TOWN WARRANT

To the inhabitants of the Town of Stoddard in the County of Cheshire in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall in said Stoddard on Tuesday, the tenth day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriation of the same.
3. To bring in your votes on the proposed amendments to the constitution.
4. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Highways and Bridges for the ensuing year.
5. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for snow removal for the year ensuing.
6. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the general expenses of the Highway Department for the ensuing year.
7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate anything for the observance of Old Home Day.

8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate or set aside the sum of Six Hundred Sixty Dollars (\$660.00) as the Town's share in State Aid Construction on the Shedd Hill Road or to raise and appropriate or set aside the sum of One Hundred Sixty Seven Dollars and Thirty-Eight Cents (\$167.38) for T. R. A., so called.

9. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

10. To see if the Town will vote to accept the Arthur E. Cutter trust fund of One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) for the care of the Arthur E. Cutter lot in the New Cemetery.

11. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the expenses of the Fire Department for the ensuing year.

12. To see if the Town will vote to take any action for the control of white pine blister rust, and raise the necessary money for the same.

13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate any sum of money for advertising the Town, said money to be expended through the Monadnock Region Association.

14. To see if the Town will vote to accept the provisions of the Municipal Budget Act.

15. To see if the Town will vote to petition the State Tax Commission to have an audit made by the Municipal Accounting Division and to make an appropriation to cover the expense of such audit.

16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate any sum of money to provide for additional fire protection due to the war emergency.

17. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate any sum of money to provide watchmen and additional police protection due to war emergency.

18. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate any sum of money for the use of the Town health officer and board of health due to the war emergency.

19. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

If they would leave their names with Mrs. MacMahon, chairman of the board, the school nurse would appreciate it and make the necessary arrangements with the parents, for the children to be taken to the oculist.

Cod liver oil was given the pupils at school through the cold weather.

GENERAL DISCUSSION

The Stoddard school at this writing has twenty-two pupils. The fires of last spring drove a number of families out of town thus reducing the membership of the school. Whether this is permanent or temporary we do not know. Judging from present day economic conditions I should not be surprised to see further increases and decreases in in the enrolment. These conditions demand the continuance on the job of a strong teacher such as we have.

Last June a very interesting program was presented in the town hall by the graduates and other children of the school. Four pupils were graduated. It is a source of great satisfaction to note that all of them entered high

school either at Keene or at Alstead. Let us hope that we shall continue to have graduates from Stoddard ambitious enough to go on to high school. Even during these times of national and international strife, and of alluring wages paid by the industries the education of our children must go on uninterrupted. More than ever do we need all the advantages which education affords, in order to maintain and propagate the democratic principles for the defense of which we have taken up arms. Dictatorships do not thrive among enlightened peoples.

A problem has risen this year which if not happily solved will affect the welfare of the school. It has been impossible for the teacher to secure satisfactory living quarters, due to the fact that people do not wish to bother with a boarder. Stoddard is too far from any town to secure a teacher willing to drive back and forth every day. Besides there are enough good homes in Stoddard which should be patriotic enough to relieve this acute situation. If some home does not "come across" it will be impossible to secure or keep a teacher. I am sure that enough civic pride exists in the good old town of Stoddard not to let this happen.

We appreciate the improvement of the school grounds, the inside painting of the school house, and the electric lights. We also appreciate the fine interest which the Parent-Teachers Association is taking in the school. Keep up the excellent work. It is needed. We still look forward to adjustable desk units, more modern heating, more sanitary toilets, and some provision for plenty of water both for drinking and washing purposes.

My frequent school visits keep me in touch with the children's and the teacher's work. I am glad to report good work and good results.
