- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be neces_sary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

- 3. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$846.14 for TRA (the State to furnish the sum of \$5,640.96).
- 4. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen to appoint a committee to investigate the possibility of the Residents of Alexandria to have parking privileges at the Bristol Town Beach or any other Beach Area on Newfound Lake.
- 5. To see what sum the Town will raise and appropriate for the maintenance of highways and bridges, except snow work.
- 6. To see what sum the Town will raise and appropriate for plowing and sanding roads and plowing driveways in winter.
- 7. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000.00 to be added to the Capitol Reserve Fund for future purchase of road equipment.
- 8. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
- 9. To see what sum the Town will raise and appropriate for the Bristol Community Center.
- 10. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate \$500.00 to be donated to the Alexandria Volunteer Fire Department.
- 11. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate \$270.00 for the Lakes Region Mental Health Center.
- 12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$300.00 for the care of cemeteries.
- 13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$200.00 for perambulation of town lines.

- 14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$1,000.00 for sealing of roads.
- 15. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate \$2,000.00 to pay for repairs to the Austin Western Grader.
- 16. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate \$500.00 for a town building fund.
- 17. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to sell the settee presently on the porch of the Town Hall.
- 18. To see if the Town will re_open a section of Burns Hill Road starting at the north end of said road and running approximately 2,000 feet southerly.
- 19. To see what sum the Town will raise and appropriate for the Newfound Region Chamber of Commerce.
- 20. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate \$750.00 for a new police radio.
- 21. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate \$300.00 for the Town to become a member of the New-found Area Nursing Association.
- 22. To hear report of Committee on modernizing Town Hall Kitchen and to act on their recommendations and raise and appropriate money for same.
- 23. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to appoint a building Committee of five to propose a town equipment building and report at the next annual meeting.
- 24. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$50.00 for partial participation to the Lakes

To see if the Town will adopt the following resolution: Any party or person constructing a water supply, digging a shallow well or drilling a well, for domestic or industrial use, within 100 feet of a public way shall first file a statement with the Town Clerk releasing the Town from and or all liability for pollution of such water supply or well, as the result of materials being used in the construction or maintenance of public ways.

REPORT OF FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND DISTRICT CHIEF

People cause fires. Our records show that the number of fires increase in an area as the population increases and our state is growing tremendously. This means that we all must be aware of fire causes and do our best to prevent their occurrence.

When we are very young the lighted matches is an adventure, burnt fingers and a dropped match is another fire. A little older we like to have a woodland cookout or go out by ourselves for a smoke but fire and forests get together for another statistic. We adults like to clean up in the spring, burn the old debris and the dead grass, result — escaped fires and much personal expense.

With new homes and summer cottages located in woodlands and with abandoned fields and forests crowding the back yard of our villages' streets, it is necessary that everyone be aware all through the fire season, which comes with the disappearance of the snow, of the need to be careful with outdoor fires and fire sources.

The following action will help:

- 1. To teach our children the danger of lighted matches.
- 2. To never discard lighted smoking material from a car or while walking through fields or woods.
- 3. To safely dispose of rubbish preferably at the town dump. If you must burn —
- a. You need a written permit from the town fire warden for all debris burning except when the ground is covered with snow. Cooking fires in outdoor fireplaces or in charcoal brasiers in your own back yard is permitted on notification of the warden.

- b. The warden is forbidden by regulation to allow burning of household rubbish on grass by householders between 9:00 A.M. and 5:00 P. M.
- c. Have equipment on hand to control the fire before you light the match.
- 4. Promptly report any fire out of control to your fire warden or fire department.

Help to keep our town out of the fire occurrence column and save your tax dollars for useful purposes.
