REPORT *Of The* SELECTMEN

TO: The Inhabitants of the Town of Jaffrey.

Several major projects that had been started during 1967 were completed during the year 1968.

The Cheshire Village sewer line was completed so as to serve that entire section of town.

The new map of the Town was completed under the supervision of the Selectmen. Each road in the town is now designated with a name and some of the old names were restored. A supply of this map was printed and can be purchased at the Town Office at a cost of 75¢ each.

Repairs to Peterborough Street sewer had to be made. The main sewer line was broken and extensive repairs made.

Several street lights were either installed or changed over to the new type lighting.

Work on the tax map was continued during the past year the map was hung on a special display fixture for easy reference. This map must be continuously maintained and changes made as they occur otherwise its usefulness would be of little use for reference.

The Selectmen are still hopeful that Federal funds will be forthcoming in order that the proposed sewerage construction as voted by the 1967 Town Meeting to take care of the area between Jaffrey Center and Highland Avenue and also to enlarge the present sewerage lagoon.

Plans are now being made to combine the recreation areas of the Town under one department, thus the Beach and Humiston Field would be utilized for a more extensive program for the youth of Jaffrey.

Several day meetings were held during the past year to discuss some of the more urgent problems that arose. However, the Board meets every Tuesday evening at 8:00 p.m. at the Jaffrey Town Offices to discuss any problems with the townspeople and taxpayers that might occur. Anyone who would like to discuss any existing problems with the Selectmen are asked to contact the Selectmen's Office on any Tuesday after 8:00 p.m.

TOWN MEETING WARRANT

TO: The Inhabitants of the Town of Jaffrey, County of Cheshire, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Conant High School Auditorium, located on Stratton Road, in Jaffrey Village, in said Town of Jaffrey, on Tuesday, the 11th day of March next, at nine o'clock in the forenoon (polls to remain open until six o'clock in the afternoon), to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose a Town Clerk, Town Treasurer and Tax Collector for three years, one Selectman for Three years, one Selectman for one year, Highway Agent, Chief Engineer of Fire Department and Overseer of Public Welfare for one year, and all other necessary Town Officers.

2. To hear all reports except that of the Budget Committee.

3. To hear the report of the Budget Committee and to raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be required for the support of the Poor, building and repairing of highways and bridges, fire and police departments, Memorial Day, street and building lighting and all other Town Charges.

4. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen and Town Treasurer to borrow money upon the credit of the Town in anticipation of taxes.

5. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to expend from the Highway Department Capital Reserve Fund, a sum of money not to exceed the amount of \$11,990.00 for the purpose of trading the present two (2) trucks now owned by the Town for two (2) 1969 trucks; said purchase to be made as the Selectmen deem to be in the best interest of the Town, or act in any way relating thereto.

6. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to expend from the Police Department Capital Reserve Fund, a sum of money not to exceed the amount of \$1,400.00 for the purpose of trading the present police cruiser for a new 1969 cruiser; said purchase to be made as the Selectmen deem to be in the best interest of this Town, or act in any way relating thereto.

7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$950.00 to support the services of the community health clinic of the Monadnock Family and Mental Health Service; said services operating under the provisions of the Community Mental Health Services Act of New Hampshire with State Grant-in Aid.

8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money not to exceed \$4,000.00 for the purpose of setting up a communications department between the Town Office, Police, Highway and Water Works Departments, or act in any way relating thereto.

9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$6,500.00; of which \$6,000.00 will represent the 1970 Budget appropriation to the Highway Department Equipment Capital Reserve Fund, and \$500.00 for purchase of equipment for the Highway Department, or act in any way relating thereto.

10. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to expend from the Highway Department Equipment Capital Reserve Fund, a sum of money not to exceed \$15,973.00 for the purpose of purchasing a payloader for the Town Highway Department, or act in any way relating thereto.

11. To see if the Town will vote to grant to Albert and Diana Leibman, a quitclaim deed to a section of Mills Road (Bryant Road) now abandoned in favor of the relocated section on land of said Leibmans which they deeded to the Town; said abandoned section marked by stone walls bordered on both sides by other land of said Leibmans; with a length of about 600 feet extending westerly from a point about 1250 feet westerly of Lincoln's Corner Road (Bonds Corner Road).

12. To see if the Town will vote to accept the gift of the United Church of Jaffrey of a certain tract of land situated in Jaffrey and bounded and described as follows: "Beginning at a point on the northerly side of Ellison Street, at land of the Parlmont Realty Trust; thence easterly by Ellison Street to the juncture of East Main Street or Turnpike Road, so-called; thence westerly by the southerly side of East Main Street to the land of the Parlmont Realty Trust; thence southerly by said land of the Parlmont Realty Trust to the point of beginning"; and to authorize the United Church of Jaffrey to place on the common with suitable plantings the cornerstone of the Old Parish House in some appropriate manner to commemorate the Baptist Church; the same to be maintained by the Town of Jaffrey.

13. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$4,500.00 for the purpose of continuing the Town of Jaffrey History Supplement now in process of compilation by the Jaffrey History Committee under the supervision of Alice E. E. Lehtinen, Chairman.

14. To see if the Town will vote to establish and/or create an Historic District Commission in accordance with Chapter 31, Sections 89C and 89D of the Revised Statutes Annotated of the State of New Hampshire; said commission to consist of five (5) members; said members to be appointed in the first instance by the Moderator with the approval and consent of the Selectmen, in accordance with Section 89D of said Statute, succeeding appointments shall be made by the Moderator with the approval and consent of the Selectmen; and said commission shall present such a plan to the Town in accordance with Chapter 31, Section 63A, Revised Statutes Annotated of the State of New Hampshire.

15. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to apply for, enter into contracts for, accept and do all things necessary to obtain Federal, State or such other aid as may be available for the construction of a sewerage treatment and disposal system, including the construction of a sewage stabilization pond with chlorination facilities, intercepting sewers, lateral sewers, an addition to the existing pumping station, related facilities and acquisition of land therefore.

16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500,000.00 for constructing a sewage stabilization pond, including chlorination facilities, intercepting sewers, lateral sewers, an addition to the existing pumping station, other related facilities and the acquisition of such land and easements as may be necessary to carry out the project; that to raise this appropriation the Treasurer with the approval of the Selectmen is authorized to borrow \$500,000.00 under the Municipal Finance Act as amended; provided that any Federal, State or other aid received by the Town for the construction costs of the project shall be used to reduce the amount of borrowing under this vote.

17. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$950.00 for the purpose of changeover in lighting on various streets in said Town of Jaffrey; said lighting changeover to be in accordance with plan approved by the Board of Selectmen as submitted by the Planning Board of Said Town of Jaffrey.

18. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money not to exceed \$5,000.00 for the purpose of installing storm drains in certain locations of this town where needed.

19. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the appointment of a committee consisting of four (4) members by the Moderator, subject to the approval by the Selectmen, to work with the Selectmen on a study of a Rubbish Disposal Area for the Town of Jaffrey, and said committee and Selectmen be directed to report the results of such study at the next annual town meeting.

20. To take up any other business that may be properly brought before the meeting.

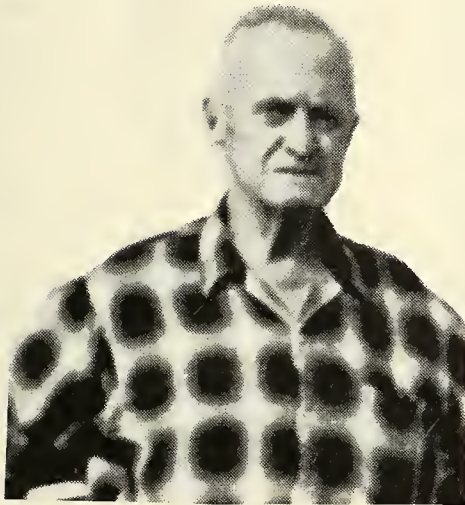

Jaffrey lost two veteran town officials during 1968.

Leon Windsor Priest, who was a member of the Jaffrey Fire Department more than 30 years, and assistant chief of it from 1946 until his retirement in 1962, died in October.

James P. Smith, who was elected to the Board of Selectmen in 1964, and reelected to a second term in 1967, died in November.



Leon Windsor Priest, a fireman more than 30 years and assistant chief of the Department 16 of those years, was made a honorary member when he retired in 1962.

Born in Gardner, Mass., he came to Jaffrey in 1905 and was employed at the Fred Stratton Livery Stable until 1930. He operated a trucking and taxi business until his retirement.

He was 73 when he died Sunday, October 20, 1968.



Selectman James P. Smith, who died in the midst of his second term, at the age of 54, had lived in Jaffrey for two decades.

He was born in Tilton, had served in the U.S. Army during World War II, and was an agent for the John Hancock Mutual Life Insurance company both in Tilton and in Jaffrey.

He died Friday, November 8, 1968.

REPORT OF HIGHWAY AGENT

For the year ending December 31, 1968

TO: The Citizens of Jaffrey:

I am submitting herewith my 7th annual report as the Highway Agent of the Town of Jaffrey and am listing below some of the major accomplishments of this department for the past year.

1. Route #124 was completed to Jaffrey Center. This work was done under State supervision.

2. A section of Route #137 was started during the past year but due to the weather this could not be completed during the past year. This work was done under State supervision also. Sewer and water lines were also renewed on this road.

3. The road around the Library was widened and rebuilt.

4. A new 8" culvert was installed on Gilmore Pond Road.

5. A new sewer line was laid on Cheshire Village upper road. The line was completed and the road was hardtopped.

6. A new sewer line was laid in Sunnyfield Drive.

7. Parts of the following roads was hot-topped: Part of Gilmore Pond Road, Old Peterborough Road, Lawrence Street, Bradley Court. We will continue this program during 1969.

8. Part of the Main Street sidewalk across from the Town Clock Tower was renewed during the past year.

9. All bridge railings were repaired and painted.

10. About twenty (20) miles of roads were resurfaced with asphalt.

11. The Department did the usual maintenance such as scraping back roads, cleaning culverts and ditches and patching some of the holes in the roads.

12. The Department also assisted the Water Department in the installation of anew 12" Main on Prescott Road.

13. The Airport at Silver Ranch was also resurfaced.

14. The street sweeper was very much in use. Approximately 600 cubic yards of debris was picked up.

Again at this time I wish to thank everyone who has cooperated with the Department in enabling us to carry on the functions of the Highway Department.

The sale of said building and land will be contingent upon the relocation and erection of a new fire station to serve that area.”

“Whereas its present location is not in the best location to serve Jaffrey Center as a Fire Station;

Therefore, be it resolved that it is the sense of this meeting that if a new station is built it would be to the advantage of the Town of Jaffrey to transfer the recondi-

tioning and reconstruction of this building to the Jaffrey Historical Society to be used as a historical building for the storage and display of items of historical interest to the Town of Jaffrey.”

Art. 16. \$5,000.00 FOR CONSTRUCTION OF A FIRE STATION AT JAFFREY CENTER. Moved: “That the Town vote to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed \$8,000.00, if necessary for the purpose of completing construction of a new Jaffrey Center Fire Station.”

19,600 ft. of pipe from Bullet Pond to the center of town was cleaned and cement lined. Nothing had been done to this line since it was installed in 1902.

Project on Peterborough Street was started and will be completed early summer. This will be a 12" pipe replacing the present 6" pipe. Projects to be done are Highland Avenue, Ellison Street and Jaffrey Center.

Water maps have been made, Little Michigan has been plotted and hydrants have been added.

Invocation by Rev. Stanley M. Polan.
Mr. James Sullivan lead the salute to the flag.

Warrant for the Annual Meeting of the Jaffrey School District was read by Homer J. Forcier.

It was voted that Homer J. Forcier act as Moderator of the meeting. Seconded and unanimously carried.

ARTICLE 1. Mr. Leon H. Hunt moved, and it was seconded, that the salaries of the District Officers for the ensuing year be as follows:

Unanimously carried.

ARTICLE 2. Mrs. Marian Mack Johnson moved, and it was seconded by Mrs. Anne Gordon, that the reports, as printed, be accepted and placed on file with the clerk. Unanimously carried.

ARTICLE 3. Mr. Robert E. Bussiere moved, and it was seconded by Mr. James Sullivan, that the Auditors chosen at the Annual Town Meeting on March 12, 1968, act as Auditors for the School District of Jaffrey. Unanimously carried.

ARTICLE 4. Mr. James Sullivan moved, and Mr. Robert E. Bussiere seconded, that the Jaffrey School District raise and appropriate \$514,578.00 for the support of the schools, for the payment of salaries for the School District officials and agents and for the payment of the statutory obligations of the District. Discussion. Carried.

ARTICLE 5. Mrs. Anne Gordon moved, and it was seconded by Mrs. Margaret Bean, that the School Board be authorized to make application for and to accept, on behalf of the District, any or all grants or other funds for educational purposes which may now or hereafter be forthcoming from the United States Government or from the State of New Hampshire. Unanimously carried.

ARTICLE 6. Mr. Ernest J. Pratt moved, and it was seconded by Mrs. Leonard Krause, that the School Board be authorized to include a contingency fund item in the regular School District Budget, and raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000.00 for the same. Carried.

ARTICLE 7. Mr. Leon H. Hunt moved, and it was seconded by Mr. Robert E. Bussiere, that the School Board be authorized to place \$1,500.00 previously voted under Article 4 for replacement of a school bus in the Capital Reserve Fund. (as amended). Carried.

ARTICLE 8. It was voted to move over Article 8, to be taken up after Article 9.

ARTICLE 9. Mr. Ernest J. Pratt moved that the School District raise and appropriate \$21,000.00 for the preparation of educational and architectural plans for the renovation and expansion of Conant High School. Seconded by Mr. William D. Tribble. Superintendent Edwards was invited to give his interpretation. Discussion. Unanimously carried.

ARTICLE 8. Mr. Robert E. Bussiere moved, and it was seconded by Mr. Ernest J. Pratt, that the School Board be authorized to divert the \$10,000.00 previously voted in Special Articles in March, 1966, and March, 1967, for a gym divider, from the Capital Reserve Fund to the General Fund. Discussion. Carried.

ARTICLE 10. Mrs. Marian Mack Johnson moved, and Mrs. Millard seconded, that the School District vote to expand the number of School Board Members to seven and that three members be elected at the next Annual Election of District Officers. Discussion. Carried.

Mr. James Sullivan: Be it resolved that those assembled at this Annual School District Meeting feel that the formation of a Jaffrey-Rindge Cooperative School District is the most

logical course of action to be followed and that such proposed cooperative school district should be submitted to the voters by the Cooperative Study Committee at the EARLIEST possible date. Seconded by Mr. Leon H. Hunt. Carried.

Mr. Tribble moved, and it was seconded, that the meeting give a rising vote of thanks to Superintendent Edwards in appreciation of his conduct during our time of decision as to the kind of a school we should have in our community.

Dr. Millard moved that we adjourn, seconded by Mr. Gallup. Meeting adjourned at 9:48 p.m. until March 12, 1968, at 9:00 a.m.

Dr. Spyros Papa-Spy-Rop-O-Lous, an official State Department International visitor from Greece was welcomed.

He is the head of the School of Philosophy, University of Athens, and will be studying at Universities and Colleges throughout the United States.

SCHOOL PROGRAM

B. JAFFREY GRADE SCHOOL

Curriculum evaluation and improvement are a continuing process in any school system and the Grade School is no exception. The language committee for Union 47, with Mary Hamilton as representative of this school, recommended that the Laidlaw English program be adopted as the basic text for the elementary schools. As a result, these text books were placed in all the grades in September.

The math and art programs of the school were extended by the hiring of additional music and art teachers for Rindge and Jaffrey. This made it possible for each grade to have art every week and to provide an increase in the time allotment for music in all the grades. Instrumental lessons are being shared by Robert Davieau and Richard Sanders. The operetta, "Cowboys on the Moon," was presented to a full house last spring. Every pupil in school had an opportunity to share this experience.

This year three days were set aside in the school calendar for workshops. A two-day workshop dealing with the new English program and related matters was held before the opening of school, on September 3 and 4. On November 1, the Rindge and Grade School teachers met at the Rindge Memorial School. The morning sessions were spent in the reading area under the direction of Dorothy Kendall, the Jaffrey remedial reading teacher, Evelyn Sands, Rindge remedial reading teacher and Frank Clark, elementary guidance counselor of Jaffrey. In the afternoon, Sherman Lovering, audio-visual co-ordinator of Keene State College, conducted a work session on "The Effective Use of Audio-Visual Material in the Classroom." After this session it was evident that this is an area which needs increased attention.

Workshop days do not count as days of school in the 180 days required by the State Board of Education.

The staff continued its professional growth during the year as shown below:

"Science in the Elementary School" was offered by TV by U.N.H. and was taken by Martha Hadley, Dorothea Hammond and Mildred Cutter.

"Learning Disabilities," offered at the Monadnock Children's Center, via Notre Dame College, taken by Dorothy Kendall and Francis Clark.

"Tests and Measurements," Fitchburg State College, taken by Dorothy Kendall.

"Etiology, Dynamics and Treatment of Emotionally Disturbed Children," Fitchburg State College, taken by Francis Clark.

"Principles of Guidance," Keene State College, by Doris Shea.

"School Law and Regulations," Monadnock Community College, by Martha Hadley and Clayton Craig.

Miss Hadley also spent the summer at Teachers College, Columbia University.

The Grade School facilities are being used for various activities after regular school hours by the children of Jaffrey. The lunchroom is used by the Brownies on Monday and Wednesday afternoons and by the Girl Scouts on Tuesday afternoons. The girls basketball team of Conant has the use of the hall for two sessions a week and the Junior High also uses it, as do the sixth grade boys on Friday for basketball.

In addition, the Cub Scouts hold their monthly meetings in Union Hall and for years the Jaffrey Dancing Class has held their classes at the hall. For the past two years the French play given by the French classes of Conant has been presented at Union Hall.



C. CONANT HIGH SCHOOL

This year there was a change in the administration of Conant High School. Mr. Vincent J. Gallucci was named principal and Mr. Alvah Niemela was named director of instruction for the current year and curriculum coordinator starting next September. Along with the principal and the director of instruction, the school board named department heads in the following areas: Miss Ruth Fitzgerald, English and Languages; Mr. Pasquale Scenna, Mathematics and Science; Mr. Kendrick Capon, Social Studies; Mr. Robert LaFlamme, Industrial Arts, Home Economics and Business; Mr. Richard Sanders, Music and Art; Mr. Bruce Edwards, Health and Physical Education.

The High School Study Committee is presently working with Dr. Stuart Marshall, Consultant from Boston University, in planning the educational future of our high school age youngsters.

This year we have had the normal number of staff changes. The following faculty members have been added: Mrs. Patricia Parks, English; Mrs. Kathleen Fitzgerald, Mathematics; Mr. Ronald Ouellette, Social Studies; Mr. Robert Davieau, Music; Mr. Frank Pinkham, Art; Mrs. Elizabeth Shea, Girls Physical Education and coaching; Miss Christine Perry, Business Education.

It is planned that the re-evaluation of Conant High School will take place in the spring of 1970. This re-evaluation of the school will be done by the New England Association

of Colleges and Secondary Schools of which Conant is a member. An evaluation of each member school must take place once each decade.

Prior to the evaluation by a visiting committee, the school will complete a self-evaluation. This self-evalua-

tion will be carried on during the spring and fall of 1969 by the principal and the school faculty. It is hoped that this in-depth study by the school staff will help to enforce the recommendations of the study committee for the future educational plans of Conant High School.

PART VI AUXILIARY ACTIVITIES AND SPECIAL REPORTS

A. Health

Colds, sore throats and digestive upsets presented the usual daily problems of sending pupils back home from school in order to keep the sick children out of the classrooms. A few cases of impetigo, pink eye, strep throat and mumps were excluded but were quickly cleared up.

Dr. Sterling, the school physician for Jaffrey's three schools, examined 579 pupils in the odd numbered grades, as well as special cases and all members of the athletic and cheering squad teams and school lunch personnel. He is always available for consultation in problem cases, and in planning for general school health programs including immunizations.

In June a Polio clinic was organized under the supervision of Dr. Sterling, the Public Health Nurse, the school nurse and with the co-operation of several mothers. Dr. Sterling administered the Sabin Oral vaccine to 754 children of school and pre-school age.

In October and November the flu vaccine was given by Dr. Sterling to all teachers and school personnel who desired it.

The Heaf Sterneedle Tuberculin Test was done by the school nurse in April on all first graders, seniors, teachers, and other school personnel.

A dental Clinic, maintained by sponsorship of the Jaffrey's Woman's Club, helped 34 pupils to have dental work done who might not otherwise have been able to have it. These pupils had 46 appointments, with 145 fillings, and 16 extractions. Dr. Harold Goodman did the work in his office.

Exams and glasses for pupils who were unable to afford them were provided by the Jaffrey Community League.

All through the school year the school nurse's days are

spent doing vision and hearing tests on all students and keeping a continuous watch for any conditions which need special attention with all findings entered on individual school health records.

Eleven approved professional meetings were attended by the nurse. Among these were:

Organizational meeting Conant and Peterborough, 2 days.

State Teacher's Convention, Manchester, 1 day.

School Nurse Professional Meetings, Concord, 2 days.

Meeting with Vocational Rehabilitation Commission, Keene.

Interagency on Drugs and Narcotics, Nashua.

Visual Detection Work Shop, Concord, 3 days.

Meetings throughout the year with area nurses and Division of Public Health in Keene.

In June before school closes pre-school registration and examinations were held. At this time 61 pupils were registered for entrance in September. Data about regulations, facilities, school calendar and administrative personnel was sent out. Health histories were completed, school records started, pupils checked for possible vision, hearing or physical defects so the parent may get corrections done during the summer. An opportunity for pupils and parents to visit school, meet with the principal, the guidance teacher, the speech therapist, who screens them for a possible speech difficulty, and also the dental hygienist who checks teeth and advises for necessary follow-up.

To end the year all Health Records were in order and up to date with permanent records filed. It was a good year health wise in all three of Jaffrey's schools, with no major illnesses or accidents.
