

### STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the Town of Littleton, in said State, qualified to vote in Town and State affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall and Police Court Room in the Town Building on the 8th day of March, next, being the second Tuesday of March, at eight o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following:

ARTICLE 1. To choose a Town Clerk, one Selectman for the term of three years, one Park Commissioner for three years, a Town Treasurer, three members of the Board of Trustees of the Public Library, and one Trustee of Trust Funds.

ARTICLE 2. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the provisions of Chapter 287 of the Revised Statutes Annotated, 1955, relative to playing Beano in the Town of Littleton, and that the following question be placed upon the ballot to be used at said meeting—"Shall the provisions of Chapter 287 of the Revised Statutes Annotated, 1955, relative to playing the games of Beano be adopted in this Town?"

ARTICLE 3. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for Town Officers' Salaries, General Expenses, Elections, Municipal Court, Town Building, Police Department, Forest Fires, Sewers, Streets and Highways, Street Lights, Vital Statistics, Sidewalks, Town Garage, Superintendent of Public Works, Health Officer, Hospital, District Nurse, Public Dump, Welfare, Old Age Assistance, Parks and Playgrounds, Community Center, Social Security, Blister Rust, Fire Department, Damage by Dogs, Garbage Disposal, Special Highway Account, County Tax, Public Library, Cemeteries, National Holidays, Advertising, Region Association, Planning Board, Recreation, Debt Retirement, Interest on Indebtedness and other necessary expenses.

ARTICLE 4. To see if the Town will authorize the Board of Selectmen to borrow monies, from time to time, for current indebtedness of the Town for the ensuing year, in anticipation of taxes to be collected for the year 1960 and to be paid therefrom. ARTICLE 5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed Twenty Five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000.00) to construct a sewer line on Auburn Street to Meadow Street.

ARTICLE 6. To see if the Town votes in the affirmative on the preceding article, if the Town will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen to borrow on the credit of the Town the sum of money so raised and appropriated; and for this purpose to authorize the issue of serial notes of the Town under and in accordance with the provisions of the Municipal Finance Act. Interest payable annually, Principal, payable five equal payments starting 1960.

ARTICLE 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed Fourteen Thousand Dollars (\$14,000.00) to purchase a Street Sweeper of approved design.

ARTICLE 8. To see if the Town votes in the affirmative on the preceding article, if the Town will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen to borrow on the credit of the Town the sum of money so raised and appropriated; and for this purpose to authorize the issue of serial notes of the Town under and in accordance with the provisions of the Municipal Finance Act. Interest payable annually, Principal, payable four equal payments starting 1960.

ARTICLE 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed Seven Thousand Six Hundred Dollars (\$7,600.00) for the purchase of a certain parcel of land situated on Mt. Eustis in said Town of Littleton and being all the land of Pepperell located westerly of the Mt. Eustis Road so-called, and southerly of the new Interstate Highway; together with the ski slope, a certain building at the top of the slope housing a motor, the ski lift and tow, towers and poles, motor rope tow, and all other equipment now located on said premises used in connection with the operation of the ski lift thereon. First payment to be made on April 1, 1960 in the amount of \$3,600.00 and the balance of \$4,000.00 April 1, 1961.

ARTICLE 10. To see if the Town will vote to rebuild and reconstruct School Street from Main Street to Oak Hill Avenue at a cost not to exceed Eighteen Thousand Two Hundred and Fifty Dollars (\$18,250.00) same to be taken from Parking Meter Fund.

ARTICLE 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) to repair the Shoe Shop Bridge.

ARTICLE 12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed Fourteen Hundred Dollars (\$1,400.00) for surface treatment of Cottage Street and West Main Street.

ARTICLE 13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed Seventeen Thousand Dollars (\$17,000.00) to purchase the land and buildings on Cottage Street known as the Boston and Maine Railroad Station, Interest to be paid annually and the Principal over a period of three years.

ARTICLE 14. To see if the Town votes in the affirmative on the preceding article, if the Town will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen to borrow on the credit of the Town the sum of money so raised and appropriated; and for this purpose to authorize the issue of serial notes of the Town under and in accordance with the provisions of the Municipal Finance Act. Interest to be paid annually and the Principal during a period of three years.

ARTICLE 15. To see if the Town will vote to have lights on the two intersections on Route 93. These lights are to be installed by the State of New Hampshire and the Federal Government, at an estimated cost of One Hundred and Ten Thousand Dollars, (\$110,000.00).

ARTICLE 16. If the Town votes in the affirmative to the preceeding article to see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed Three Thousand Dollars (\$3,000.00) for electricity for balance of year after installation.

ARTICLE 17. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed Fifteen Thousand Dollars (\$15,000.00) for the repair of the elevator and other repairs, and for the installation of a Sprinkler System, in the Apthorp Building, on Redington Street.

ARTICLE 18. To see if the Town votes in the affirmative on the preceding article, if the Town will vote to give Henschel Shoe Co., Inc., an option to purchase within five (5) years, the said Apthorp Building and land for a sum equal to the amount expended by the Town for such repairs and installation and pending the exercise of the option to lease said premises to said company for a rental of One Dollar (\$1.00) per year. The lessee to maintain, repair and insure the property at Its own expense during the term of the lease; both the option and the lease to terminate whenever said Shoe Company shall cease to do business on said premises; and all details relative to the option and lease to be determined by the Selectmen, and the Selectmen empowered to execute any leases, options, and deeds of conveyance that are necessary to carry out this article.

ARTICLE 19. To choose any other necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year, and to choose and elect any agents or Committees which may be necessary to carry into effect any vote that may be passed under the warrant.

ARTICLE 20. To hear the report of Agents, Auditors, Committees, including the Planning Board, or Officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.

### FOURTH ANNUAL REPORT OF LITTLETON PLANNING BOARD

Citizens of Littleton:

February 15, 1960

Your Planning Board is completing its 4th year. During our first three years Joseph W. Delisle was our chairman. The unusual amount of study and research done and goals achieved were due in considerable measure to the unusual amount of time and conscientious effort and ability he gave to our problems and goals. To him we, of the Planning Board, extend our thanks. Mr. Delisle's term expired April 1.

In September Robert A. Harris, a member for over three years, found the pressure of his other duties necessitated his resignation. It hurts to lose a faithful and experienced member. To him we also extend our thanks.

Mr. James J. Gannon was appointed by the Selectmen for Mr. Delisle's place. The board consisting of the following members elected the officers named:

At the first meeting of the year to pick officers it was suggested and voted that each year the member whose term is expiring will be Chairman and that the newest member of the board will serve as Secretary-Treasurer.

In making this report we noted with interest that on January 22, 1960 we held our 100th meeting since the Planning Board was first started by the Town Meeting of 1956.

Therefore it seems especially appropriate at this time to review the highlights. Among a multitude of problems and ideas studied, checked and worked at, those on which the major time and energy were placed are:

1. Zoning

2. Swimming Pool

3. Parking, especially Off Street Parking

4. Traffic Control

5. River Pollution and Sewage Disposal system

 Town Dump
 Subdivision

9. Capital Improvements

### Zoning

It was found Littleton had no valid zoning ordinance for the control of land use. You, by vote of Town Meeting, instructed your board to suggest an ordinance. Your board studied, discussed, employed the services of an engineering concern for recommendations and a report, held various meetings with interested public groups, had two public hearings, and interviewed many groups and individuals for ideas and information.

We consulted with other communities with zoning and also with the N.H. Planning and Development Commission. At the special town meeting held in January 1959 the suggested ordinance was turned down by the citizens attending.

There is ample evidence that most of the citizens feel there should be some regulations of some kind. Last year we recommended that for the orderly guidance of future community growth there is a definite need for zoning in Littleton and that the subject should be reconsidered.

Therefore your Planning Board has decided to initiate action in the near future by asking a group of approximately 100 representative citizens to meet for the purpose of organizing and activating a citizens committee to further study zoning and try to come up with an acceptable ordinance.

The Planning Board will make available to the Committee all its information and help which may be needed or wanted.

### Swimming Pool

At the 1959 town meeting propositions for swimming facilities were considered. There was some confusion as to the facts and particularly as to the feasible type of construction and its cost. After the meetings, facts were sought and it developed the proposed construction was not practical. The Planning Board was asked for its feeling and advice. Since the Allen Co., an engineering firm familiar with swimming pool facilities, had previously studied the problem and made recommendations, we asked the firm for its advice on the proposals. It was as a result of this firm's advice that the town purchased the Chiswick Inn property originally. After contacting them your board still recommended that, if and when a swimming pool project is agreed upon, the recommendations of the Allen Co. should be generally followed. That report outlines a proper swimming area utilizing the Chiswick Inn site.

### Parking

All of us realize parking is one of our prime problems. We know that reasonable facilities are necessary for the business health of any community, for the convenience of the public, and for economical and efficient administration.

Your board tackled this problem and its related one, traffic, almost immediately. At our suggestion engineering firms were employed. They studied our problems and made detailed reports and recommendations. With these as guides, your board has been constantly trying to find and suggest any reasonable means of alleviating our parking jam.

our parking jam. We still advocate the general recommendations previously made. Frequently this last year we have reviewed or initiated consideration of different aspects of local parking, working with our selectmen or passing helpful suggestions on to them. Among these were a renegotiation of use of the Thayers Hotel parking lot for mutual advantage; further study of future use of our public lots; consideration of use of land at rear of the library; steps toward the eventual purchase of parking areas in or close to the vital central business and service section of Littleton.

Along this line, there will be an article in the 1960 town meeting warrant to consider purchase of the B&M station property. Your board found this property was to be sold. The property is so situated that it possibly could have value to Littleton for truck and overflow parking, a future fire station site, a future town office building site and so on. Your board is neither promoting or advocating purchase of the property, but felt that with the purchase opportunity coming at this time, the citizens should note and consider if it might be a sound investment for future needs at this time.

### Traffic

The firm of Anderson-Nichols made a long range report and recommendations in the spring of 1959. Your board believes Littleton should use these suggestions as a goal to work toward when and as often as is reasonable. Traffic congestion and problems are related closely to parking problems. We have discussed and studied various related parts and have consulted and worked with our selectmen.

The main items under consideration this year had to do with future trafic controls, traffic lights, etc., which will be needed upon completion of the Union St. improvement and the big highway 93. These problems include whether to have parallel or diagonal parking on Main Street; what controls will be best at the town building intersection, at West Main and Meadow St. intersection, on the new Union St.; steps to make Mill St. a through street to allow traffic circulation; whether Littleton should accept and pay the relatively high cost of a heavily lighted installation on the Littleton interchanges of the new highway 93.

### **River Pollution and Sewer System**

We realized that, with a program of street and highway repair and the new construction necessitated by a growing town, there would be increasing need of a long range sewer system plan and many benefits could be derived from a study of our present facilities in conjunction with long range effects.

We also knew that New Hampshire is progressing slowly on a program to eliminate pollution from our streams and Littleton will likely in the coming years be required to dispose of its sewage by other means than dumping directly into the river.

Your board studied the problem. The firm of Camp, Dresser, and McKee, specialists in such work made a detailed survey of Littleton's problems and supplied us with detailed maps, guides and recommendations as to future planning and layout.

Their studies were of great help and their advice saved considerable money on the Union St. project. The Littleton Public Works Department frequently uses the engineering report as a guide.

This year there were discussions in regards to the sewer problem on Auburn St. Our selectmen have included an article in the coming Town Meeting warrant for the construction of the much needed sewer to service Auburn St. and eliminate the long time nuisance from that source.

### **Town Report**

In 1956 your board spent some time considering the annual town report hoping it could be made more readable and more easily understood. We recommended a town report committee to prepare the report under the direction of the selectmen. Nothing further has been done on this, but we still hold to the same recommendations for future consideration.

### **Town Dump**

In 1957 you asked your board to study and make suggestions on this problem. This we did. Disposal of refuse and rubbish usually is a nuisance problem. It is taken care of normally by sanitary land fill, incineration or open dump methods.

The board suggested some changes in regulations which were done. Also the board recommended continuance of present methods until more urgent town improvements are finished and the federal highway 93 through Littleton is completed. Then it is expected there will be a review of the situation with intention of relocation.

### Subdivision

The Town Meeting of 1958 granted your Planning Board authority in accordance with the provisions of the state law to make subdivision regulations.

Subdivision control pertains to the proper development of vacant land in regard to street and utility layout. Because it is a sort of companion to zoning, your board did not press for subdivision control, hoping to do that after adoption of a zoning plan. After the suggested zoning ordinance was defeated, your board has proceeded with studies as to suitable subdivision regulations. We employed the services of consultants Conklin and Kulski and the N. H. Planning and Development Commission for their ideas and advice. This last year we have formulated a tentative set of regulations. We are interviewing active developers and subdividers and other directly affected persons to obtain as comprehensive a cross section of practical needs as possible. It is our desire to develop regulations definitely for the best interests of our citizens as a whole.

### Capital Improvements Planning

We feel Littleton is fortunate in being a growing, desirable town in which to live. We enjoy many advantages. However, even in our small community the necessary requirements of continuing community improvement and fulfillment of needs can be quite complex.

Streets and highways, public buildings, sewers, lighting, schools, recreational facilities, and many other items are affected. All improvements usually concern in some way your Selectmen, Park Commission, School Board, Public Works Department, Fire Department, Police Department, Water & Light Department, Planning Board, every town agency and every citizen. Any degree of planning or programming for the future will help the control of finances and the proper scheduling of debt so as to minimize the burden.

Along with your various town administrators, the Budget Committee, and interested citizens, your Planning Board wishes to help as much as possible in obtaining the benefits from capital improvement planning. Therefore whenever we can, we are constantly working as an informational, advisory or sounding board agency with any officers, groups or individuals interested in Littleton improvement and growth.

### Miscellaneous

During this last year our new Secretary, Mr. James Gannon, undertook and completed the arduous and time consuming task of making a cross index of the Planning Board records, votes and activities from its inception. This is a valuable asset and time saver and will become more so as time goes on. For his efforts we are very appreciative.

Your board has been aware of a shortage of room for the storage of town records and also has been concerned as to the adequacy of the vaults and safes presently used for the protection of valuable town papers and records. The facilities are to be checked by persons familiar with such problems and a report made to the Selectmen.

### Acknowledgment

Whenever needed, the various departments, officials and employes of the town have been most friendly and cooperative. Many of our citizens have assisted.

We extend our sincere thanks to all those in or out of Littleton who have assisted us in any way. The members of your Littleton Planning Board reiterate that we want and welcome the ideas, opinions, suggestions and any information which any of you choose to give us. Littleton, for its size, is a most fortunate community. Littleton has an unusually diversified industry. Littleton is the natural center of activity in our area. Littleton is in an attractive, scenic location. Littleton is a nice place to live and work. Let us join together in a continued spirit of cooperation to help make our town ever better.

Gentlemen:

Submitted herewith is the report of the annual examination and audit of the accounts of the Town of Littleton for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1959, which was made by this Division in accordance with the vote of the Town. Exhibits as hereafter listed are included as part of the report.

### Scope of Audit

Included in the examination and audit were the accounts and records of the Board of Selectmen, Treasurer, Tax Collector, Town Clerk, Trustees of Trust Funds, Library, Municipal Court and Planning Board.

### **Financial Statements**

Comparative Balance Sheets — December 31, 1958-December 31, 1959: (Exhibit A-1)

Comparative Balance Sheets as of December 31, 1958 and December 31, 1959, are presented in Exhibit A-1. As indicated therein, the Net Debt increased by \$157,-982.12 in 1959.

### Analysis of Change in Financial Condition: (Exhibit A-2)

An analysis of the change in financial condition of the Town during the year is made in Exhibit A-2, with the factors which caused the change indicated therein. These were as follows:

A summary statement of receipts and expenditures for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1959, made up in accordance with the uniform classification of accounts, is included in Exhibit B-1. Proof of the Treasurer's balance as of December 31, 1959, is indicated in Exhibit B-2.

### Parking Meter Account: (Exhibit B-4)

A summarized statement of the Parking Meter Account is presented in Exhibit B-4.

### Statement of Long Term Indebtedness: (Exhibit I)

A statement of long term indebtedness as of December 31, 1959, showing annual debt service requirements, is contained in Exhibit I.

### **Audit Procedure**

The accounts and records of all town officials charged with the custody, receipt and disbursement of public funds were examined and audited. Vouchers and cancelled checks were compared with supporting invoices and payrolls as well as entries in the books of record. Receipts were checked by source insofar as possible and totals of receipts and expenditures verified. Book balances were verified by comparison with reconciled bank balances made from statements obtained from depository banks. Verification of uncollected taxes was made by mailing notices to delinquent taxpayers as indicated by the Collector's records. The amounts of uncollected and unredeemed taxes as indicated in this report are therefore subject to any changes which may be necessitated by the return of verification notices.

### **General Comments**

### **Current Surplus:**

The current surplus (excess of total assets over cur-

rent liabilities) increased by \$38,837.88, from \$8,-257.55 to \$47,095.43 during 1959, as shown herewith:

### Town Treasurer's Surety Bond:

It is again recommended that the surety bond of the Town Treasurer be increased from \$15,000.00 to \$25,000.00, in order that the amount of the bond may be more commensurate with the amount of funds which are in the custody of the Treasurer.

### Motor Vehicle Permits:

In accordance with the provisions of Chapter 260, Section 5, of the RSA, as amended by Chapter 13 of the Laws of 1957, no permit for the registration of a motor vehicle should be issued without first requiring the applicant to show a tax collector's receipt for the payment of any poll and head taxes for which the applicant is liable for the preceding year or an affidavit that such taxes have been paid.

### Conclusion:

The provisions of Chapter 184, of the Laws of 1955, require that this report or the summary of findings and recommendations (letter of transmittal) shall be published in the next annual report of the Town.

We extend our thanks to the officials of the Town of Littleton for their assistance during the course of the audit.

### LIBRARIAN'S REPORT 1959

In 1959 the most significant event at the Littleton Public Library was the completion and presentation to the board of trustees of a survey of the library made by the N. H. State Library. This survey is being published in its entirety in the Littleton Courier and will give the reader a complete picture of all phases of the library; its good points are noted, its weaknesses exposed and suggestions are made for improved service and a more attractive and efficient interior. Many of the library's inadequacies are attributed to a lack of sufficient funds. This results in a shortage of books. cuts staff hours, and limits such special activities as story hours, film programs and other projects which make for good public relations. It is estimated that by modern library standards the present budget is about two-thirds of what it should be in a town the size of Littleton. Expert opinions are given for remedving this situation either over a period of years or all at once.

The board of trustees is considering the ideas put forth in the survey and has already acted on some which involve little or no expense. Library hours have been changed to a more easily remembered schedule; the loan period for books has been extended to three weeks for most books, and two weeks for new fiction and magazines. Curtain rods have been installed in the children's room to be fitted with curtains for use during film programs. The adult reading room now housing books seldom used is to be turned into a browsing room shelving the more attractive and recent books of all classes. The phonograph and the record collection will also be moved to a more accessible place. The stackroom can be made more inviting by some slight shifting of book cases. Further improvements in the building will have to wait upon added funds. It is hoped that annual increases in the library budget will be made to help the library reach some of its goals.

Circulation continued high in 1959. Reference questions increased greatly in number and borrowing from the State Library was heavy due to more high school assignments that required material this library was unable to supply from its own resources. A busy Book Week schedule included a story hour, film program and a poster contest. Visits to the Littleton Elementary School have been made by Mrs. Buxton and have helped create interest in reading and in the library. A total of 795 books were loaned to three schools, the Elementary, St. Rose of Lima and St. Mary's-in-the-Mts. Groups making use of library facilities included the Investors' Club, the Garden Club and the Mormon congregation. A film workshop for librarians in the area was held here in June.

The Littleton Garden Club and the White Mt. Garden Club have made a splendid contribution to the library since early summer by providing a bouquet, plant or dried arrangement for the desk at regular intervals. This is a real and much appreciated effort that provides great enjoyment to both patrons and staff.

The Ruth Richardson Lewis memorial fund reached a total of \$250.00 with 44 people contributing. The money has been used to buy books in the fields of American literature and history. Other books were received as memorials to Hector G. Polson, Mrs. Aneta Dovholuk, Chester F. Meacham, Walter N. Heald, Mrs. Etta Harris and Mrs. Charles Morrill.

The help and interest of the board of trustees and of many patrons during the year was much appreciated by the librarian.

### ANNUAL REPORT OF LITTLETON DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS AND HIGHWAYS

### T.R.A. Work

With the Town Road Aid-V money from the state of N. H. amounting to \$7,098.40 and with the Town's share amounting to \$1,252.66, the following work was done by this department under the guidance of the N. H. State Dept. of Public Works and Highways:

On the Manns Hill Road from Hopkins' turn to the Dalton Town line, the road was shaped, gravel added where needed, and a 3-inch thick mixed-inplace bituminous surface was laid.

On the Farr Hill Road from Judd's on Auburn St. to the top of the hill just beyond Girouard's, new drainage was installed, electric and telephone lines moved, the road widened and graveled, and a 3-inch thick mixed-in-place bituminous surface laid.

### **Sewer Projects**

In addition to the normal maintenance work on sewers in town, there has been a considerable amount of work done on other projects which are as follows:

Old Franconia Road Sewer — With arrangements made with the N. H. Dept. of Public Works and Highways and the Hinman Co., contractor, the town crew laid some 2,300 linear feet of 8-inch sewer pipe, and did necessary appurtenant work, starting at the Hospital turn up the Old Franconia Road.

Badger Street Sewer—A new 8-inch sewer was laid on Badger St., branching off the Bethlehem Road Sewer just above Perkins Motel along to the rear of Calendar's house and then along to Bessie Stevens' for a total distance of approximately 1,027 linear feet.

### **Union Street**

The contract for reconstruction of Union Street was awarded to Cooke-Ross of Torrington, Conn. In connection with this work, there were many things which were the responsibility of the Town, such as, lowering sewer services which had not been previously located, the care and replacing of street signs, and general inspection of repairs to sewer lines and other utilities.

### **General Maintenance**

Sewers: We are continually adding manholes in existing sewer lines at trouble spots and on dead-end lines. Also there is routine cleaning and checking of sewer lines where there is apt to be trouble from roots and clogging. This is all designed to give the public better sewer service and more trouble-free lines.

Sidewalks: During the past year there was a considerable amount of money and time spent on sidewalks. The balance of the sidewalks on Main and West Main Streets were resurfaced and a portion of the sidewalk on School Street was done.

Streets and Highways: During the past summer months this department surface-treated several streets and highways. More of this work is planned for the coming year, and this program should be continued in years to come in order to keep the maintenance of these streets and highways from climbing to an all time high.

## REPORT OF THE LITTLETON PARK COMMISSIONERS

The Littleton recreation program got underway with a new slate of park commissioners for 1959-60.

Harassed by a decrease in our budget from previous expenditures we feel we have been most successful in presenting a sound and versatile program to the youngsters of Littleton.

Mrs. Richard Ross was engaged as playground supervisor at Remich Park and received merited praise for her varied entertainment program.

A highlight of the summer program was a circus staged by her, assisted by an able corps of mothers.

This was an overwhelming success, thoroughly enjoyed by a throng of over 500 spectators, the net proceeds being turned over to the Littleton Hospital Expansion Fund.

Events of this nature are a great interest builder for the youngsters as a great number of them have varied acts and duties to perform.

Mothers went all-out making costumes, selling notions, food, refreshments and supervising the "Midway" in general.

We were very fortunate in being assisted by a large contingent of very talented youngsters from Stonecrest Colony in Bethlehem, who fascinated the crowd with their juggling and tumbling acts as well as their singing. Much credit goes to "Crow" Enderson for the ingenious midway booths and his untiring efforts on all fronts, throughout the summer, particularly the swim program which maintains its perennial popularity. We had to cancel out activities at Apthorp Common the past summer for monetary reasons, but have provided for a recreational director there, in this year's budget. Also we would like to plant a few trees each year both at Remich Park and Apthorp Common to provide shade around play areas and bleachers. We also have the bandstand, grandstand and bleacher improvements to do this year which have been neglected for several seasons.

We also plan the purchase of a new mower this year from the D. C. Remich Trust Fund. The Selectmen renewed the lease with Mr. Pepperell for the Mt. Eustis Ski-tow with a purchase option. This is a proven mecca for devotees of the sport and should, we feel, be acquired by the town, due to its proximity and improved condition.

Much credit goes to Graydon Erickson for the latter, as he acquired dozers and scrapers at a nominal fee and supervised the job.

Due to adverse weather conditions last fall completion of these improvements had to be abandoned, but we hope to relocate the warming hut, and with a little more grading and seeding, have it in top shape for next winter.

The skating rink has seen uninterrupted service for one of the longest periods in recent years, with ice conditions nearly ideal.

With the advent of spring we hope to add a few new pieces of playground equipment to both parks, as none has been purchased in recent years.

Hayrides again proved a very popular attraction, with weekly picnics at such spots as the Dells and the Moore Picnic area at the Dam.

Nearly 5,300 children have been on the fifty-four rides to date, without a single casualty; which speaks

well of Art Tunney's untiring efforts to provide safe, economical fun for the youngsters throughout the summer months.

We plan to move the power house over the crest of the hill at Chiswick Inn this year to allow a longer tow line, thereby making greater use of the slope. Hundreds of youngsters as well as their parents have enjoyed this facility this season. In closing may we say that it takes many things to make a recreational program tick.

Criticism, fairly offered is also good; and we welcome it. We are also deeply appreciative of all the "lifts" given us by the various town departments, individuals who gave unstintingly of their time to teach skiing, skating, swimming and all the various games that gladden a child's heart. They are the unsung heroes of today and tomorrow and to them we are perpetually grateful.

### **REPORT OF BOARD OF EDUCATION**

To the Citizens of Littleton:

The school board of Littleton School District presents herewith its annual report. Included in the report will be found the audit of finances for the year 1958-1959 by the Division of Municipal Accounting of the State Tax Commission, showing a balance of \$5,862.71 as of June 30, 1959; budgets and estimated receipts and expenditures for this year and next year; and written reports by the superintendent of schools, the principal of the high school and the school nurse.

The budget for the coming year shows an increase of about \$30,000.00, but increases in estimated receipts of about \$12,000.00 over last year reduces the increase in the assessment to \$18,000.00. The major portion of the increase is due to increases in teachers' salaries and the need for two additional teachers. We therefore recommend an appropriation of \$442,247.59 for the ensuing year.

### WARRANT FOR SCHOOL MEETING

To the inhabitants of the Union School District, in the town of Littleton, qualified to vote in district affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the town building, in said Littleton, on Saturday, March 12, 1960 at 5:00 o'clock in the afternoon to act on the following articles: (Discussion of warrant at 8:00 P.M.)

Article 1. To choose a moderator, a clerk, two members of the Board of Education for a term of three years, and a treasurer.

Article 2. To see if the district will vote to petition the State Tax Commission to have an audit made by the Municipal Accounting Division.

Article 3. To hear reports of officers, auditors or committees of the district and pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 4. To see if the district will authorize the school board to enter into tuition contracts with neighboring school districts for a period not to exceed eight years, tuition rate to be determined annually by the Littleton School Board.

Article 5. To see what sum of money the district will raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of school officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from state equalization fund together with other income; the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.

Article 6. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

Submitted herewith is the report of the annual examination and audit of the accounts of the Littleton Union School District for the fiscal year ended June 30, 1959, which was made by this Division in accordance with the vote of the District. Included in the examination and audit were the accounts and records of the School Board and the School District Treasurer.

#### FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

#### Comparative Balance Sheets: (Exhibit A-1)

Comparative Balance Sheets as of June 30, 1958 and June 30, 1959, are presented in Exhibit A-1. As indicated therein the Net Debt increased by \$177,873.42 during the fiscal year ended June 30, 1959.

#### Analysis of Change in Financial Condition: (Exhibit A-2)

An analysis of change in financial condition of the School District during the fiscal year is made in Exhibit A-2, with the factors which caused the change indicated therein.

#### Comparative Statements of Appropriations and Expenditures— Estimated and Actual Revenues: (Exhibits A-3 and A-4)

Comparative statements of appropriations and expenditures, estimated and actual revenues for the fiscal year ended June 30, 1959, are presented in Exhibits A-3 and A-4. As indicated by the Budget Summary (Exhibit A-4), a revenue surplus of \$4,840.72, plus a net unexpended balance of appropriations of \$1,959.49, resulted in a net budget surplus of \$6,800.21.

#### Statement of Receipts and Expenditures: (Exhibit B-1)

A summary statement of receipts and expenditures for the fiscal year ended June 30, 1959, made up in accordance with the uniform classification of accounts, is included in Exhibit B-1. Proof of the Treasurer's balance as of June 30, 1959 is indicated in Exhibit B-2.

#### Building Fund Account: (Exhibit B-3)

A summarized statement showing the activity in the Building Fund account during the fiscal year ended June 30, 1959, is presented in Exhibit B-3.

#### Statement of Bonded Debt: (Exhibit C)



#### SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the School Board and Citizens of Littleton:

It is with pleasure that I submit to you my annual report relative to your schools.

There were comparatively few changes in the teaching staff in our schools this past summer. Two high school teachers were granted leave of absence for advanced study and six teachers left the system. Mr. J. Kenneth MacPherson, who taught mathematics in the high school, was given a leave of absence to study under a government scholarship at the University of Louisiana. His position has been filled this year by Miss Sara Ellen Hyde, who graduated from New Rochelle College. Mr. Francis A. Paquette, teacher of French, was given a leave of absence to study French under a government grant at the University of Massachusetts. His position has been filled by Mr. Paul R. Lorenzi. Mr. Lorenzi is a native of French Morocco and graduated from a teacher college in that country. He received his master's degree from Boston University in 1956. He has taught in French schools in North Africa and in the Berlitz School of Languages in Boston.

Mr. Edward Twomey of Franconia, a graduate of St. Mary's University in Baltimore, with previous experience in Dow Academy, was elected to teach English replacing Mr. Leonard Valway who resigned to accept a position in Pakistan.

Mr. Richard Millen, a graduate of Plymouth Teachers College, was elected to teach mathematics in Grades 7 and 8, replacing Mr. Harold Eichel who resigned to accept a position in Berlin, N. H.

Mr. Louis Bougie of Washington, D. C., was elected guidance counselor. Mr. Bougie received his B.S. from Concord College in West Virginia, and his master's degree in guidance from Indiana University, and has six years teaching experience in Oxon Hill, Maryland. Miss Sally Lehan of Littleton, a graduate of Plymouth Teachers College, was added to the staff to teach English.

Mr. Harold F. Kyte of Orono, Maine, with a master's degree from the University of Maine, was added to the staff to teach Chemistry and Physics. Mr. Kyte had previous experience in Old Town, Maine.

In the elementary school Miss Eleanor Rowe of Littleton, a graduate of Plymouth Teachers College, was elected to replace Miss Jane Harrison as kindergarten teacher. Miss Harrison resigned to get married.

Mrs. Elizabeth Parker of Littleton, a graduate of Plymouth Teachers College and with previous experience in North Stratford, was elected to teach the third section of Grade I in the elementary school.

Mrs. Jean Stocks of Lancaster was elected as the third teacher for Grade II in the elementary school. Mrs. Stocks graduated from Lyndon Teachers College and had previous experience in Lancaster.

Mrs. Charlotte Keysar of Newport, New Hampshire, a graduate of Plymouth, with previous experience in Bethlehem and Newport, N. H., was elected additional teacher for Grade III.

Miss Winifred Trask of Groveton, a graduate of Plymouth, with previous experience in Littleton, Arlington, Mass., and Groveton, was elected to replace Mrs. Helen Tetley who resigned to accept a position in North Woodstock.

Mrs. Faith Pilgrim of Franconia, a graduate of Plymouth, with previous experience in Wolfeboro, N. H., and Wheaton, Maryland, was elected as an additional teacher for Grade VI.

Mr. Edward Bilodeau of Littleton, a graduate of Plymouth, with previous teaching experience in Somersworth, was elected to teach in Grade VI, replacing Mr. Richard Enderson who resigned to accept a position in Maryland. Your high school program was strengthened this year by the addition of a guidance counselor and additional teachers in the English and Science departments. Pupils in the junior high school grades were grouped and sectioned according to achievement and ability. The same program is being followed in the senior high school when the number of pupils in a subject is large enough to require more than one class in that subject.

In the elementary school it has been possible to reduce the size of classes because of the added rooms and teachers. All grades have three sections except the fifth grade. Pupils were grouped in the various sections according to ability, using the following criteria: report card grades, achievement test results, mental maturity test results, and teachers' estimates. A few changes in pupil assignments were made since the opening of school when it was determined that such a change was best for the child. The reading program that was started last year in the upper three grades is being continued and everyone is pleased with the results that are in evidence. Many supplementary books have been purchased for recreational reading and teachers have been supplied with added basic and cobasic reading books. The success of the program is due in a large part to the cooperation of the administration and teachers in the program.

Reference books and library books have been added to both the elementary and high school libraries. The Littleton Public Library has been most cooperative in loaning a supply of books to the schools, which are placed in the school for a period of nine weeks. This means that we have access to four complete changes of books during the course of a school year.

Much progress has been made in the establishment of a modern foreign language laboratory in the high school. Dr. James Faulkner of the University of New Hampshire and the State Department of Education has been in Littleton on several occasions, and has advised the school relative to equipment. At the time of writing this report the project has been approved for assistance under the National Defense Education Act and the equipment has been ordered. It is hoped that it will be delivered and installed at an early date.

The school lunch program continues under the able direction of Mrs. Kathleen Brown at the high school and Mrs. Ruby Kinne at the elementary school. During the first five months of operation this year, which includes 91 days of the 180 day school year, we find that 65,520 pupil meals have been served. This amounts to an average of 720 pupil meals per day and puts the Littleton program into the category of one of the larger programs in the state.

Through the cooperation of Plymouth Teachers College, two extension courses have been offered in Littleton this year. During the first semester a course in "Modern Concepts in Science" was given, and during the present half year a course in "Child Growth and Development" is being given. Many of our teachers have taken advantage of these course offerings.

Everything is being done to make the educational program strong and I feel we are constantly making progress. I wish to commend the school board for its continued interest in all phases of the program, and express my appreciation to the community for its support in providing the necessary facilities, equipment and financial support which is so vital to the operation of a good school system.

In closing, I wish to thank the school board, principals, teaching staff, other school district personnel and citizens of Littleton for their cooperation and support.

### To Mr. Leslie S. Cummings Superintendent of Schools:

I hereby submit my tenth annual report as principal of Littleton High School, for the year beginning September 1959 to date.

#### REGISTRATION

The total registration for the senior high school (grades 9-12) is 368. The junior high school registration is 174. This represents an increase of 3 in the high school and 52 in the junior high school. Fifteen have withdrawn from the high school to date and 6 from the junior high school.

#### GUIDANCE

A very forward step was taken on September 9, 1959 when Mr. Louis G. Bougie began his duties as full time Guidance Counselor. Some of his duties include:

- 1. To coordinate and supervise the testing program.
- 2. To counsel pupils in their vocational, educational and personal problems.
- 3. To assist in obtaining part-time employment for those interested in working.
- 4. To make available any resource materials and information which would assist pupils in understanding the complexities of living in today's world.

The above is accomplished in either of two ways:

- 1. Individual pupil conferences.
- 2. Group guidance in the classroom.

### TESTING

The Iowa Tests of Educational Development, a battery of nine tests, were administered on February 1-2 to 185 pupils.

The Preliminary Scholastic Aptitude Tests were administered to 50 juniors and seniors on October 20.

Orientation discussions are carried on by the various armed services groups.

Testing and interviewing of seniors was conducted by Mr. Paul Brazier of the New Hampshire Employment Division.

The Northeastern University program of occupational information is being made available to those interested.

### CURRICULUM

The philosophy upon which our curriculum is based is that certain basic studies, involving the basic skills, should be required of all pupils; these include English, written and oral expression, mathematics, science, and social studies. The depth and degree to which these studies are pursued is determined by the ability, the educational aims, and the future plans of the pupil.

The curriculum is divided into five courses, namely—Academic, Business Education, Home Economics, Industrial Arts, and General. Health and Physical Education is required of everyone. Music chorus, glee club, band—and Art may be elected by those interested in work in these areas.

#### ACCREDITATION

Littleton High School is accredited by the State Department of Education and the New England Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools.

### NATIONAL HONOR SOCIETY

The purpose of the Littleton Chapter of the National Honor Society of Secondary Schools is to create enthusiasm for scholarship, to stimulate a desire to render service, and to promote worthy leadership and character. Members include Dianne Colby, Nancy Conway, Frank Hannah, Charlotte Hicks,

## THE SCHOOL LIBRARY

The school library, activated last year, has been expanded this year by budget allocations and by a generous gift of 500 books from Miss Marion Cass of the class of 1912. It is catalogued and shelved according to the Dewey Decimal system, and has now good non-fiction, fiction and reference sections adequate to most of the needs of the student body. There has been a gratifying increase in student use of the library during the year. There is still, however, need for further acquisitions in all sections.

The library is proud in the possession of a complete bound set of the magazine "The Granite Monthly," now a collector's item, gift of Mrs. Elizabeth J. Varney, Littleton, Mrs. William B. Spaulding, Winchester, Mass., and Mr. John Pearson, Concord, N. H. We gratefully acknowledge two gifts of money made "in memoriam" (Gary Whitcomb, class of 1959) for the purchase of books for the library.

### CONCLUSION

Considerable progress has been made but there is still work to be done. Increasing enrollments particularly in the junior high school are creating a problem of over-crowding, and the need for more space is evident. This year our junior high school has increased by 52 pupils and next year we expect a futher increase. As the junior high school expands it is necessary to take rooms away from the senior high school thus creating the necessity for expansion. The high school continues to grow and the increases in the junior high school will continue to effect the high school. Space is the number one problem of our school. The program in music and art should be strengthened and remedial programs expanded.

In conclusion I wish to thank everyone who helped to make this a significant year, particularly the school board, Mrs. Howland, Mrs. Beere, the staff and yourself.


