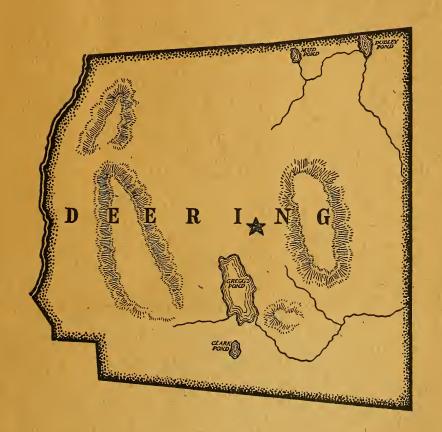

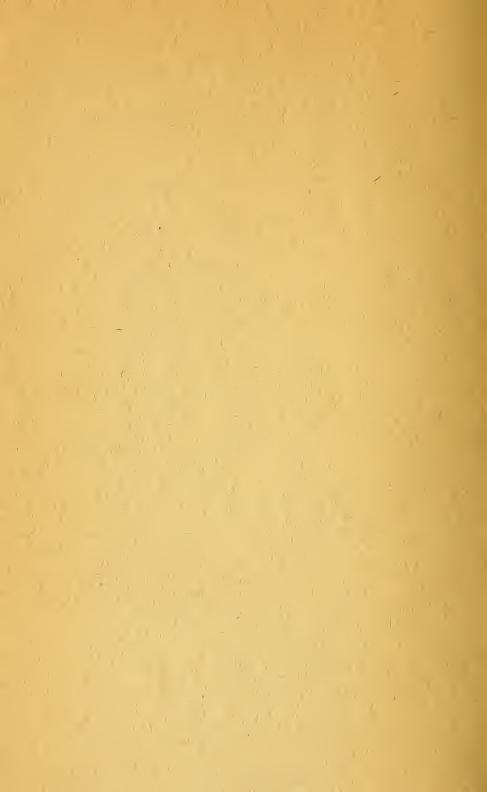

TOWN WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Deering, in the County of Hillsborough in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Deering on Tuesday, the thirteenth day of March, next at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

Article 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year. Submitted by Selectmen.

Article 2. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,000.00 for the Town Officers' salaries and expenses. Submitted by Selectmen.

Article 3. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 for the elections and registrations. Submitted by Selectmen.

Article 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 for the upkeep of the Town Hall and other buildings. Submitted by Selectmen.

Article 5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 for the Police and Fire Departments. Submitted by Selectmen.

Article 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$750.00 for insurance. Submitted by Selectmen.

Article 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,500.00 for winter and \$5,000.00 for summer roads. Submitted by Selectmen.

Article 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$851.10 to secure Town Road Aid. Submitted by Selectmen.

Article 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$310.00 for street lights. Submitted by Selectmen.

Article 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,750.00 for Old Age Assistance and Town Poor. Submitted by Selectmen.

Article 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 for interest. Submitted by Selectmen.

Article 12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$10.00 for flags for Soldiers' graves on Memorial Day. Submitted by Selectmen.

Article 13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4000.00 for completing the black-topping of that portion of the 2nd New Hampshire Turnpike, from near the old school house to junction of Bennington road, and that portion of road leading from 2nd New Hampshire turnpike, near River Bridge to Holton's Crossing, all in West Deering. This money is to be raised under Town Road Aid Plan, of which the State of New Hampshire will contribute approximately 85% and the Town approximately 15% plus interest, such sum to be raised through issuance of bonds or notes, under and in accordance with the provision of Statutes, and to authorize the Selectmen to issue and negotiate such bonds or notes, and to determine the time and place of payment thereof, under such terms and conditions as they may deem to the best interest of the Town. The said portions of roads are part of roads constructed under so called stage construction in 1954 and were not completed in 1955 as authorized in Article 16 of Town Warrant, March 1955. Said roads, if not completed will have to be rebuilt, if erosion and wear and tear set in, and the State will not contribute anything toward rebuilding. The work of black-topping said portions of roads shall be accomplished during the summer and early fall of 1956. Submitted by petition with the following signers:

Article 14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$70.00 (1/100th of 1% of the valuation of the

town) to the Monadnock Region Association of Southwestern New Hampshire for issuance and distribution of printed matter, newspaper and magazine advertising, and by other means calling attention to the resources and natural advantages of the town, in cooperation with the other thirty-seven towns of the Monadnock Region. Submitted by Selectmen.

Article 15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 for the purpose of finishing the dining room in the upstairs of the Town Hall. Submitted by Deering Fish and Game Club and Wolf Hill Grange.

Article 16. To see if the Town will vote to buy a sand-spreader or take any action thereto. Submitted by Howard E. Whitney.

Article 17. To see if the Town will vote to raise a sum not to exceed \$300.00 to pay for a spreader if Article 16 is passed. Submitted by Howard E. Whitney.

Article 18. To see if the Town will vote to change the salaries of Town Officials or take any action thereto. Submitted by Rosamond Herrick.

Article 19. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes. Submitted by Selectmen.

Article 20. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to auction property taken by Tax Collector's Deed. Submitted by Selectmen.

Article 21. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same. Submitted by Selectmen.

Article 22. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting. Submitted by Selectmen.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the School Board and Citizens of Hillsboro and Deering:

It is a pleasure to have the opportunity to present my second annual report.

Since my last report, the district has completed its first year as a cooperative school district. Many problems relative to the operation of a cooperative were resolved through changes made in the law by the 1955 legislature. Your schoolboard and superintendent were very active in helping to formulate these changes. One of the most helpful pieces of legislation during this last session was the allowance of 40% building aid to cooperative school districts as compared to 20% for regular districts.

As we look to the future for tax relief for the support of schools every indication is, that on the state level, the next legislature will probably increase the state aid to schools in such an amount that we shall be the recipient of some of that aid.

On the national level, the results of the White House Conference on Education give us considerable confidence that there will be made available federal money to aid school house construction. To those who may fear that with this aid there will be control it is interesting to note that the bill which is ready to be reported to Congress calls for the distribution of federal money to the states to be distributed on the same basis as any state building aid program now in effect.

To return to the local level I can only say that the school board and the superintendent are definitely aware of the cost of education to the communities. The increasing cost year after year has been and continues to be a discouraging element for school boards to contend with. It would be nice to be able to say that we have reached the peak but we may as well face it and admit that the summit is nowhere in sight.

The registration at the school has continued to grow as expected and, as you know, facilities are being provided this summer to provide for this growth.

As has been reported from time to time we are concentrating on the improvement of reading in our elementary grades. It is much too early yet to determine whether we are having much success. One adjustment which should be of help to us is the lengthening of the school day.

The changes made in the high school program of studies are working out exceptionally well as it is possible now to assign pupils to classes which are more in line with their ability and interest.

It is hoped, that early in the next school year, our housing problem will be behind us and that we may concentrate on the quality of education being provided for our youngsters. This year we are encouraged by the improvement of the attitude of the majority of our pupils toward school work. It is expected that the extended facilities will do much toward further improvement of this attitude.

I wish to express my appreciation to the School Board, Building Committee, faculty, pupils, and citizens of Hillsboro and Deering for their very close cooperation with me during the past year. It has been, indeed, a real pleasure working with them.

NURSE'S REPORT 1954-55

To the Board of Education:

I am submitting an account of the school nursing work for the year 1954-55.

The Pre-School Registration day in school for next September term was well attended. Forty-five new pupils were registered and nearly everyone had had their booster shot against whooping cough, diphtheria, and tetanus, given to them either by their own family physician or at our annual Pre-school Immunization clinic held in March, April, and May, also everyone is now vaccinated against small pox.

The Anti-Polio Salk Vaccine by Parker Davis was given to the pupils of grades 1 and 2, 58 were vaccinated from our own school, 4 from Washington, 3 from Stoddard, and 40 from Antrim making a total of 105. The clinic was held in our school having two physicians in attendance, 6 registered nurses besides the State Nurse and myself, also a fine group of volunteers, 9 of them, helped with the care of the children.

After their shot each one marched merrily to the Gym to receive a large hoodsie. The ice cream was donated by the following garages and stations: Spalding's, Demag's, Cochrane's, Vaillancourt's, Sterling's, and Richies's Service Stations, Page Auto Service, B. H. Smith Garage, Wyman's Chevrolet, Morton Ford Sales, and Bedell's Garage.

No ill effect resulted from the vaccination. The vaccine was made available to us through the National Foundation for Infantile Paralysis.

A large number of children had measles—176 cases in all, a few mumps, one chicken-pox, a few cases of skin diseases, such as impetigo and scabies, all of them cleaned up quickly with the cooperation of the parents.

The hearing test was given as usual in school to nearly everyone as 486 were tested, some twice, a few three times.

Twenty-eight pupils in Junior High and High School and seventy-six in Grammar school received first aid in one form or another, cut, bruises, some requiring daily care for a week or ten days.

A member of the Nursing Assn. Board of Directors gave me \$10.00 for milk for children who bring their cold dry lunch. This

was done as directed. Three school children were taken to an Ophthalmologist for eye refraction, through the kindness of the Lion's Club. Two of them needed eye glasses, the third one required eye treatment only, all were paid by them.

Two children were taken several times to the N. H. Mental Hygiene Clinic for proper evaluation. I have reported to school daily.
