THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the Town of Rumney in the County of Grafton in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Rumney on Tuesday, the ninth day of March next, at two o'clock in the afternoon, at which time the polls shall be opened and shall close not earlier than nine o'clock in the afternoon to act upon the following articles, all articles not on the ballot will be acted upon at seven-thirty in the evening.

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and to make appropriation of the same.
- 3. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of its highways and bridges.
- 4. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of the Library.
- 5. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the care of the Cemeteries.
- 6. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Fire Department.
- 7. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the care of the Common.
- 8. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Street Lights.
- 9. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the LaMott-Kenneson Post No. 76 American Legion for Memorial Day and other patriotic purposes.
- 10. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the care of the Dump.
- 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$593.56 to secure from the State \$3,957.06 for Town Road Aid.

- 12. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to pay the Lakes Region Association for the purpose of Publicizing and promoting the natural advantages and resources of the town, in cooperation with other towns in the Lakes Region.
- 13. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Civil Defense.
- 14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 for the Pemi-Baker Home Health Agency, Inc.
- 15. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the use of the Planning Board.
- 16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$800 to purchase the police cruiser now owned by Donald A. Young.
- 17. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for water holes for fire protection.
- 18. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$635.00 for the Lakes Region Mental Health Center, Inc.
- 19. So see if the Town will vote to choose one of the following schedules for Ambulance Service.
 - Schedule 1. Amount to be raised at Town Meeting for Ambulance Service from April 1, 1971 to April 1, 1972: \$1,200.00.
 - Schedule 2. Amount to be raised at Town Meeting for Ambulance Service plus rate of \$35.00 per run from April 1, 1971 to April 1, 1972: \$400.00
 - Schedule 3. Rate of \$45.00 per run for Ambulance Service from April 1, 1971 to April 1, 1972.
- 20. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Ambulance Service.
- 21. To see if the Town will vote to add to the Highway Equipment Capital Reserve Fund, for the purpose of purchasing Highway Equipment, in the amount of \$1,000.00 to be transferred from Surplus Fund.
- 22. To see if the Town will establish a Town Conservation Commission as set forth in R.S.A. 36-a.

- 23. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to administer, lease, rent or sell or otherwise dispose of any real estate or mineral rights acquired by the Town at any of its Tax Collector's sales.
- 24. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
- 25. Shall the provisions of Chapter 171-A of the Revised Laws relative to playing Beano be adopted in this town.
- 26. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors and Committees heretofore chosen and to pass any vote relating thereto and to transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

REPORT of the FOREST FIRE WARDEN and DISTRICT CHIEF

The 1970 forest fire season was a quiet one in this area, quiet in part because of your continued cooperation and favorable weather conditions.

Fires that did occur were, for the most part, caused by debris burning, children and smokers.

The elimination of these three causes of forest fires would drastically change this picture — to bring about this change we make the following suggestions:

1. When the ground is not covered with snow a permit to burn must be obtained from the Forest Fire Warden. This permit covers waste burning, even if an incinerator, grass burning, as well as garden trash and brush burning such burning is restricted by regulation to prior to 9:00 A. M. and after 5:00 P. M. with the following exceptions:

Commercial or industrial burning is permissible at any time under normal conditions but only with the approval of the District Chief and a written permit from the Forest Fire Warden.

- 2. Fires caused by children can be prevented only with the complete cooperation of parents in the supervision of their children, keep matches out of reach of children, this action will help to prevent fires and may save a life, the life of your child. Try to explain this to your child, won't you?
- 3. Forest fires caused by smokers can be reduced in number by the exercise of more care in the discarding of matches and smoking material whether from a vehicle or by a hiker. In all cases, make sure that the butt or match you discard is out, dead out. Smokey says, "Thanks for your help", and invites you to join with him in setting a good example for others in the prevention of fires and the protection of our environment.

REPORT OF THE

ASSISTANT SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

The people of Rumney certainly should feel proud of their present school. The staff is diligently trying to offer the children of Rumney a good education. The school staff is operating with a spirit of cohesiveness which is most evident when I work with individual members.

The curriculum is an area which will require some revision. The disciplines of math, science, and reading are the areas of emphasis for the next two years.

A National Science Foundation proposal has been written by certain members of Plymouth State College science department. This proposal, if funded, would train most elementary teachers (grades K-6) in Supervisory Union No. 48 to work with a selected science program for one year before putting it into operation in our schools. The teacher would receive a 6-credit course at no cost to the Town of Rumney. Hopefully the end result will be one of the most up to date science programs in the country. One other advantage will be continuity in the science background of the students going to your AREA High School.

Workshops in reading and testing have been set for next year. There will be other educational meetings to update teachers in new educational practices. With such a tremendous knowledge explosion over the past few years it becomes imperative that teachers constantly avail themselves of this new knowledge.

Next year Rumney will have a testing program that will be given in grades 2-8. This program will give us a general idea of student achievement and ability. We will be able to compare the student with himself which is the most important comparison, and we will also be able to view the curriculum on a local, Supervisory Union, and national basis.

A very important issue which all citizens of Rumney should be aware of is the State Standards for Elementary Schools. By September 1972 all elementary schools in New Hampshire must either comply with these Standards or submit a proposal for implementation with a "reasonable" time schedule. The penalty for not complying will be loss of all state aid which to Rumney means a substantial sum of money.

Although the Standards are quite forceful, in my opinion, the rationale for improved elementary education to a minimum of acceptability is quite logical.

A sequential plan for meeting the Minimum Standards is currently being worked out by the Superintendent's Office and your School Board. This plan will require a reasonable time schedule so the cost will be spread out over a period of years.

In closing I feel it appropriate to call your attention to the presently inadequate space in your school. An expanded facility is certainly needed. Certain members of the staff are working with multiple grades in one room. The cafeteria, hallways, teachers' room and library are frequently busy with student projects for lack of classroom space, and in general the total downstairs area teems with very active upper grade students.

It has been a pleasure working with the people of Rumney on various committees.

EXPLANATION OF SUPERINTENDENT'S SALARY

Chapter 189, Section 48 Revised Statutes Annotated of the State of New Hampshire, requires that the school district annual report show the total amount paid to the superintendent of schools as per the follownig quotation: "Reports. Each superintendent salary paid to the superintendent, showing in detail the amount paid by the state and each local school district, and their share of same. Said report shall be filed with the school board of each school district involved and shall be included in the annual report of the respective school district as a separate entry. A like report and entry shall be made for each assistant superintendent, teacher consultant, and business administrators, if any is in service in the union."

One-half of the supervisory union expenses is probated among the several school districts of the union on the basis of adjusted valuations. One half is prorated on the basis of average daily membership in the school for the previous school year ending June 30th. The salary of \$12,500, which was received by the superintendent of schools of Supervisory Union No. 48 during 1969-1970 was made up as follows: \$4,000.00 paid by the State of New Hampshire and \$8,500.00 prorated among the several school districts. Allowance of \$1,400.00 for travel within the union was also prorated as stated above.

REPORT OF SCHOOL DISTRICT NURSE

The nurse made forty visits to the school during the school year. Inspections were made for vaccinations; also for signs of infectious diseases, hair and skin infections and cleanliness.

Dental inspections were made on each pupil and the nurse assisted the Dental Hygienist on Dental Health Program.

The nurse assisted Dr. Kirk on Rubella Immunizations on grades 1, 2, 3 and 4, and the State Nurse with Hearing tests on grade 1 with the Vasc Audio test.

A Vision screening test on New York School Screening Tester was given each pupil, and a Hearing screening test was done on each pupil. Notices were sent home on pupils that needed attention in these areas.

Each child was weighed and measured and a health record kept on each one.

First Aid supplies were kept up to date and first aid was given by the Nurse when at the school.

Health conferences were held with parents and pupils as needed. Pre-school registration was held and records made out.

The nurse made eight home visits and took three pupils home.
