RURAL DISTRICT HEALTH COUNCIL ANNUAL REPORT 1975

The past year has seen an increase in the services provided by the Rural District Health Council coupled with an increase in the requests for service. As the federal government studies the cost of health care there is increased interest in home care and preventive medicine as methods of reducing costs and improving health services. The Rural District Health Council continues to qualify as a certified home health agency, implementing procedures to continue to provide quality care.

In January 1975, Mrs. Marie Dexter, R.N. joined the staff in a dual role as Referral Coordinator at the Frisbie Memorial Hospital where she is a member of the Utilization Review Committee, and also as staff nurse for the agency providing skilled care for the towns of Barrington and Strafford. The addition of a Health Aide, Mrs. Joan Menez, has enabled the Council to better utilize the professional staff while continuing to provide quality care.

Along with the regular skilled nursing services provided in the home, members of the agency staff conduct adult screening clinics monthly in Northwood and Farmington which was requested by senior citizen groups in those towns. They also participate in the aftercare program in cooperation with the Strafford County Guidance Center and the Seacoast Counseling Center, assist local groups with area screening programs, participate in health planning and, by contract, supervise health aides in the Strafford County Homemaker – Home Health Aide Program. The Maternal and Child Health Program is very active providing regular physical examinations, immunizations and dental care for children 0–6 years enrolled in the Well Child Clinics. The agency staff also does home visiting to the patients participating in the Strafford County Prenatal and Family Planning Program and the Exeter Area Family Planning Program.

The strength of the Council lies in the efficiency and dedication of its staff. In addition to the two persons mentioned above, members of the professional staff are Mrs. Ardala Houle, R.N. Agency Supervisor; Miss Arlene Thorne, R.N., Maternal and Child Health nurse; Mrs. Barbara Drew, R.N.; Mrs. Myrtle Walsh, R.N.; Mrs. Lucy Myers, R.N.B.S.; Mrs Bernadette Cameron, R.N.; and Mrs. Kathleen Hansen, RPT. The office duties are ably handled by Mrs. Norma Davis and Mrs. Eleanor Eaton.

The Rural District Health Council has been requesting \$1.00 per capita from member towns since 1969. As a result of the recent inflationary times and increase in services provided, it has been necessary, therefore, to increase the per capita request from each town by 10¢ to enable the Council to continue to provide these services.

During the past year the Council has made 343 home visits and 62 well child visits making a grand total of 405 for the town of Middleton.

REPORT of the FOREST FIRE WARDEN and DISTRICT CHIEF

Upon the recommendation of town selectmen and city councils, the Division of Forests and Lands appoints a forest fire warden and several deputy forest fire wardens in each town and city every three years. The town or city warden is responsible for maintaining a force of men and adequate equipment to suppress any wildfire that occurs in his town or city during his term of appointment. The fire warden must authorize all open burning when the ground is not covered with snow. No open fires can be authorized between 9 a.m. and 5 p.m., unless it is raining, without the additional permission of the state district fire chief.

Any person wishing to kindle an open fire when the ground is not covered with snow must first obtain the written permission of the forest fire warden. Camp and cooking fires also require the warden's permission.

The Division of Forests and Lands, through its Forest Fire Service, assists all cities and towns in meeting these requirements by training the warden and deputy forces in wildfire suppression tactics, making hand tool suppression equipment available at fifty percent of cost, supplying pieces of Federal excess property for use as fire attack vehicles and sharing up to fifty percent of the cost of wildfire suppression costs.

Wildfire prevention is also a joint state, city or town program. Smokey Bear is available from the Forest Fire Service for local fire prevention programs. Posters and Junior Ranger kits are available for distribution by local fire departments upon request to the Forest Fire Service. Each forest fire warden is expected to carry on a continuous wildfire prevention program within his town or city.

This compares with 115 Middleton pupils registered in Farmington schools a year ago at the same date.

The tuition rates for pupils from the Middleton School District attending Farmington AREA School for 1975-1976 are as follows: Grades 1-7, \$580.00; Grade 8, \$597.00, and Grades 9-12, \$859.00. The state average tuition figure for grades 1 through 8, not including a rental fee, is \$885.00 and for high school, \$1,121.00. This is a difference of at least \$288.00 per pupil in elementary grades and \$262.00 for high school.

Additional curriculum opportunities have been made available for pupils in Grades 11 and 12 by contracting with Somersworth AREA School to provide more vocational opportunities for these pupils. This is a concurrent enrollment program made possible by state law. The pupils who are qualified may attend special courses for them, such as the building trades, at Somersworth, after completing their academic subjects in their home school. At present there are three Middleton pupils taking advantage of this fine opportunity.

A number of statutes which were passed during the last session of the General Court which have to do with educational matters are summarized here for the information of citizens.

DUTY TO PROVIDE EDUCATION. It is the duty of the school board to provide, at district expense, an elementary and secondary school education to all pupils residing in the district who have not reached the age of 21. (Was 18).

POSTING WARRANT. In counting the days between the posting of a meeting warning and the meeting, Saturdays, Sundays and legal holidays are included in the count of 14 days between posting the warrant and the meeting. This was passed for clarification purposes.

OFFICERS TO BE CHOSEN. This statute is changed to allow the election of auditors for more than one year terms and to stagger the terms if that were the wish of the district.

ELIGIBILITY. No person employed on a salaried basis by a Supervisory Union or any District within the Supervisory Union may at the same time serve as a school board member in any District of the Supervisory Union. Examples of salaried positions include teachers, custodians, and bus drivers paid by the district.

FILING FOR OFFICE. This is a change. Persons filing for district office must file not earlier than 45 days before the election and not later than 5:00 P.M. of the third Monday before the election with the District Clerk. This had the effect of beginning the filing period ten days earlier, but also closing it a week earlier than formerly.

The Farmington AREA Agreement has worked to the mutual advantage of Middleton and Farmington. The present contract does not specifically cite when tuition payments are due. There should be an amendment made which will do this.

Under RSA 195-A:14, the AREA plan may be reviewed after the third anniversary of the date of operating responsibility. (July 1, 1973). This may be done at the end of the current school year. The two school boards at a joint board meeting may vote to establish a review board and this board would be responsible for making a study of the plan and propose any changes the board believes would be beneficial. These changes could propose converting from an AREA plan to a cooperative school district, or to dissolve the plan altogether. This is an important matter, and the Boards should consider their actions under this provision of the law very carefully.

In closing, the undersigned would like to thank the pupils, School Board members and citizens of Middleton for the continued support and cooperation which they have received.

Washington's Birthday Anniversary falls on February 21, which is during the Winter Vacation, and Fast Day falls on April 25, which is during the Spring Vacation.

The above calendar provides for 185 days of school. The equivalent of 180 days must be devoted to classroom instruction as a minimum. This calendar allows for either 5 full days for staff development, curriculum review, staff planning and the like, or for 10 half days. Days missed due to storms, etc., would need to be recovered either during vacation periods, or by extending the number of sessions. If the staff development program is to be effective, it would need to be operated as a part of the contracted school year.

This calendar is subject to revision by the School Board.
