# REPORT Of The SELECTMEN

#### TO: The Inhabitants and Voters of Jaffrey.

The year 1969 was a busy one for the Board of Selectmen, several meetings each week were held besides the regularly scheduled Tuesday evening meetings due to problems arising that necessitated immediate attention.

The last part of checking the tax map was completed with the exception of a few parcels remaining to be checked.

Two new lateral sewers were installed, one on Turnpike Road and one in Jaffrey Center, both of which have helped to alleviate the sewerage problems existing.

Negotiations were completed with the State and Federal Governments for pre-financing for the new addition to our present major sewerage system, construction of which we hope will commence before too many months. The new communications system for the Town has been completed, so that the Highway, Police and Water Works Departments are now in communication, with a base station set up in the Town Office Building.

The Board was pleased to have two new major industries developed in town by private enterprise. Some smaller places vacated were taken over by smaller industries. This reflects on the Town, showing it is progressing and growing.

A summer recreation program, under the supervision of Richard Roy and Janet Duval proved to be most successful, the program consisting of morning activities at Humiston Field and afternoon programs at Lake Contoocook.

Again the Board of Selectmen wishes to express its sincere appreciation to all who have helped us in any way in carrying out our obligations.

# TOWN MEETING WARRANT

TO: The Inhabitants of the Town of Jaffrey, County of Cheshire, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Ernest J. Pratt Auditorium, formerly Conant High School Auditorium, located on Stratton Road, in Jaffrey Village, in said Town of Jaffrey, on Tuesday, the 10th day of March next, at nine o'clock in the forenoon (polls to remain open until six o'clock in the afternoon), to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose one Selectman for three years, Highway Agent, Chief Engineer-Fire Department, Overseer of Public Welfare for one year, and one Water Commissioner and one Commissioner for Humiston Park for three years, and all other necessary Town Officers.

2. To hear all reports except that of the Budget Committee.

3. To hear the report of the Budget Committee and to raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be required for the support of the Poor, Building and Repairing of Highways and Bridges, Fire and Police Departments, Memorial Day, Street and Building Lighting and all other Town Charges.

4. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen and Town Treasurer to borrow money upon the credit of the Town in anticipation of Taxes.

5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money not to exceed \$2,000.00 for final compilation of the Town of Jaffrey History, Volume III.

6. To see if the Town will authorize the Jaffrey History Committee to act as agents to contract for the publication of, and provide for, the sale of advance subscriptions for the Town of Jaffrey History, Volume III, now near completion, said Volume III to be sold at a price of \$25.00 per volume, and to authorize the said committee to apply said subscriptions towards the total cost of publication, or act in any way relating thereto.

7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money not to exceed \$23,000.00 for publication of the Town of Jaffrey History, Volume III, or act in any way relating thereto.

8. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Jaffrey History Committee to act as agents for the sale of published copies of the Town of Jaffrey History, Volume III, and that said agents shall render annually a financial report to the Town Meeting on the sale of said histories, or act in any way relating thereto.

9. To see if the Town will vote to amend the action taken under Article 12, of the March 8, 1938 Annual Town Meeting as reads: "That the price of the new volumes shall be \$15.00" to read: "That the price of the new volumes shall be \$20.00." (This refers to the Town of Jaffrey History Volumes I & II remaining in stock).

10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropirate the sum of \$20,000.00 providing the State will appropriate an equal amount of matching funds to rebuild the present bridge and approach on Prescott Road at the Annett Manufacturing Co.

11. To see if the Town will vote to establish and create an Historic District to be known as Jaffrey Center Historic District, in accordance with Chapter 31, Sections 89A through 89I of New Hampshire Revised Statutes Annotated, the boundaries of the same being as established and defined in the plan and report of the Historic District Commission filed with the Town Clerk and printed in the Annual Town Report -1969; and to direct the Town Clerk to file with the Register of Deeds for Cheshire County a copy of said plan and report, together with this article and a certification of the vote thereon. (By Ballot).

12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money not to exceed \$1,400.00 to replace the present police cruiser.

13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money not to exceed \$4,100.00 for the purpose of purchasing a new four-wheel drive pickup truck for use of the Town of Jaffrey Highway Department, and to authorize the Selectmen to make such purchase as they deem to be in the best interest of the Town.

14. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen and Town Treasurer to borrow \$50,000.00 in anticipation of sewer rental fees, for the construction of lateral sewers to connect with the main trunk system.

15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money not to exceed \$552.00 in support of the operating cost of the Elliot Community Hospital for the year 1970; and to instruct the Budget Committee to consider similar annual Budget requests thereafter.

16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$950.00 to support the services of the Community Health Clinic of the Monadnock Family and Mental Health Services; said services operating under the provisions of the Community Health Mental Health Services Act of New Hampshire with State Grant-in Aid.

17. To see if the Town will vote to authorize and direct the Moderator with the consent and approval of the Selectmen, within three months, to appoint a Bicentennial Celebration Committee to draft plans and proposals for a 1973 Bicentennial Celebration and report the same to the 1971 Town Meeting, the size of the same to be at the discretion of the Moderator in consultation with the Selectmen.

18. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000.00 to create a Bicentennial Celebration Capital Reserve Fund, and to instruct the Budget Committee to consider this as an annual budget request thereafter for the next three years.

19. To take up any other business that may be properly brought before the meeting.

In working toward the goal of establishing subdivision regulations, The Planning Board of the Town of Jaffrey has been conducting a study of Jaffrey's resources and capabilities. This report is on file at the Town Office and is available for use. It is anticipated that 1970 will see the completion of the subdivision regulations.

# ABSTRACTS OF TOWN MEETINGS

The annual Town Meeting of the Town of Jaffrey was held on Tuesday, March 11, 1969 at nine o'clock in the forenoon at Conant High School Auditorium, David R. Sawyer, Assistant Moderator conducted the meeting.

RESOLUTION: "Resolved: March 11, 1969. That we dedicate this day to be Ralph E. Boynton Town Meeting Day, a Selectman of Jaffrey for 27 years; a Trustee of Jaffrey Clay Library for 35 years; a total of 62 years of Public Service – and always in the best interest for the Town of Jaffrey."

The above resolution was unanimously adopted.

Art. 1. ELECTION OF OFFICERS. This article was voted on by ballot with the results as indicated at the end of this abstract.

AUDITORS: Moved: "That the Town Clerk be instructed to cast one ballot for Roger A. Smith and Theodore R.A. Lambert as Auditors for the ensuing year."

Motion CARRIED.

TRUSTEES OF TRUST FUNDS. Moved seconded. "That the Town Clerk be instructed to cast one ballot for Warren

C. Ruffle as Trustee of Trust Funds for the ensuing three years."

# Motion CARRIED.

Art. 2. REPORTS. Moved: "That all reports except that of the Budget Committee be accepted as printed and placed on file."

#### Motion CARRIED.

Art. 3. REPORT OF THE BUDGET COMMITTEE. Moved: and amended. "That the Town raise the amount of \$293,605.75, but appropriate the amount of \$336,255.75, as approved by the Budget Committee for the Town of Jaffrey for current expenditures for the year 1969."

Motion CARRIED as amended.

Art. 4. TEMPORARY LOANS IN ANTICIPATION OF TAXES. Moved: seconded and carried: "That the Town vote to authorize the Selectmen and Town Treasurer to borrow money upon the credit of the Town in anticipation of taxes."

Motion CARRIED.

Art. 5. PERMISSION TO EXPEND FROM THE HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT CAPITAL RESERVE FUND. Moved: "That the Town vote to authorize the Selectmen to expend from the Highway Department Capital Reserve Fund, a sum of money not to exceed \$11,990.00 for the purpose of trading the present two trucks now owned by the Town for two 1969 trucks; said purchase to be made as the Selectmen deem to be in the best interest of the Town."

### Motion CARRIED.

Art. 6. PERMISSION TO EXPEND FROM POLICE DEPARTMENT CAPITAL RESERVE FUND. Moved: "That the Town vote to authorize the Selectmen of Jaffrey to expend from the Police Department Capital Reserve Fund, a sum not to exceed \$1400.00 for the purpose of trading the present police Cruiser for a new Cruiser, and said purchase to be made as the Selectmen deem to be in the best interest of the Town."

### Motion CARRIED.

Art. 7. SUPPORT FOR THE SERVICES OF THE COMMUNITY MENTAL HEALTH SERVICE OPERATING UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF THE COMMUNITY HEALTH SERVICES ACT OF NEW HAMPSHIRE WITH STATE GRANT-IN AID. Moved: "That the Town vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$950.00 to support the services of the Community Mental Health Clinic of the Monadnock Family and Mental Health Service, said service operating under the provisions of the Community Mental Health Services Act of New Hampshire with State Grant-in Aid."

### Motion CARRIED.

Art. 8. COMMUNICATIONS CENTER FOR TOWN DEPARTMENTS. Moved: "That the Town vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money not to exceed \$4000.00 for the purpose of setting up a Communications Department between the Town Office, Police, Highway and and Water Works Departments."

#### Motion CARRIED.

Art. 9. APPROPRIATION TO THE HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT EQUIPMENT CAPITAL RESERVE FUND. Moved: "That the Town vote to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed \$6,500.00; of which \$6000.00 will represent the 1970 Budget appropriation to the Highway Department Equipment Capital Reserve Fund, and \$500.00 for purchase of equipment for the Highway Department."

#### Motion CARRIED.

Art. 10. PURCHASE OF A LOADER FROM THE HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT CAPITAL RESERVE FUND. It was Moved: "That the Town vote to authorize the Selectmen to expend from the Highway Department Equipment Capital Reserve Fund, a sum of money not to exceed \$15,973.00 for the purpose of purchasing a loader for the Town Highway Department."

### Motion CARRIED.

Art. 11. QUITCLAIM DEED TO ALBERT & DIANA LEIBEMAN. Moved: "That the Town vote to authorize the Sclectmen of Jaffrey to grant to Albert & DianaLeibeman, a quitclaim deed to a section of Mills Road (Bryant Road) now abandoned in favor of the relocated section on land of said Leibeman which they deeded to the Town; said abandoned section marked by stone walls bordered on both sides by other land of saidLeibemans; with a length of about 600 feet extending westerly from a point about 1250 westerly of Lincoln's Corner Road (Bonds Corner Road)."

# Motion CARRIED.

Art. 12. GIFT OF LAND AT CHARITY SQUARE TO THE TOWN OF JAFFREY. Moved: "That the Town vote to accept the gift of the United Church of Jaffrey a certain tract of land situated in Jaffrey and bounded and described as follows: 'Beginning at a point on the northerly side of Ellison Street, at land of the Parlmont Realty Trust; thence easterly by Ellison Street to the juncture of East Main Street or Turnpike Road, so-called; thence westerly by the southerly side of East Main Street to the land of the Parlmont Realty; thence southerly by said land of the Parlmont Realty Trust to the point of beginning and to authorize the United Church of Jaffrey to place on the common with suitable plantings, the cornerstone of the Old Parish House in some appropriate manner to commemorate the Baptist Church; the same to be maintained by the Town of Jaffrey."

### Motion CARRIED.

Art. 13. \$4500.00 FOR JAFFREY TOWN HISTORY SUPPLEMENT. Moved: "That the Town vote to raise the sum of \$4500.00 for the purpose of continuing the Town of Jaffrey History supplement now in process of compilation by the Jaffrey History Committee under the supervision of Alice E.E. Lehtinen, Chairman."

#### Motion CARRIED.

Art. 14. ESTABLISHMENT OF AN HISTORIC DISTRICT IN THE TOWN OF JAFFREY. Moved: "That the Town vote to establish and/or create an Historic District Commission in accordance with Chapter 31, Sections 89C and 89D of the Revised Statutes Annotated of the State of New Hampshire; said commission to consist of five (5) members; said members to be appointed in the first instance by the Moderator with the approval and consent of the Selectmen, in accordance with Section 89D of said Statute, succeeding appointments shall be made by the Moderator with the approval and consent of the Selectmen; and said commission shall present such a plan to the Town in accordance with Chapter 31, Section 31A, Revised Statutes Annotated of the State of New Hampshire."

#### Motion CARRIED.

Art. 15. AUTHORIZATION TO ENTER INTO CONTRACTS, ACCEPT AID, FEDERAL AND STATE FOR SEWERAGE CONSTRUCTION. Moved: "That the Town vote to authorize the Selectmen to apply for enter into contracts for, accept and do all things necessary to obtain Federal, State or such other aid as may be available for the construction of a sewage treatment and disposal system, including the construction of a sewage stabilization pond with chlorination facilities, intercepting sewers, lateral sewers, in addition to the existing pumping station, related facilities and acquisition of land therefore."

### Motion was CARRIED.

Art. 16. AUTHORIZATION TO BORROW \$500,000.00 FOR SEWERAGE CONSTRUCTION. Moved: "That the Town vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500,000.00, which includes the amount of \$280,000.00 raised at the Annual Town Meeting of March 14, 1967, for constructing a sewage stabilization pond including chlorination facilities, intercepting sewers, lateral sewers, and addition to the existing intercepting sewers, lateral sewers, in addition to the present pumping station, other related facilities and the acquisition of such land and assessments as may be necessary to carry out the project; that to raise this appropriation, the Treasurer with the approval of the Selectmen is authorized to borrow \$500,000.00 under the Municipal Finance Act as amended; provided that any Federal, State or other aid received by the Town for the construction costs of this project shall be used to reduce the amount of borrowing under this vote."

This being a bond issue and a two-thirds vote being necessary, a standing vote was called for, and the vote being unanimous the motion CARRIED.

Art. 17. \$950.00 FOR STREET LIGHT CHANGEOVER. Moved: "That the Town vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$950.00 for the purpose of changeover in lighting on various streets in said Town of Jaffrey; said lighting changeover to be in accordance with plan approved by the Board of Selectmen as submitted by the Planning Board of said Town of Jaffrey."

#### Motion CARRIED.

Art. 18. \$5,000.00 FOR STORM DRAIN CONSTRUCTION. Moved: "That the Town vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money not to exceed \$5,000.00 for the purpose of installing storm drains in certain locations of this Town where needed."

### Motion CARRIED.

Art. 19. DUMP STUDY COMMITTEE. Moved: "That the Town vote to authorize the appointment of a committee consisting of four (4) members by the Moderator subject to the approval of the Selectmen, to work with the Selectmen on a study of a Rubbish Disposal Area for the Town of Jaffrey, and said committee and the Selectmen be directed to report the results of such at the next annual town meeting."

### Motion CARRIED.

The following were appointed by the Moderator and approved by the Selectmen to be the four members of said Dump Study Committee:

### Art. 20. OTHER BUSINESS. None.

# REPORT OF HISTORIC DISTRICT COMMISSION

January 27, 1970

To the Board of Selectmen:

As authorized by vote of the Town Meeting of 11 March 1969, an Historic District Commission was created. Appointed to the Commission by the Moderator were: B. Leonard Krause, Homer J. Belletete, Paul J. Kidder, Peter B. Davis, William W. Torrey and Frederick S. Richardson. At the organizational meeting the following offices were filled: Chairman. B. Leonard Krause; Vice-Chairman. Homer J. Belletete; Secretary, Frederick S. Richardson.

Two public hearings have been held to acquaint the town with the proposed bounds of the Historic District in Jaffrey Center, as well as to hear comments and suggestions regarding the regulations of the District. These hearings were on Thursday, 18 September 1969 and Monday, 19 January 1970. Attached you will find a copy of the proposed regulations including a sketch map showing the bounds of the proposed Historic District.

It is the hope of the members of the Commission that the town will vote, at the 1970 Town Meeting, in favour of the establishment of an Historic District in Jaffrey Center and of the proposed regulations.

# THE TOWN OF JAFFREY, NEW HAMPSHIRE

# HISTORIC DISTRICT REGULATIONS

**Purposes.** The preservation of structures and places of historic and architectural value is hereby declared to be a public purpose. The heritage of Jaffrey Center will be safeguarded by (a) preserving a district which reflects elements of its cultural, social, economic, political and architectural history; (b) conserving property values in such district; (c) fostering civic beauty; promoting the use of an historic district for the education, pleasure and welfare of the citizens.

Authority Granted. For the purposes of this subdivision the Town Meeting of March 11, 1969 voted the authority to establish, change, layout and define the Historic District of Jaffrey Center. Within said district, the construction, alteration, painting, moving, demolition or use of structures and places shall be regulated by the Historic District Commission.

Historic District Commission. The Moderator shall appoint the Historic District Commission members.

Membership; Qualifications; Terms; Vacancies. The membership of such commission shall consist of not less than five nor more than seven members. All members shall be residents of Jaffrey and one shall be a member of the board of selectmen, thereof and one shall be a member of the planning board. In determining the qualification of a member of said commission, the moderator shall take into consideration his demonstrated interest and ability to understand, appreciate and promote the purpose of this subdivision. The members of said commission shall be appointed for three-year terms except the initial appointments shall be staggered so that subsequent appointments shall not recur at the same time. Members of said commission shall serve without compensation and shall serve no more than two successive terms. In the event of a vacancy on the commission, interim appointments may be made by the appointing authority to complete the unexpired term of such position.

Organization; Meetings; and Rules. The commission shall elect a chairman, vicechairman and a secretary from the appointed members and create and fill such offices as it may deem necessary for its work. The term of all officers shall be one year but any officer may succeed himself. The commission shall meet at the call of the chairman and at such other times as the commission may determine, and shall adopt rules in accordance with the provisions of the implementing ordinances of the municipality. All meetings and records of the commission shall be open to the public.

**Powers and Duties.** It shall be the duty of the commission to develop a policy for the accomplishment of the purposes of this subdivision within said historical district and within the provisions of the ordinances and to relate said policy to the comprehensive plan of Jaffrey. The commission shall have the power to accept, review and act upon all applications for building permits in reference to properties situated with the boundaries of any historic district established hereunder. Such power of review and approval or disapproval shall be limited to those considerations which affect the relationship of the applicant's proposal to its surroundings, to the location and arrangement of structures, to the architectural treatment of the exterior features and finish of structures, and to the compatibility of land uses within the district as they may be deemed to affect the character and integrity of said district to achieve the purposes of this subdivision. It shall be the duty of the commission to request reports and recommendations regarding the feasibility of the applicant's proposal from the planning board, fire chief, health officer and such other administrative officials who may possess information pertinent to the application. It shall be the duty of the commission to seek advice from such professional, educational, cultural or other groups or persons as may be deemed necessary for the determination of a reasonable decision. The commission shall have the power to engage such technical assistance and consultants as may be deemed necessary to carry out the purposes of this subdivision. The commission shall have the power to accept and use gifts, grants, or contributions for the exercise of its functions. It shall be the duty of the commission to file with the Selectmen either a certificate of approval or a notice of disapproval following the review and determination of the application. Said certificate shall be filed with the Town Clerk within forty-five days after the filing of the application for said certificate, unless the applicant shall agree to a longer period of time. No building permit shall be issued until a certificate of approval has been filed, but in the case of disapproval, such notice shall be binding upon the Town Clerk and no permit shall be issued. Failure to file said certificate within the specified period of time shall be deemed to constitute approval by said commission.

Changes in Existing Buildings, Land and Uses. When an exterior change, including color of paint, or change in use of building on land is contemplated, details shall be submitted to the commission. The commission shall have the power to accept, review and act upon the proposed changes situated within the boundaries of the historic district.

**Historic District Boundaries.** The bounds of the District shall start on the west wall of the Cutter Cemetery at land n or f of Wetherell at a point 200 ft N of the north side of Harkness (Henchman) Road, proceeding thence southerly along wall and beyond in the same line to and across Harkness Road, and across land n or f of Wetherell, and across Main St, and across land n or f of Hearsey to a point 200 ft S of the south line

of Main St. said point being approx 660 ft. from the point of beginning, thence turning and proceeding westerly on lands n or f of Hearsey, Hanson, Proctor, Calkins, Coleman, Mills, Dunham, deWolf, Sullivan, Wild, and the Frederick W. Greene Estate Inc. to a point on the E side of South Hill (Gilmore Pond) road distance 200 feet southerly along said E side of the Road at land of said Greene Est. this bound being roughly parallel to Main St. and with a length of approx. 2015 ft. thence turning and proceeding westerly across South Hill Road to a corner of walls at land of said Greene Estste and Morgan being the SW corner of the original town common approx. 700 ft. thence turning and proceeding northerly across lands of Morgan, Burgoyne, Main St. and Richardson to a corner of walls at the Old Burying Ground, at lands now or formerly of Richardson and Leach a prox. 685 ft. thence turning and proceeding easterly along the N wall of the Old Burying Ground and continuing in the same line easterly along land n or f of Toppan and across lands n or f of Toppan, Marean, and Greene to a point on the east bound of land of J.C.V.I.S. known as Melville Academy approx. 760 ft. Thence turning and running northerly on land of Greene and the JCVIS approx. 115 ft. thence turning and running easterly on land of Toppan and the JCVIS a prox. 45 ft. thence turning and running northerly on land of Toppan and the JCVIS approx. 60 ft. thence turning and running easterly on land of Newbegin and the JCVIS approx. 55 ft. to the west side of Thorndike Pond (Academy St.) Road and continuing in the same line across Thorndike Pond Road and on land of Trimble and Quinlan to a point 200 ft. east of the east side of said Road approx 315 ft. Thence turning and running southerly on lands of Quinlan, Hazel, and the JCVIS to a point on the boundary between the JCVIS Blacksmith Shop lot and the JCVIS Mills Swamp so-called said point being 200 ft. east of the east side of the Thorndike pond Road and approx. 185 ft. N of the N side of Main St. with a total length on this bound of approx 805 ft. Thence turning and running easterly on lands of [CVIS, Bernbaum, and Wetherell also crossing Byrant (Mills) Road approx. 1375 ft. to the point of beginning.


Interpretation. Nothing in this subdivision shall be construed, to prevent ordinary maintenance or repair of any structure or place within any historic district, nor to prevent the construction, alteration, repair, moving or demolition of any structure under a permit issued by the Town Clerk prior to the establishment of any such district.

Appeal. Any person or persons jointly or severally aggrieved by a decision of the commission shall have the right to appeal concerning such decision to the board of adjustment.

Separability. In case any sub-section, paragraph or part of this subdivision be for any reason declared invalid or held unconstitutional by any court of last resort, every other sub-section, paragraph or part shall continue in full force and effect.

Remedies for Violations. In case any building or structure is erected, constructed, reconstructed, altered, repaired, converted, or maintained, or any building, structure, or land is used in violation hereof or of any ordinance or other regulation made under authority conferred hereby, the Selectmen may institute any appropriate action or proceedings to prevent such unlawful action to restrain, correct, or abate such violation, to prevent the occupancy of the building, structure or land, or any illegal act or use in or about such premises.

Effective Date. This ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its passage



# REPORT ON REFUSE DISPOSAL

The selection of the type of refuse disposal for the Town of Jaffrey whether it be sanitary land fill, incineration, pit burning, hauling away, composting, or any other method that may be used, means that eventually this refuse will have to be buried.

Each community has a problem of its own for the disposal of its waste, and needs individual study as to the proper disposal method. The small community such as Jaffrey will not have as much trouble to solve this problem as a larger community such as Keene.

First of all the community must have a disposal area. Jaffrey does have one, and owns it as shown on page. The present area is estimated to be good for about thirty years at the present population, and rate of disposal. This shown on the map. Each square represents about one year of refuse disposal. This is not compacted material, just loose waste.

Jaffrey has a problem, the same as all New Hampshire towns, and that is it is growing. This population growth is delineated on page  $\cdot$ . The two curves show the population trend – one for the state of New Hampshire, and the other for the Town of Jaffrey – estimated or projected to the year 1990. Twenty years from now we can expect a population of around 7000. At present, 1969, our population is around 4,000, more or less, according to the influx of summer residents, or transients.

Whether Jaffrey acquires more land at the present disposal site for future generations is a matter for the residents to decide. The present site is desirable, and is set up for the disposal of refuse. Acquiring additional land at this site seems the logical procedure to follow either now or in the future as the population increased.

To comply with the law we will have to stop the burning of combustible material at the disposal area by 1972. This gives us a choice of sanitary land fill, incineration, pit burning, hauling away, composting, and a variety of other mediums too complicated, or expensive, for the town of Jaffrey.

Incineration and pit burning still requires the combustion of the refuse, and propaganda stating that these units are smokeless is misleading as gasses and fly ash issue from the apparatus, and if not properly regulated there is a plume of smoke seen from the stack. Both the incinerator and the pit burning apparatus require a place to deposit the residue after the refuse has been burned. This is composed of melted glass, metal, and non-combustible material. The refuse fed to the apparatus is reduced to about one tenth the volume by the combustion of the refuse. This residue does not have to be buried as it is sterilized during the process of combustion. An incinerator is an expensive proposition, and requires a constant feed of refuse. The volume required is far in excess of the amount that Jaffrey can produce. On the other hand the pit burning apparatus, somewhat of a recent innovation, around two hundred in existence so far, does not require a constant feed of refuse, and may be worked two or three days a week. This would be a better proposition than an incinerator, and less costly for Jaffrey. The University of New Hampshire Experimental Station at Durham is presently working out the details, and in a short while an experimental unit will be in operation.

The hauling away of refuse by a trucking concern requires one or two depots in the town for depositing refuse. The trucks remove the refuse from the depots, and truck it to a land fill, or incinerator. If by any chance the trucking concern goes out of business, other means of disposal will have to be worked out.

Composting of refuse requires apparatus, buildings, a quantity of sewage near at hand to mix with refuse, and a sales force to sell the bagged peat fertilizer as it is called. This means that the town goes into the manufacturing business.

Sanitary land fill is not new to anyone of us. It is just the complete burial of refuse from the town each day. The burning of combustible refuse is not allowed. The residents of Jaffrey, and the collectors, will go to the disposal area in the same manner as they have in the past with one exception. The waste will have to be placed in a trench for that purpose each day. At the end of the day the caretaker will compact and cover the refuse with sand, gravel, or earth from the new trench dug for the next day. The trench may be dug for a week's supply, but the refuse must be buried each day.

The present disposal area of Jaffrey is an open faced dump. The face of it is forty feet high, more or less, with a disposal area at the top periodically covered with earth so that cars and trucks will be able to get close to the edge to deposit refuse over the side. Caretakers supervise the refuse deposits, and enforce the regulations. The area is partly fenced in to keep papers from flying around. Sanitary facilities are regulated by the health officer of the town, and fire protection is available from the Jaffrey Fire Department. A limited amount of sand and gravel is available at the site for covering the refuse. Some has to be trucked into the area. Suitable machinery to work the area has to be borrowed from other departments of the town, or rented from private contractors. Twenty four waste disposal areas in the Monadnock Region have been visited, and only two surpass the Jaffrey Disposal Area for cleanliness and upkeep.

It may be of interest to the statistically minded person to briefly state a few figures concerning the quantities that go into the disposal system. Figures are all estimates from the government, or sanitary engineers as no method has been used to measure or weigh the refuse thrown away. The population of Jaffrey (1968) is 3450 persons, and it costs the town \$7323 to maintain the disposal system for 1968, or a cost of \$2.13 per person per year, or a daily cost of \$.0058 per person. The estimated cubic yards thrown away per person yearly is 4, and each person throws away approximately 1460 lbs. of refuse a year, or about 4 to 5 lbs. of refuse each day. About 2500 tons of refuse were disposed of in 1968 in Jaffrey, or 14,300 cubic yards of an average density of about 350 lbs. per cubic yard.

To maintain any type of refuse disposal system economically requires the use of proper machinery either borrowed from the town, rented from contractors, or bought for the exclusive use of the refuse disposal area. For the Town of Jaffrey it seems the logical thing to do is to continue the land fill operation, but go one step further and make a SANITARY land fill disposal area. Buy a steel treaded front end loader exclusively for the disposal area. The reason for a steel treaded apparatus is to compact the refuse. A rubber tired machine would have its tires punctured in no time from the sharp metal, broken glass, and cans. Trucks may be borrowed from the town as are necessary, or may be rented from contractors. The front end of the loader scoop, or bucket, is used for distributing the earth to cover over the refuse. Trucks would be used just for hauling earth cover.


If at any future date the pit burner is approved, and shown to be successful, Jaffrey has the site already established to install the unit, and a disposal area to deposit the residue, the machine to compact, dispose and bury the residue. In the meantime Jaffrey will have complied with the law, and stopped burning refuse at the disposal area.

Page 62 - 1968 Capacity of Solid Refuse Disposal Area Page 63 - Projected Population Growth of Jaffrey and



Ralph E. Boynton, who had a total record of service to his town and his county that neared a century, died February 6, 1969, at the age of 80 years.

He had served Jaffrey as a selectman through nine terms, from 1933 until 1960. He had been a Cheshire County commissioner for a dozen years. He had served Jaffrey as a library trustee for 27 years and as a water commissioner for a quarter of a century.

Born a few miles over the line in Sharon in 1888, he had lived in Jaffrey all but a few weeks of his life.

"I can't claim to be a native," he said with a wry smile on one ceremonial occasion. "But I can come close to it."

## SCHOOL PROGRAM

## **B. JAFFREY GRADE SCHOOL**

As mentioned in previous reports curriculum evaluation is a never ending process. After more than a year and a half of study, the math study committee of Union No. 47 recommended the basic text published by Holt, Rinehart and Winston for the schools of the Union. In September 1969 the math consultant for the company met with the teachers to help them prepare for the introduction of this text and the series was introduced at all grade levels in the Grade School.

During the past year the music program at the school was expanded to include a fifth and sixth grade chorus and an elementary band composed of members from the Grade School and St. Patrick's School. The two groups combined to present a concert in the spring of 1969. It is interesting that, because of the sustained interest of the children, much of the rehearsing for this event could be done in the mornings before school.

In the spring the Gesell Developmental Tests were administered to all children who would be old enough to enter the first grade on September 1, 1969. These tests measure the maturity of the child and not his intelligence. Studies have shown that maturity is a big factor in a child's success in his school progress. As a result of these tests no child was refused entrance to the first grade, but it was suggested that some children should be better able to cope with the present first grade program if their entrance were delayed for another year.

A committee of teachers from Union No. 47 under the direction of Norman LaPalme, principal of the Peterborough Elementary School, held regular meetings throughout the school year to develop a new card for reporting to parents. Mildred Cutter was the representative from this school. This card was issued at the end of the first marking period in November. After the second reporting period in January, parents were given an opportunity to comment on their reactions to the card.

The intent of the new progress report is to evaluate each child's achievement in relation to his own ability, rather than in relation to his classmate's achievement or an arbitrary standard.

#### C. CONANT HIGH SCHOOL

The continued success and progress of Conant High School is foremost in the minds of the faculty at Conant.

We are proud of the comprehensive status Conant has held over the past ten years as a member in good-standing of the New England Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools. Another ten year period begins as Conant prepares for a re-evaluation this year. This process consumes much time and effort on the part of the faculty. Over the past year we have been going through the phase of self-evaluation which, although strenuous, is also found to be an enriching experience. This procedure lays the groundwork for the actual evaluation by an outside team of educators which will take place during a three day period in early April.



Changes within our society over the past decade have been significant in promoting changes within our school systems. The past few years have evidenced changes in the approach to learning in forty one per cent of our nation's secondary schools.

Educational philosophy and objectives are used as the criteria to determine the plan or program of any educational institution. The success of this program is dependent upon whether the institution practices what it proposes in its philosophy and objectives.

This year the science curriculum was expanded to include the elective subjects of earth science and a laboratory course in physical science in order to provide appropriate course selections for all students. Added to the English curriculum were semester courses in creative writing and public speaking.

With the dwindling numbers in Latin and the trend of schools to delete this subject, it was decided to phase out Latin and offer Spanish as our second foreign language (along with French).

The initiation of a work-study program to lessen the number of drop-outs has been successful to date with ten students enrolled. These students must take four subjects during the morning session and then are allowed to leave school to work in local firms during the afternoon. We appreciate the fine cooperation received in this program by our local businessmen.

These additions have added strength to some of the weaker areas of our curriculum. The efforts put into curriculum revision over the past few years have resulted in a balanced core curriculum for a small high school.

The music department continues to show gains with more students taking instrumental lessons. We take pride in the performance of the various musical groups that have entertained ihe people of our community and others throughout the state. The high school band was again invited to play at one of the football games at the University of New Hampshire.

The school library continues to grow. This year we added five hundred new books to bring the total books in the library up to five thousand volumes. New card catalog files have improved the record keeping facilities.

In the area of maintenance all of the floors in the old building were sanded during the summer which greatly enhanced their appearance. We were fortunate in having the services of our boys through the Office of Economic Opportunity, a federally-funded program, to assist in sanding desks, painting, and general cleaning.

This year marks the end to a long, successful history of

the Jaffrey School District with school boards that have continually shown noteworthy concern for the education of the young people of Jaffrey. Already the School Board of the newly formed Jaffrey-Rindge School District has been working diligently to improve the educational status from kindergarten through grade twelve which are encompassed within the two towns.

On behalf of the student body it is our desire that Jaffrey continue its fine support of schools, and pursue the prospects of even more effective education for its young people.

## JAFFREY SCHOOL HEALTH WORK

#### 1969-1970

Colds, sore throats, digestive upsets were the most frequent problems in all three Jaffrey Schools. Chicken pox, measles, mumps, and whooping cough are almost unheard of, now that vaccines are available for these communicable diseases.

There were many cases of strep throat, but with timely exclusions and early treatment by family physicians, students were quickly returned to classes.

Dr. Franklin Sterling, school physician, examined all odd numbered grades and all sport participants. He also sees pupils as the need arises and makes many visits to the schools to check on health needs. He does not treat or prescribe. If any condition is found, the parents are notified, through the mail, by the school nurse and advised to take their child to their own physician for treatment.

In September the new first graders were welcomed, all vaccinations checked by the school nurse and entered on health records.

During the year the annual vision and hearing tests were performed on all students in all twelve grades. Height and weight gains recorded on their health history. The follow through on remedial defects show a higher percentage of corrections each year. Parents are very cooperative.

The Matching Fund Dental Clinic sponsored by the Jaffrey Women's Club was completed from September through December. There were sixteen clinics with ninety appointments and twenty-six pupils treated. Dr. Harold Goodman did the work in his office. In March the Heaf Stem-needle Tuberculin test was administered by the school nurse to all first graders and seniors. Teachers and personnel who desired it, also received it. Results were sent to the New Hampshire Tuberculosis Association.

The Jaffrey Community League again provided funds for the eye exams and eye glasses for pupils whose parents found it difficult to provide.

In January the Lions Club members were introduced to Amblyopia by Mrs. McDonald, R.N., Field Nurse, Pre-School Vision Screening Program, through the school nurse who approached them regarding a screening program. This was held at the grade school May 3rd. Sixty-three children were screened. We hope it will be an annual service.

Approved professional meetings were attended by the school nurse throughout the year, these with area nurses and Division of Public Health in Keene.

In June, pre-school registration and examinations were held. At this time, sixty-three pupils were registered for entrance in September at St. Patrick and Grade School. Data about regulations, facilities, school calendar and administrative personnel was sent out. On that day the children are checked by the nurse, the speech therapist, and the dental hygienist. The parents are then advised about the necessary follow-up and needed summer corrections.

To end the year all Health Records were completed and filed.

It was a good year health-wise in all three Jaffrey's Schools with no major illnesses or accidents.
