TOWN WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Bennington in the County of Hillsborough in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Benntington on Tuesday, the 10th day of March, next at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate for highways and bridges.
- 3. To see if the Town will vote to accept State Aid for Class V roads and raise and appropriate money for the same. The Town must raise \$351.99 and the State will contribute \$2,346.57.
- 4. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow such sums of money as may be necessary in anticipation of taxes.
- 5. To see what action the Town will take in regard to real estate taken over by the Town for non-payment of taxes.
- 6. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000.00 for tarring and to see if the Town will approve the inclusion of this item as a regular part of future Town Budgets. (Proposed by Selectmen and Budget Committee.)
- 7. To see if the Town will vote to transfer any balance in the Fire Department appropriation to a Capital Reserve Fund to be used toward the building of a new fire station. (Proposed by the Fire Department.)
- 8. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 for purchase of hose by the Fire Department. (Proposed by the Fire Department.)

- 9. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 for the purchase of a road broom. (Proposed by the Selectmen and Budget Committee.)
- 10. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate \$941.00 for repairs and painting of the Town Hall. (Proposed by the Selectmen and Budget Committee.)
- 11. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$177.00 for the support of the Monadnock Family and Mental Health Service Clinic in Keene.
- 12. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to appoint the Chief of Police, or take any other action relating thereto. (Proposed by Budget Committee.)
- 13. To see if the Town will ratify and approve the amendments to the Town Hall Bylaws proposed by the Town Hall Bylaws Committee and printed elsewhere in this Town Report. (Proposed by the Town Hall Bylaws Committee.)
- 14. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Planning Board to adopt a Subdivision Ordinance, and empower it to approve and disapprove subdivisions and plats thereof showing streets, or widening thereof, or parks, in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 36 of the New Hampshire Revised Statutes Annotated. (Proposed by the Planning Board.)
- 15. To see whether the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to enter into a lease on such terms and conditions as they deem appropriate of certain land owned by Frank and Ardell Johnson situate in North Bennington consisting of approximately 50 (fifty) acres to be used as the site for a solid waste disposal facility (Town Dump), to see what sum the Town will raise and appropriate for the same, or take any other action related thereto. (Proposed by the Selectmen and the Planning Board.)
- 16. To see whether the Town will vote to constitute a committee consisting of the Selectmen and members of the Planning Board to prepare with representatives of the Town of Antrim a proposed agreement between the Town and the Town of Antrim for the creation and operation of a solid waste disposal facility (town dump) or to take any other action related thereto. (Proposed by the Selectmen and the Planning Board.)

- 17. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$1,000.00 to acquire land, options, or easements, required for the construction of the proposed domestic sewage and industrial waste treatment facility or take any other action related thereto. (Proposed by the Selectmen and the Planning Board.)
- 18. To see if the Town will vote to accept from Monadnock Paper Mills, Inc., a deed conveying to the Town as a gift land consisting of approximately 10 (ten) acres situated north of the plant of Monadnock Paper Mills, Inc., to be used for construction of the proposed domestic sewage and industrial waste treatment facility. (Proposed by the Selectmen and the Planning Board.)
- 19. To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate for Statutory requirements and to carry the articles and appropriations of the School District into effect.

To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

REPORT OF THE FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND DISTRICT CHIEF

Less fortunate than our northern towns, we had too many fires. Carelessness in burning trash and discarding smoking material and children playing with fire caused most of the fires. Your Forest Fire Warden's job would be easier if everyone understood the State laws that govern the kindling of outdoor fires. A synopsis of these laws follow:

Fire Permit

A fire permit is needed for all outdoor fires in or near woodland anytime the ground is not covered with snow. This includes household waste burning, even if an incinerator, grass burning, garden trash as well as brush burning. Such burning is restricted by regulation to be prior to 9:00 a.m., and after 5:00 p.m.

Exceptions

Commercial or industrial burning is allowed anytime under normal conditions with permission of the District

Chief and a permit from the Fire Warden.

Camp or cooking fire are allowed on your own property with permission of the Fire Warden. On another's property with written permission of the landowner and permission of the Fire Warden. The Warden can forbid such fires if in a hazardous area. Permits for cooking fires in the White Mountain National Forest can be obtained from the Laconia Office or at the Ranger Stations. Permits are not required in public camp or picnic grounds where fireplaces have been built for this purpose.

Penalties

1. For kindling a fire without a permit, Maximum of \$200.00 fine; or imprisonment for not more than 60 davs.

2. For kindling a fire by any means wilfully or recklessly that shall endanger woodlands the maximum fine is

\$500.00 or one year's imprisonment.

3. For failure to totally extinguish a camp or cooking fire before leaving it the same penalties as in (1) above. 4. For dropping inflammable material in or near wood-

land, maximum fine is \$25.00.

Fire prevention is a personal matter and a good habit. Keep our town free from smokes in 1970.

SUGGESTED REVISIONS IN THE TOWN HALL BY-LAWS AS RECOMMENDED BY THE COMMITTEE AP-POINTED BY THE MODERATOR SUBSEQUENT TO THE ANNUAL TOWN MEETING OF MARCH 1969

The following recommendations would all represent suggested changes to Article II of the Bylaws for the Bennington Town Hall as published in the 1967 Town Annual Report.

That Section III be revised by substituting for the present section the following:

All town organizations and other town groups organized for activities to the general good of the townspeople FREE

Section IV - substitute for the present section the following:

For all local religious meetings or meetings when no admission or collections are made. For all functions locally sponsored connected with town recreation activities

FREE

Section VII — substitute for the present section the following:

Article II

Local active and organized teen clubs or groups shall have the use of the hall for free when no other groups, organizations or persons have rented the hall, provided they are properly chaperoned by persons of 21 years of age and sponsored by a local organization. It shall be understood by the term teenagers

means any minor under the age of 21. It shall be the duty of the chaperones to see that the hall is properly cleaned before leaving

the function.

Add the following sections to Article II:

Section XIII

A bulletin board shall be maintained by the Janitor of scheduled use of the town hall facilities

Section XIV

Questions of interpretation of these bylaws to be subject to the final decision of the Bylaws Committee. Decision of the janitor related to restriction of the use of the hall as provided in Section XII may be appealed to the Bylaws Committee for final judgement.

REPORT OF THE ACTIVITIES OF THE BENNINGTON PLANNING BOARD DURING 1969 TOGETHER WITH THEIR RECOMMENDATIONS FOR ACTION AT THE MARCH 1970 TOWN MEETING

Town Sewage Project

At the time of the submission of the last report by the Bennington Planning Board on this project in the Town Report of 1968, we had on file with the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) of the Federal government an accepted application for an interest-free loan with which to undertake the final engineering for the Bennington-Antrim joint sewage project. In June of 1969 we were informed by HUD that our application had been approved and funds had been made available. Later in the year the engineering firm of Anderson-Nichols began the final engineering work on this project and this work is expected to be completed sometime in mid-1970.

When the final engineering work is completed and approved by both HUD and the State Water Pollution Commission, the town will then be ready to begin construction as soon as State and Federal funds are available. When this will be is, of course, impossible to know exactly, but if the State Legislature continues the precedent established at the last session of providing state funds with which to pre-finance the portion of the total cost which is to be provided by the Federal government, it is quite possible that construction could begin fairly soon thereafter.

The town is now under Official Order No. 1409 from the New Hampshire Water Supply and Pollution Control Commission for abatement of pollution in the Contoocook River by July 18, 1970. We will, of course, ask for an extension of this time limit and, having in good faith taken all the proper steps, we see no reason why there should

be any difficulty in this connection.

The consulting engineering firm of Anderson-Nichols has recommended that the town raise and appropriate \$1,000 to provide for the necessary acquisition of land and easements in order to complete this project. In view of the fact that Monadnock Paper Mills, Inc. has committed to donate to the town the land necessary for the treatment plant and lagoon, it is anticipated that this appropriation should be more than sufficient to obtain the necessary easements and whatever other land might be necessary.

Joint Dump - Bennington & Antrim

In the 1968 report to the town we explained that we had been studying the possibility of a joint dump with Antrim related to the knowledge that open burning of town dumps will be prohibited by the state fairly shortly. It was also stated that the Planning Board would expect to have recommendations for the March 1970 Town Meet-

ing.

The Planning Board and the Selectmen jointly with the Planning Board and Selectmen of Antrim have held meetings during the year on this project. They have agreed in principle that a dump for the use of both towns to cover not only the usual rubbish disposal but later on the sludge from the sewage treatment plant would be in the interest of both towns. A site in North Bennington was selected and discussion initiated with the owners regarding a long term lease in order that this site be used for a land-filled solid waste disposal area. The site has been approved by the State authorities. In view of the fact that the site is in Bennington, it was also agreed that the dump would be owned and operated by the Town of Bennington and that an agreement would be made with Antrim providing for their use of the facility based upon an allocation of the anticipated operating costs.

It was also agreed that Bennington would add items to the Town Warrant requesting (a) the necessary authority to enter into a long-term lease for the necessary land and (b) the necessary authority to negotiate an operating agreement with the Town of Antrim. Antrim in turn agreed that they would also include in their Town Warrant an article requesting the necessary authority for

Antrim to enter into such a negotiated agreement.

Sub-Division Code

Many recent studies have indicated that there would be a substantial growth in the towns in Hillsborough County, but, even so, the Planning Board has been surprised at the recent indications of substantial growth

within our town. We are suddenly conscious that for the best interests of all, provisions should be made for an orderly and well-planned basis for such growth. Town legal counsel has recommended that the Planning Board should consider the adoption of a Sub-Division Code and we expect to report further to the townspeople at the time of the March 1970 Town Meeting.
