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The Visual Aids Program continues to be a very important part of the school curriculum. The Speedi-o-scope is again a very helpful tool that is used in the reading program. Filmstrips, accompanied by records, are now a stimulating and exciting part of the Social Studies Program in Grades 3 and 4. Television is being utilized to the fullest despite the handicap of being unable to receive New Hampshire's Educational Channel 11.

The pupils in Grades 5 and 6 are now publishing a school paper called THE FRANCONIA STAR GA-ZETTE. The first issue received this commendation from Harvey Harkness, Assistant Superintendent: "... I have circulated the newspaper among the teachers of the White Mountains Regional School District as an example of sound Language Arts instruction."

Reading Readiness Tests were, as usual, given the First Grade pupils in September. Intelligence Tests were given Grades 2, 4 and 6 in the spring. Achievement Tests were also given to all grades at that time.

These records are kept in individual cumulative folders and prove helpful in developing an overall picture of each child and his progress in school. Parents are always welcome to discuss the results of the Achievement Tests with the faculty.

SCHOOL LUNCH:

The school lunch program continues to operate smoothly under the very capable managership of Mrs. Louise Peabody. Approximately 62 children participate daily in this program.

During National Education Week, parents and friends were invited to have lunch with the children.

It may be of interest to read the following com-

ments from Miss Ruth Cutter, State Director of School Lunches, after she had visited your school last winter. To quote:

"Mrs. Peabody is doing an excellent piece of work and Mrs. Sheila Jesseman's records were in fine shape.

"I can't remember of visiting a school that is kept so immaculate and the spirit of the entire staff which includes custodian and lunch worker is so superb. It was such a joy to visit a program like this on a Friday."

SCHOOL HEALTH:

Dr. Ralph Parker and Nurse Louise Clark have given complete physicals to the pupils in Kindergarten and Grades 1-6, whose parents so desired. Mrs. Clark visits the school regularly and is on call at any time. Her report will give you further details as to her other activities in this school.

SCHOOL ACTIVITIES:

The children enjoyed foliage tours in the fall due to the kindness of Mr. Ford.

Seasonal parties are held during the school year. Again, a costumed Halloween party proved highly successful. Mrs. Louise Peabody, School Lunch Operator, has charge of the refreshments at all parties.

Open House was held during Educational Week in the fall. Parent attendance was most gratifying.

The annual Christmas Program, with 100% pupil participation, was presented in the school auditorium Tuesday evening, December 21. Spring assemblies are now being planned.

The Ski Program, sponsored by the Franconia

School District, was in effect during the winter of 1965. Plans have now been made, as of this writing, for a similar ski program for the winter of 1966.

Pupils from Grades 5 and 6, under the direction of Physical Education Director Glenn Stillings, participated in the Track Meet at Lancaster on Saturday, May 22. Mr. Ford donated the use of his bus. Mr. Sullivan assisted in this activity.

A Field Day for Grades 1-6 was held on May 28th. Later, ribbons were presented the winners of the various contests.

Dedication Exercises were held outdoors in June with the School Board, parents, faculty and pupils in attendance. The cornerstone was laid. James Moulton, Chairman of the School Board, gave a brief address. The children also participated in the program.

SUPERINTENDENT:

In the school year of 1965-1966, your school became a part of a new union with new superintendents. This school came under the superintendency of Mr. Leslie S. Cummings of Littleton.

Mr. Cummings is retiring at the end of this school year. The staff of the Franconia Elementary School joins me in expressing our gratitude and appreciation to him for his constant interest and help during this transitional year. Any change makes for additional problems and Mr. Cummings has been "on call" at all times. It has been a pleasure to work for him. We wish him many years of continued happiness.

CONCLUSION:

I wish to express my sincere thanks to the people of Franconia, the Board of Education, Superintendent of Schools, Leslie Cummings, Assistant Superintendent Harvey Harkness, the staff and pupils for their co-operation and assistance.

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REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT

To the School Board and citizens of Franconia School District:

It is with pleasure that I submit my report to you as Superintendent of Schools.

The enrollment this year to date in grades K-6 is 85. This compares with an enrollment last year of 81. Of this number, there are seven pupils from Easton, sixteen from Lisbon Town and two from Sugar Hill. There are fourteen pupils enrolled in Littleton Junior High and thirty three pupils enrolled in Littleton Senior High School.

Graduating from Littleton High School this year will be Robert Allten, Duncan Cullman, Beulah Jesseman, Frederick Libby, Sally Libby, Paula Murray, Joyce Shapiro, Christine Talamo and Andrew Wessels.

The school lunch program continues to provide nutritious noon day meals to an average of about 60 pupils each day under the efficient management of Mrs. Louise Peabody.

Franconia can be proud of its educational program in a modern facility, with a dedicated and well prepared faculty. Mrs. Alice Leavitt is a most efficient administrator and I suggest that you take the time to read her report, which covers all aspects of the school program. It has been a pleasant experience for me to have been able to work with her this year.

I would be remiss in my duty if I did not mention the outstanding job that is done by Richard Sullivan, school custodian. This type of custodian is invaluable to a school and especially to a school that is relatively new. Franconia is most fortunate in having a person of Mr. Sullivan's calibre. On other pages of this report will be found, statistical report, report of school nurse, role of perfect attendance and list of tuition pupils.

As of January 1 of this year, the offices of the new Supervisory Union have been consolidated in Littleton. On July 1, 1966, William Grass, Jr. will take over as superintendent of the entire union. Mr. Harvey Harkness will be Assistant Superintendent and it is anticipated that a position of Business Manager will be created, thereby relieving the Superintendent and Assistant to spend more time in administration and supervision.

In closing, I wish to state that I have enjoyed my relationship with the Franconia School District and want to thank the school board and teachers for their cooperation.

REPORT OF THE FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND DISTRICT CHIEF

Most of us who live in New Hampshire and the thousands of vacationists that visit us every year love the State for the variegated woodlands that encircle our clean lakes and clothe the hills and mountains. Most of us appreciate these values, but still there were enough careless people among us to cause over 880 grass and woodland fires to start in 1965. True this was a much dryer than normal year but this should have meant the use of extra care. Fortunately the fire fighting forces have held the line against such careless acts. It is up to each one of us to be ever mindful that a spark or flame is a potential fire.

WE MUST ALL BE CAREFUL:

- 1. To teach our children the danger in lighting matches.
- 2. To never discard lighted smoking material from a car or while walking through fields or woods.
- 3. To safely dispose of rubbish preferably at the town dump. If you must burn rubbish or brush;
 - a. Always get a permit to burn from the warden.
 - b. Start your fire late in the day after 5:00 P.M.
 - c. If burning a field or brush have equipment and adequate help on hand. The heat from your fire creates its own draft to spread fire.

Our carlessness with fire is costing our State and Towns thousands of wasted dollars in suppression and hundreds of acres of destroyed woodlands. Yours never to enjoy.
