**TOWN WARRANT**

To the inhabitants of the Town of Windsor in the County of Hillsborough in said State, qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House in said Windsor on Tuesday, the 4th day of March, 1975, the Town Meeting to open at the conclusion of the School District Meeting; which is called for at 6 P.M., to act upon the following subjects.

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

3. To hear reports of Auditors and Agents heretofore chosen and to pass any vote in relation thereto.

4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$1,800.00 for highways.

5. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the withdrawal from the Revenue Sharing Fund established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972 for use as set-offs against budgeted appropriations for the following priority purposes and in amounts indicated or take any other action hereon:

Town Dump	\$800.00

6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$200.00 for Town Mapping.

7. To see if the Town will vote to accept State Aid on its highways and raise and appropriate \$23.14 as the Town's share.

8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$250.00 for Police and Fire expenses.

9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$100.00 for the upkeep of the Town House.

10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$45.00 for Street Lighting.



11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$100.00 for the upkeep of the Town Cemeteries.

12. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of Taxes.

13. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to use all or any amount of surplus to alleviate the tax rate.

14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$50.00 to donate to the Hillsboro Rescue Squad.

15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$1,500.00 to be paid to the Town of Hillsboro for the use of the public sanitary receiving station in Hillsboro, N. H.

16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$100.00 for legal expenses.

17. To see if the Town will vote to authorize and empower the Planning Board to approve or disapprove plats showing streets or the widening thereof and to adopt subdivision regulations all in accordance with the provisions of R.S.A. 36:19 to 34 or take any other action in relation thereto.

18. To see if the Town will vote to determine whether the Town will become a member of the Southwest New Hampshire Regional Planning Commission, and to appropriate \$40.00 as annual membership dues.

19. To see if the Town will vote to prohibit the use of petroleum powered boats on Black Pond to ensure the safety of swimmers and users of other small non-powered boats.

20. To see if the Town will vote to officially designate the section of town highway extending from the Hillsboro-Windsor town lines to Camp Wediko as Windsor Road, as it presently appears on the Hillsboro town map.

21. To see if the Town will vote to close all Town Roads subject to gates and bars except the following: Windsor Road from the Hillsboro-Windsor Town line to a point approximately 200 feet south of Black Pond Bridge. White Pond Road from Windsor Road to land of Davis and Palmer. Dodge Hill Road to now existing turn around. North Star Camp Road from Route #31 to land of Cranston.

22. To see if the Town will vote to participate in the operation of a scholarship fund established by Interlocken Camp in the name of Thomas H. Hines Sr., for the benefit of resi-

dents in the Town of Windsor who are high school graduates, and to authorize the Board of Selectmen and School Board to serve as directors and otherwise participate in the management and operation of the fund, the resources of which will be supplied by private sources and not out of public monies.

23. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

## FOREST FIRE WARDEN'S REPORT

All open burning when the ground is not covered with snow is controlled by the Town Forest Fire Warden in cooperation with the New Hampshire Forest Fire Service. Anyone wishing to kindle a fire out-of-doors when the ground is not covered with snow must have a written permit signed by the Town Forest Fire Warden. If the fire is to be kindled on land not owned by the person kindling the fire then he must have the permission of the landowner. No outdoor fires can be kindled between 9 A.M. and 5 P.M. unless it is raining, without the additional approval of the District Forest Fire Chief.

The 1974 forest fire season was one of the worst in the past two decades. Woodlands in central and southern New Hampshire became so dry in mid August that the Governor and Council, upon the recommendation of the State Forester, enacted a partial woodlands closure in Sullivan, Cheshire, Hillsborough, Merrimack and Belknap Counties and a complete closure in Strafford and Rockingham Counties plus the Towns of Barnstead, Gilmanston and Alton in Belknap County. Through the excellent cooperation of the citizens of our State no major forest fire occurred at any time during the year.

## **SUPERINTENDENT'S MESSAGE**

The burden of funding education weighs heavily upon local districts while concurrently the task of providing satisfactory educational programs with suitable alternatives is likewise the responsibility of the district. Your indulgence is necessary through these trying times to provide the necessary instruction vehicle so that an undiminished educational program may continue for our children.

The professional staff and school boards have worked diligently to provide a maintenance budgetary appropriation with change only where mandated for subsistence. We respect your affirmation of excellence in education and support for continuance of instructional improvement for our youth.
