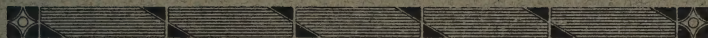

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of New Hampton in the County of Belknap in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Town House in said New Hampton on Tuesday, the 13th day of March next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriation of the same.
3. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the repair of highways and bridges and make appropriation of the same.
4. To see if the town will vote to accept State aid and appropriate money for the same.
5. To see how much money the town will vote to raise for the payment of Long Term notes and make appropriation of the same.
6. To see how much money the town will vote to raise for Memorial Day and the Decoration of Soldiers' graves and make appropriation of the same.
7. To see how much money the town will vote to raise for Old Home Day and make appropriation of the same.
8. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and contribute to the support of the Laconia Hospital and make appropriation of the same.

9. To see how much money the town will vote to raise for the repair of Town House and make appropriation of the same.

10. To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the town through Tax Collector's deeds.

11. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire money in anticipation of Taxes.

12. To see whether beer or other lawful alcoholic beverages shall be manufactured or sold locally as permitted under this Act, Chap. 99, Section 22, Laws 1933.

13. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board and Citizens of New Hampton:—

Herewith I present my fifth annual school report. New Hampton conducts six schools, with six teachers, one hundred ten elementary pupils attending school in New Hampton, seventeen elementary school pupils attending school in Ashland and Meredith, and thirty-two high school pupils attending school at Ashland, Bristol and Meredith and the New Hampton School, making a total school population approximating one hundred sixty pupils. According to the financial report of the school district for the fiscal year which closed the 30th of June, 1933, it costs New Hampton over fifteen thousand dollars a year to support public education. The sum just stated is a substantial amount when compared with the equalized valuation of the town. Considering the financial and educational aspects involved in bringing up children we solicit your interest in the greatest enterprise carried on in New Hampton, namely, the education of all the children of all the people.

The New Hampton school district has indeed done well by its schools. Our textbooks and supplies are just as modern and plentiful as those of any community. Old type furniture has been replaced with modern equipment. The buildings have been materially repaired and improved every year. It will not be very long before all the schools will have electric lights. Our teachers give their best; and the graduates of our elementary schools do good work in high school.

A few essential improvements remain to be made. The schools still need a nearer source of water supply. Growing children require plenty of water, both for drinking and washing purposes. Then they will be able to practice the laws of health which we teach them in school. Every school should be provided with cup-

boards for the children's lunch boxes. The school room floor or the entry are not the proper places for this purpose. The old type toilets should be replaced with chemical toilets, and with flush closets wherever possible. Toilets which discourage their use are a menace to health. Rocks and stumps should be removed from all school yards, and the grounds should be leveled off. The avenues of approach should be kept open the year around. This winter it has been impossible to park or turn a car on the school grounds except at the Old Institution.

Considering the interest which the school board and the school district in general take in the educational advancement of the town, a fact which was made clear in the early part of this report, the time is not far when the improvements advocated will be accomplished.

Arrangements have been made with the State Board of Education to send a school nurse to New Hampton for a number of weeks, at no expense to the town. The advantages of a school nurse are self evident. Every community which employs a school nurse has a far better school attendance, and less outbreaks of contagious diseases than a community which does not enjoy this advantage.

It has been a pleasure and a privilege for the superintendent to be associated with your progressive school board, your corps of conscientious teachers, and the splendid children of New Hampton.
