



TOWN WARRANT THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Wakefield in the County of Carroll in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall in said Town on Tuesday, the tenth day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriation of the same.
- 3. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the repairs of highways and bridges.
- 4. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for oiling roads.
- 5. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for continuing the W. P. A. work on the Stoneham Road.
- 6. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for surfacing and oiling the road leading from the state road across the B. & M. R. R. tracks to the Acton, Me., line.
- 7. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of a Public Health Nurse to be employed by the Red Cross Organization.
- 8. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of Libraries and where it shall be expended.
- 9. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the proper celebration of Old Home Week.

- 10. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for street lighting in the villages of Sanbornville, Union, Wakefield, East Wakefield and Woodman.
- 11. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the proper observance of Memorial Day.
- 12. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire such sums of money as may be necessary to pay Town Bills in anticipation of taxes.
- 13. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the suppression of Brown Tail and Gypsy Moths and Pine Blister.
- 14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the purchase of a snow plow and tractor, or truck.
- 15. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Province Lake Road with a joint account with the State.
- 16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$554.79, the State to contribute the amount of \$2219.17 for Town maintenance on Class 5 roads.
- 17. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the provisions of the Municipal Budget Act.
- 18. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate money for the issuance and distribution of printed matter calling attention to the resources and natural advantages of the town in cooperation with other towns in the lake region.
- 19. Do you approve the passage of the following by-laws adopted by the Selectmen relating to observance of the Lord's Day;

Moving pictures and Theatricals. It shall be lawful on the Lord's Day to conduct moving pictures, lectures, concerts, theatricals, and vaudville performances, but no earlier than six o'clock in the afternoon, providing no unreasonable disturbance of peace and quiet is caused thereby. The Selectmen shall make regula-

tions as to such performances.

20. To see if the Town will vote to allow three percent on all property taxes if paid on or before July 1st, two percent if paid on or before August 1st, and one percent if paid on or before September 1st, not to apply on precinct taxes.

21. To see what action, if any, the Town will take relative to a fee or fees for breaking out private

roads.

22. To transact any business that may legally come before said meeting.



GAFNEY LIBRARY

Report For The Period February 1st, 1935 to January 31st, 1936 inclusive

Gafney Library was dedicated ten years ago the twenty-eighth day of last August. Thousands of people have enjoyed the comfort of the reading rooms and the privilege of borrowing the books.

For several years, boxes of books have been loaned to our friends at South Wakefield and Brookfield and books have been given to Union Library and to the County Home at Ossipee.

The past year, the Library has been open the usual time with the exception of two weeks in May when it was closed for the scarlet fever epidemic.

The attendance has been 4188 and the circulation 4632. One hundred and fifty-five books have been catalogued, the greater part of which were given by interested friends. "My Book House", a collection of twenty-three volumes has recently been added to the Juvenile section. These books are beautifully illustrated and contain a wealth of material for our young readers.

The Reading tables have been well supplied with magazines, given by friends.



Of these eighteen graduates from our eighth grades all but two entered some secondary school in this or another state last September.

This year we have 18 pupils in Rochester High School, 7 in Nute High School, and 14 in Brewster Academy.

For the past three or four years there has been a considerable increase in the number of our pupils who elect to attend Rochester High School. This is due chiefly to the fact that Rochester offers opportunities for manual training and domestic arts which are not given in the other high schools to which we have been sending our pupils. Brewster Academy dropped its Commercial Department a year ago. This also accounts for the fact that fewer of our pupils are now attending that institution than formerly.

Our corps of teachers is the same this year as last. We are fortunate in not being obliged to make any changes.

Medical Inspection remains under the charge of Miss Maude McBride as for several years past. Her report will follow.
