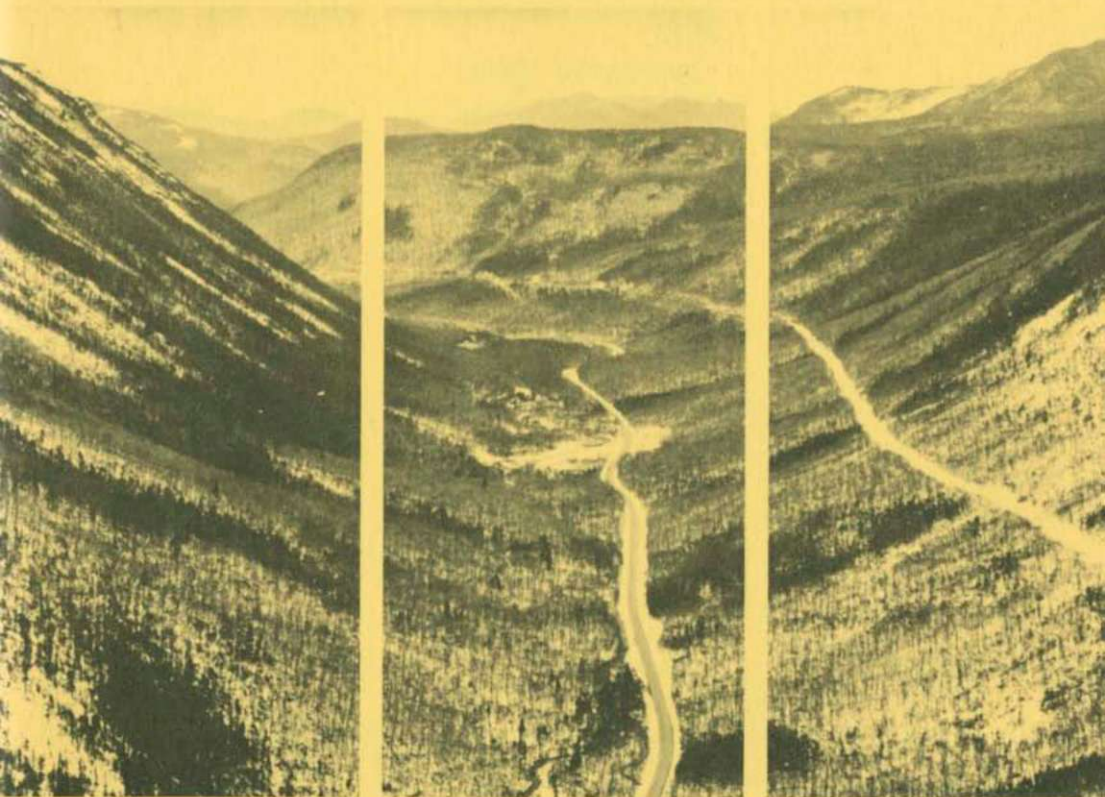

# Warrant For Town Meeting

## 1976

Town of Hart's Location                      State of New Hampshire  
The polls will be open from 9AM to 2PM

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Hart's Location in the County of Carroll in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the former Willey House Post Office in said Hart's Location on Tuesday, the second day of March, next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same, including town officers salaries, town officers expenses, election and registration expenses, fire department, damages and legal expenses, health department and ambulance service, dump and garbage removal, town maintenance of highways, lighting, Town Road Aid, Planning Board, Insurance and Civil Defense.
3. To authorize the Selectmen to borrow sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of same.
4. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$20.01 Town Road Aid, to be used with State Highway Department quota of \$133.42 for all Town roads.
5. To see if the town will vote to petition the State Tax Commission to have an audit made by the Municipal Accounting Division and make appropriation to cover the expense of same.
6. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$200.00 for all town roads.
7. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 for fire expenses.
8. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 for dump and garbage removal.
9. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$60.00 for the Planning Board.
10. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 for Health Department and Ambulance Service.
11. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for Insurance.



12. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 for damages and legal expense.

13. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 for Civil Defense.

14. To see if the town will vote to join the North Country Council and raise and appropriate money for same, amount for one year \$17.00.

15. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$70.00 for lighting.

16. To act upon any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

FROM: The Selectmen                      SUBJECT: Ambulance & Rescue Squad

The North Conway Fire Department Rescue Squad has made several costly and unnecessary runs up here lately. Each time the Squad comes up, the Town gets a substantial bill. We pay it, and then try to collect from the person for whom the Squad was called. Getting the user to reimburse the Town is next to impossible. There has been no need for some of these Rescue Squad runs, when only an ambulance was needed. The situation for which the Squad was called was minor in terms of the Squad's design and abilities.

The Conway Ambulance Service (which keeps one of its ambulances in North Conway) is fully accredited and capable of handling those incidents which do not require ten to fifteen men and a sophisticatedly equipped rescue truck. Furthermore, the Town, along with the other area towns, annually subsidizes the Conway Ambulance Service.

When a situation occurs in Hart's Location in which a person needs outside professional emergency assistance, call for that help. If it is one that a fully equipped ambulance, with two medics can take care of, call the ambulance: Telephone 356-5561. If it is a situation which requires many men and a rescue vehicle full of all types of technical equipment, call the Rescue Squad: Telephone 356-2424.

#### PUBLIC NOTICE

As Hart's Location is located in a tourist area, during the summer months there are unattended cars along the highway. During the winter these unattended cars hamper snow plowing operations. The Selectmen remind the public of the following State law.

RSA 262-A: 70                      Upon any highway outside of a business or residence district no person shall stop, park or leave standing any vehicle, whether attended or unattended, upon the paved or main-traveled part of the highway when it is practicable to stop, park or so leave such vehicle off such part of said highway, but in every event an unobstructed width of the highway opposite a standing vehicle shall be left for the free passage of other vehicles and a clear view of such stopped vehicles shall be available from a distance of two hundred feet in each direction upon such highway.
