# REPORT OF THE SEACOAST HOME HEALTH ASSOCIATION

The Seacoast Home Health Association serving the towns of North Hampton, Hampton, Hampton Falls, and Seabrook is most commonly known as "The Visiting Nurse Association," but its scope has become far wider.

Because of both Federal and State requirements, Home Health Care may also mean teaching a member of the family to properly care for a child, or anyone in the home who is ill. It also means checking and following up on T.B. cases, operation a "Well Child Clinic", assisting School Nurses (at their request) with an immunization clinic, - and much more than giving a bed-bath or a shot, although the latter are necessary.

The following report of our Nurse Supervisor, Mrs. Doris Gardner, gives an excellent picture of the growth and activity of our Association:

"Since the Seacoast Home Health Association was established three years ago there has been a steady increase in the number of calls made each year. From 2089 in the year ending June 30, 1970 to 3886 in the year ending June 30, 1972. Due to the increase in case load our Staff now consists of three full time Registered Nurses, and one part time Licensed Practical Nurse. In addition to the nursing staff our agency now has under contract a physical and occupational therapist. The service of a speech therapist is available when required.

There are 44 children from our area being followed by the State Crippled Children service. We make visits to these families at the request of the State Public Health nurse when there is any problem regarding appointments or medications.

Our Well Child Clinic, which was started in May 1971 at the request of the State, has been well received. It has been proven that there is a definite need for this service as we now have 248 children enrolled, and have discharged 98. Services provided at the clinic include Physical Examinations by Dr. Whitney, a complete immunization program, routine hemoglobin, counseling regarding dental care by a State Dental Hygenist, and Nutrition counseling by Rockingham County Home Economist. Growth and development assessments are done by agency nurses, and follow-up

home visits WHEN REQUESTED BY THE PHYSICIAN. The outreach worker at our clinic has referred 81 patients to the Family Planning Clinic in Exeter, and 11 children have been referred to the Crippled Children Service, Pediatric, Diagnostic, or Heart Clinics.

The Well Child Clinic is funded by the State with regard to supplies and salary of the doctor, and due to the generosity of the Trinity United Church of Seabrook, N.H. is held the first Friday in each month at their Parish House located on Lafayette Road. Appointments must be made in advance.

Our last report showed 9 patients being followed under the State T.B. Program. Currently our records show that this has increased to 14. Monthly visits are made to check on medications and x-ray appointments.

Members of the staff have taken advantage of any educational opportunities offered in the area some of which include a monthly Pediatric conference presented by the doctors from the Exeter Clinic, bi-monthly conferences given at Exeter Hospital on Cancer, programs presented by the State on T.B., Maternal and Child Health conferences at the University of New Hampshire, as well as workshops on Arthritis, Stroke, Nutrition, Cystic Fibrosis and re-habilitation nursing."

Between July 1, 1972 and December 31, 1972, 2113 calls have been made by our nurses, and increase of 212 over the same period last year. 458 of these have been free.

The fiscal year of the Association runs from July 1, to July 1 each year, but the annual meeting is held the second Tuesday in January. This makes budgeting a bit difficult as the need increases. We must bear in mind that the population of ALL southern New Hampshire towns has increased very rapidly during the past few years.

On behalf of the Board of Directors I wish to express our appreciation to the four Towns involved, to the organizations and private citizens who have contributed to this worthwhile work, and the ladies who have given

volunteer service at the Well Child Clinic.

The Board is very prowd of our Staff who are dedicated and conscientious nurses, and of our efficient part-time Secretary.

On January 1, 1973 it was necessary to move to larger quarters at 33 Winnacunnet Road, Hampton where our nurses may be reached at phone number 926-2066.



To the Inhabitants of the Town of Seabrook in the County of Rockingham, in said State, qualifed to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet in the lower hall of the Seabrook Firemen's Association Building, Route 286, on Tuesday, March 6, 1973, at 9 o'clock in the forenoon and to cast ballots until at least 7 o'clock in the evening of the same day, and to meet in the upper hall of the Seabrook Firemen's Association Building, Route 286, on Wednesday, March 7, 1973, at 7:30 o'clock in the evening to act on the following articles:

ARTICLE I. To elect by Non-partisan ballot: One Selectman, and one Assessor for a term of Three (3) years; One Trustee of the Trust Funds for a term of Three (3) years; One Tax Collector for a term of Three (3) years; a Road Agent; a Chief of Police; a Chief of the Fire Department; Three (3) Constables; Two (2) members of the Budget Committee for a term of Three (3) years; a member of the Park Commission for a term of Three (3) years; and any other officers for the ensuing year.

#### (On the Official Ballot)

ARTICLE II. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$915,000.00, said amount to be raised by the issuance of bonds or notes of the Town, the discretion of fixing the date, maturities, denominations, interest rate or discount rate, place of payment, form and other details of said notes or bonds and for providing for the sale thereof to be delegated to the Board of Selectmen; for the purpose of adding to and improving the municipal water system and the acquisition of such real estate as is necessary for the project.

#### (Approved by the Budget Committee)

ARTICLE III. To see if the Town will vote to authorize and empower the Selectmen to contract for or accept grants of federal or state aid or both for said project thereby giving the authority to borrow in anticipation of said aid.

ARTICLE IV. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes and to renew and refund Town notes.

ARTICLE V. To see if the Town will vote to revise the salaries and wages of Town officials and employees.

ARTICLE VI. To see if the Town will vote to authorize and empower the Selectmen to appoint such permanent police officers as they deem necessary.

ARTICLE VII. To see if the Town will vote to authorize and empower the Selectmen to appoint such permanent firemen as they deem necessary.

ARTICLE VIII. To see if the Town will vote to authorize and empower the Selectmen to accept Federal and/or State and/or other funds to be applied to the salaries of Town employees.

ARTICLE IX. To see what action the Town will take regarding the balances of the Special Appropriations: New Lands, \$1,342.47; Farm Lane Dock, \$2,205.78; Cross Beach Road, \$4,885.00; Dwight Avenue, \$925.00; Police Equipment, \$789.10.

ARTICLE X. To see if the Town will authorize and empower the Selectmen to sell and convey those premises owned by the Town, whether acquired by Tax Collector's Deeds or otherwise, which are within the perimeter of the following bounds:

North of the Mill Creek,
South of Brown's River,
East of a line which is perpendicular
to the end of Rocks Road,
West of Route No. 1A.

at private sale, upon such terms and conditions as the Selectmen, in their discretion, deem to be in the best interest of the Town, and to execute such agreements, deeds, or other documents necessary to accomplish the same.

ARTICLE XI. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to expend the Highway Subsidy provided by the State of New Hampshire pursuant to the provisions of RSA 241:14, as amended, for the purposes defined in said statute.

(Approved by the Budget Committee)

ARTICLE XII. To see if the Town will vote to accept as a public highway the road known as Cemetery Road and an extension thereof 40 feet in width along the northwesterly border of premises owned by George Dow.

ARTICLE XIII. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 for the purpose of donating said sum to Child and Family Services of New Hampshire.

(Approved by the Budget Committee)

ARTICLE XIV. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$35,000.00 to be used in the preparation of a report for sewerage and sewage treatment facilities, including such land acquisition, easements, rights-of-way, surveys and borings as are required.

(Approved by the Budget Committee)

ARTICLE XV. To see if the Town will vote to authorize and empower the Selectmen or whomever they may appoint to act on their behalf to supervise the placement and/or moving of street lights in the Town.

 $\mbox{\sc ARTICLE XVI.}\ \mbox{\sc To see}$  if the Town is in favor of continuing the surplus food program.

ARTICLE XVII. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the withdrawal from the Revenue Sharing Fund established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972 for use as set-offs against budgeted appropriations for the following priority purposes and in the amounts indicated or take any other action hereon:

ARTICLE XVIII. To see if the Town will vote to establish a Capital Reserve Fund for the financing of all or a part of the cost of a new municipal building and the acquisition, if necessary, of the land therefor, said fund to be known as the Municipal Building Fund; and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$60,000.00 for the establishment of said fund.

#### (Approved by the Budget Committee)

ARTICLE XIX. To see if the Town will vote to authorize and empower the Selectmen to sell tax title property owned by the Town to former owners of the property or the heirs of said owners and/or to sell such property at public auction, the moneys from said sale to be paid into and added to the Municipal Building Fund.

ARTICLE XX. To see if the Town will vote to become a member of the Southeastern New Hampshire Regional Planning Commission and to raise and appropriate \$3,018.00 for the purpose of becoming a member thereof and to finance studies to be conducted by the Regional Planning Commission.

#### (Approved by the Budget Committee)

ARTICLE XXI. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of 14,000.00 for the purpose of purchasing a new five ton dump truck.

#### (Approved by the Budget Committee)

ARTICLE XXII. To see if the Jown will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$14,000.00 for the purpose of purchasing a new five ton dump truck, said amount to be raised by the issuance of bonds or notes of the Town, the discretion of fixing the date, maturities, denominations, interest rate or discount rate, place of payment, form and other details of said notes or bonds and for providing for the sale thereof to be delegated to the Board of Selectmen.

ARTICLE XXIII. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$24,000.00 for the purpose of buying a new garbage truck.

#### (Approved by the Budget Committee)

ARTICLE XXIV. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$24,000.00 for the purpose of buying a new garbage truck, said amount to be raised by the issuance of bonds or notes of the Town, the discretion of fixing the date, maturities, denominations, interest rate or discount rate, place of payment, form and other details of said notes or bonds and for providing for the sale thereof to be delegated to the Board of Selectmen.

#### (Approved by the Budget Committee)

ARTICLE XXV. To see if the Town will vote to authorize and empower the Selectmen to sell various items of equipment of the Town to include an International Garbage Truck, a Chevrolet Fire Tank Truck, and any other obsolete equipment of the Town.

ARTICLE XXVI. To see if the Town will vote to increase the licensing fee for restaurants, roadside stands, vendors, and stores selling food and beverages from \$5.00 to \$10.00 and to authorize and empower the Selectmen to set the amount of said fee hereafter.

ARTICLE XXVII. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,000.00, \$2,000.00 of which will be paid to the Building Inspector as a salary and \$1,000.00 of which will be paid to the Building Inspector for expenses.

- The Regional Refuse Disposal Planning Board shall report its finding and recommendations to the Board of Selectmen.

- 3. The Selectmen upon receipt of a recommendation that a Regional Refuse Disposal District be established shall cause a question of accepting such plan to be presented for determination by vote with printed ballots at the next annual Town Meeting or at a Special Meeting called for that purpose.
- 4. The above Article is in accordance with RSA 53B.

ARTICLE XXX. Upon the petition of Warren G. Crawford and fourteen (14) other voters of the Town: To see if the Town will vote to ban all surf boards and surfing on the shores of the Atlantic Ocean at Seabrook Beach, New Hampshire. This act shall take effect immediately upon passage. Anyone violating this act shall be fined \$10.00 for the first offense, \$25.00 for the second offense and \$50.00 for each offense thereafter.

ARTICLE XXXI. Upon the petition of Benjamin E. Moore and twenty-four (24) other voters of the Town: That the Selectmen, Building Inspector, Planning Board, or any other agent for the Town of Seabrook issue no building permits for the construction of apartments or condominiums within the geographical boundaries of the Town of Seabrook. This Article is to go into effect immediately upon passage.

ARTICLE XXXII. Upon the petition of Benjamin E. Moore and twenty-five (25) other voters of the Town: That the Planning Board or Board of Selectmen disapprove any site plan which is specifically for use as a mobile home, or trailer, park; and that no certificate or notice of authorization for such site plans be filed with the registrar of deeds. This Article is to take effect immediately upon passage.

ARTICLE XXXIII. Upon the petition of James W. Humphries, Jr. and thirty-two (32) other voters of the Town: (a) To see if the Town will vote to accept as a public highway, the roads named Pine Cone Drive and Timber Court, as shown on the plan entitled 'PINEBROOK ESTATES, NEW HAMPSHIRE" by Great Eastern Land Corp.; Scale 1" = 60°; Dated August, 1971; Parker Survey Associates, Surveyor; Lafayette Road, Seabrook, New Hampshire. (b) To see if the Town will vote to put the finish coat of asphalt on Pine Cone Drive and Timber Court.

ARTICLE XXXIV. Upon the petition of Elliot L. Eaton and ninety-two (92) other voters of the Town: To see if the Town will vote to have the land of the Boston & Maine Railroad deeded to the Town in lieu of taxes.

ARTICLE XXXV. Upon the petition of Bernard L. Morrison and fourteen (14) other voters of the Town: To see if the Town will vote to install a street light on pole # 7-1092 located on Pine Street.

ARTICLE XXXVI. Upon the petition of Gordon K. Hill and sixteen (16) other voters of the Town: To see if the Town will vote to accept the street light on Rocks Road, which is presently installed on Pole #6, illuminating Fire Box #231. This street light was installed by the Exeter & Hampton Electric Co., allegedly at the request of a former property owner, who left the state and sold the property two years ago. The present owner has since been billed \$43.20 annually for this street light which benefits several other residents in the area as well as all others who use the road.



### REPORT OF TRAFFIC SAFETY COMMITTEE FOR 1972

The committee reactivated in April 1972 and made the beach problem its first order of business. No parking areas were marked and several "Tow Areas" established. With excellent cooperation from the Police Department there were practically no complaints of illegal parking.

The following improvements were made in road warning signs:

Route 286 speed limit was reduced to 50 MPH, to cover the cross road at Adams Avenue and Adams Campground. In addition a 35 MPH warning sign was placed ahead of the Black River 35 MPH sign. On route northbound, the signal ahead sign was improved by adding the 3 color triangle, indication that three color signals were located around the bend. This improved the route 107 - route 1 situation considerably.

Improved 35 MPH signs of larger dimensions have been placed on route 1A northbound. Additional 35 MPH signs are still to be placed in both northbound and southbound lanes from Hampton Bridge to route 286.

The excessive speed on route l was cut down by having the 35 MPH sign replaced l00 yards north of the Seabrook line.

The bad situation of water accumulation at Paul Carey's on route 1A has been eliminated.

The State has approved making the right hand lane southbound from Hampton a right turn only lane. The State is also studying the problem of cutting across a one way lane at Folly Mill Road. This is a hazard in both north and southbound lanes.

The pedestrian crosswalk markers will be replaced on route lA. Absence of these created a hazard this past year.

The committee is also trying to get highway safety material from the state to be paid for in part by Federal funds.

Submitted herewith is the report of the annual examination and audit of the accounts of the Town of Seabrook for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1971, which was made by this Division in accordance with the vote of the Town. Exhibits as hereafter listed are included as part of the report.

One of the enclosed audit reports must be given to the Town Clerk for retention as part of the permanent Town records.

### SCOPE OF AUDIT

Included in the examination and audit were the accounts and records of the Board of Selectmen, Treasurer, Tax Collector, Town Clerk, Municipal Court, Water Department and Trustees of Trust Funds.

### FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

### General Fund:

Comparative Balance Sheets - December 31, 1970 and December 31, 1971: (Exhibit A-1)

Comparative Balance Sheets - General Fund - as of December 31, 1970 and December 31, 1971 are presented in Exhibit A-1. As indicated therein, the Current Surplus of the Town increased by \$12,458.26 in 1971, from \$5,772.50 at December 31, 1970 to \$18,230.76 at December 31, 1971.

Comparative statements of general fund appropriations and expenditures, estimated and actual revenues for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1971, are presented in Exhibits A-3 and A-1. As indicated by the Budget Summary (Exhibit A-4), a net unexpended balance of appropriations of \$6,302.98 plus a revenue surplus of \$9,583.43 resulted in a net budget surplus of \$15,886.41.

### Water Department:

### Comparative Balance Sheets - December 31, 1970 and December 31, 1971: (Exhibit A-5)

Comparative Balance Sheets of the Water Department as of December 31, 1970 and December 31, 1971 are presented in Exhibit A-5. As indicated therein, the Net Debt of the Water Department decreased by \$46,726.85 in 1971, from \$481,460.32 at December 31, 1970 to \$434,733.47 at December 31, 1971.

### Long Term Indebtedness:

### Comparative Balance Sheets: (Exhibit A-6)

Comparative Balance Sheets of the outstanding long term indebtedness of the Town as of December 31, 1970 and December 31, 1971 are shown in Exhibit A-6. The outstanding long term debt decreased by \$28,766.49 during 1971, from \$463,587.84 to \$434,821.35.

### AUDIT PROCEDURE

The accounts and records of all town officials charged with the custody, receipt and disbursement of public funds were examined and audited in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards, and accordingly included such tests of the accounting records and such other auditing procedures as were considered necessary in the circumstances.

Verification of uncollected and unredeemed taxes was made by mailing notices to delinquent taxpayers as indicated by the Tax Collector's records. Consequently, the amounts of uncollected and unredeemed taxes as indicated in this report are subject to any changes which may be necessitated by the return of verification notices.

### GENERAL COMMENTS

### Unredeemed Taxes:

As of December 31, 1971, unredeemed taxes on account of the levies of 1968 and prior years amounted to \$27,657.07, as shown in the following tabulation:

This amount represents approximately forty four percent (44%) of the total unredeemed taxes outstanding at December 31, 1971, as shown by the Tax Collector's records.

The statutory redemption period has expired in all of these cases. The Tax Collector, therefore, should have delivered tax deeds to the Town for all the tax-delinquent real estate involved. This, however, was not done prior to the close of the fiscal year ended December 31, 1971.

Consequently, these unredeemed taxes are carried on the records as part of the total assets of the general fund and, in our opinion, overstate the amount of the Town's current surplus.

To correct this situation, the sum of \$27,657.07 has been inserted as a provision for estimated uncollectible tax liens on the Balance Sheet as of December 31, 1971 (Exhibit A-1). This reduces the estimated recoverable tax liens held by the Town at that date to \$35,578.31. We believe that this latter amount reflects more realistically the net assets and current surplus of the Town at the close of the fiscal year 1971.

We again have instructed the Tax Collector to execute tax deeds to the Town at once on all properties on which tax liens are in default, in accordance with the requirements of R.S.A., 80:38.

### Surety Bond of Town Treasurer:

The surety bond of the Town Treasurer should be increased in amount from \$25,000.00 to \$29,000.00 in order that it may be proportional to the amount of funds received by this official. This bond should be issued on an annual basis in that amount.

### Tax Collector:

During the fiscal year, there were excess credits of \$2,788.70 in the accounts of the Tax Collector, i.e., credits exceeded total debits as indicated in Exhibit C-1. These resulted from posting errors

in the tax warrants and inadequate accounting over receipts. Also, tax collections in excess of \$400,000.00 received after the close of the fiscal year were entered as 1971 receipts. This is a violation of both state and federal laws, which require that tax payments must be recorded in the fiscal year in which such payments are made.

It is essential that the Tax Collector's records be reconciled at the end of each year in order that errors in the accounts be located and corrected before the annual audit. This process reduces the audit time required in connection with the tax accounts, and consequently, results in considerable savings to the Town. Additionally, it should be noted that the law requires that the Collector shall reconcile the tax accounts. This is not the function of the auditors of this Division.

The Tax Collector should adopt the use of the prescribed columnar cash journals in which all tax payments (cash or check) should be recorded and classified. Tax collections should be recorded in the calendar year in which they are received.

The Collector's cash book, by law, must be closed on December 31st of each fiscal year.

### Trust Funds:

It is noted that a portion of the Trust Fund assets are invested as follows:

In this connection, the attention of the Trustees is called to Chapter 31, sections 25 and 27 of the Revised Statutes Annotated, relative to legal investments prescribed for Trust Funds. All funds are required to be invested in approved banks located and doing business in the State of New Hampshire.

### Conclusion:

The provisions of Chapter 71, Section 27-a, of the Revised Statutes Annotated require that the auditors' summary of findings and recommendations (letter of transmittal) shall be published in the next

annual report of the Town. Publication of the Exhibits contained in the audit report is optional, at the discretion of the Board of Selectmen.
